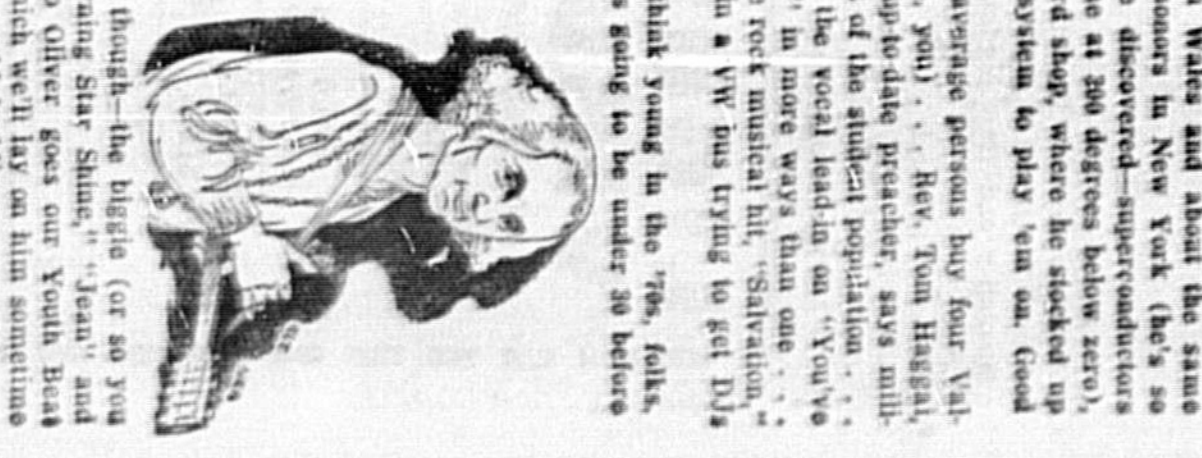

Schools File Exceptions To HEW Local Findings

Exceptions to initial decision of J. Marker Dern, U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW), declaring that Seminole County's schools are "infected with discrimination" in two of the seven federally-funded programs have been filed by Douglas Stenstrom, board attorney.

This is the latest legal procedure in the long complicated process which evolved after the District School Board submitted a freedom of choice school plan for the 1969-70 school year.

That plan, in an HEW action by Dern has been declared not in line with latest federal guidelines regarding the establishment of a unitary school system and will result in the loss of \$883,000 in federal funds for services to educationally deprived children and assistance in federally affected or impacted areas, if a review of the Dern decision made by a board of persons in Washington agree with the examiner that a dual school system affecting both black and white students does exist in the government administered programs.

School For Retarded To Open

Seminole County Association for Retarded Children has received a grant from the State Department of Retardation of \$8,877 to fund a school for pre-school retarded children through June, Jim Ryan, president of the association has announced.

The state is supplying 75 per cent of the operating cost with the local association supplying 25 per cent.

The VIC (Very Important Children) School will be located in the First Baptist Church at the corner of Church Street and Grant Street, Longwood, and will open its doors on Monday, March 16. Hours will be 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

A highly qualified teacher, Mrs. Vivienne Paul, has been hired for the school and an aide secured. Mrs. Paul has had 30 years experience in this field.

Now all that remains is for parents of retarded youngsters 3 1/2 years old to enroll them in the school. The prime learning years for children are from birth to six years, therefore it is especially important to begin formal training as early as possible.

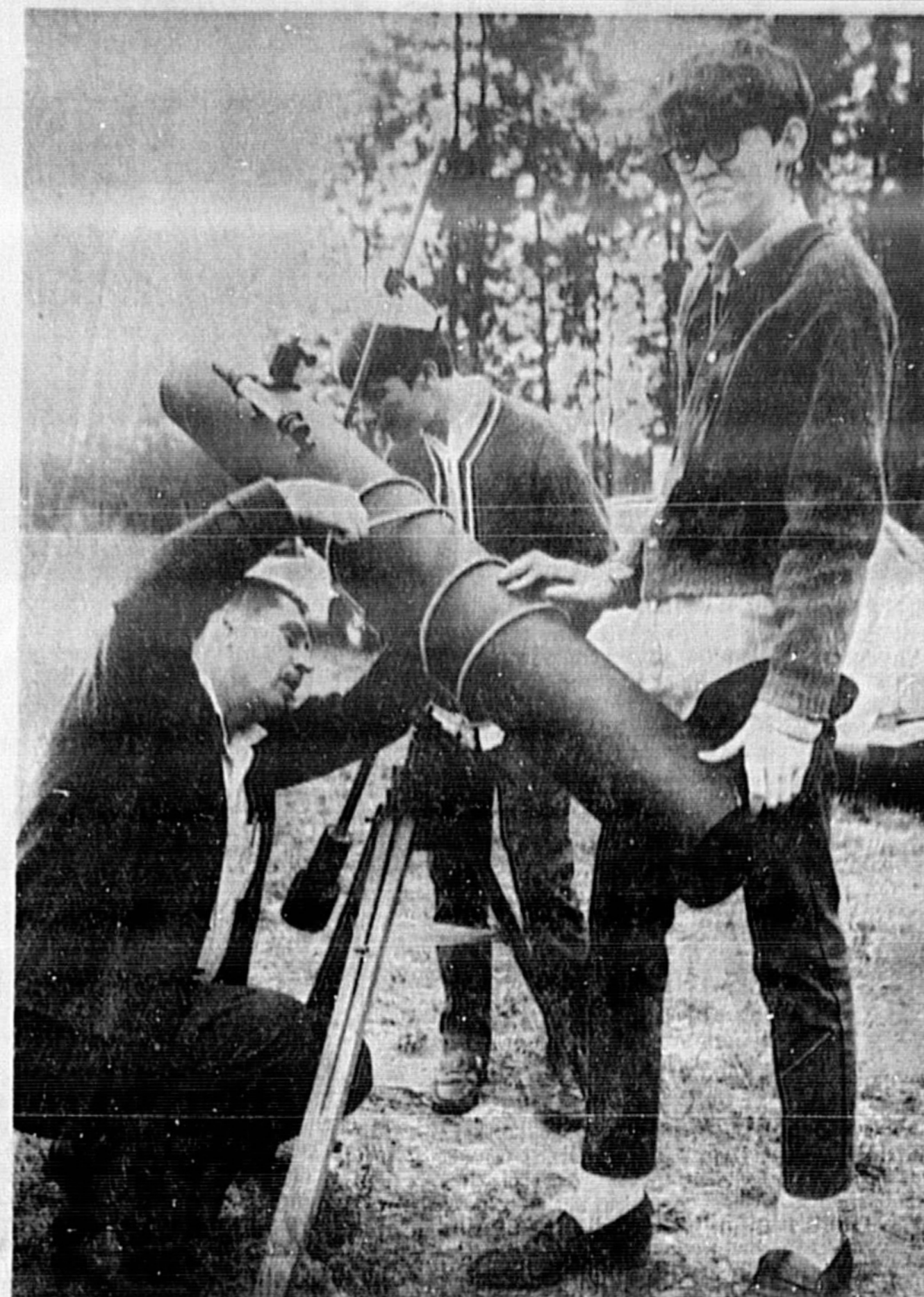
The VIC School is designed with this purpose in mind. The school will start with one class of no more than eight children. Three have already signed up.

There is still room in the class for additional children. Ryan also said tentative approval for a federal grant for next September is expected.

At the present time funds are not available for busing the children so parents will have to provide transportation to school for their own youngsters.

Jury Probing Death Of Girl

Seminole county grand jury is meeting today to consider an indictment against a 33-year-old Longwood mechanic accused of murder, second degree, in the death of his 2 1/4-year-old step-daughter.

Ronald Frank Powers, 207 Lake Gene Drive, Longwood, was arrested March 5 by county deputies after a warrant was issued by County Judge Wallace Hall charging the man in the death of Lana Bennett, daughter of Charles Powers.

According to an autopsy report from Orange County Medical Examiner Dr. Thomas Haggert, the little girl died as a result of a ruptured spleen, allegedly to have happened after a beating.

Sheriff's department investigators were called into the case after the child had been hospitalized for over two months within a year for various injuries, including a broken arm and leg.

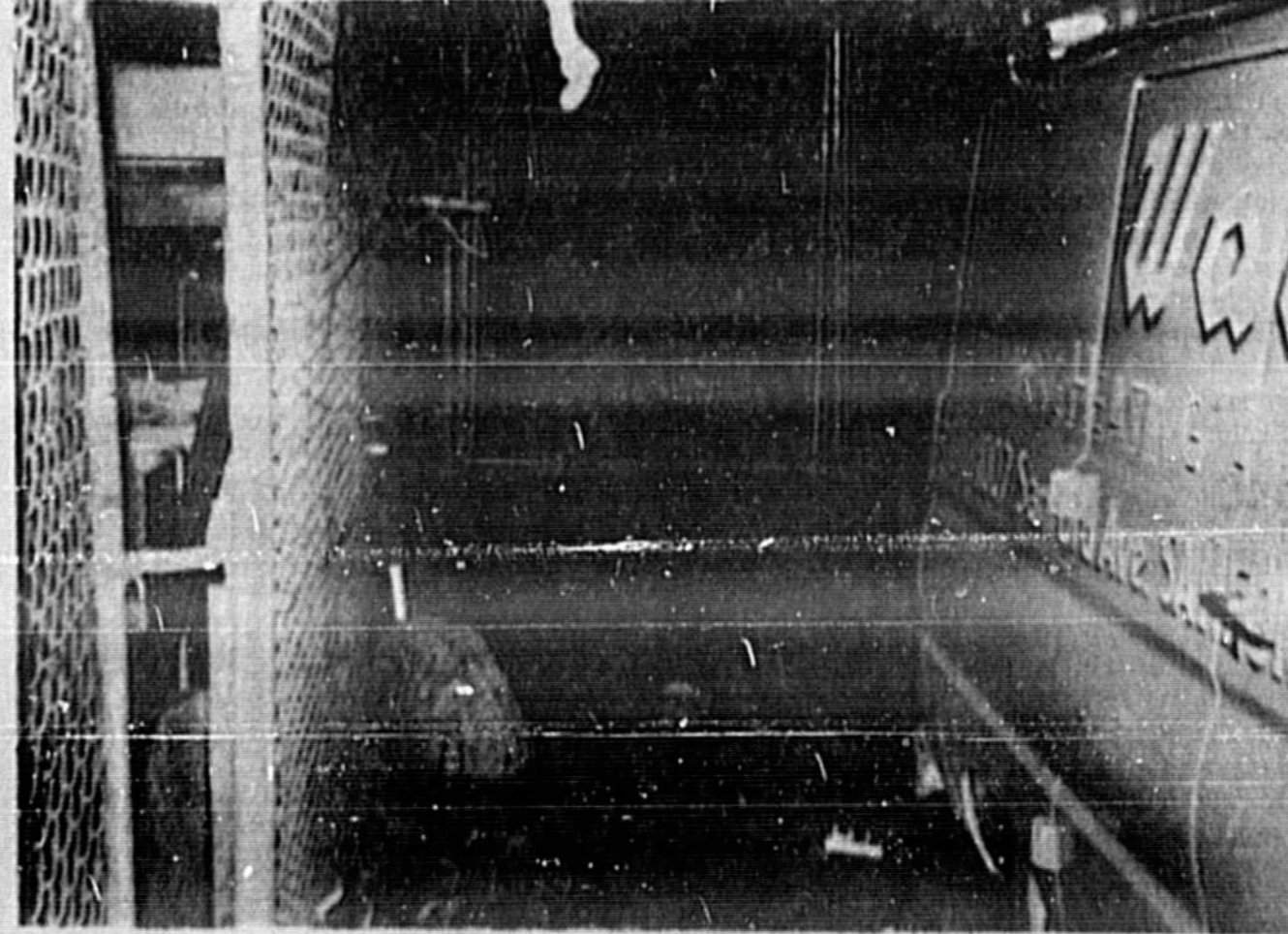
