ORLANDO - (Spl) - Effect of the consolidation of Jacksonville and Duval County, from the original idea through its inception to the present, was outlined in detail before the Central Florida Development Committee here last night. The outline was presented by Mayor Hans G. Tanzler and J. J. Daniel, chairman of the Local Government Study Commission of Duval County.

Tanzler said it is logical that adjoining cities will benefit by consolidation of services through lower taxes. He said consolidation served to equalize services and taxes in rural and urban areas of Duval.

"One telephone call," said the Mayor, "can bring any emergency service, whether it be ambulance, firemen or policemen. When communities have common needs, why cannot they work together for their mutual

Daniel, president of Stockton, Whatley, Davin and Company, largest mortgage banking firm in the South, said the consolidation "enables us to plan in an orderly way for future growth, Duplication of government service creates waste, graft and inefficiency. 

Detention By MARION BETHEA

County Commissioner Robert Parker has advised that Seminole county is going to have to "quit dragging its feet" and establish a concrete plan for detention of juveniles. Parker stated that the facility in which juveniles are currently placed in Orange county is becoming overcrowded and will, in all probability, no longer be able to accommodate Seminole county placements.

It was stated that the Florida Supreme Court recently ruled that the new constitution does but that the matter must have a public referendum if it is to be funded by ad valorum taxes. Therefore, the juvenile facility as well as facilities for the mentally incompetent, the branch office of the Court House in south Seminole County, and the new Agricultural Center must be placed on the election ballot in September. Commissioner Greg Drummond predicted that the proposals will be defeated because of the possibility of the county having to levy 1% Road and Bridge millage to offset the loss of race track funds to the Seminole County School Board, and because the school board may increase millage from 2.5 mills to 5 mills to retire bonds.
