U.S., North Vietnam In 'Frequent Touch' - LBJ

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson has said diplomats in the United States are in frequent touch with North Vietnam on the subject of changing the site for a Vietnam peace treaty.

Johnson said he and his advisers do not know whether the North Vietnamese leadership is sincerely interested in solving the site problem or whether it has some other purpose in mind. He said he would be glad to meet with them tomorrow.

State Will Launch Fight On Poverty

LIVE OAK (AP) — A new program to fight rural poverty in Florida has been announced on the heels of a controversial report which branded communities — such as this one — in eight Florida counties as "hunger areas."

James Bax, Director of the Division of Economic Opportunity in Gov. Claude Kirk's office, announced Tuesday the formation of a "rural team" to aid counties in fighting poverty.

Bax criticized past efforts in Florida for either being "pork-chop" flavored or too urban-oriented, and said he generally concurred with the findings of the citizens' board of inquiry into hunger and malnutrition in the United States.

Tornadoes Kill 13, Hurt 207

Tornadoes ripped into small communities in Kentucky and Ohio Tuesday, spreading death and destruction. Twisters also struck two towns in Michigan, causing damage but no deaths.

The count of dead rose to 13. Involuntarily, a twister in Kentucky, near Augusta, Ky., 6 in Wheelersburg, Ohio, 1 in Clermont County, Ohio, and 1 in Evansville, Ohio.

The storms injured 207 persons, left more than 706 homeless and wrought damage in excess of \$2 million.

"We were going through a taste of death right there," reported Henry Dance, 77, a Fallmouth resident who was at home with his wife.

"It sounded like a clap of thunder," he said. "And then the roof began to fall. Holding on to each other, we fell down to the ground and part of the floor fell on us. The Lord saved us, that's all."

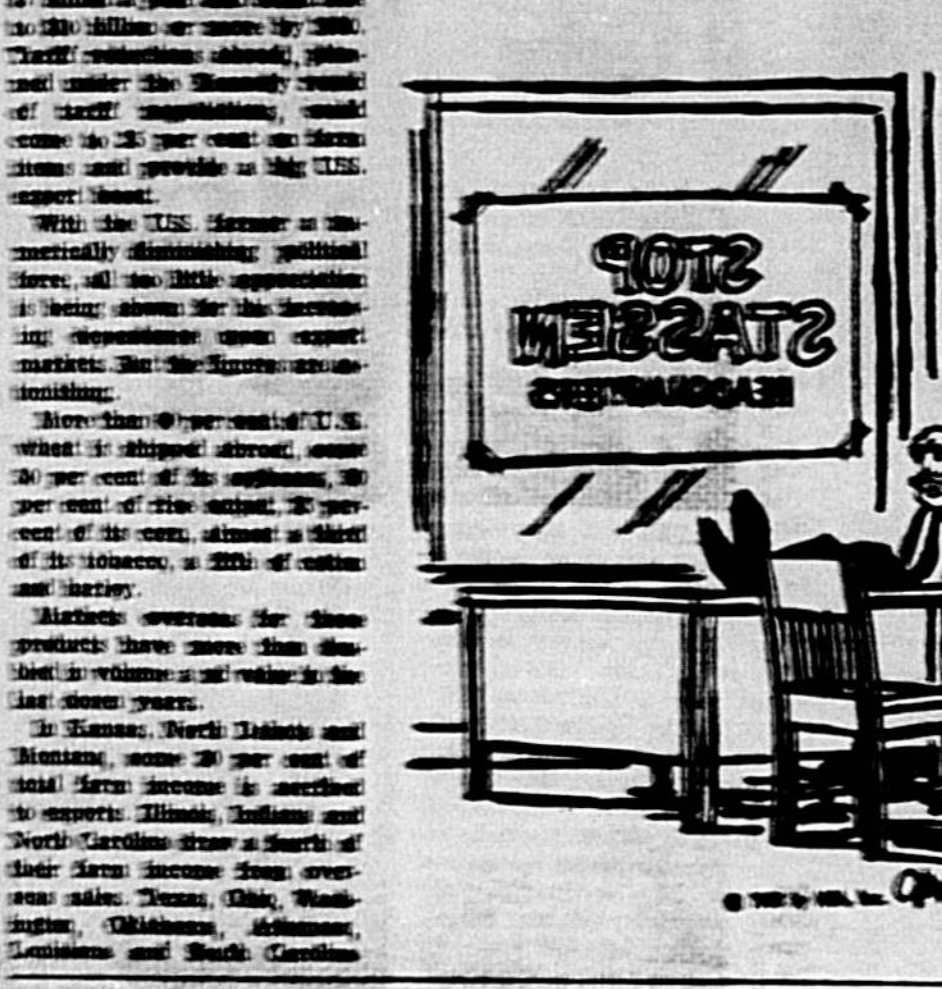

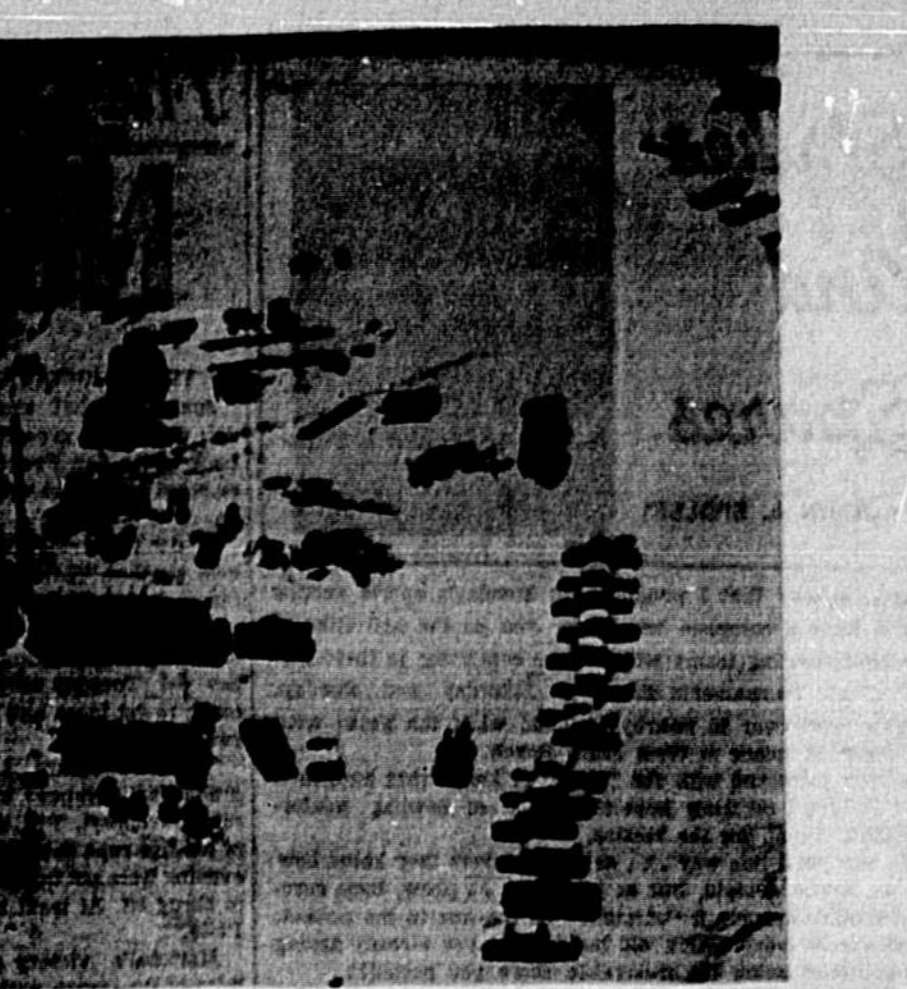

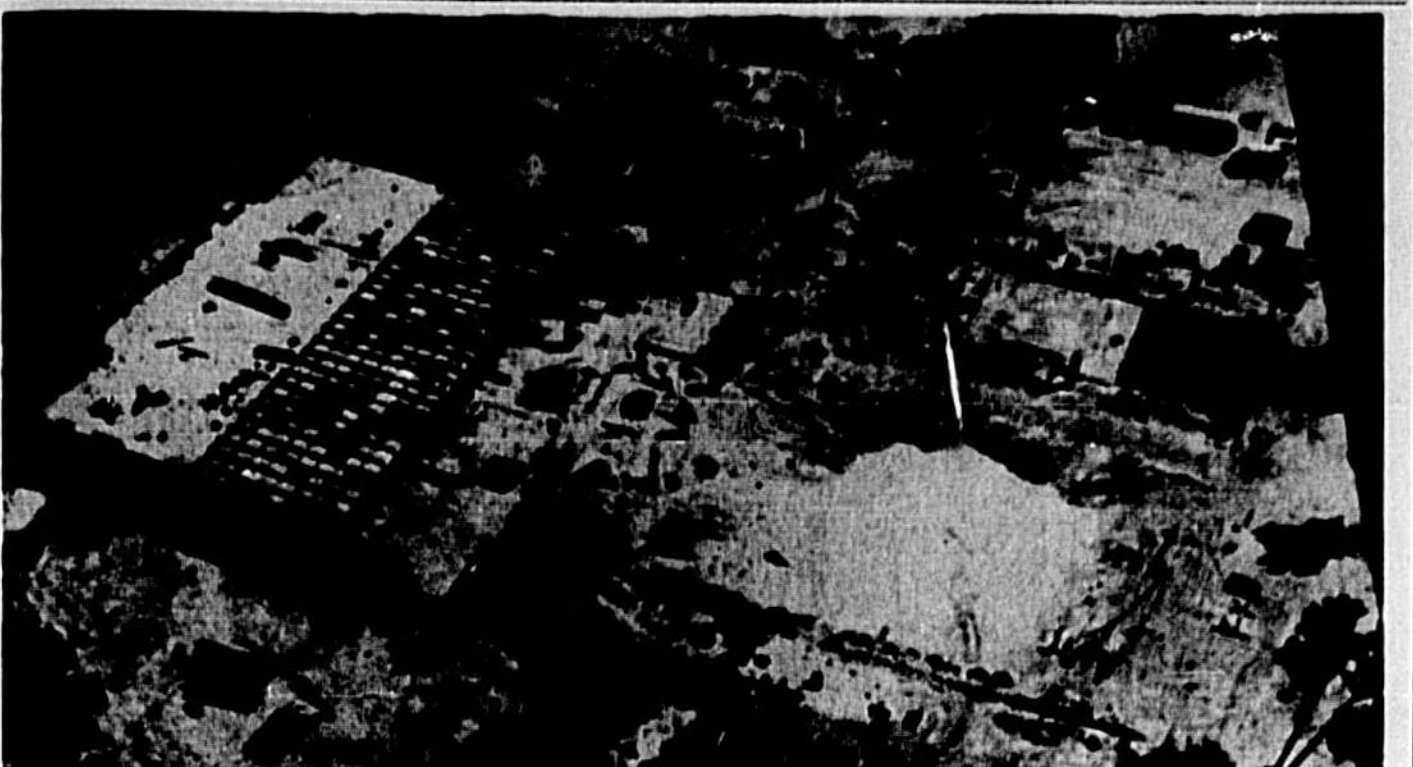

Besides flying their own plane, the team occasionally makes night flights with the Marines, to drop flares over enemy installations. The C-117 has thus far been able to avoid any serious damage.

Half of the time though, the crew doesn't even know they're being shot at until they get hit, and sometimes not even then. On one trip to Hue, the crew was hit by a rocket. The aircraft was damaged, but the crew was able to land safely.

As soon as the plane comes in from a trip, the entire crew gets out to wipe down, fuel it and check for any possible malfunctions. The crew also has to be ready to take off at a moment's notice.

In addition, every time the bird logs 30 hours in the air, it goes into the hangar for an overhaul. During the overhaul, the crew works on the plane to make sure it is in the best possible condition for the next trip.

 4 shoulder lamb chops, about 1/2 inch thick
 1/4 cup cracker meal
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 tablespoon butter or margarine
 1/2 cup finely chopped onion
 1/4 cup finely chopped celery
 1/4 of a medium green pepper, finely chopped
 1-1 1/2 cups canned tomato sauce with mushrooms
 Cut most of fat away from around chops. On wax paper stir together the cracker meal, salt and pepper. Dip chops in mixture. In a large skillet melt the butter; brown the chops in it in one or two batches. Discard skillet drippings. Place chops in an oblong glass baking dish (13 1/2 by 8 1/2 by 1 1/2 inches) or similar utensil. Mix together the onion, celery, green pepper and tomato sauce. Spoon over chops. Cover dish with foil. Bake in a 350-degree oven until tender—about one hour. Slice fat from sauce in bottom of dish; serve sauce. "It will be a small amount," with chops. Makes six average servings.

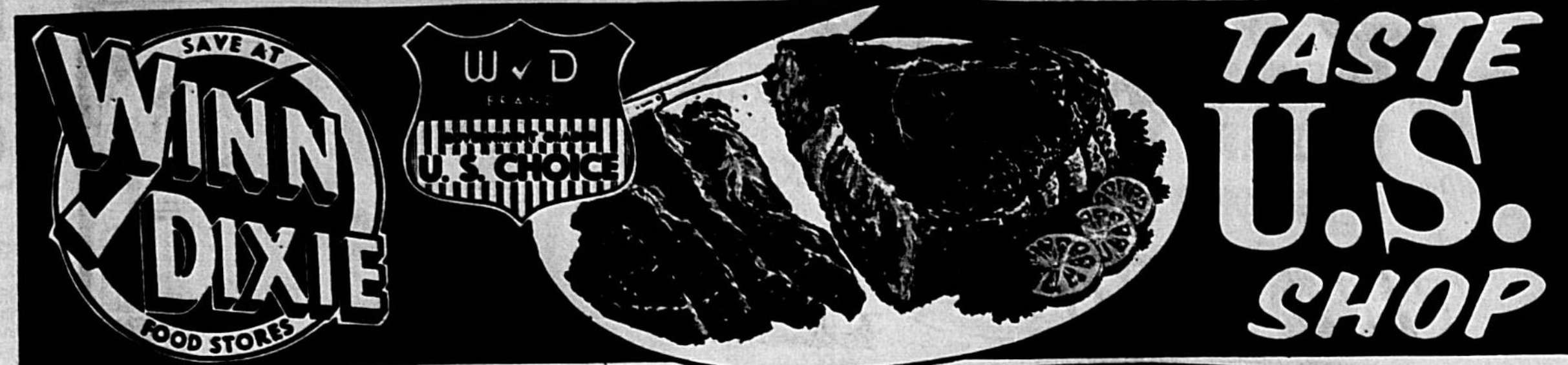

Roast Lamb Leftovers

Dear Cecily: My wife and I like roast lamb very much but we're usually at a loss when it comes to the leftovers. Have you a recipe you can suggest?
Answer: Cook.

Dear American Cook: I've just tested a recipe for stuffed green peppers, using cooked lamb, and I'm enthusiastic about this use of the leftover meat.
This recipe is just a little different from the usual rules of the road. First, because most green pepper stuffings call for beef. Second, because this stuffing has a Mediterranean touch—olive oil with lamb and cooked rice is called for. Grated carrot goes in, too, but maybe that addition is plain American. Anyway, it's good! To speed the stuffing together, add flour, and to keep the peppers moist, canned tomato sauce is used.
Although this recipe is fashioned for four, you can easily cut it in half to serve two. Should you want to prepare the four portions, serving with the idea of offering the peppers in the top of a double boiler and reheat them over boiling water.

LAMB-STUFFED PEPPERS
4 large green peppers
Boiling water
2 tablespoons vegetable oil
2 cans (each 8 ounces) tomato sauce
2 cups sliced cooked lamb
2 cups cooked converted-type rice 2 small carrots, shredded medium-fine 1/4 cup raisins 1 teaspoon season salt 1 teaspoon oregano
Cut a lengthwise slice, about 1/2 inch of the pepper, off the side of each pepper, forming a deep holder; reserve slices. Remove seeds and membrane from peppers.
Put peppers in a saucepan, add salt and enough boiling water to cover. Boil for 15 minutes. Drain. Arrange peppers in a shallow baking dish, into which they fit with a little space between.
Meanwhile, chop reserved green pepper slices.
In a 1 1/2-inch skillet over moderately low heat, heat the oil, add chopped green pepper and onion. Cook, stirring often, until browned. Remove from heat. To the skillet, add one can of the tomato sauce, lamb, rice, carrots, raisins, seasoned salt and oregano; mix lightly.
Fill peppers with lamb mixture; pour remaining one of tomato sauce over peppers. Bake in a 350-degree oven for 45 minutes, basting a few times. Serve hot.
Makes four servings.

It's an old-fashioned potato salad and it's great. Knowing cooks have prepared it over the years. Maybe your grandmother made it.
This potato salad is different from the kind usually served nowadays because it's offered hot. And its dressing is different, too. No mayonnaise is called for. Not a speck of oil goes into it. Instead, bacon and bacon fat, along with bouillon, vinegar and seasonings help to make it savory. The dressing is thickened with flour.
Add bacon pieces, have some. This hot potato salad is an offspring of the German cuisine. It's a great accompaniment for German sausage—Knockwurst, bockwurst or bratwurst. If you're planning to serve the combination at an informal company supper, you might like to have all three varieties of sausage on hand.
As a crisp accompaniment for the salad and sausage, offer a "finger" salad. What's that? Celery, carrot sticks, scallions. An attractive way to offer these raw vegetables is to put them in a low pitcher, a beer stein or an old-time celery vase.
HOT POTATO SALAD
6 medium-large potatoes (about 3 pounds)
4 slices bacon
1 medium onion, thinly sliced
1 tablespoon sugar
1 1/2 tablespoons salt
1 teaspoon salt
White pepper to taste
1 1/2 tablespoons celery seed
1 beef bouillon cube
1/4 cup boiling water
1/4 cup cider vinegar
Boil potatoes in their skins until tender. Peel and slice into a large bowl.
Meanwhile in a 1 1/2-inch skillet fry the bacon until crisp. Remove bacon (leaving fat in skillet), drain on paper toweling and break into pieces.
To the bacon fat in the skillet, add onion and cook gently until transparent. Stir in flour, sugar, salt, pepper and celery seed.
