



Iowa Waitress Extradition Sought

A 40-year-old Council Bluffs (Iowa) waitress will be extradited to Seminole County to face trial for the kidnaping and robbery of a Casselberry liquor store manager. Lt. L. J. Kriz, sheriff's investigator, stated today if Delores Donna McEvoy declines to waive extradition and seeks a hearing, the county will take whatever procedures are required to bring the woman back to Florida.

WASHINGTON (AP) - Here at a glance are the key points of President Nixon's Vietnam steps announced in a broadcast address Monday night:

MEASURES-All entrances to North Vietnamese ports will be mined, U.S. forces will "take appropriate measures within" North Vietnam's territorial waters, and rail and all other communications will be cut off "to the maximum extent possible" to block North Vietnam's access to military supplies. Air and naval strikes against North Vietnam will continue.

SOVIET UNION-Directing specific comments to Soviet leaders, the President said "we expect you to help your allies" but "only for the purpose of their defense." He said the United States wants to continue building "a new relationship" with the Soviet Union and urged the Soviet leaders to join the effort.

NORTH VIETNAM-Hanoi has responded "with insolence and insult" to U.S. offers at the bargaining table and has "flatly and arrogantly refused to negotiate an end to the war..." The North Vietnamese offensive has "reached the point that it gravely threatens the lives of 60,000 American troops '

SOUTH VIETNAM-The United States cannot turn "17 million South Vietnamese over to Communist terror and tyranny." In comments directed to the South Vietnamese, Nixon assured continued "firm support in your resistance

UNITED STATES-Acknowledging that many Americans favor immediate withdrawal of all U.S. troops, Nixon rejected that as an easy but unwise choice. He appealed for public support.





The Public's Message To Washington

Could it be that underneath the surface of these presidential preference primaries, there is a growing manifestation of something which transcends politics and which needs to be recognized before too long?

We believe there is. It has attracted a definition as a re-birth of populism from some. Others have looked at it from the viewpoint of a single issue: Witness Gov. George C. Wallace and his "anti-busing" stance.

But this is only an easy way to consider the grave challenge which is now forming and has yet to burst into an explosion which will shake more than the formal political structures.

In almost every primary the specifics may change but there emerges a sense of "anti-" that has shown itself in such changes in formerly assured political appeals as to make the appeals themselves suspect.

In both major parties there is taking place a realignment of support which stumps the oldtimers and can be stated as confusion in the toomany Democrats who want to live in the White House and loss of confidence by some GOP stalwarts in the man who is there now. Such changes are not, of course, obvious. But

what is as plain as the nose on your face is that a great wave of lack of confidence is forming. Take the most ominous of the issues. It is the oldest and the most dangerous: Indochina war. We have been and still are critical of the means

by which President Nixon has taken and is pursuing to "end this war" as he promised in '68 while seeking election. It had been Mr. Nixon's hope that the Vietnam issue would not be present in this

presidential election year and he had relegated it

to a low spot on the issue pole. Now, however, with the Hanoi offensive flexing its muscle (made in Russia) and threatening a knock-out punch for the weak Thieu regime, this has become more than a political issue. It is a matter of the most grave substance, which has brought the National

Security Council into session. During the past weeks the opposition to the renewed bombing and naval bombardment by U.S. armed forces of Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia has spread from any purely political point of attack to that of the moral.

Throughout the nation there is an aspect of this war which cannot and must not be ignored. This is the moral or religious. This is the message that the public is sending to Washington: an end to destruction and killing.

Another message which has no political tag on it is that of the economy. Certainly this is something which the presidential hopefuls from

Pie In Sky Or Wave Of Future?

WASHINGTON - Some say Sen. George McGovern's proposals for curing America's ills are like the limitless skies beyond the badlands of his native South Dakota. They extend on and on toward the horizon.

Most certainly the current front-runner for the Democratic presidential nomination has expressed himself on a surprising number of issues troubling the nation and is adding more proposals almost daily. A \$33 billion cut in the defense budget, a drastic cutback

in U.S. armed forces, a redistribution of American income, amnesty for draft dodgers, the naming of a woman to the U.S. Supreme Court and a program of guaranteed jobs for everyone who wants to work - all these are part of his

An immediate, total and irrevocable U.S. pullout from Vietnam keyed to return of American prisoners of war, recognition of Communist China, strong support for Cesar Chavez and his United Farm Workers, an investigation of the Federal Bureau of Inevstigation, and abandonment of the U.S. Safeguard antimissile programs. So far among the Democratic contenders only Sen.

Henry Jackson, D-Wash., has assailed the McGovern porition, calling it "way out in left field," and McGovern's views of national defense "naive." Others have suggested that McGovern is "a left-wing Goldwater, a reverse referral to the conservatism of Sen.

Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., the unsuccessful 1964 Republican presidential nominee. And there have been mutterings from the camp of Sen. Hubert Humphrey. D-Minn., that McGovern might divide the party.

\$54.8 billion over three years. At a time when the United States is rapidly losing its strategic nuclear superiority this would mean active duty military manpower would be cut from 2.38 million to 1.73 million, made up entirely of volunteers.

It would require a reduction in Army divisions from 13 plus to 10, in Marine divisions from 3 to 2, a cutback in reserves from more than 800,000 to 600,000 and withdrawal of three of the current five U.S. divisions in Europe. "The legitimate national security interests of the United States have been ill-served by the growth of an excessive,

wasteful, overly large military establishment at the expense

of our vital economic and social health," McGovern says. The Pentagon on the other hand has termed McGovern's recommendations so unrealistic that a spokesman on Jan. 18 said it was impossible to comment on them constructively. Not nearly so clear, but equally controversial, are McGovern's proposals for tax reform. Among other things he has called for a minimum income tax that would apply to those with incomes in excess of \$50,000 regardless of their legal deductions. McGovern says this would raise \$6 billion.

He also is advocating: - Return of corporate income tax rates to the 1960 level, dropping the accelerated depreciation rates and investment tax credits now provided to stimulate investment. This, he claims, would raise \$17 billion.

Pressures Await Hoover Successor

WASHINGTON (NEA)

The kind of man the new FBI director turns out to be may have a greater bearing on your life and mine than any other appointment made by a U.S. president.

If J. Edgar Hoover's 48 years in the post are at all indicative of the future, his successor will, from time to time, cative of the future, his successor will, from time to time, face political pressure of the strongest type aimed at using the very considerable power of the FBI in ways dangerous to democracy and to our liberties.

If history is any judge, these pressures will come both from "liberals" and "conservatives"—or men who use these labels to describe themselves.

Hoover faced down these pressures with guts and with some very able marshalling of his political and public defenses. For courage alone is not enough. To defend against such pressures you must have political resources and the ability to use them.

 After watching the FBI in operation for something over two decades, this reporter has, on occasion these past few years, awakened at night worrying over who might be Hoover's successor. I would think of the infor-mation in those millions of files. A ruthless politician with that data could come close to destroying much of his

Not too many years ago, this reporter knows that a very high U.S. government official made direct personal attempts to secure the FBI's files for use against his political enemies. Among other things, he had a list of opposition congressmen he wished to tarnish. Hoover faced him down. Though this powerful politician

then set out to destroy him, Hoover was by then so well ensconced and had so much prestige that this man, with all his high connections, could not force Hoover to do his will. But Hoover bore the marks of these attacks until his The question is, could a new man, however courageous,

face this type of pressure?

Then again, there has long been a movement within Congress for enlarging the police powers of the federal government. There have been moves to give the FBI more government. There have been moves to give the FBI more power on the college campuses, to make more crimes federal crimes, thus giving the FBI more authority.

In these piecemeal moves Hoover saw danger—the risk of making the FBI a national police force. He repeatedly told colleagues he would have no part in this—that a national police would be a step toward a police state.

Most assuredly Hoover's successor will also face this

problem time and again—as local violence threatens to get out of hand and Congress moves toward stronger fed eral crime laws. Hoover's answer was that these problems, great as they are, are for local communities and local police—and that the FBI role was in providing information, training and backup for local police forces, on request—and for work on a few truly national crime prob-

 A succession of political figures have attempted to bring their men into the FBI—either as a means of moulding the institution to their own partisan objectives, or as a means of providing jobs for faithful retainers.

Here Hoover was particularly fierce. For the ineffective agency he inherited was a shambles because it was hackridden and dominated by politics.

It is certain that at one time or another men with politics that a state of the state

Screen Violence Is It Contagious? By DAVID HENDIN

The recent Surgeon General's report on the effects of TV violence on children is being supported in several ways by the research of a University of Utah psychol-


The psychologist, Dr. Victor B. Cline, adds motion pictures to the list of media that may be leading Americans into an era of unrelenting violence and exploitive sex devoid of love and responsibility.

"Evidence is mounting that motion pictures and televi-sion can alter behavior patterns, influence values and attitudes and possibly contribute to changes in life styles," Cline remarked after conducting a recent study of theater fare in his home town. "By making violence appear glamorous and exciting and illicit sex normal and desirable, these media are setting the stage for a society based on aggression and irresponsibility," he added.


According to the Surgeon General's report, there is a causal link between the exposure of some children to television violence and subsequent aggressive behavior. "Psychologists have for years demonstrated, for example, that you can overcome a person's fear of snakes by gradually exposing him to others who casually play with snakes," Cline noted. "It stands to reason that you can also change attitudes and emotional responses to violence, sex and various antisocial behavior by repeated

The real question raised by all of this research, however, is this: Is the violence in television and the movies the cause of troubles in our society? Or is the trouble in our society, perhaps, being accurately portrayed by these

It all boils down to the chicken or the egg riddle, and since we don't know where these behavior patterns come from, we are hard put to find ways to stop them.
