Dear Mr. Fisher:

We have read with interest your editorial under the heading "A Negligible Calamity". We appreciate your deep interest in this matter. We too would like to see "Negligible" as quite dangerous to the agricultural interests of central and southern Florida, and most particularly of Seminole County. What might be "negligible" in the mind of General Hamner and some of the army engineers might be a deadly disaster to a Seminoles' farmer.

We were interested in the last sentence of the last paragraph in your editorial calling attention to the fact that it was "high time that some of our local organizations go busy and correct this completely erroneous impression". Some weeks ago, the Seminole County Agricultural Association appointed a special committee to study this proposed canal project as carefully as available data would permit. This study has led this committee to believe that there is a possibility of very grave danger to the agricultural interests of the central and southern portion of the state due to major causes from the possibility of salt contamination and the depletion of soil under ground fresh water supply.

Following up our studies, and in an effort to secure support of our position, we have brought this matter to the attention of a large number of our people. You will be interested to know that we have obtained by letter 27,000 signatures from 11,000 citizens of Seminole County. In addition to the 27,000 signatures, we have obtained a number of other signatures from other counties in the state.

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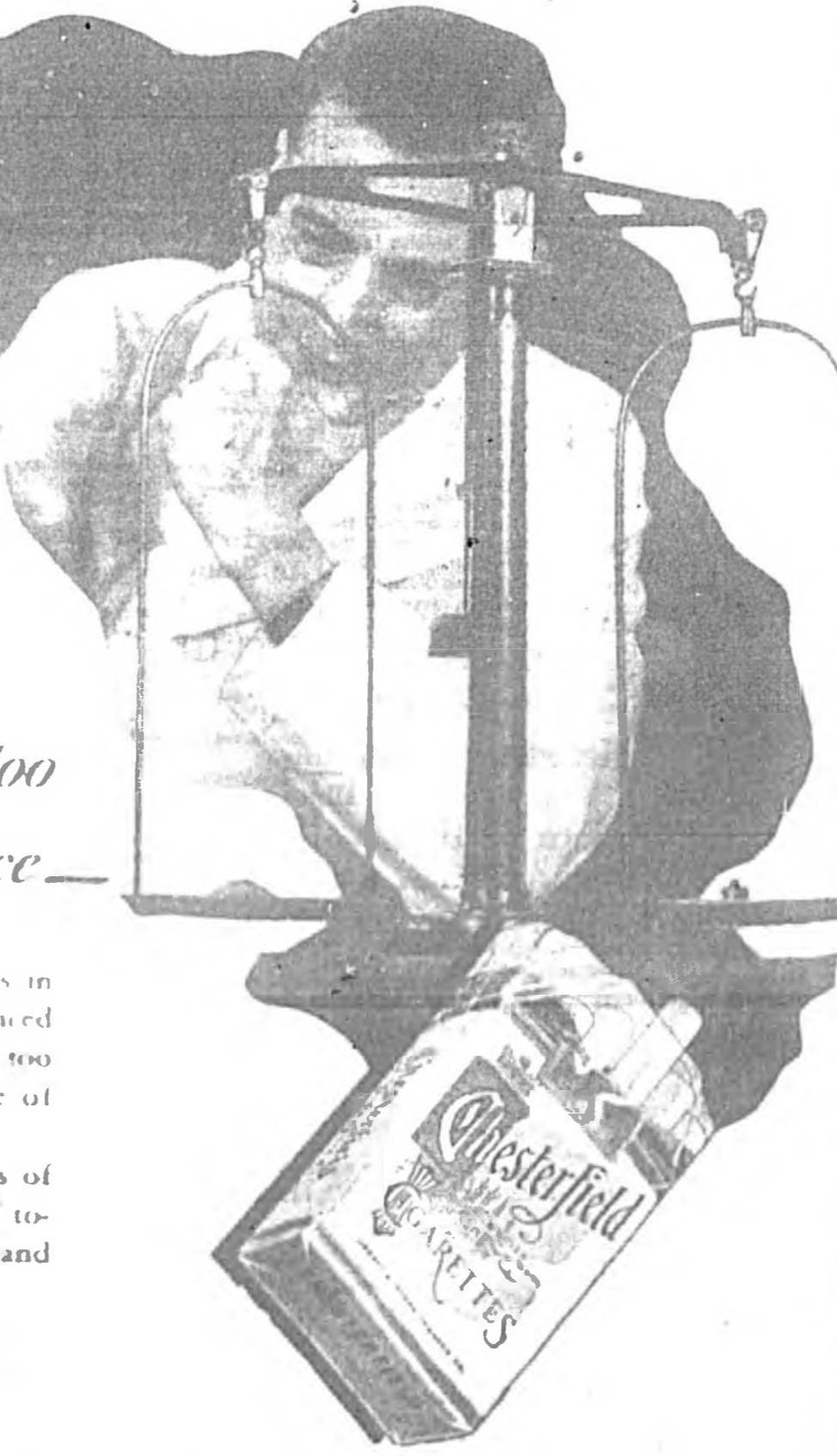
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SANFORD TWENTY YEARS AGO
