LAKE MARY - Florida's state championship is going to be decided a little early and in a new city this year.

Tonight, at Lake Mary High School, the Lady Rams basketball team, ranked number one in the state and undefeated in the season, will host Pensacola High School in a rematch of last year's state championship game. Pensacola has one loss, which it suffered during a Christman tournament and in currently ranked number two.

Lake Mary fell to the Tigers in that game, by three points, and is looking forward to the grudge match.

"This is the biggest game of the season for us," said Lake Mary coach Carl Brown. We are very excited and will come out ready to play. It would be ridiculous for me to tell the girls not to be nervous, but if they come out and play the way they know how to, hopefully the nerves will quite down quickly."

Judge scolds county officials

SANFORD Seminole County Commissioner Dick Van Der Weide and Clerk of the Court Maryanne Morris took their squabble to court on Monday - and both were scolded by the judge.

He's suing her for taking \$1,081 out of his last two paychecks - money she says he owes the county from a trip to Europe last August.

Monday, Judge Thomas G. Freeman denied a temporary injunction by Van Der Weide's attorney but at the same time told Morse. You're not a Super Commissioner.

Attorney Michael Jones is expected to amend Van Der Weide's suit, a legal maneuver that may give Morse but two options - to defend the suit at a cost of up to \$30,000 to the taxpayers of the county or to pay the commissioner the \$1,08t, He's also asking for attorney fees.

"It makes no spend the \$30,000 of taxpayers' money," was Freeman's somber advice to both Morse and Van Der Weide.

"Its an oddball situation," said Morse's attorney Terry Griffin. "To pay him the money would be an illegal act. That's why she deducted the money in the first place."

Freeman turned down Van Der Weide's injunction Monday because Morse said she had no plana to take more money from the commissioner. If she had planned to dock more pay, and injunction would have stopped that action until the problem is resolved. His attorney is ex-

Last June, Wood made VIP Gold cover up its nude dancing girls.



SANFORD - Philosophy is more than a course taught by Dr. Pat Fitzgerald. During classes at Seminole Commuclasses at <u>Berninole</u> Community College, Fitsgerald teaches his students that philosophy is the pursuit of knowledge. For Fitsgerald that pursuit is not just the way he carms his living. It is the way he lives.

Fitsgerald did not set out to be a teacher of philosophy or anything else. As a child of the 60's coping with the anget of a

80's coping with the anget of a tour of duty with the United States Marine Corps he found his passion for philosophy while attending University of Bouthern Indiana, hi 1974 he received a bachelor's degree with a combined major in Philosophy, Art and History.



This Valentine's Day you will probably either send or receive a Valentine from someone. More than a billion are expected to be given away in the United States alone. Who gets Valentine cards? According to Hallmark Cards, people receive them in this order: teachers, children, mothers, wives, and sweethearts. The Hartz pet food company says that 3 percent of pet owners will even give a Valentine gift to their pets.

If you're like me, whenever Thankagiving rolls around you picture the Pilgrims and the indians sitting at a table breaking bread together. It's the story behind the holiday that provides the spirit of warmth. When it comes to Valentine's Day, there is also a true life story behind the holiday, and it has a lot to teach us about the true meaning of love, sacrifice and commitment.

In the third century, the Roman Empire was ruled by Emperor Claudius II Gothicus. He was nicknamed Claudius the Cruel because of his harshi leadership and his tendency for getting into wars and abusing his people. In fact, he was getting into so many wars during the third century that he was having a difficult time recruiting enough soldiers.

Claudius believed that recruitment for the army was down because Roman men did not want to leave their loves or families behind, so he canceled all marriages and engagements in Rome. Thousands of couples saw their

hopes of matrimony dashed by the single act of a tyrant. And no one seemed interested in

standing up to the emperor. But a simple Christian priest named Valentine did come forward and stood up for love. He began to secretly marry soldiers before they went off to war, despite the emperor's orders. In 269 AD Emperor Claudius found out about the secret ceremonies. He had Valentine thrown into prison and deemed that he would be put to death.

As Valentine was awaiting execution, he fell in love with a blind girl, who happened to be the jailers daughter. On the even of his execution, with no writing instruments available. Valentine is said to have written her a sonnet in ink that he squeezed from violets. Legend has it that his words made the blind woman see again. It was a brief romance because the next day Valentine was clubbed to death by Roman executioners.

St. Valentine gave his life so that young couples could be bonded together in holy matrimony. They may have killed the man, but not his spirit. Even centuries after his death, the story of Valentine's selfsacrificing commitment to love was legendary in Rome. Eventually he was granted Sainthood and the Catholic Church decided to create a feast in his honor. They picked February 14 as the day of celebration because of the ancient that birds (particularly lovebirds, but also owls and doves) began to mate on that very day.

According to the resolution and the commission discussion Monday night, the committee will examine the applications and trim the number down to the top five to 10, after which the information is to be forwarded to the commission for additional examination and subsequent interviews with

candidates. Simmons and several other officials said they expected possibly as many as 200 applications will be submitted. "I have already had several sent in even before we advertised," Simmons observed. "I have some as well," added Mayor Dale.

The advertising is to be done in publications circulated in the League of Cities and other municipal papers, rather than in local newspapers.

Simmons had previously said he would retire from his 12 1/2 year-long position after midчсаг. when preliminary budgetary work has been completed for fiscal 1998/99.

There was no immediate indication regarding when the selection committee will begin to hold meetings, which will be open to the general public.

Neither Morse nor Van Der Weide has budged in a dispute over an economic development trip he took to the Netherlands and London. The commissioner did not turn in receipts for his meals on the 10 day trip, filing for \$50 per diem.

Morse also insisted that Van Der Weide was not entitled to expenses for the London portion of his trip because she said it was not approved by the commission. He argued otherwise.

Each took the stand in a lively one-hour session in Judge Freeman's court on Monday. The two attorneys read from state and county travel procedures. Some of the language in the county's book was vague and has led to problems.

Morse testifled that she asked Economic Development Manager Bob Turk and Planner

John Jones to adjust their travel vouchers for the trip to Europe because they, too, put in for the straight \$50 food per diem. Both did so. Van Der Weide did not.

Van Der Weide was asked if losing the \$1,081 was a financial strain. "It does hurt," he said. "I have to pay bills. Yes, it has an effect. A very serious effect."

He also said that the episode was "a major embarrassment," that he was constantly having to answer the same questions in the newspapers. Judge Freeman was unhappy

to discover the Board of County Commissioners had voted to give Van Der Weide the per diem but that Morse refused to pay the commissioner. "Wait a minute." he said, "the County Commission voted in a public meeting to pay the bill. What authority do you have to

override what they did?" Morse said that giving Van Der Weide the money would have violated county laws.

Successful saltwater fishermen must know the tides

SANFORD For success, saltwater anglers must know the stages of the tides, especially the amount of time between a high and low tide. Fish are most active when the water is ebbing or flowing. The longer the time be-tween tides, the longer the period of best flahing. Anglers may debate over whether the incoming or outgoing tide is better for fishing, but the important point is that fishing is better during the ebb and flow than during the slack times at high and low tide.

Experienced angiers also know that there are certain times each day when fishing activity reaches a peak. These times correspond to the times the moon is directly over or under the earth. For approximately one hour on either side of the moon over or moon under time, fishing should be the best for that part of the tidal cycle.

Every bait and tackle store that deals with saltwater anglers will have a tide chart for their area. Several companies publish yearly tide chart books, and charts are usually included in the saltwater fishing magazines. Florida Sportsman magazine provides de-tailed tide times for the entire state in each month's issue:

Much of the Florida coast experiences two highs and two low tides per day. Remember that the times and actual levels of tides may vary due to winds and storms.

SHUPE'S SCOOP

Anglers have strong opinions about what tides are best to fish. It is my opinion that tides are very relative to the area being fished, and that certain fishing conditions require different tides, some spots may be best at high tide, while others are hot when the tide is dead low.

FIGHING FORECAST

For good base action, stick to the Wekiva River. Base are hitting shiners fished close to heavy cover. The river is great for just getting out in nature, but the fishing is beyond tough with the flooded conditions. Lake Monroe has fair action with specks.

Big winter flounder are still the big news at Sebastian Inlet. Anglers bouncing finger mullet alowly across the rocky bottom are scoring with flatfish to over 10 pounds. Small enapper and a few anook and redfish round out the action.

Captain Jack at Port Canaveral reports that high seas have kept boats in Port. Inside the Port. expect a few anook, sheepshead and flounder. Trout and redfish are scattered in the Banana and Indian Rivers. Passing cold fronts are keeping the fish confused. Cold weather forces them into deeper water for a day or so, and then warmer water finds them moving towards the flats.

Ponce Inlet has consistent action with sheepshead, drum, redfish, bluefish and jack crevalle. Live or dead shrimp is a great all around bait. A few flounder are being caught on the south side of the south jetties. Trout and redfish are rated as fair in Mosquito La-





Is lung scar uncommon?

DEAR DR. GOTT: In the course of testing for a chronic cough, eventually discovered to be due to a chronic postnasal drip, I had a chest X-ray which showed a "scar." Is this serious?

DEAR READER: Probably not. During healing from an infection or injury, the lungs - like any tissue in the body - may form scars. Actually, such pulmonary scars are a fairly common finding on routine chest Xrays. By and large, such scars indicate that the person had a lung infec-tion, which cleared up. For example, a serious bout of childhood pneumonia can, after complete recovery, leave pulmonary scars.

If your doctors are convinced that the scar and shadows on the X-ray are old and not a cause of your cough, you can ignore them. In most cases, such an abnormality will not adversely affect health or lung function.

DEAR DR. GOTT: For several days. I have had very yellow urine — almost orange in color. This week, I noticed that the whites of my eyes are yellow. What's going on?

DEAR READER: From your brief description, I suspect that you have a liver problem that is causing the bile in your system to enter the bloodstream, leading to jaundice. You need immediate medical attention.

Jaundice can result from hepatitis, gallstones and a host of other medical conditions. In my opinion, you should have an examination and testing to determine the cause for your symptoms. Make an appointment with your family physician immediately. If he cannot see you in the next few days, go to the emergency room of your local hospital.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have chronic pain in my muscles and joints that has not responded to customary therapy and pills. A friend suggested osteopathic manipulation. What do you

DEAR READER: In most respects, esteopaths do not differ from traditional MDs. They have the same training and perform identical services with one notable exception: manipula-

Osteopathic medical principles emphasize the relation between body structure and function. Discord among these factors can lead to discase. For example, chronic pain could be the result of disruption of the normal, healthy relation between muscles and the jobs they were designed to carry out. In such a situation, a traDR. GOTT



ditional osteopath would closely examine and palpate the muscle groups, looking for inflammation, swelling, tenderness, temperature

variations and contractures. Then, based on his findings, he might choose to use manipulation to restore the normal reciprocity between organ and function. Such manipulation might well be used in conjunction with special exercises and prescription medicine.

This approach has been used for decades with success. And I think that you ought to try it. Although osteopaths generally subscribe to standard medical practices, their use of manipulation adds another dimension to the treatment of disease.




