We are, unfortunately, having to put up with the activities of a child molester, a peeping tom, a smart alec who thinks he can pick up children for, supposedly, a ride, children taking part in un-childlike activities.

There's no need for all of this.

But, to make such happenings a practical impossibility we must do something about it.

The answer, we think, is to provide recreational activities for the children of our community, of all ages. To keep them husy in clean, wholesome, guided recreation so that they will learn by doing, keep healthy by exercise, and stay out of the way of pitfalls that must surely come when children are allowed to provide their own outlets for amusement.

The cost to the city is minor, compared with the price of a child's life. The cost to the city is less than the stigma attached to a child because someone failed in their duty.

What we need, right now, is a city wide, year 'round, recreation program headed by a trained recreation director.

These people don't come "dime a dozen" understand, because recreational directors are professional people, trained to lead children in paths of usefulness. They're chrisian people devoted to the christian view of
