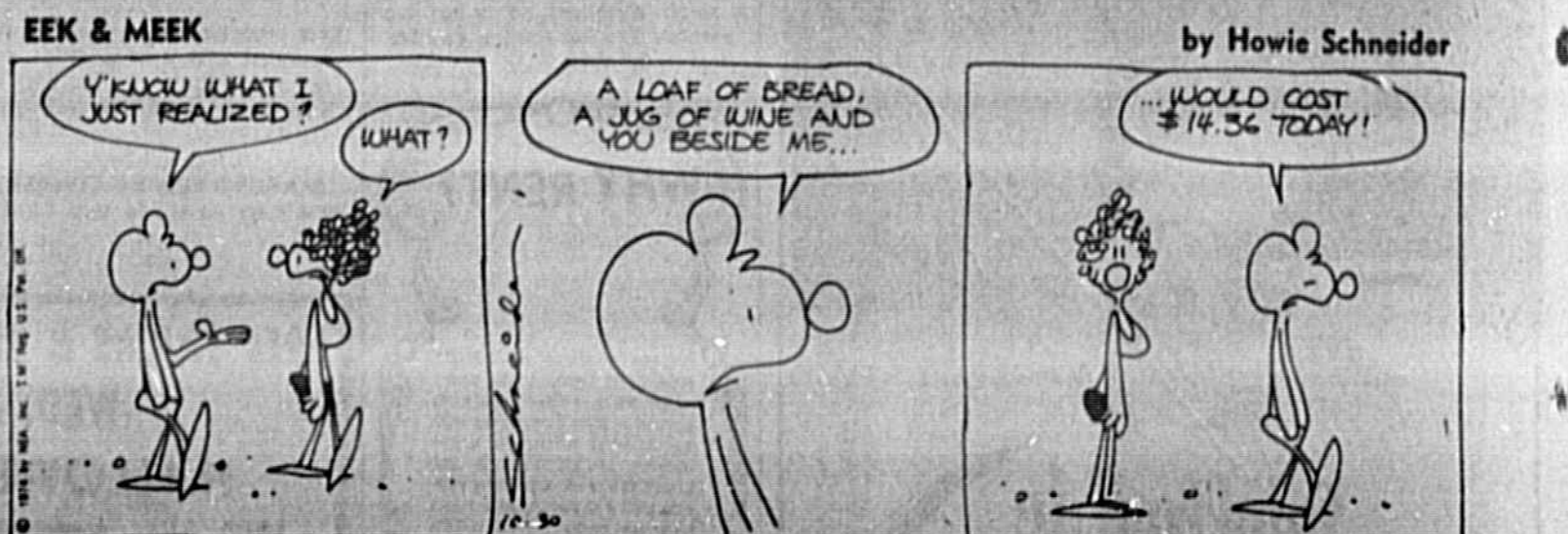
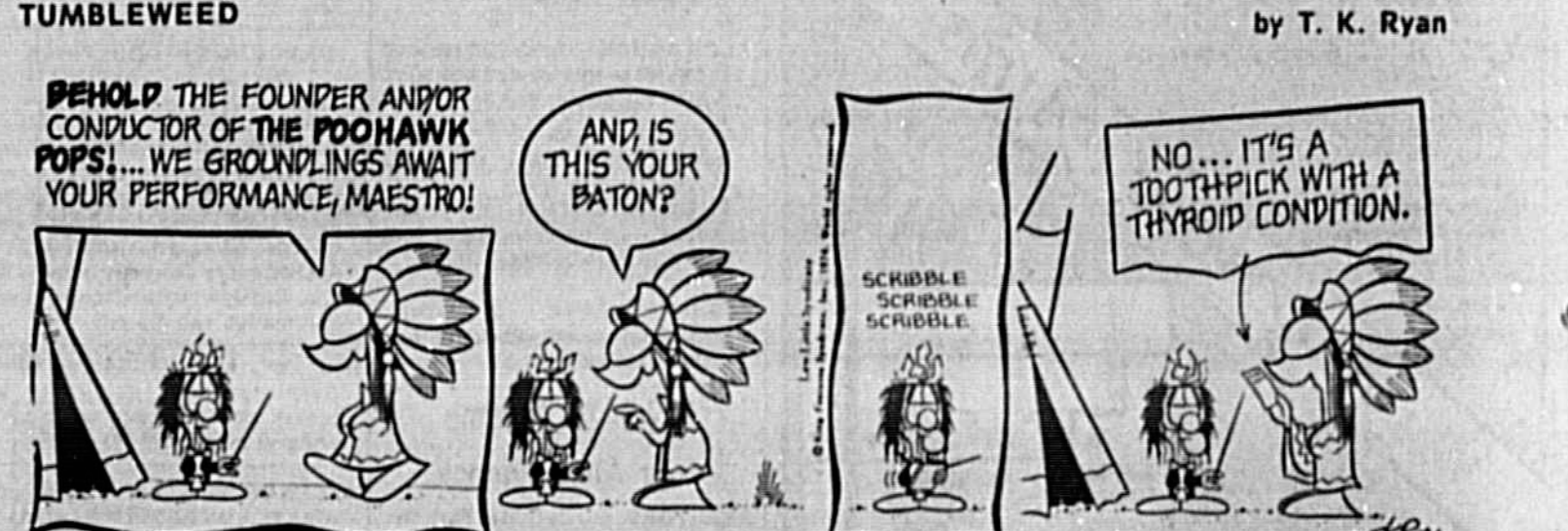

School Board Discusses Suit Layer's Flyer Misleading

Controversy highlighted the Seminole County School Board meeting Wednesday evening when the chair refused to meet a speaker on the agenda and the board debated the ethics of political flyers and the role of the superintendent in labor negotiations.

The meeting started amicably enough, with a discussion of the \$250,000 personal damage suit by the Seminole Education Association (SEA) against the board members.

'Not For The Public' This meeting is held in the public, but not for the public. Sims explained, "We had to listen to anyone. (Other speakers) added the last minute to the agenda are not using the board. When they (SEA) filed suit that draws the line."

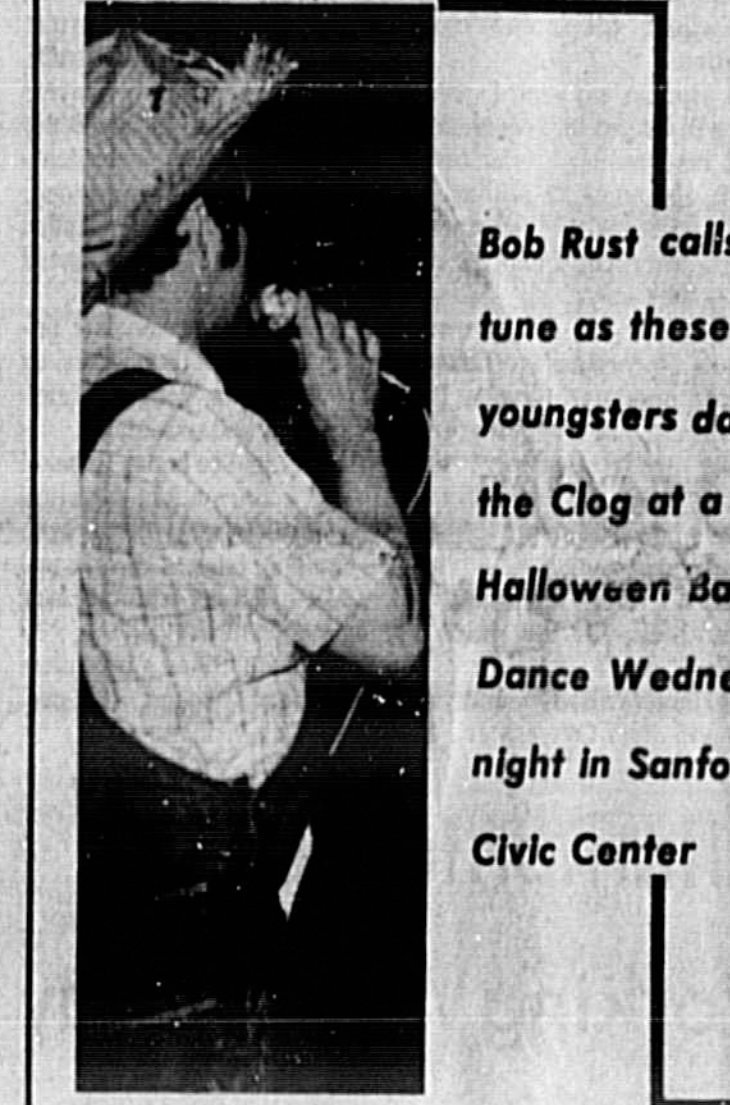
Petition Seeks Recall Of Officers

Seminole Education Association (SEA) officers admitted Wednesday evening a petition is being circulated to remove three officers of the teacher organization.

A leaflet distributed by Seminole County School Superintendent William Layer urging the rejection of the November ballot proposal for appointing school superintendents is grossly misleading according to a partial survey made by the Evening Herald of the nine counties listed by the flyer.

The leaflet, which gives no indication as to who prepared or paid for its printing and therefore may be in violation of Florida's election laws, implies that those counties where superintendents are appointed rather than elected have a history of instability in office.

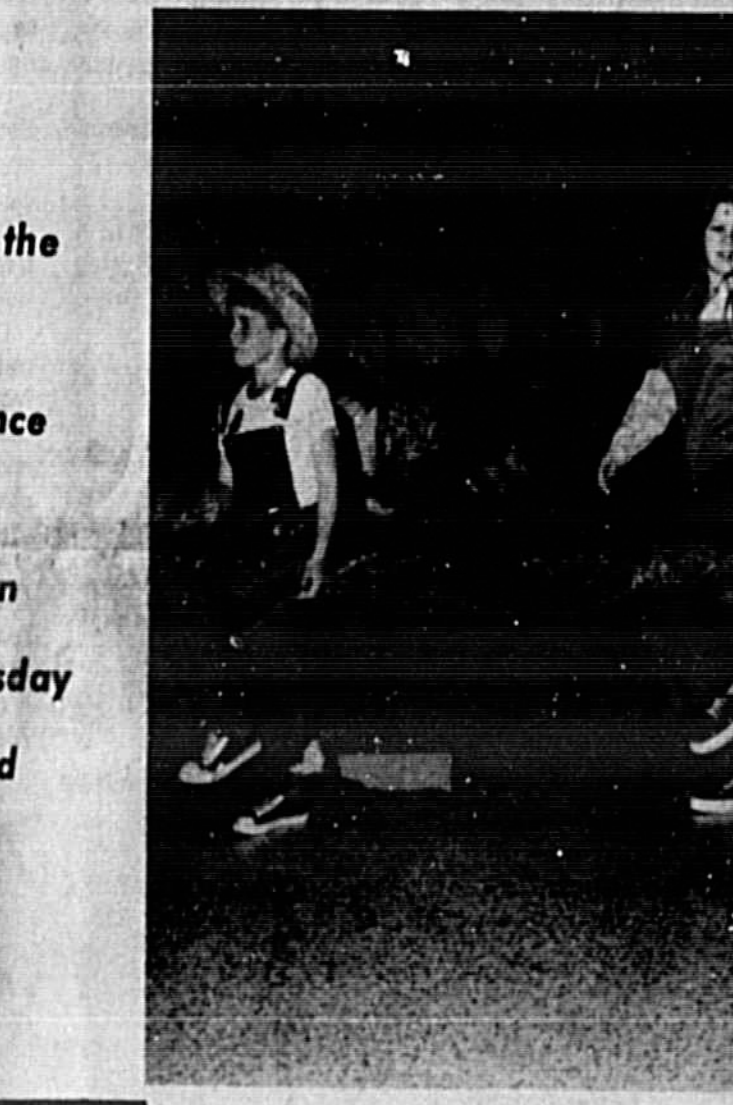
Casselberry Hikes Rates

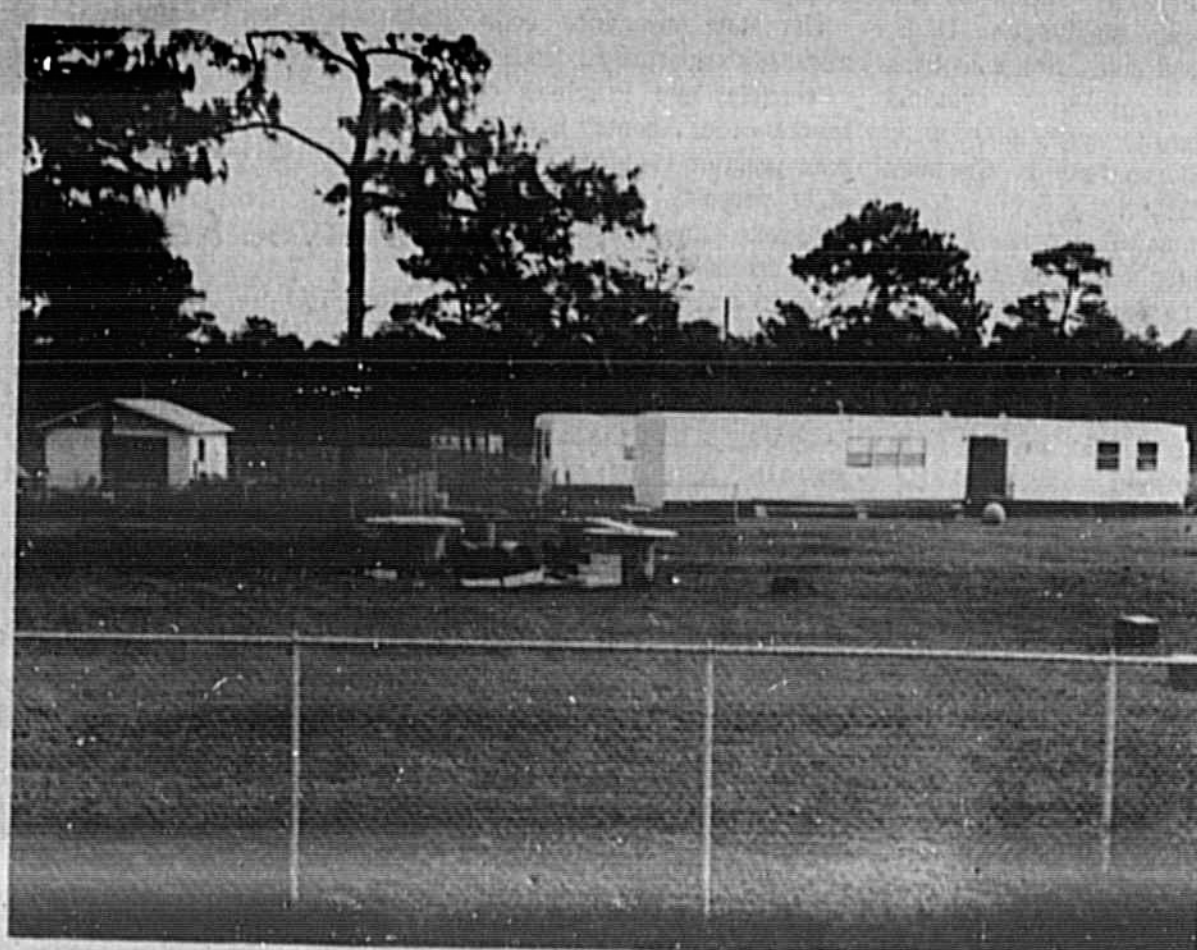
CURTIS CRIDER ATTEMPTS THIRD TITLE AT VOLUSIA

Rotary Tees Off For Charities

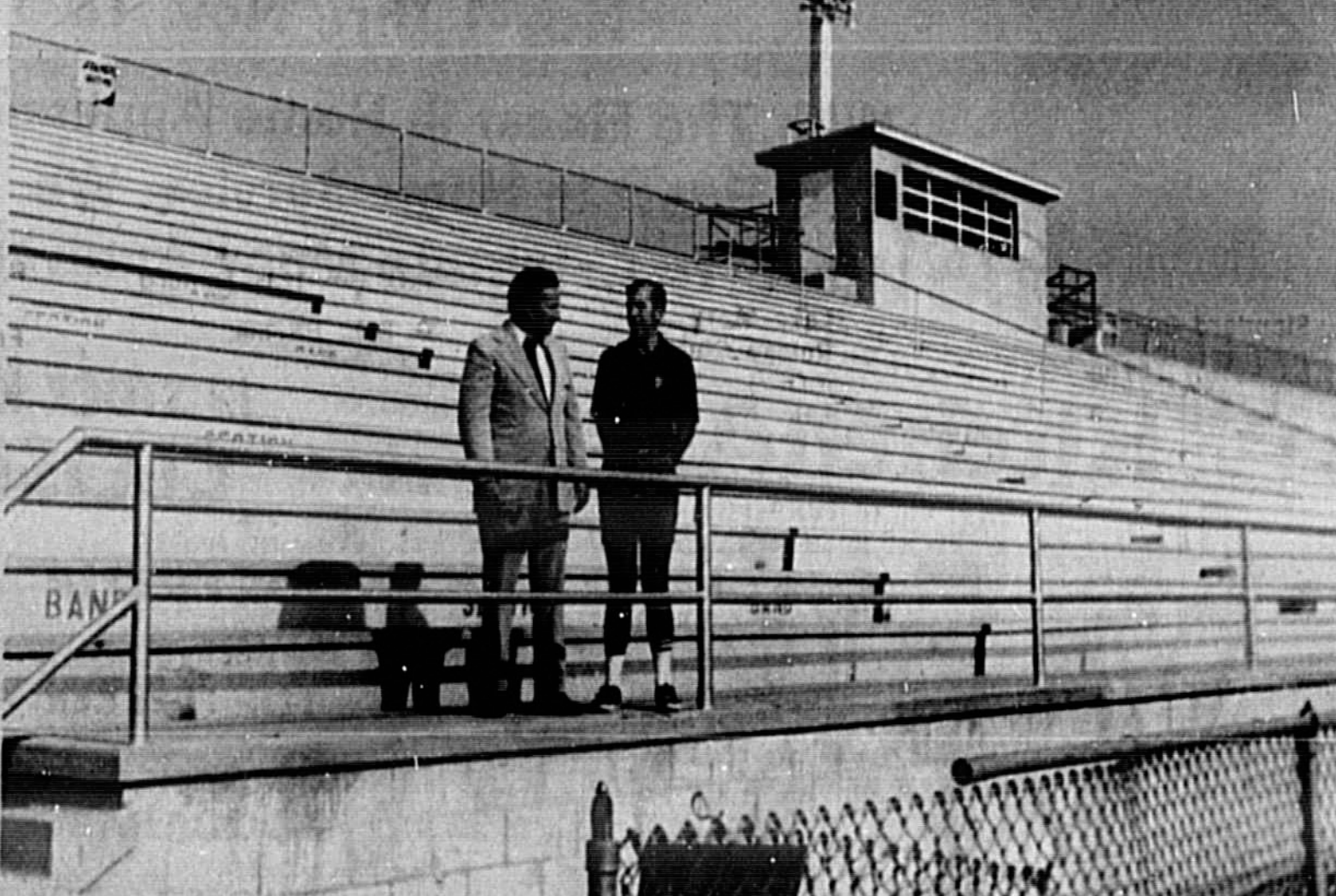

The real winners in this tournament will be Seminole County charities, as the estimated \$1,000 pot will be split equally among the Little Red School House, Seminole Junior College's Scholarship Fund and the Seminole High School Stadium Fund as the Sanford Rotary Club holds its first Charity Golf Tournament.

FSU Consistent, Losing

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — "We emphasize that the process is more important than the product," says Florida State University football Coach Farrell Mudra.

FSU's Seminoles have suffered 19 consecutive defeats, dating back to November 1972. But Mudra, who holds a Ph.D. degree in psychology, is not one to brood.

After trailing 7-6 at halftime, FSU miscues caused the Seminoles to fall behind 24-6 in the third quarter.

That game, a 35-6 thumping by 5th-ranked Auburn, tyfied the Seminoles losing skid inherited by Mudra.

The National Collegiate Athletic Association cleared Jones but gave FSU a mild reprimand for technical violations.

It is doubtful if many of the 28 players who quit during Jones' tenure would have helped this year. Most were upper classmen who would have been lost through graduation.

But Jones proved successful in recruiting. The Seminoles have many promising sophomores and freshmen on whose shoulders will fall the task of turning around the school's once highly successful football fortunes.

Hubbard Not Predicting

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Florida A&M Coach Rudy Hubbard says a flat fight in Zaire has taught him to be a little more cautious with his predictions.

Hubbard commented on the fight Wednesday when asked if he would make his usual victory prediction for the Rattlers' Homecoming game Saturday against Tuskegee.

"I'm not going to make predictions," he said. "I think we'll win because I think we're a good football team. But I thought George Foreman would beat Muhammad Ali."

This is a tougher ball game than I ever anticipated. This is probably our most important game up to now."

Hubbard said Tuskegee uses a triple option wishbone offense which is "very effective if you master it well, and they have. They don't make any mistakes."

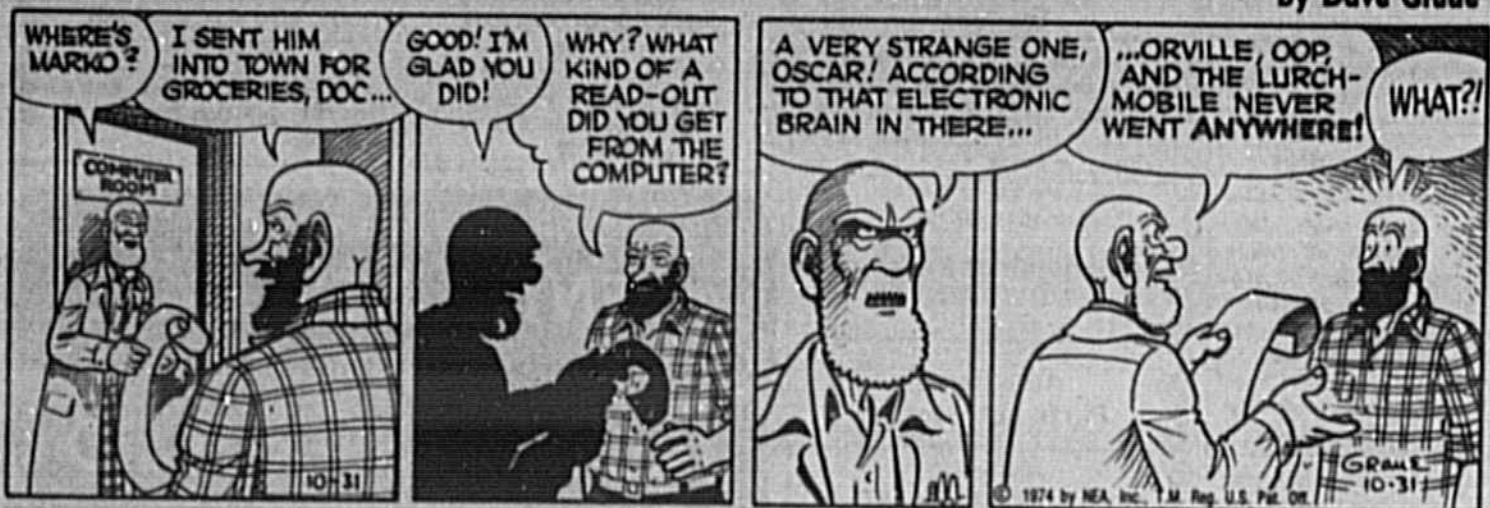

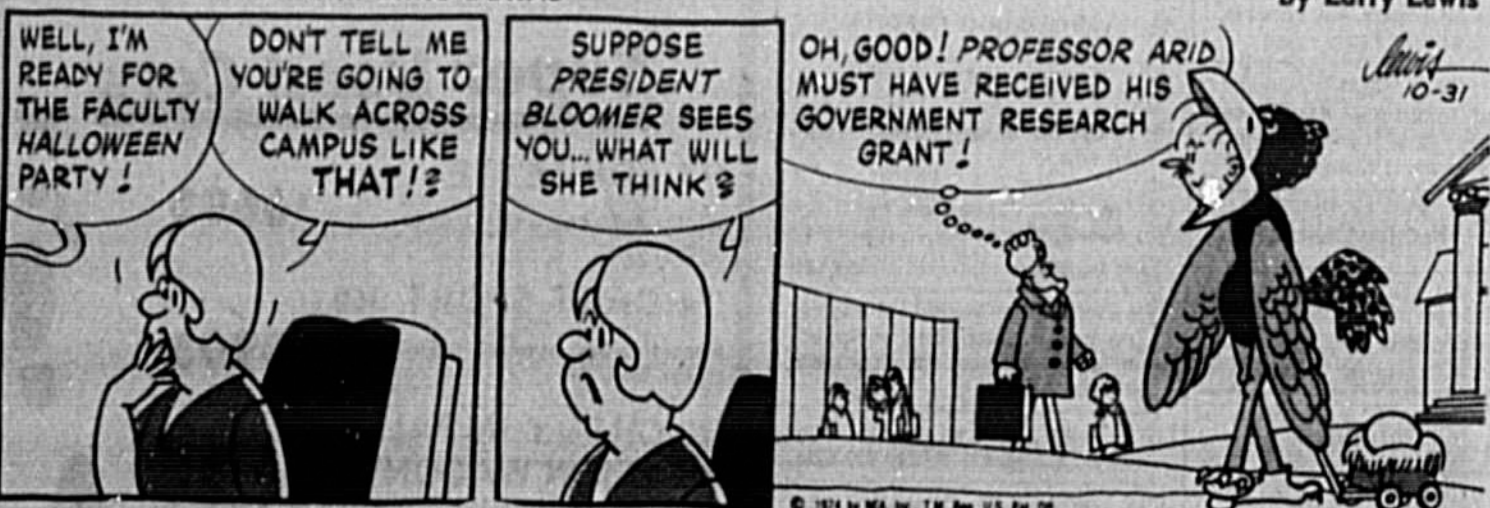

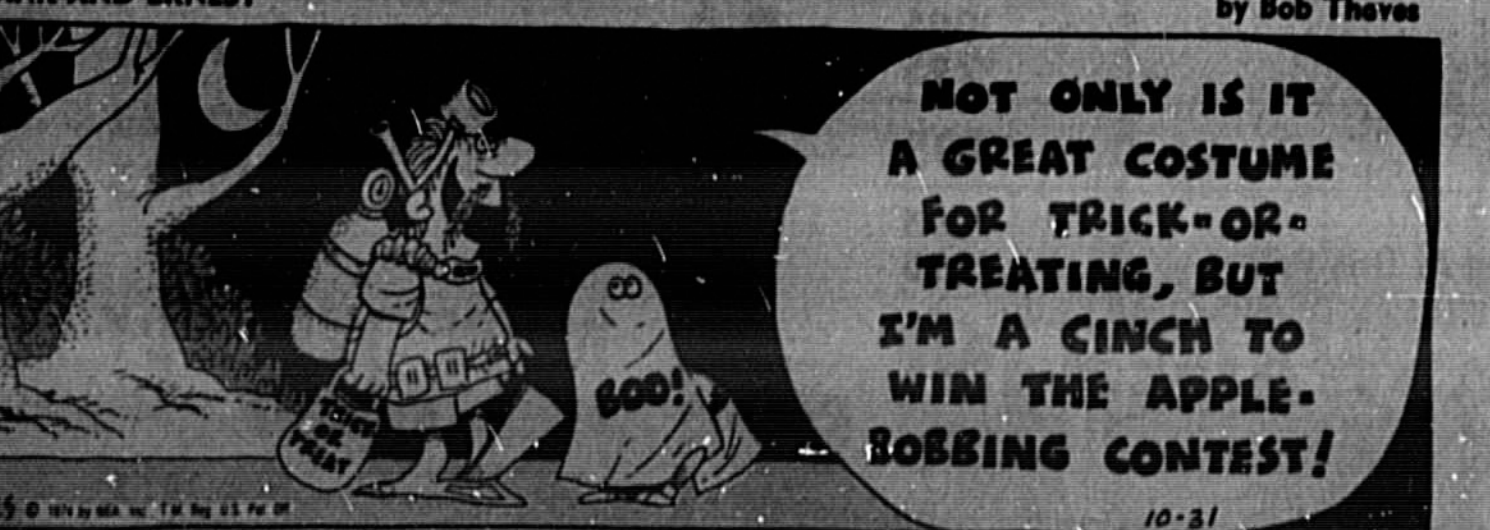

East won and led a second trump. When West followed, South breathed a sigh of relief. He held the trick in his own hand; ruffed a spade with dummy's last trump; led and ruffed a diamond from dummy; cashed his last trump and smiled happily at the world in general.

East had been forced to throw a spade on the third diamond. Obviously the last trump was going to squeeze him in spades and clubs. It did and the slam came home.

What were the other ways to make the slam? Clubs might break 3-3 or with slightly different distribution, West could have been squeezed in the major suits.

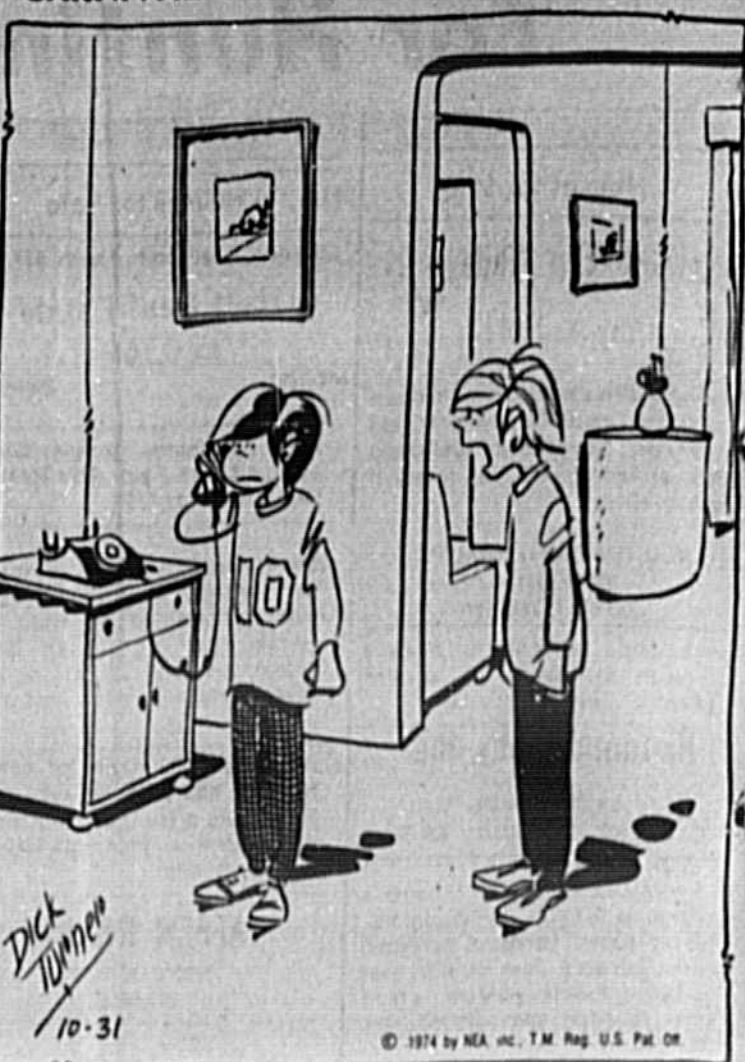

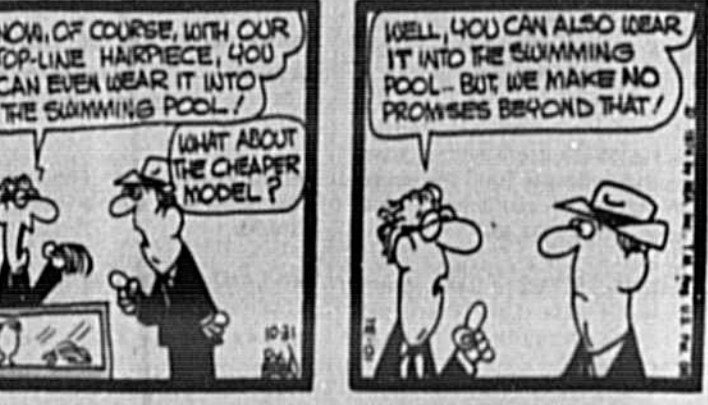

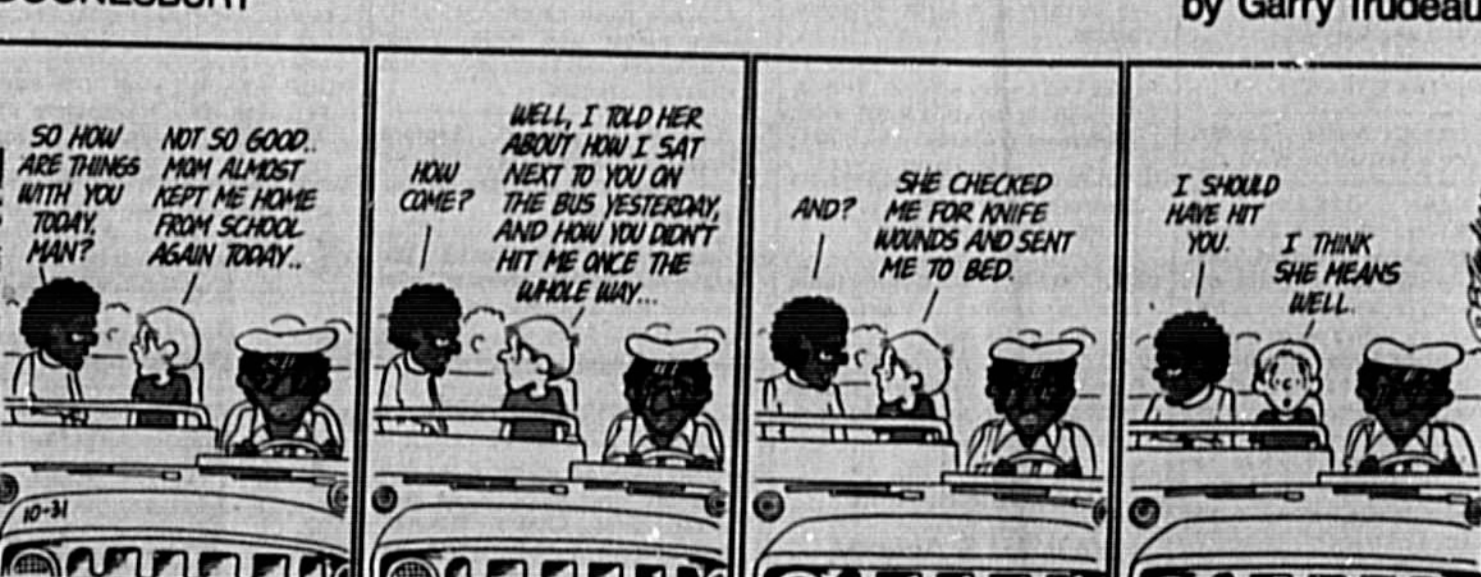
