completion of bankruptcy laws, a similar point had been ruled on recently by the United States Supreme Court and discussed at length by Justice Brandeis.
"In the light of such discussion," the opinion said, "I am not prepared to say that Congress did not have the power to include municipal corporations in an amendment to the Bankruptcy Act."
Hailing on the second day, Judge Akerman said that while it was true Congress had no power to interfere with the local management of a municipal corporation, he could see no reason why Congress could not amend bankruptcy laws to allow the filing of voluntary petitions by municipal corporations.
With regard to the third point, that such a plan would deprive the intervening parties of their property without due process of law, the judge said that the question should be decided when the plan is submitted for confirmation.


