### The Stamp Mart

**GRAF ZEPPELIN WILL BE POPULAR**  
Undoubtedly the new air mail stamps issued by several countries for use on the coming round the world tour of the Graf Zeppelin will be very popular. Philatelists have looked forward for some time to the issuing of higher value air mail stamps by the United States, and perhaps these special stamps will be a forerunner of some more complete issue to be announced later.

There is some room for criticism in the fact that these Graf Zeppelin stamps are unnecessary so far as a special mail service is concerned. They are unquestionably gotten out directly for the stamp collecting public and they and the government are the only beneficiaries thereby. Some collectors, are pleased, others are not so well pleased to pay nearly five dollars for a stamp for an unnecessary issue.

In spite of arguments on both sides of the question, the fact remains that the new stamps will be most interesting to collectors who show they have been on the Zeppelin trip. To get the stamps used in this fashion, it will be necessary for collectors to act quickly in placing their orders with the various agencies. For those who wish only to have uncancelled copies of these stamps for the purpose of their U. S. album, they may secure the stamps any time before June 1st from the Philatelic Agency in Washington.

#### USE A BLANK ALBUM

Many collectors will find good use for a blank half album for stamp collecting even though they may have the large illustrated books for the mounting of most of their stamps. Even the most up to date illustrated album does not provide for the multitude of new issues that are constantly appearing; and the new stamps do not show up as advantage when lined along the edges of the regular album pages. A fourth letter and more attractive arrangement can be secured and the stamps kept in better condition through the use of the blank page, loose leaf book.

For the younger as well as the more advanced collector, blank page books may even replace the illustrated album, if a catalog such as published by Scott or Yvert is used in connection with them. The large illustrated album has so many vacant spaces that will never be filled by the average collector that it is discouraging to work with. The blank book on the other hand may have the stamps arranged in the pages in any way desired, attractive designs and no empty, unfillable spaces. Covers, blocks, foreign revenues, and other illustrated stamps, postcards, may and all kinds may be placed satisfactorily on blank pages, but where would you find room for these in the average illustrated album.

#### HANDLE STAMPS CAREFULLY

It is important for collectors to realize that stamps should be handled carefully. Nothing could harm them more readily than the attention than a comparison of valuable stamps in perfect and in poor condition. While the United States stamps in expert condition, that well preserved, lightly cancelled, and if perforated, with all perforations undamaged; or if mounted with wide margins, will sell for twice as much as stamps that are cancelled, the same stamps if cancelled, slightly torn, or otherwise defective, may be bought for only twenty five percent of value.

#### BEFORE PLACING STAMPS IN ALBUM

Before placing stamps in an album, all paper adhering to them should be removed. 184 projects and 306 surveys, including \$29,500,000 for deepening the channels in the great lakes, \$180,000 for beginning the development of a 27-foot channel on the St. Lawrence River between Lake Ontario and Ogdensburg, New York, and \$7,500,000 for the completion of the Illinois waterway.

The administration plans to separate the projects and surveys into three categories. Those considered necessary and urgent, those held to be necessary but not urgent, and those expected to become urgent and necessary in time. These are to be the guiding points in selecting the projects for which expenditures will be made within the year.

In a tumultuous session, supporters of the measure successfully turned back effort after effort to make material changes in its provisions. Important among these was the attack of western members upon the Erie-Owego Canal section. It was kept in the bill by a vote of 118 to 59. The charges of deception and pork barrel legislation were raised by the westerners.

The debate arose from representative Lufkin, Republican, New York, in opposing a provision that the assistant chief of army engineers be permitted to retire as a major general. Brigadier General Herbert Drake holds this office at present and passes open all rivers and harbor recommendations.

Lufkin insisted that the provision had no place in the bill that the Rivers and Harbors Committee had exceeded its authority in incorporating it, and finally, he shouted:

"That's not legislation, that's bribery!"

## Another One Of Capone Family Is Found Guilty

which is the Cotton Club. The younger Capone, however, portrayed himself as an "independent race horse man" whose sole assets consisted of a half interest in two horses. He was "virtually penniless" when he made his compromise offer of \$1,000 to settle a \$12,500 tax bill.

Then the government put Capone "on the spot." They found that he had deposited nearly \$2,000,000 in seven banks from 1921 to 1929. They showed the jury he had \$25,000 on deposit when he made the compromise offer. They placed saloon keepers on the witness stand who swore they paid "Battler" \$25 a barrel for beer; they produced evidence purporting to show profits from vice and gambling resorts and from rackets.

It took the jury three hours and 20 minutes to decide for the government. Ralph's conviction made the record against the Capone family within little more than a week. In Miami, Fla., where "Scarface Al" has opened his Palm Island home, a still younger brother, Albert, was sentenced to six months

in jail on a technical agrancy charge. This is being appealed. Six hundred men and women, virtually all of them in evening attire, were in the night club when the prohibition administrator and his men, followed by a squad of uniformed police entered.

Nit, T. Grantlino, master of ceremonies, and known to radio fans as "N. T. G." was about 20 minutes the cover for which the club is noted. Guests were sitting at ease in a parlor, awaiting the performance and the unexpected arrival of the agents and police sent them into momentary confusion.

The prohibition administrator, however, mounting the stage from which Grantlino was about to make his announcement, burst the pattern to remain in place, and ordered them there would be no disorder. The men and women agents, who in a minute clothes had been scattered through the guests, quickly singled out those alleged to have been consuming liquor. As the men went about gathering up the black and

bottle, the accused guests were told they were under arrest. When the patrol wagon arrived it attracted a throng that blocked traffic and as the agents and police led out their prisoners they were greeted by catcalls and boos that could be heard for blocks over the din of Broadway. It was necessary for the wagon to make five trips to remove all the prisoners and the crowd became so great that Campbell had to call upon the police reserves to restore order and open traffic.

At the club and later at the police station the arrested patron loudly voiced protests against being forced to desert their women companions. Some also decried they had been consuming liquor and charged that bottles and flasks were kicked under their tables by others when the raiders appeared.
