County seeks land-use authority

SANFORD — Seminole County commissioners want voters to give them more authority on land use, but the City of Winter Springs does not see a need for it.

"For some reason, they don't want the eastern part of the county developed," said Winter Springs Mayor John Bush.

The county voted unanimously to ask voters to approve an amendment that would give commissioners the authority to approve land-use changes in the eastern part of the county.

Sanford, Oviedo, and Winter

Springs border the area in question. Bush, reached by cell phone out of town, said he didn't know why the county wanted to do this. The city had not received the proposed amendment yet.

That is because the county hasn't finalized the wording, according to county officials.

Since 1991, the county has had an urban service boundary, said Matthew West, manager of the county planning.

At that time, the state was concerned about the density in the eastern part of the county. The zoning was one home per acre. That was changed beyond this boundary and lowered to three or five or even 10-acre lots.

"We want to limit development in this area because it's environmentally sensitive," West said.

The eastern third of the county contains probably the richest environmental assets of the county, besides the Wekiva River area, he said.

The area is ecologically diverse, but there is also a lifestyle issue, he said. How much of the county should remain undeveloped, and how much should become urban.

If zoning there is not low density, what municipality will widen roads like state roads 46 and 426 or provide services? Those are questions that need to be discussed.

Winter Springs has annexed several

properties in the area, but has not assigned them an urban zoning designation, West said. The areas continue to have the county zoning status and land use designation.

If they assign city zoning designations to the areas, then the issues may have to be arbitrated, he said.

"Our attitude is to follow the state law," Busy said. If a development meets requirements, the city tries to accommodate them, he said. There are laws that govern development, even in environmentally sensitive areas, he added.

The mayor said Winter Springs did

Van Gaale answers charges

City manager will decide fate by 5 p.m. Friday

SANFORD — Deputy City Manager Andrew Van Gaale maintains he did not violate city policy by using a golf cart and contends he was improperly suspended without notice by the city manager.

Van Gaale filed his formal response Monday to City Manager Al Grieshaber's allegations that he misused public property for personal gain. Grieshaber contends Van Gaale improperly used a golf cart the city acquired for staff members working during the city's July 4 celebration. Van Gaale has been suspended with pay since July 6.

In his response, Van Gaale said he informed Grieshaber on Friday, July 2 that he would be on-call for code enforcement or other issues during the July 4 event. He also asserts that he told Grieshaber he would utilize

New zoo property would aid education

SANFORD — Seminole County agreed July 13 to match state funding to purchase a tract of land and expand the Central Florida Zoo.

The land cannot be developed or used for animal exhibits, according to Joe Montisano, chief executive officer of the zoo. It may be used for education about the history farming life in the area and possibly as a trail head for Seminole County trails.

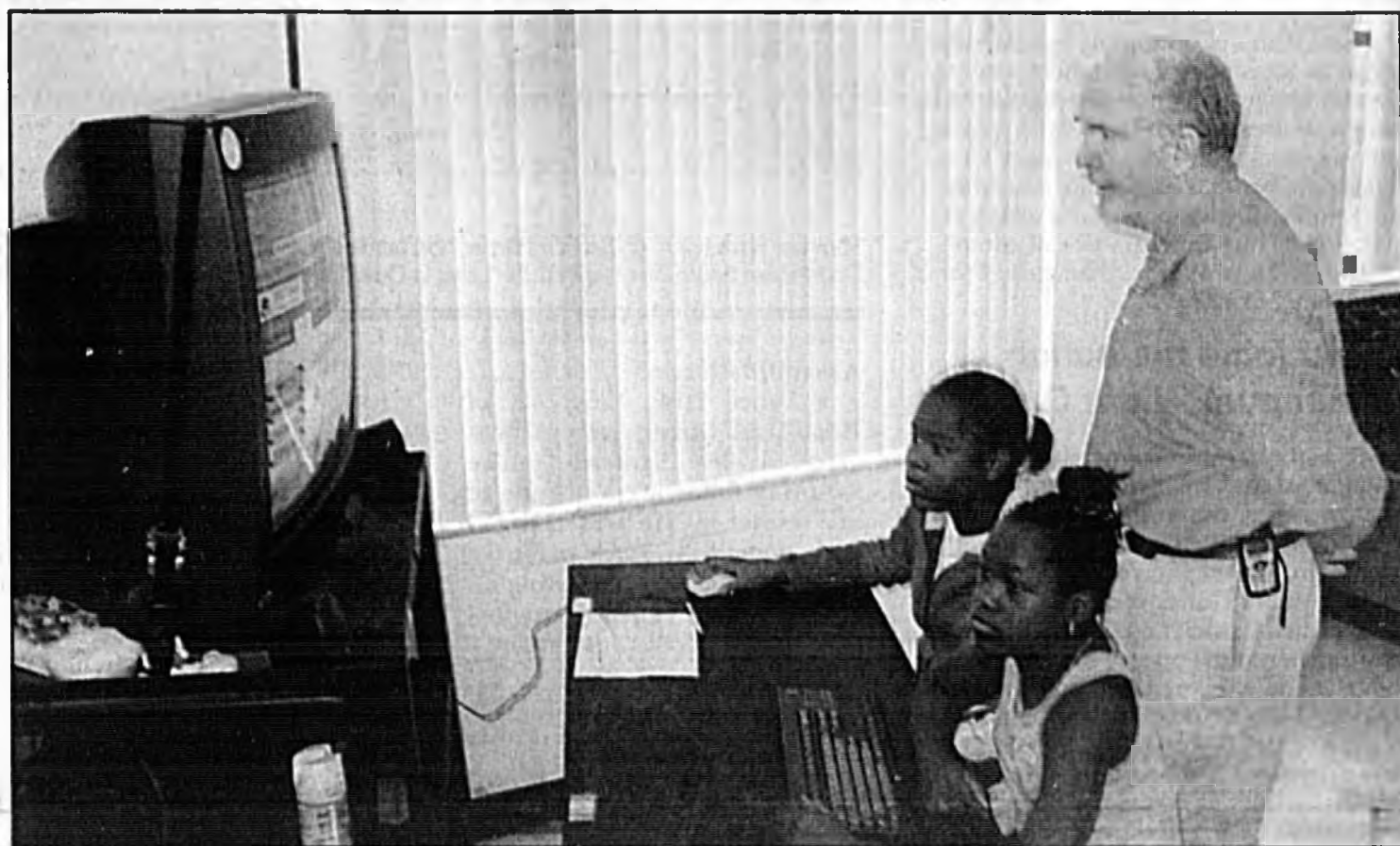
"We haven't actually acquired yet," Montisano said.

Seminole County received a 2003 Florida Communities Trust matching grant on behalf of the Central Florida Zoo to acquire the Woodland Park property west of the zoo.

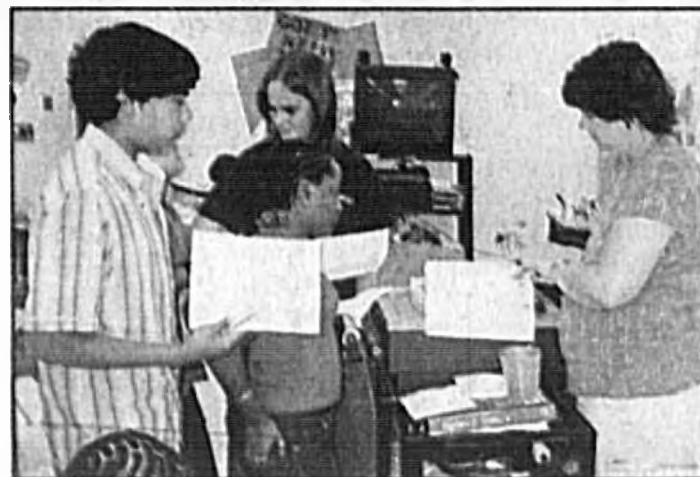
The grant provides up to \$385,000 and requires matching funds. The Board of County Commissioners voted to match the grant. The vote follows the recommendation of the county Natural Lands Program, whose

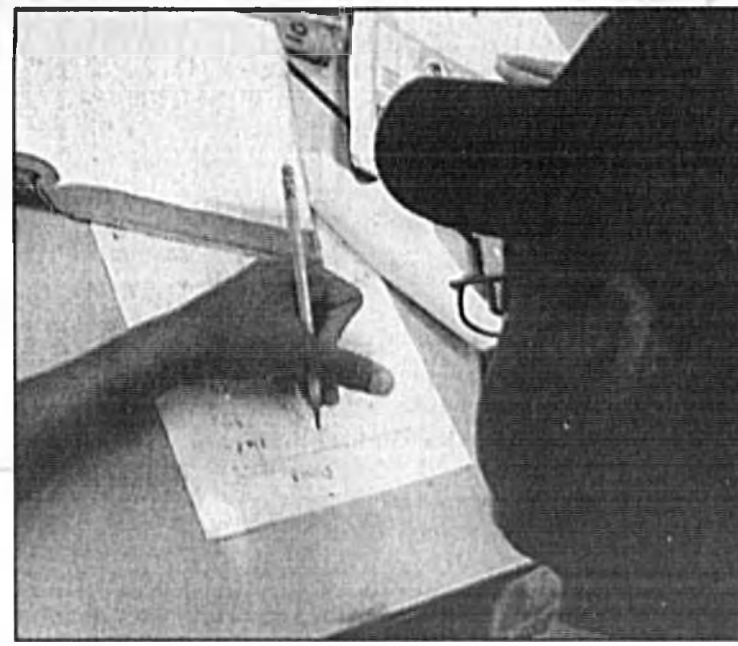
Math Happens

For the past two weeks 44 Sanford Middle School students have prepared themselves for the upcoming school year by attending

summer MATH camp. Twenty-one upcoming seventh-grade and 23 algebra students attended camp for four hours of instruction each day.

These students refreshed and improved their math skills so they will be successful in honors level math classes, which start up in less than two weeks. Students were taught lessons on fractions, order of operations, integers, and

equations. They also took pre- and post-tests that will provide data to be analyzed by Seminole High School statistics students next school year. The students worked in small groups to better learn the presented material and used graphing calculators and computers for a review of those topics.

This program is expected to help more students be successful in the honors/PreIB math class-

room at Sanford Middle School, and to help the students become better prepared for their high school math courses to follow. The MATH program is designed to not only raise the math achievement level of each student, but also build each student's confidence in his or her math abilities. Student tutors and a teacher resource will be available for the camp attendees during the school year.

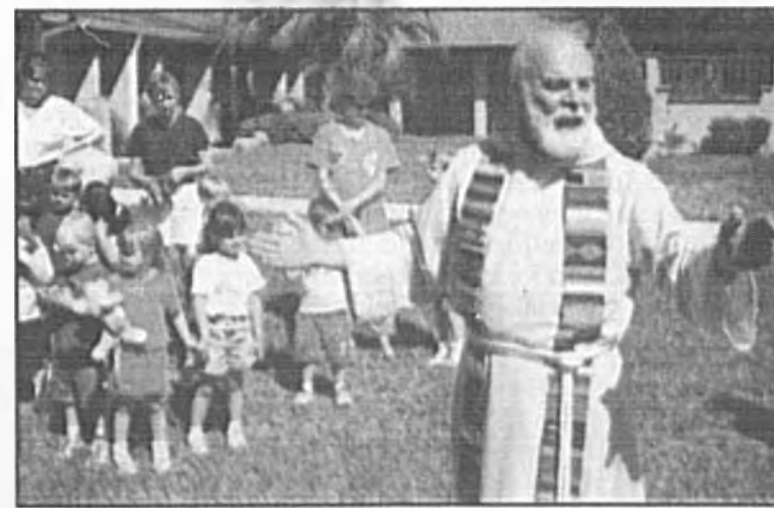

Mayor: We will polish diamond we call home

To the editor:

There has been quite a bit said and written over the past week related to a personnel matter here in City Hall. Most of you that read *The Sanford Herald* know the basic story so I won't bore you with a recount.

First, I would like to set the record straight on a quote attributed to me in *The Herald* last Wednesday. It was said that I told the city manager, "I'll get three votes to fire you." This is categorically untrue and can be confirmed by all five people who were present at the meeting. I'll shoulder the blame for not being crystal clear when asked about the general tone of the meeting.

The purpose of the meeting was to bring the parties together and try to resolve the situation. We failed to achieve that goal, but I'm perpetually convinced it was worth the effort. The City of Sanford was clicking on all cylinders prior to this incident and on behalf of the City Commission I did what I thought was prudent to maintain the momentum. Before, after, and since the meeting the city manager has reminded me that the City Charter precludes the City Commission and I from directing personnel matters and he is correct. Fortunately, we had a referendum last year that put the issue to rest. I apologized to the Colonel for meddling in his duties and have assured him that I will make no more comments, public or private, related to the matter unless it comes before the Commission. We will also not be hearing any public input on the matter at any

regular Commission meeting, as it would be inappropriate.

Abraham Lincoln once said, "It isn't difficult to make a mountain out of a molehill ... just add dirt." In an effort to fan the flames, the usual no-load critics of Sanford have contributed their 2 cents.

Finally, I would like everyone to know that Sanford is continuing to move forward. Our community has made tremendous progress and the future is very bright. I attend many meetings in the region on behalf of the city and can tell you, we are setting the standard as a great place to live. Evidence? Talk to any realtor who sells homes in Sanford.

The residents have a great commission in place that, I assure you, is doing its level best to insure that never changes.

Art Woodruff has just unveiled an exciting program called Youthbuild that combines the talent of the building community with troubled kids. Velma Williams battles every day to bring a better quality of life to every citizen with an emphasis on areas that were neglected for decades. one of the golf carts the city obtained for the event to travel from his house to the event site some eight blocks away, as well as to get around the event site.

A key issue among Grieshaber's allegations is whether Van Gaale performed city business on July 4. Two employees in the city's recreation department provided Grieshaber with memos saying they did not see Van Gaale performing code enforcement duties during the event.

"I have no specific examples of code enforcements activities," Van Gaale said. "I did an inspection of the site, and I had informed the supervisors that I was on call if issues came up during the event."

During his pre-event inspection, Van Gaale con-

tends he spoke with numerous city employees about the event, including police officer Claudia Webber. Webber was mentioned in a memo from recreation department supervisor Eveline Bennett as assisting with code enforcement issues involving unlicensed vendors.

Grieshaber would not comment on specific claims made in Van Gaale's response.

"It would be inappropriate for me to comment on the merits of his response," Grieshaber said.

The city manager must now decide the validity of Van Gaale's response. Grieshaber has proposed terminating Van Gaale and will make a decision by 5 p.m. Friday.

In addition to denying any wrong-doing, Van Gaale

insisted he was improperly suspended.

In his response to Grieshaber's allegations, Van Gaale's attorney, N. James Turner, argued that Grieshaber violated the preamble to the city of Sanford's Human Resource Manual, which states: "Any appointing authority may dismiss, suspend, or demote an employee for cause as stated in section 2.71; however, the reasons for such action shall be sent to the subordinate in writing by mail or hand delivery within 24 hours."

Van Gaale was sent home on Tuesday, July 6, and told his access to City Hall would be denied and that he was not to report to work until told. Two days later, Grieshaber directed a city staff member to inform Van

Gaale that he should resign by 5 p.m. July 8 or face an investigation. That deadline was extended twice, with Van Gaale refusing each time.

"I have not received any written or verbal explanation of what the investigation would be about, why I have been suspended and why I have been asked to resign," Van Gaale wrote in a July 9 e-mail to Grieshaber.

Grieshaber did provide Van Gaale with a written explanation on July 12, six days after the deputy city manager was suspended.

"I thought it was appropriate to suspend him with pay while I conducted the investigation," Grieshaber said, adding that he does not think he violated city policy by not providing written notice within 24 hours.



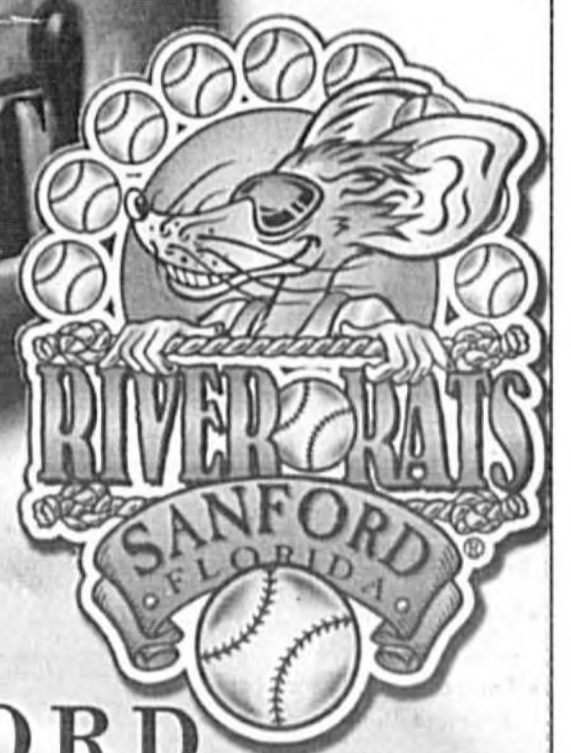

Touch-Screen voting audits sought


Based on reports and evidence suggesting touch-screen voting machines in Florida produced high voter error rates during recent elections, U.S. Sen. Bill Nelson, D-Fla., has called on the U.S. Justice Department and Florida Secretary of State to conduct independent audits of the electronic devices. The close scrutiny of the touch-screen voting however, will not involve Seminole County, as this county does not use that method of voting. In letters sent earlier this week to U.S. Attorney General John Ashcroft and Florida

Secretary of State Glenda Hood, Nelson argued the audits were warranted because results from March's presidential preference primary and recent elections in south Florida indicated counties using touch-screen devices had higher voter error rates than ones using older technology. Nelson cited, among other things, a report revealing counties with touch-screen voting devices had eight times as many voters who failed to cast ballots during March's presidential preference primary than ones using optical scanners. The *South Florida Sun-*

Sentinel's analysis of some 350,000 ballots state-wide found 2,193 voters failed to cast ballots using touch-screen devices versus 176 by those using the scanners. Touch-screen voting machines are used in 15 of Florida's 67 counties, including Broward, Collier, Indian River, Lee, Miami-Dade, Palm Beach, Pinellas, Sumter, Charlotte, Hillsborough, Lake, Martin, Nassau, Pasco and Sarasota counties. Nelson said these counties contain 53.6 percent of all African-Americans registered to vote in the state of Florida.

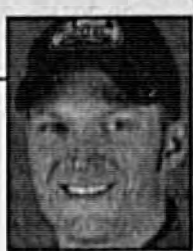

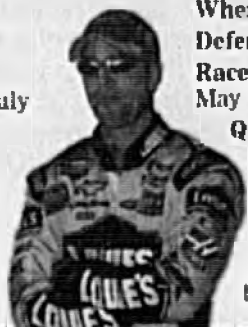

Silver FOX

The tracks are short and the cars old-fashioned, but legendary David Pearson, at 69, is still a hard charger

Spartanburg, S.C.

The 1937 Ford Modified race car with its red and white paint scheme and a big gold No. 6 on the door looks like a museum piece.

But instead of being on display it was on the starting grid earlier this month for a race for 1930s and '40s vintage cars at Riverside Speedway a dirt track in Travelers Rest, S.C.

Strapped behind the wheel was another icon from an earlier era — David Pearson, the Silver Fox of NASCAR racing, who won 106 races and three championships in NASCAR's top division before retiring in 1966.

Pearson, 69, is unpretentious as ever off the track, but when he's racing, the competitive fires burn white hot. A nine-race winning streak was on the line, and he had no intention of allowing it to end.

Pearson lined up fourth in the main event and charged into Turn 1 on the start. With his spinning tires slinging slivers of red clay toward the outside wall, he stormed into second place on the first lap. Two laps later he drove to the inside of pole-sitter Bobby Williams exiting Turn 4, and he had no intention of allowing it to end.

Lap after lap he kept his right foot to the floor, diving hard into the corners and swinging wide out next to the wall on the straightaways. If not for a couple of late-race cautions, he'd likely have lapped the field.

It was just a 15-lap feature on a relatively obscure dirt track, but from the big smile on Pearson's face afterward, it might as well have been the Daytona 500.

"A win's a win," he said. "I like to win whether I'm racing in a cow pasture or on a super-speedway track. I like to win even if I'm just playing checkers."

But it's not a take-no-prisoners approach. Before the race he gave fellow drivers, including Terry Cox, a few chassis set-up tips.

"We're all out here trying to

win," said Cox, 43. "But David will give you all the advice he can so you can get up there and run with him."

Cox realizes he's experiencing a brush with racing history. "It's a great honor, a dream come true, to run with a champion like David Pearson," he said.

Pearson's latest racing venture began a couple of years ago when he agreed to run a vintage race and found himself up against a foe with a faster car.

For Pearson, who many consider the best in NASCAR history, the outcome was unacceptable. "I was not going to get outrun like that again, so I decided to build my own car," he said.

With the aid of lifelong friends such as Gerald Pruitt, who helped Pearson build his first race car in 1963 and has worked with him ever since, and Willis Smith, who first got to know Pearson when they crashed in a race in the early 1960s, he started with some rusty old parts and set out to build a winner.

The car's rust holes are hard to hide. In fact, it shows its age more than Pearson, who, with a bit of thinning hair, looks fit and tanned as ever.

Using the body-shop skills he developed long before he drove a

stock car, Pearson took the rust-pitted sheet metal and made it shine like new. A powerful flat-head engine and the latest in shocks and springs make the red-and-white No. 6 — it's the number he used when he won his first Winston Cup title — a formidable Ford.

Several of his competitors have made improvements to their cars, too. Some, like Williams, have sent word to Pearson that his winning ways might soon come to an end.

His response: "They'll have to catch me first."

Pearson's son Ricky, who works as a Busch Series crew chief and also helps out with his dad's racing efforts, said vintage racing has been good for his father.

"It's kept him young, for sure," Ricky said.

Ricky Pearson said the Silver Fox takes the sport as seriously as he did in his Cup years, when — in addition to his three championships — he started on the pole in one of every five races he entered, won 42 superspeedway races from 1972-78 and amassed an 18.29 winning percentage.

"When he gets in that car, the expression on his face brings back lots of memories for me," Ricky said. "He's still the most competitive person I've ever dealt with."

To hear Pearson talk and watch him prepare his car, it's hard to believe he's changed much in the 18 years since he was a regular Cup competitor.

"I don't worry about age," he said. "It's just a number. I'm just as good now as I was 30 years ago — except for my back."

Back problems plagued Pearson throughout his career and eventually led to his retirement.

"I could run one of those cars today," he said. "I just don't know for how long."

He might be able to handle the driving chores. But NASCAR's changes — the shift away from traditional tracks such as Darlington, dominant multi-car teams, a playoff-type system for determining the champion and lucky-dog rules — probably would be too much for him.

"I don't like any of the new rules, none of it," he said. "They ought to go back to the way it was."

Home Depot throws support behind Stewart

If Tony Stewart's sponsor Home Depot is at all upset about the controversy surrounding its driver in recent weeks, it's not apparent in the company's actions and statements.

The Atlanta-based worldwide chain of home improvement stores ran full-page newspaper ads last week celebrating Stewart's win in the Tropicana 400 at Chicagoland Speedway, and a statement from the company seems to indicate Stewart's post-race run-in at Sonoma, Calif., with Brian Vickers isn't a big concern.

NASCAR fined Stewart \$50,000, docked him 25 Nextel Cup points and put him on probation for grabbing Vickers, but he's received no penalties for several on-track incidents other drivers have blamed him for this season.

Home Depot spokesman Eric Oberman issued only a brief statement in response to the recent events.

"The Home Depot supports Joe Gibbs Racing and NASCAR in their response to recent incidents involving Tony Stewart," the statement read.

New faces in Busch Series

New faces will be showing up in the Busch Series in the coming weeks. Reed Sorenson, who is a part of the driver development program at Chip Ganassi Racing, is expected to make his Busch debut in the Kroger 200 at Indianapolis Raceway Park on Aug. 7.

Joining him will be Blake Feese, who already has one Busch start — at Kentucky last month — and plans to run Dover in September.

Boston Reid will make his Busch debut at Richmond on Sept. 10, then enter races at Lowe's Motor Speedway and Atlanta Motor Speedway.

Sorenson, a full-time racer on the American Speed Association circuit, also plans to enter Busch races at Atlanta, Darlington and Homestead.

Feese and Reid are part of the driver development program at Hendrick Motorsports and will drive cars prepared by Joe Nemechek's Busch team, which is working with Hendrick to field entries for young drivers.

Burton crew shuffle

Veteran crew chief Bill Ingle has essentially swapped jobs with Tony Furr on the No. 0 Nextel Cup car driven by Ward Burton.

Furr, who had been crew chief, is now shop foreman. Ingle, who had been overseeing the preparation of both Burton's car and the No. 00 Busch Series ride of Jason Leffler, is now crew chief.

First year proves interesting for France

Within a few years, NASCAR could hold the Chase for the Championship in major markets with redesigned cars and featuring several minority drivers racing in such places as Mexico City and Canada.

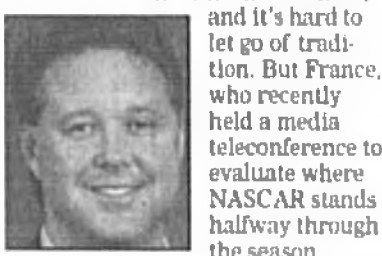
At this time last year, none of those things were even close to being a reality. But with the arrival of new NASCAR Chairman Brian France, each of those ideas are already in place.

Since the conclusion of the season last year, France has helped:

- Implement the new points system, the 10-race Chase for the Championship.
- Settle a major antitrust lawsuit concerning ownership of tracks and accordingly altered the schedule to run more races in bigger markets and less in rural areas like Rockingham, N.C., and Darlington, S.C.
- Introduce programs called "Drive

for Diversity," which encourages minority drivers, and "NASCAR Canada," which will help spread the sport north of the border.

It's easy to resist change. It's comfortable to stick with what we have, and it's hard to let go of tradition. But France, who recently held a media teleconference to evaluate where NASCAR stands halfway through the season, seems to have all the right ideas.

He touted the effectiveness of the Chase and addressed concerns over NASCAR's rules. But most of all, he emphasized that more changes are on the way.

Among those are the so-called "Car of Tomorrow," which France said will be implemented within the next couple of years. NASCAR officials hope the car will be safer and provide more competitive racing.

France hasn't been on the job for a year yet, but he clearly understands what it's like to be in a leadership position.

"The expectations from the drivers, the owners, the fans and everybody in the industry is that NASCAR is going to conduct the events in a mistake-free environment," he said. "Now, we all know that's not humanly possible, but it's all about simplifying it, it's all about improving our accuracy and speed."

NASCAR still has plenty of work to do, from balancing the schedule between tradition and growth, to finding a scoring system that works quickly and efficiently. The sport isn't perfect, but it's great that France recognizes that.

"We always seem to have three or four things that we are looking at for next year," he said.

An open mind and a willingness to change ensure that NASCAR's second half of the season will be as good as the first.

An old irrigation system for the former farm exists on the current zoo property, Montisano said. He said it could be an opportunity to educate people about farming the way it was not so very long ago.

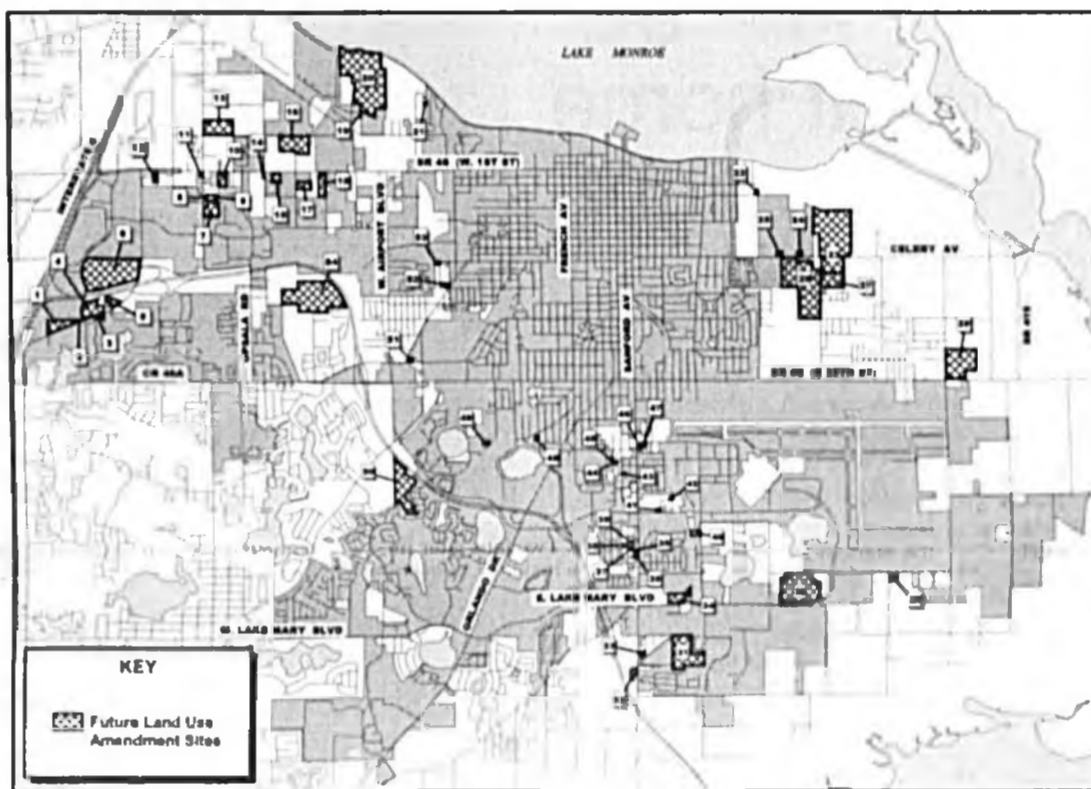

The Seminole Community College men's basketball team is having a good summer, recently signing 6-foot-7 power forward Jerome Boyd from Edgewater High School in Orlando.

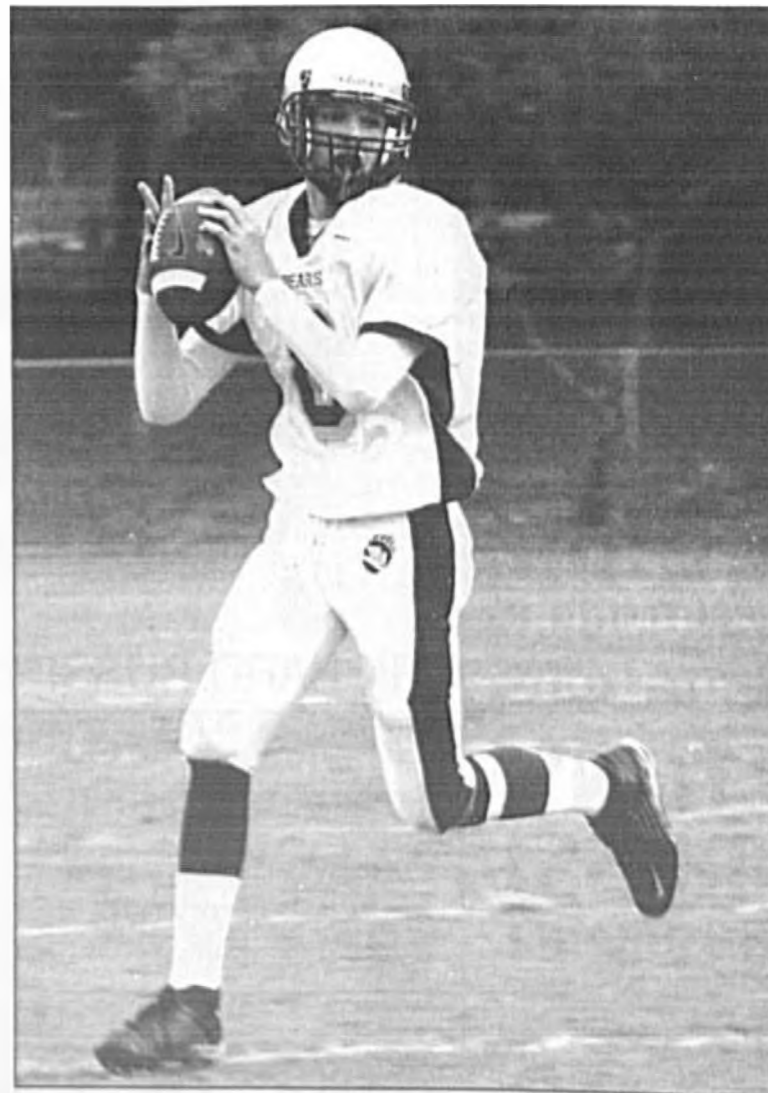
During his senior year Boyd earned Class 6A All-State Honorable Mention Honors while helping lead his team to the 6A Finals.

Orlando-Sanford sets monthly record

Total passenger traffic at Orlando Sanford International Airport for June 2004 was 194,981, up 60 percent compared to June of 2003.

It represents a new all-time record for any one month at the airport, breaking the previous record of 181,790 in August 2003.

The traffic mix for June 2004 included a record month of domestic travelers with 86,191, up 105 percent and 108,790 international, up 36 percent.

Specifically, there were 91,968 United Kingdom passengers, up 15 percent from June 2003.

Cargo volume was up 38 percent and aircraft operations were up 3 percent.

The year-to-date figure of 813,113 shows an increase of 95 percent in total passenger traffic. Larry Dale, President of the Sanford Airport Authority commented: "The traffic increases we are seeing so far this year are strong evidence that the types of airline services this Airport offers are certainly meeting the demands of our customers."

"With July and August traditionally being the busiest months of the year, we expect to see even more growth during the rest of the summer."

on \$3,900 bail.

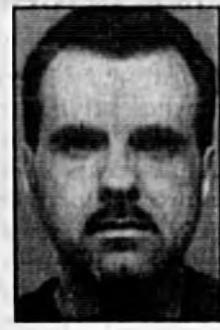
David Sundstrom, a board member at the school on Rantoul Lane in Lake Mary, said that figure could increase as investigations continue.

"We were in a total state of shock," Sundstrom said. "He used that trust to do what he did."

Van Gaale fired City manager: Dismissal is for 'course of conduct'

SANFORD — City Manager Al Grieshaber fired his second in command for "a course of conduct" involving the use of a golf cart during the July 4 celebration.

Grieshaber informed Deputy City Manager Andrew Van Gaale Friday afternoon that was effect beginning 5 p.m. Friday, July 23. Grieshaber stressed in an interview after his meeting with Van Gaale that the dismissal was not the result of simply using a golf cart donated to the city for personal use.

"It was not a single incident but rather a course of conduct," Grieshaber said. "It started prior to July 4."

Grieshaber conducted a two-week investigation into the matter and presented Van

Gaale on Friday with a 17-page "Notice of Decision on Contemplated Removal." In the document, Grieshaber outlined 15 separate areas where he said Van Gaale violated Florida statutes or city policies, from solicitation of gifts and misuse of public position to using city property for personal gain. Grieshaber also maintains that Van Gaale did not perform any code enforcement duties. In responding to Grieshaber's original charges, Van Gaale said he obtained a golf cart to conduct code enforcement during the celebration on July 4.

As part of the preparations for the celebration, the city obtained golf carts for staff members to use during the event. Mayfair Country Club donated eight carts for city

Horse vanishes near Lake Jesup

SANFORD — A high-strung thoroughbred gelding threw his rider July 15 near Lake Jesup and owners, boarders, and the Seminole County Sheriff's Office have not located him.

Four horses and their riders walked along a trail in the Lake Jesup Wilderness Park Area. The riders missed a turn and got stuck in a wooded area with palmettos.

When they tried to turn, the thoroughbred named Madeo became separated. He spooked and tossed his rider, according to the horse's boarder Anne Britton of Crooked Creek Farm. The rider, a young woman, was not hurt.

"He took off in the opposite

direction which is not the normal behavior," she said. "He totally lost it."

The Sheriff's Office's Range and Water Division used four-wheel ATVs and a helicopter from July 15 through 17, but could not find the horse, Britton said. Friends and others have helped in the search, but to no avail.

Two stirrups from the English saddle were recovered close by, Britton said.

On regular patrols, the Sheriff's Office helicopter flew over the area, but it is heavily wooded with thick foliage making it difficult to see anything, said Brent Davison, sergeant in charge of special operations.

"This is just an assist to the public," he said. "There is

District spends millions on schools, learning center

SANFORD — The Seminole County School Board voted July 20 to raise \$37.5 million to pay for a new elementary school in Lake Mary and to replace Tuskawilla Middle School in Oviedo.

Of that amount, \$24 million will go toward the middle school and \$11 million for the new elementary school. The rest would cover closing and other costs.

In settling a dispute between the school district and the City of Lake Mary, and in conjunction with developer D.R. Horton Homes, a school site was carved out on Rinehart Road.

The new school will be located behind the public safety complex, said Dianne Kramer, deputy superintendent of schools. She also estimated the school would probably open in August 2007.

The school district sued the City of Lake Mary earlier

this year when the city tried to ban school sites from a high-tech zoning area. Once the dispute was settled out of court, the new school site was formed.

"We have looked for a place in that area," Kramer said. She added that there will not be a need to rezone the entire district since that process just ended for elementary schools.

Some localized rezoning will take place as the city gets

District proposes budget, sets hearing

SANFORD — The Seminole County School District budget for the 2004-2005 year will be \$373 million, an increase of about \$24 million over last year, according to the superintendent.

The first of two public hearings on the budget is set for Tuesday, July 27 at 5:05 p.m. at the Educational Support Center on Lake Mary Boulevard. The second public hearing is at 5:05 p.m. Sept. 7.

For a homeowner with a house valued at \$100,000 with a homestead exemption of \$25,000, taxes levied for the Seminole County School District will be \$638, according to a district report.

That figure is nearly \$17 less than last year, when the same homeowner with a house valued at \$100,000 with the homestead exemption paid \$655.

Unlike a city or the county, the school district does not
