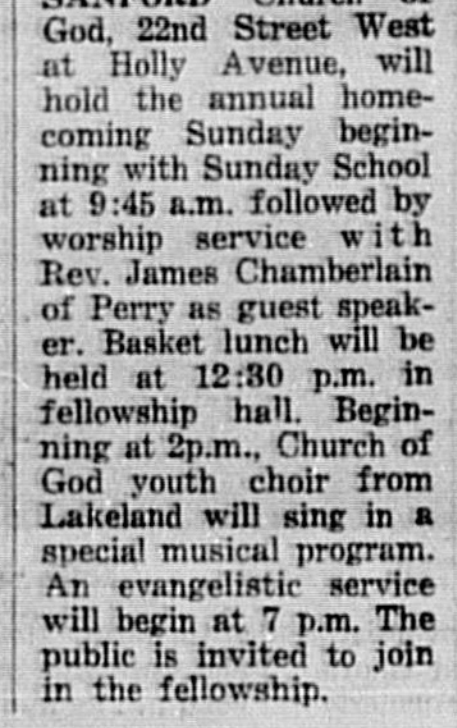

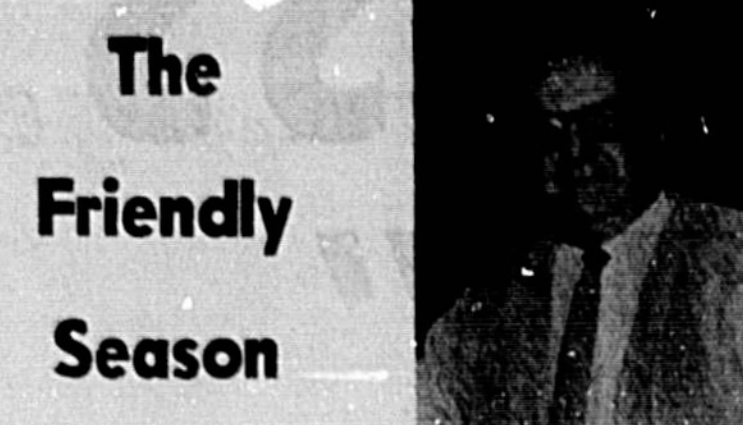
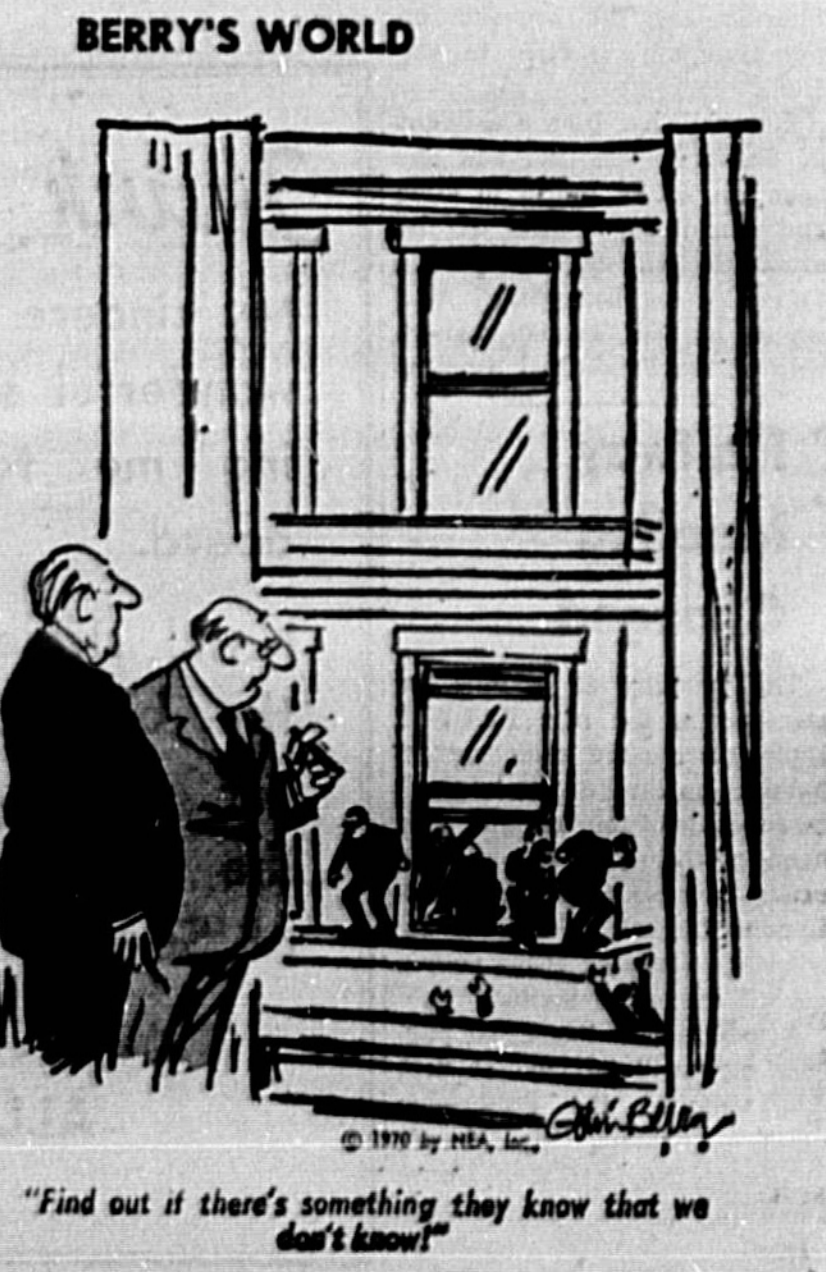

The shooting is over and the war has been lost. The victors are off on secluded vacations, and the losers are licking their wounds.

The split in the Republican Party will be a white-baiting. Although with Claude Kirk soon out of the picture completely, Bill Cramer may not get the climb back by preparing these next four years to run against Ed Gurney for the GOP bid for Gurney's U.S. Senate seat.

Could be thought that Gurney, now "Mr. Republican" in Florida, may head off that possibility by persuading Governor Kirk to appoint Cramer to the Florida Supreme Court vacancy caused by the death of Justice Campbell Thorpe.

Two names have cropped up for the Supreme Court seat: Wade Hopping and Gerald Mager, both former Kirk aides. Kirk named Hopping to the court Aug. 1, 1968, to replace Alto Adams, who retired. He ran for the office a month later and was defeated by Democrat Vassar Coffin, who sat on the Circuit Court bench here in Sanford.

There's another deal cooking, too. It's far fetched but it could happen. It happened before, elsewhere. The story is that Gurney will resign his Senate seat and Kirk will name Claude Kirk to the Florida Supreme Court bench. Then Kirk will resign as governor, moving Ray Osborne up from lieutenant governor for the last two months of Kirk's term.

It is interesting to note that while the Republicans failed to carry the state, they did practically sweep Seminole County, despite a division in local GOP ranks.

That many Republicans are registered as Democrats is shown in the fact that Bill Cramer, on top of the ballot, tallied 2,700 more votes than there are registered Republicans in Seminole County.

One of the major upsets — if not the major upset — in this election was the defeat of Sandy Bassett. His loss can only be attributed to his support of the pay raise from \$1,200 to \$12,000 for legislators.

Sanford Herald newspaper had some fun for themselves in this election. On Monday they marked sample ballots and mailed them to themselves. On Wednesday they opened the envelope. They averaged 64 per cent in their guesses as to winners and losers.

Senate president Terry Thomas has formally called a one-day special session of the Senate for Nov. 10 to consider the suspensions of six officials by Governor Kirk.

Seminole County Republicans now have an excellent opportunity to heal their rifts and ready a united front for the 1972 campaign.

But getting back to Seminole Republicans, Salt will now resign from his newly elected post of Republican state committee chairman for Seminole. The county executive committee will name his successor.

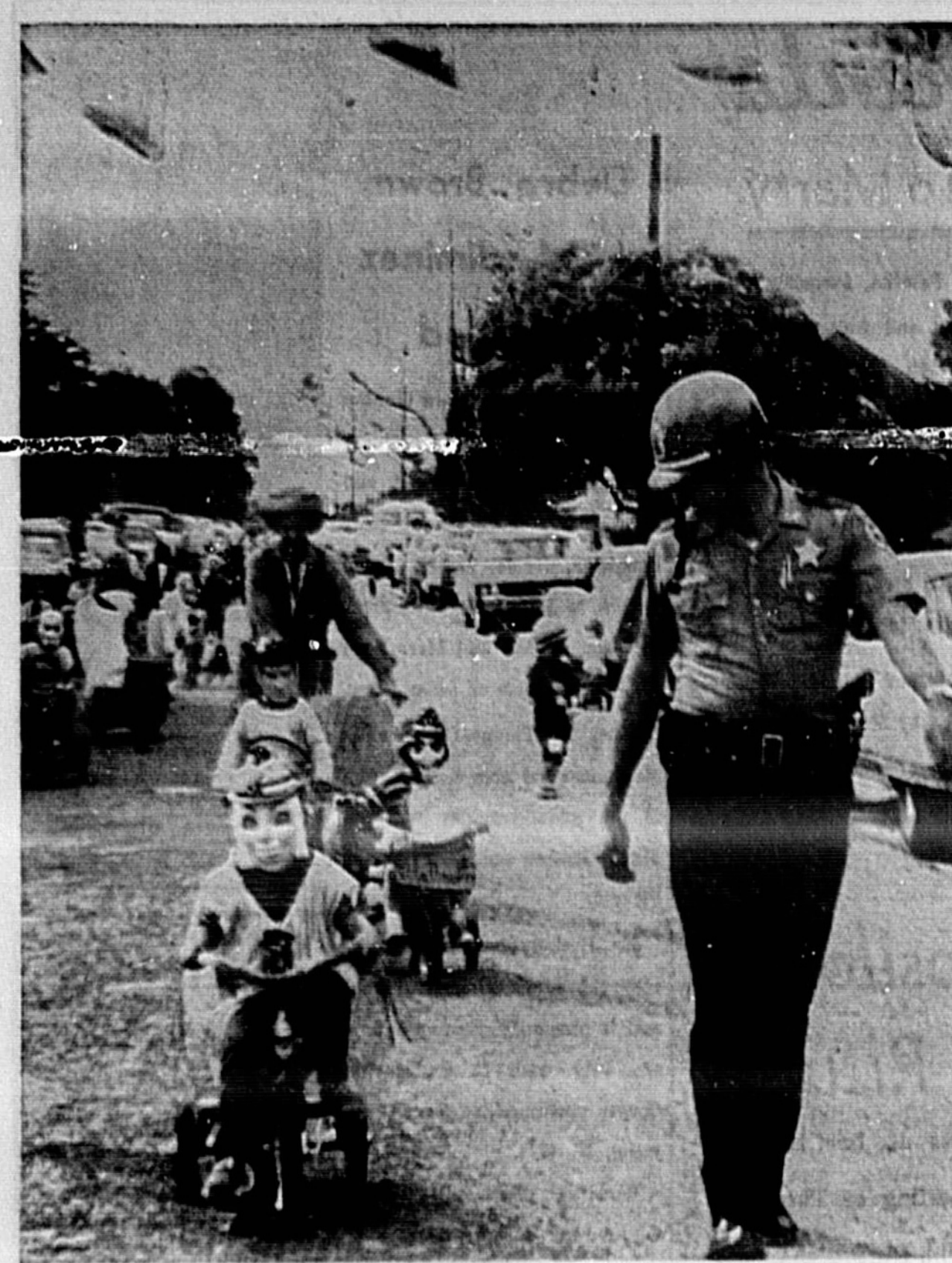

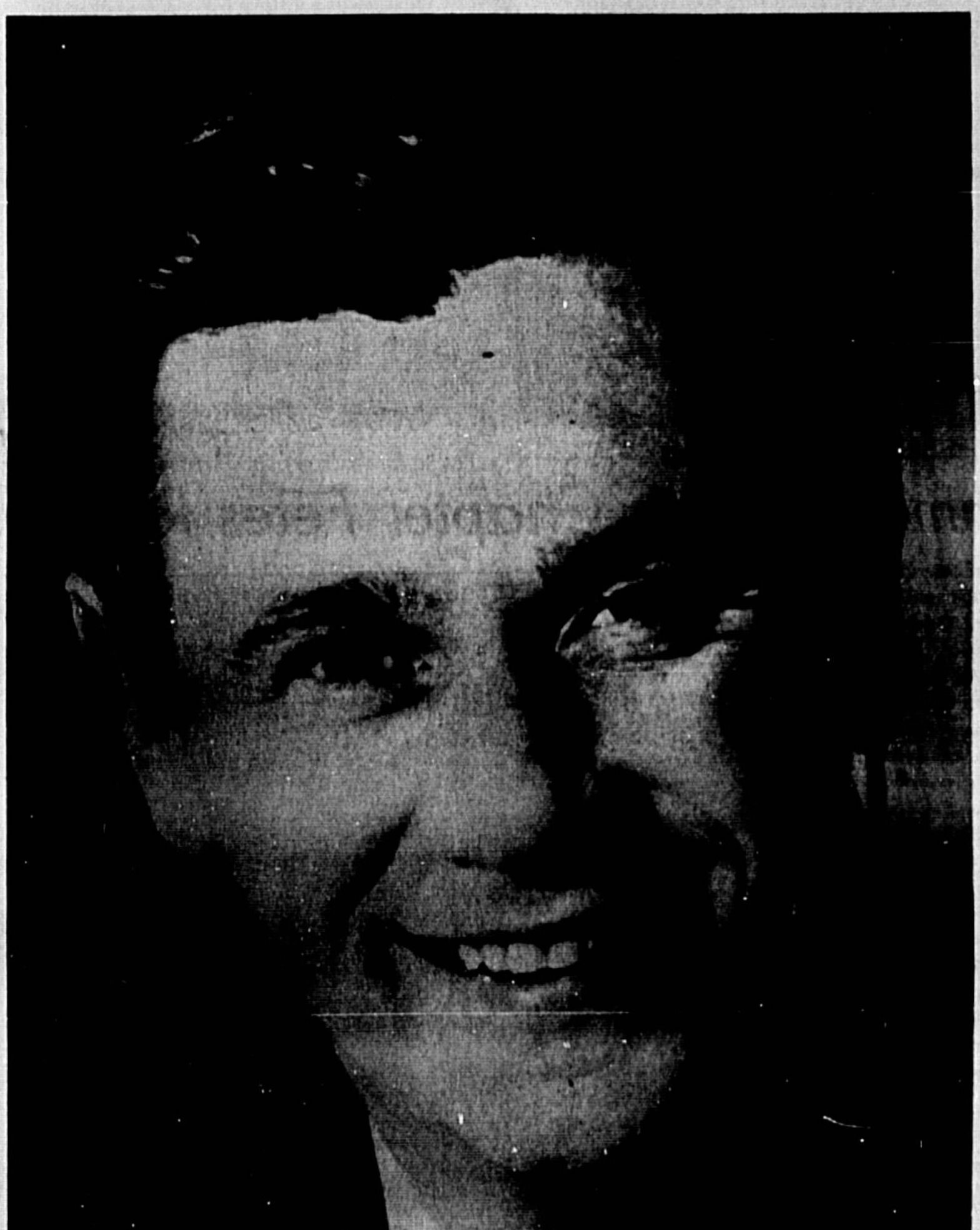

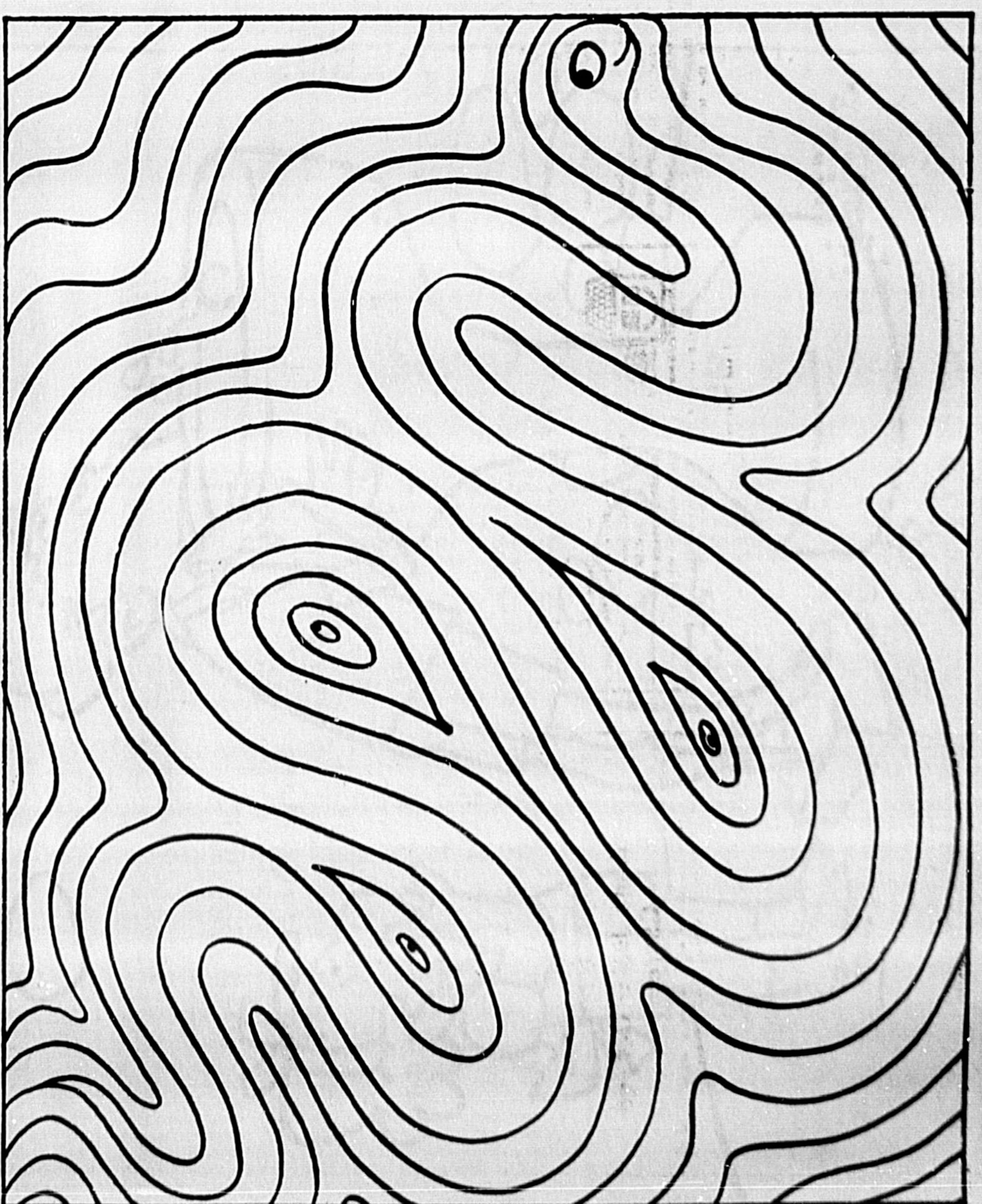
