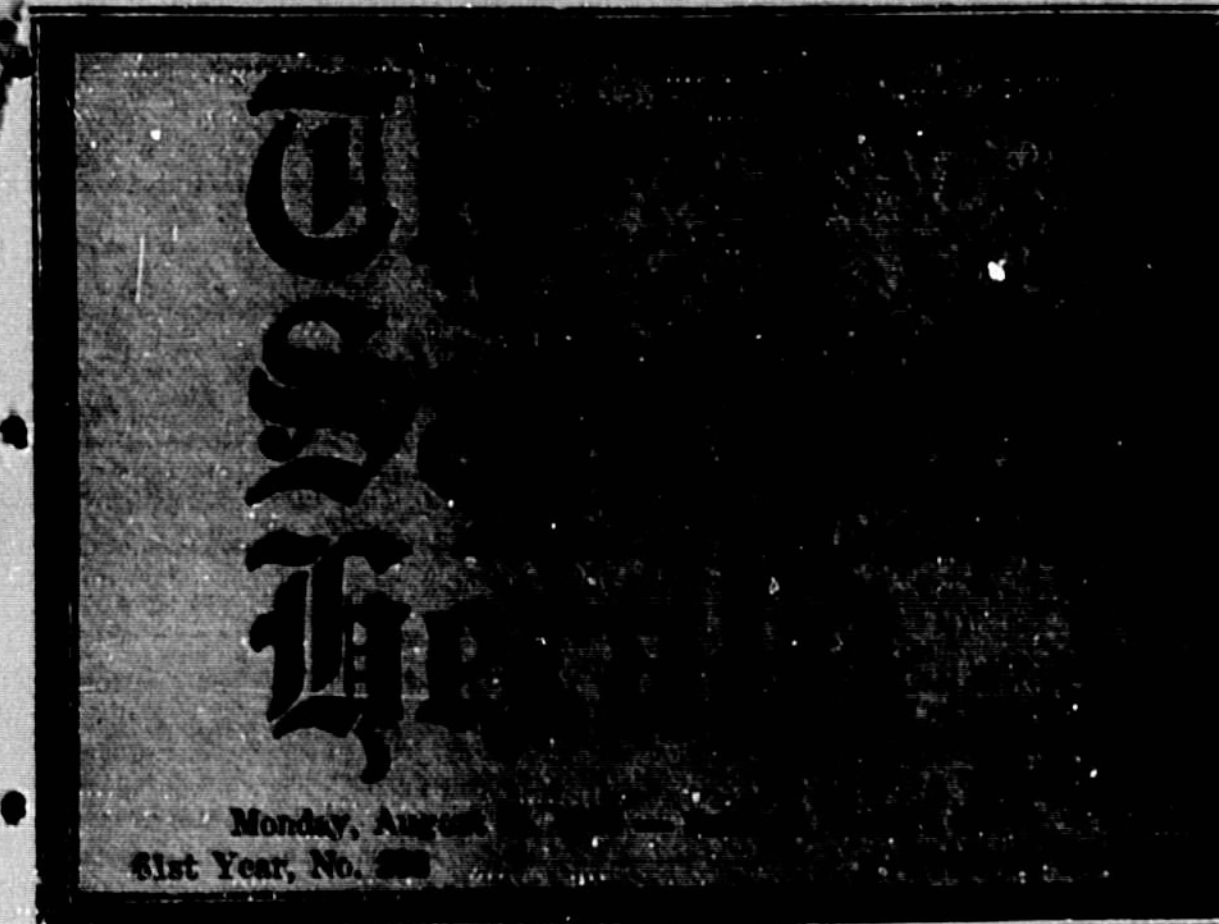

Teenage Girls Object Of Hunt

Information has been sent to all law enforcement officers in the area to be on the lookout for a late model black car with a Forest City tag reported to have picked up three Longwood teenage girls near a Sanford drive-in theater last night.

The girls, Melissa Owens, 14, Teresa K. Owens, 15, and Lanette Frickers, 15, have been missing since 8:50 p.m. Sunday. They were last seen getting into the late model car occupied by two men said to be in their late 20s.

The Owens sisters are the daughters of Mr. and Mrs. William A. Owens, 1121 Reams Avenue while Lanette is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. M. H. Fricker, 110 Selma Road, both Longdale subdivisions, Longwood.

Longwood Police Chief Eddie Sweet told The Herald today he has clues which he is following up concerning the girls.

Schools List Top Roster

Seminole County is just a week away from the Sept. 2 opening day of school when some 10,000 county children are expected to join the county's 19 elementary and eight secondary schools, an increase of 1,000 over 1968.

Approximately 850 professional personnel, including teachers, principals, etc., have been assigned to handle this largest enrollment ever to attend county schools.

Two new schools will be among the 27 facilities readied for classes. These are Milwee Junior High (the old Lyman High School facility) and Idylwild Elementary School in the Ravenna Park section near Sanford.

New plants to open for the first time include Lyman High and Spring Lake while new additions will be used initially at Longwood, Altamonte and English Estates, all elementary schools.

An improvement in the county's school lunch program has been announced and offers parents the opportunity to save money by buying weekly lunch tickets in advance.

Tickets may be bought by parents in groups of five and will be valid for any day in the school year. Paced on sale at schools Thursday, the tickets thereafter will be sold on Monday of each week.

A five cents saving per meal may be had by purchasing tickets in advance. Otherwise, the meals will cost 30 cents a day at elementary schools and 40 cents daily at secondary schools.

Before a child can be admitted to kindergarten or first grade, the principal shall require evidence that the child is free from a contagious or communicable disease by having the child's parents furnish a health certificate and a birth certificate. If the child was enrolled in kindergarten last year the two certificates will not be required.

Students will receive two days, Nov. 27-28, for Thanksgiving. Winter vacation will begin Dec. 15, with schools reopening Jan. 5.

Spring vacation is scheduled for March 27-28 and Florida Education Association convenes for two days, April 23-24.

Final school day is June 5.

Casselberry Votes Tuesday

Casselberry City Clerk Mary Hawthorne, with member of the City Council present, will purge the voter registration books at 6:30 p.m. today at the Women's Club building on Overbrook Drive in preparation for tomorrow's special election.

The election concerns an amendment to the city charter which would change the terms of office of the mayor and members of Council from two to three years.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. for the referendum with Mrs. Burnham Storrs as inspector, and Mrs. Myron Jacobs and Mrs. John Zimmer as clerks.

Following the purge tonight, the governing body will meet in continued session at 7:30 to consider the permanent appointment of Mrs. Cera Kanmer as police dispatcher and matron. Mrs. Kanmer recently completed her 90-day probation period with the department.

Also on the agenda is the appointment of Mrs. William Cass to the Board of Adjustment.

Councilman Tom Napier is expected to report to the Council that the "Casselberry Special" bus is proving to be successful with standing-room-only experienced on its run this past Saturday. Napier is further expected to report that the bus company will complete the monies taken in through bus fares through the end of this month to determine the amount of guarantee the city will have to pay.

Public hearings are expected to be set on the requests of Richard Lusk for rezoning of a tract on Seminola Avenue to commercial and on the request that the highway frontage adjoining Indian Hills be rezoned to commercial except for a 100-foot strip on the south end of R13 for a buffer area.

Zoo Site Action May Be Tabled

Sanford City Commissioners probably will table the recommendation of the city's zoo committee to locate the animal attraction on 10.3 acres of land adjacent to the Sanford Herald previously set aside by the commission for industrial development.

This is expected to be the action taken since the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce is actively engaged in seeking an interested insurance firm to locate on the tract reserved for industrial application and sought by the zoo committee for locating the present zoo.

Mayor Leo P. Moore, John Krider, Seminole Chamber manager, and Don Rathel, Sanford Industrial Commission director, are to enplane for Atlanta later in the week for reported "serious talks" with the insurance firm.

Commission tonight is expected to table the recommendation until the Sept. 8 meeting. A public hearing on amending the zoning requirements regarding height restrictions on downtown buildings is not expected to draw any opposition.

A report on the number of replies to the tract reserved for persons interested in establishing community antenna television is also expected to be discussed before action on awarding a lease for a city antenna system.

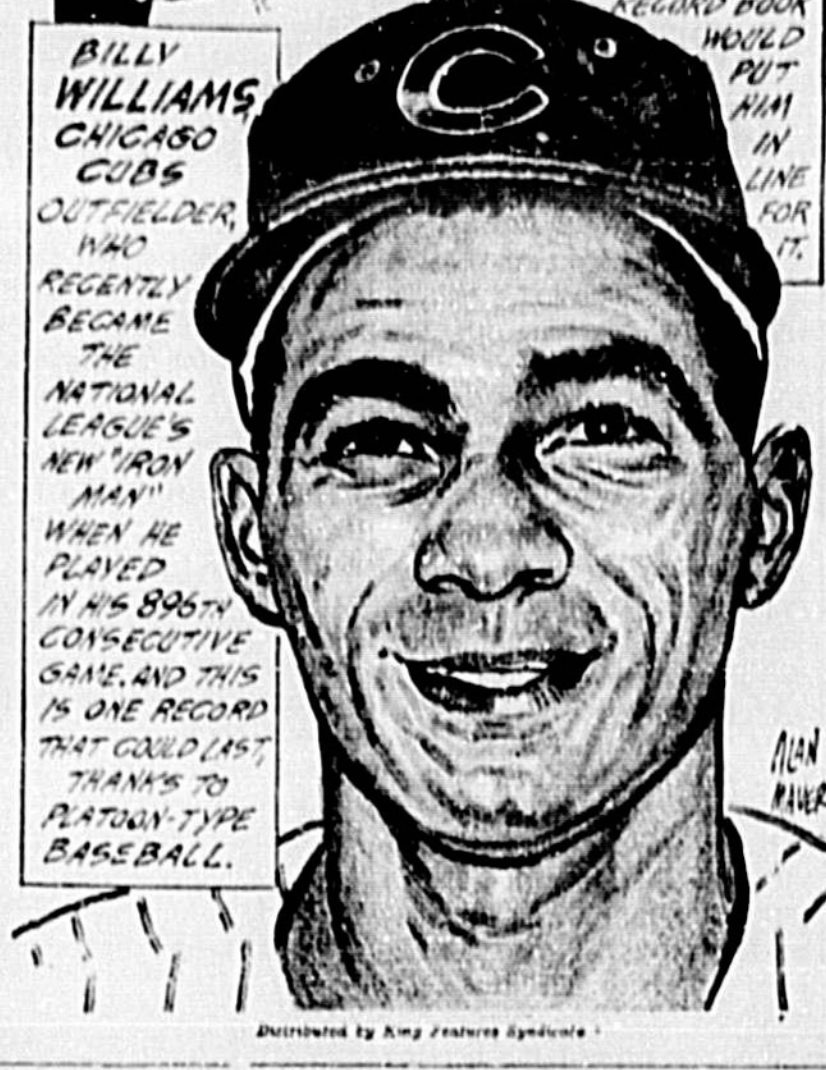
Atlanta In Second Surging Giants Move To First In West

Airport Is Ours, Sen. Gurney Says

Sanford Airport, a 1,600-acre site that once served as a U. S. Navy base, will become city property in a \$1 purchase from the federal government, Mayor Lee Moore announced Monday night.

Moore told the City Commission he based his announcement on word from Sen. Edward Gurney (R-Fla.) in Washington. The base was abandoned 18 months ago in a military budget cut-back.

The Sanford city government attempted since then to buy the property for the token \$1 price. Four months ago the site was reclassified as industrial and the price tag leaped to \$80,000. City Manager Warren E. Knowles went to Washington to appeal the case with the General Services Administration and Federal Aviation Administration.

The positive reaction to Knowles' trip was released through the Florida junior senator's office and the base was reclassified again and dropped to \$1 for city purchase.

The GSA informed Knowles that the move was precedent setting. The agency said there are four other such situations in the country that will be ruled on.

Sanford City Manager W. E. Knowles said today that deed to the Sanford Naval Air Station, now known as Sanford Airport, will be given to the city "about the middle of next week."

Knowles said he arrived at this opinion after consulting with General Services Administration (GSA) Regional Atlanta office this morning after first calling Hart T. Mankin, GSA general counsel, at his Washington headquarters.

He received additional information on the title transfer after receiving word from Sen. Edward Gurney late Monday that the city would receive all of the 1,600-acre base under provisions of the Surplus Property Act.

Gurney, in a telegram to city officials, newspapers and radio stations in the area, advised the title to the former military site had been given to Sanford after several months of serious negotiations with GSA, the U. S. Atomic Energy Agency and Federal Aviation Agency (FAA).

Gurney said the title also would give to the city all easements, buildings and improvements made at the airport.

Gurney stated, "I am particularly gratified that, by this opinion, there can now be developed in the city of Sanford a base for the future economic growth, increased property and in the long run will more than offset the adverse economic impact resulting in the closing of the SMA."

Mankin speaking today to The Sanford Herald by phone, stated, "There are no strings attached, the city gets everything."

He advised that FAA received proper certification yesterday and everything is now in agreement.

The official said he had asked all operational people to call him about title transfer and work on this would begin immediately.

"The Atlanta regional office is being advised today to prepare the deed and there are no more hangups," Mankin said.

Mankin acknowledged that Gurney had helped "quite a lot" in Sanford receiving the base property without having to pay the \$200,000 for the industrial area as first sought by GSA.
