



LEXINGTON, Mass. (AP) - Donald M. Boyd goes before a board of officers at West Point, N.Y., today in his attempt to graduate from the U.S. Military Academy despite being married while enrolled there. Boyd, 23, from Lexington, was married secretly in his

junior year at the service academy. The marriage was revealed in an anonymous letter to his superiors two weeks before he was to graduate from West Point last

Boyd was barred from receiving his diploma and commission as a second lieutenant. West Point officials said he was dismissed not because he married but because he violated the academy's honor code by lying about his

Zebra Busts Hit

NEW ORLEANS (AP) - The stop-and-frisk searches of black men during San Francisco's "Zebra" manhunt was condemned by the NAACP convention as dangerous overreaction by police.

Undertaken in a drive to end terrorist-style murders of whites by blacks, the searches later were ruled unconstitutional by a federal judge.

"The lawless acts of the police created such an intolerable condition of tension and apprehension in the black community that it could have led to an explosion of enormous dimensions," a resolution said.

It was among resolutions that the 3,070 delegates approved by voice vote during the last two days of the fiveday 65th annual convention. The gathering ends tonight with a banquet.

In other resolutions, the NAACP demanded a moratorium on mental tests where most blacks-score lower than

Standardized tests are misleading when they have not been corrected for cultural bias, the delegates said. Such tests result in "a disproportionately large number of black students being misplaced in special education classes and denied admissions to higher education op-

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) - A crowd that police estimated totaled about 4,000 persons marched without incident through the North Carolina capital protesting the death

Black militant Angela Davis, who cochairs a group that calls itself the National Alliance Against Racist and Political Repression, led the Independence Day march. It was held to spotlight the state's Death Row population, highest in the nation.

Miss Davis estimated that the crowd totaled 10,000

Navy To Pressure

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) - Secretary of the Navy J. William Middendorf says he will pressure Congress to provide more funds to revitalize the U.S. Navy.

Middendorf also says he does not entirely agree with Adm. Elmo Zumwalt, recently retired chief of naval operations, who warned that the United States had temporarily surrendered its supremacy at sea.

Middendorf, speaking to Independence Day ceremonies in Jacksonville, which has several Navy facilities, said that American naval might had been beefed up by aircraft carriers and nuclear submaries and would still be superior in any direct confrontation with the Soviet Union.

But he added that he believed Zumwalt was right in saying the Navy needs to be more powerful.

"We can't minimize the widening gap between the two navies," Middendorf said. "They've got 1,300 ships plus combat ships and we've got 300. And I'm not considering the Russian garbage scows.

BELFAST, Northern Ireland (AP) - Militant Protestant leaders today rejected key points in the British government's new proposals to bring peace to Northern

Ireland, and there was no immediate reaction from the militant Catholics of the Irish Republican Army, Moderate Protestant and Catholic leaders gave the plan a qualified welcome. The British government proposed that the people of Northern Ireland elect a constitutional convention to draft proposals for a new political structure subject to the approval of the British Parliament. But the government said the constitution must allow for power to be shared between the Catholics and the Protestants, and it must recognize that Northern Ireland has a special relationship with the Irish Republic.

French President Briefed

PARIS (AP) - Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger briefed France's president at breakfast today on President Nixon's summit talks in Moscow, then rushed to Orly Airport to fly to Rome for talks with Italian President Giuseppe Leone and Pope Paul VI.

"We discussed international relations as well as FrancoAmerican relations and relations between the United States and Europe in a very friendly, constructive, open and warm atmosphere," Kissinger said after his 80minute session with President Valery Giscard d'Estaing at the Elysee Palace.

Opium Crop Protested

ANKARA, Turkey (AP) - An informed source said today U.S. Ambassador William Macomber has been recalled to Washington for consultations because of indignation in America over Turkey's recent decision to lift a ban on opium poppy cultivation. The source said consultations would include the entire

range of U.S. relations with Turkey. There was no immediate confirmation from U.S. of-

Turkey banned opium poppy cultivation in 1971 under strong pressure from the United States which claimed at the time that most of the heroin reaching U.S. addicts was of Turkish origin.



sending up potentially lethal fumes. Firemen donned gas masks and worked under a shower of water to get close enough to the valves to cut off the flow of ammonia, officers said. The area was reported clear of the poisonous gas within 40 minutes.
