





Richard King, an engineer from Atlanta, Georgia, and Darwin H. While they are the sun-tan oil, and the cold cream working with an eye toward future sources of water they are drilling wells for immediate relief of the situation.

They have brought in many dry holes but they have also found eight very good sources of water. They leave the casing in the well and cap it. The village or the government provides the pump. In one case the water from two wells has been bumped to a storage tank on higher ground from whence it supplies two villages with fifty gallons per per-

Mao's Tieup With The Kremlin

Will Communist China ever break with Russia? Some observers, among them Senator Alexander Wiley, Chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, believe that such a break is inevitable. They point out that Russia has learned nothing from the incidents that led to the defection of Tito and they predict that a similar situation will arise in China.

The Communist Chinese leader Mao Tse-Tung was an ardent admirer of Joseph Stalin. After Stalin's death he pledged his allegiance to the new leaders but many doubt whether he holds for them the respect and affection he did for Stalin. It is also possible that he may be tiring of pulling Russian chestnuts out of the fire,

The Chinese Reds have borne the brunt of the fighting in Korea. That war has caused a critical shortage of manpower at home and has prevented Mao from fulfilling many of the promises for reform that he made to his people. He will soon have to deliver on some of those promises or face the kind of revolts that have been spreading through Europe. He will not be able to do this if he must spend his best efforts serving the interest of the Russians.

We must not depend on a rift between the Chinese Reds and the Kremlin as a substitute for our own defense efforts, Some way may be devised in Moscow to keep the Chinese Reds in line. But if Mao should follow the example of Tito in leaving the Soviet camp a great source of danger from Communism would be eliminated.
