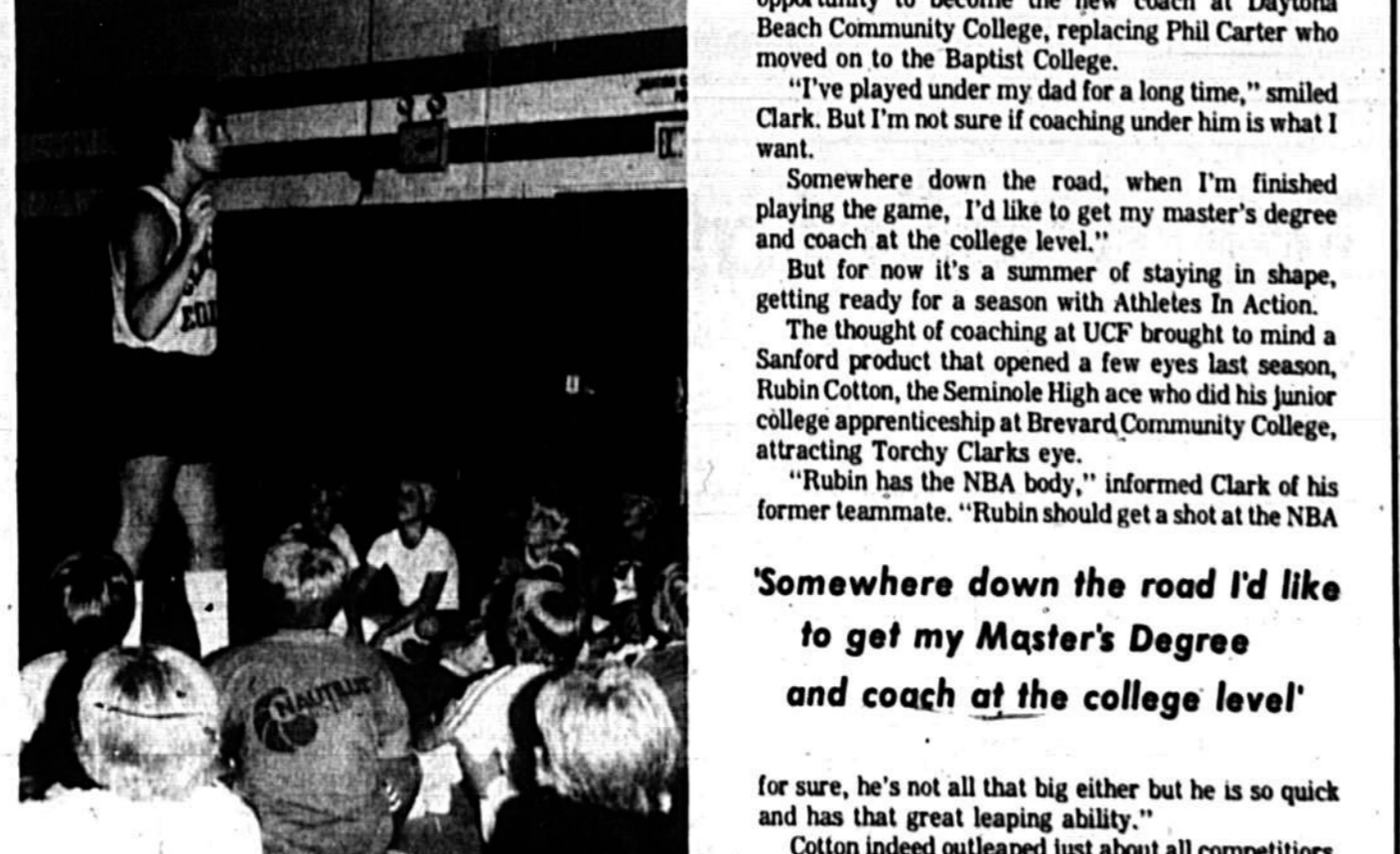

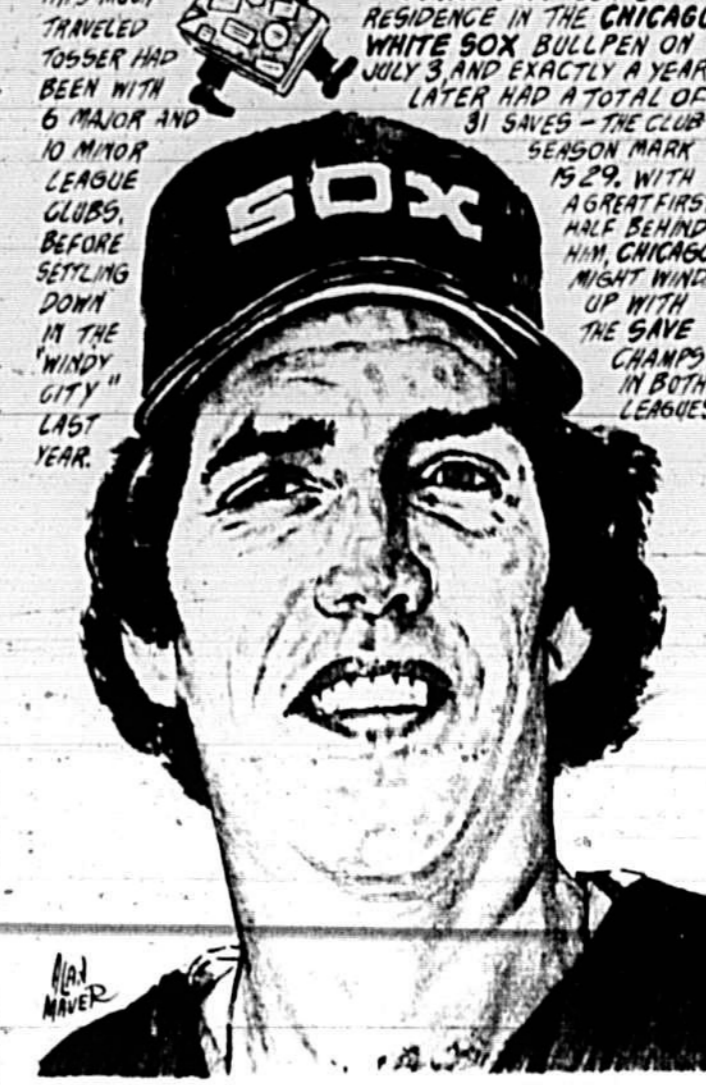

RSVP Program At Work

Evelyn Mattice was quite excited when 6-year-old Li Trinh said to her, "You are my friend."

For three weeks, under the direction of the Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP), the 62-year-old volunteer has been teaching the bright-eyed Vietnamese youngster the language of his new country, along with his 10-year-old brother, Hepp, and 9-year-old sister, Yen.

Mrs. Mattice knew that Li had learned a lot, but she nearly melted when the little tyke looked at her, smiled, and declared in very clear English, "You are my friend."

Just as new to the RSVP program as the youngsters are to this country, Mrs. Mattice really didn't know what to expect when she was asked if she'd like to help teach the youngsters. Rushing through her mind were thoughts like, "I don't even know their language... how can I teach them?" and "I'm not a teacher. Can I do it?"

But when she learned that helping the children would get through RSVP was extremely important to their future in this country, she didn't hesitate.

The children, from a family sponsored by the Casseberry Rotary Club, were in the country for just one week, and they knew only two words — "Hello" and "Yes" — a propitious beginning.

Volunteers Teach English To Children

"It was a little difficult at first," explained the neophyte instructor, "but the children responded easily to anything you try to do with them."

Three mornings a week, Mrs. Mattice drives from her South Seminole County home to Longwood school to teach the youngsters. She began by showing them picture cards and having them repeat the words after her. Before long, they were responding in complete sentences. She also taught them their colors, the alphabet, and simple commands.

Before the arrival of the Vietnamese children, RSVP volunteers were working with three Laotian children — 12-year-old Phatsomane Kanyays and her brothers, 9-year-old Virakone and 7-year-old Nirandone.

Among the volunteers working with the children is Harry Bergstrom of Lake Mary, who delights in tutoring Virakone and Nirandone twice a week.

"I can tell the difference from Wednesday to Friday," he says. "They learn so quickly. It's a learning experience for me," explained the 66-year-old retiree, who formerly worked for the U.S. Postal Service. "I probably derive much more enjoyment from it than any individual I have anything to do with."

Sixty-three-year-old Helen Murphy of Longwood, admits that sometimes she has felt frustrated trying to teach the youngsters. "I don't know whether or not they understand. Sometimes it's hard trying to explain."

Counseling Program Leads To Recreation, Work Ethic

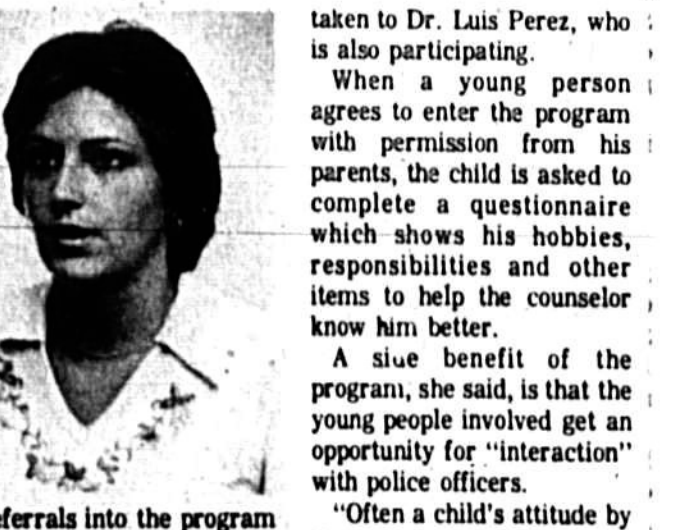

The Lake Mary Police Department has begun its juvenile counseling program to help young people of the community who have had minor scrapes with the law and to help others to stay out of trouble.

Kathy Ostrander, a recent graduate of the University of Central Florida, is heading the program being funded by the U. S. Justice Department's Office of Justice Assistance, Research and Statistics.

The program began earlier this month and will continue until Sept. 30. "We are focusing on first offenders and those who have committed violations of state law, which would not be violations if the kids were over 18," Miss Ostrander said. She listed examples of these violations as drinking and breaking curfew.

"Many of the kids are bored, looking for attention and need help. They try to call attention to themselves. Some times there are family problems. They are bored with nothing to do."

"We try to open up interests for them and to give them something to do in a constructive way," Miss Ostrander said. "We will try to change this attitude, but we won't force the issue. Perhaps in the case of some police officers, the officer's attitude toward the young people will change."



When a young person agrees to enter the program with permission from his parents, the child is asked to complete a questionnaire which shows his hobbies, responsibilities and other items to help the counselor know him better. Miss Ostrander, 21, double majored in criminal justice and psychology for her bachelor's degree. She is available for counseling in her office at the city police station Tuesday through Friday and on Saturdays will be participating with the young people on recreational or community projects.
