



#### Over Field Trip Pay

## Seminole School Bus Drivers Hint Action

said today his group may file an unfair labor practice action against the school board Thursday because of a disagreement over pay bus drivers get for field trip work.

But if the union does file, school board negotiators today threatened to accuse the bus drivers of illegally striking for refusing to bus students on field trips. At issue is how much bus drivers want to be paid for field trips.

"Under last year's contract a top bus driver with 10 years' experience, being paid for a field trip and receiving overtime (for more than 40 working hours in one week) would draw \$6.85 an hour," said Ernest Cowley, chief negotiator for the school board. "Under the present system all drivers, regardless of experience, would be paid a flat rate of \$3.47 an hour for driving time, with waiting time paid for at \$2.30 an hour," Cowley said.
Waiting time, Cowley explained is that period the bus driver is waiting for students, after they have reached their destination, to re-board the bus for the return trip.

"The bus drivers returned to work at the opening of the school year without a contract. They were given that information on how they were to be paid for field trips," said Gene Grooms, executive director, Seminole Education Association. "It is entirely different from last year's contract, and we feel this constitutes an unfair

If Cowley and the board do decide to formally accuse the bus driver's union of being on strike, they would file an injunction in circuit court in Sanford, he said. That injunction would demand that the bus drivers drive on school field trips, "to stop a strike," said Cowley. "It is possible the union could be fined \$20,000 a day until it no longer is on strike," Cowley added.

"These bus drivers are very strong minded people," Grooms warned. "I don't think they are going to back down."

Despite the fact that the union does not want its members to drive for field trips until the new contract is reached, no disruption has yet occurred in school activities. Neither Cowley nor Grooms said they were aware of any problems in finding enough willing drivers for transportation to football games when the season opened last Friday.

## NATION **IN BRIEF**

Midwest Floods Kill 7, More Rain Predicted

KANSAS CITY (AP) - Seven persons were known dead and hundreds were stranded in submerged cars and flooded homes today after two days of torrential rains in the Kansas City area, authorities said.

Widespread lowland flooding and heavy crop and property damage were reported in northeast Kansas and northwest Missouri. Police sent boats on rescue missions throughout the city to aid persons trapped in submerged cars, mobile homes and houses near small streams, rivers and lakes.

The rains that began Sunday night subsided early today, but the National Weather Service said more was on its way. Nearly 12 inches had fallen by 1 a.m., a one-day rainfall record for Kansas City.

Power outages and disruptions in telephone service also occurred in Kansas and Missouri.



The Herald reported in today's edition that a majority of the U.S. Senate's Commerce Committee is ready to vote against confirmation.

It quoted unidentifed senators and committee sources as saying Tucker's nomination is jeopardized by the current controversy surrounding Bert Lance, the Carter Administration's budget chief.



The New Directory Assistance Plan Begins September 20, 1977.

On Suptember 26, 1977 the new plan requesting eaths for Directory Assistance goes into effect. The plan provides an allowance of six calls a wouth from each customer line without charge. 



## A Big Thanks For Dr. Starke

More often than not, an individual's contribution to his community and society are not recognized or acknowledged during his lifetime. More often than not, the accolades become posthumous - with only the surviving family and friends basking in the recognition.

Fortunately for us all, the case of Dr. George

H. Starke is different. His community, neighbors, friends and colleagues were farsighted enough to repay him for his 50 years of medical service in Sanford and environs while he is still with us.

And a fine repayment it was. Sanford Mayor Lee P. Moore named a park and picnic area for him. Fellow medical men Drs. Luis Perez, Jorge Gomez and Thomas Largen presented plaques honoring his service to the community and medical

It was all part of the special Appreciation Day Sunday for Sanford's Dr. Starke who on Thursday will mark his 50th anniversary of service here. It was on Sept. 15, 1927, that Dr. Starke opened his first office here in a small space above the old "Jerry's Drugstore" on Sanford Avenue. The days leading up to that event had not been easy ones.

George H. Starke had encountered all the obstacles and roadblocks thrown up in those days - everything from the bucking of tradition to prejudice and plain old bigotry.

But he was not to be deterred. He persevered

and, after being rejected by all-white University of Florida Medical School, enrolled at all-black Meharry University in Nashville.

And the rest is history — a history of service and compassion for hundreds of residents here all of which was remembered on Sunday...

Dr. Starke's professional life has been guided by principles he was taught in medical school. He aborated on them only last month in conjunction with publication of The Herald's special Centennial edition marking the 100th birthday of Sanford. Recalled Dr. Starke:
