





Iran Makes No Decision On Fate Of Hostages

By United Press International Iran's parliament debated the fate of the 52 American hostages for the fourth time today but adjourned the secret sessions with no announced decision on whether to free the captives held just four days short of a year. A spokesman for the parliament's secretariat told UPI in London by telephone an "open session" of the Majlis, or parliament, would be held Thursday. The hostage issue was expected to be on the agenda

beleaguered law enforcement system. Virtually the identical amendment was defeated by voters two years ago as part of a package offered by the Constitutional Revision Commission. But proponents believe it was unfairly lost in controversies over other issues. The item is one of five proposed constitutional amendments on Tuesday's ballot. It got overwhelming support from both liberals and conservatives when the Legislature voted to put it

The proposal got new life last spring in the House, when supporters depicted it as an important philosophical statement on limitation of government interference in private lives. It is simply worded: Every natural person has the right to be let alone and free

from governmental intrusion into his private life except as otherwise provided here in. This section shall not be construed to limit the public's right of access to public records and meetings as provided by law." Proponents say the second sentence nullifies any potential damage the amendment might do to the Sunshine law. They contend it would do nothing to hamper legitimate governmen-

Opponents aren't so certain. They fear the language might be interpreted by courts to limit wiretaps in bonafide criminal One outspoken opponent is Sen. Don Childers, D-West Palm

Noting the support for the proposal from gay rights groups, Childers contends the amendment could be interpreted as sanctioning homosexual behavior and clearing the way for marijuana to be grown legally in the home.



WASHINGTON (UPI) - Dramatic testimony from former Attorneys General John Mitchell and Richard Kleindienst highlighted the trial of two former high FBI officials Tuesday, and the federal jury could hear from an even bigger surprise witness.

officials W. Mark Felt and Edward S. Miller. Mitchell and Kleindienst each testified they never approved break-ins for intelligence gathering purposes - Known as "black bag jobs" - while in office. Mitchell and Kleindienst said they only approved break-ins to install electronic listening devices.





Tal Smith: 'The Season Caused A Greater Breach'

HOUSTON (UPI) - Forget the standings. Forget first place. Forget the thrilling, five-game National League championship series against Philadelphia. Houston Astros' owner John McMullen says his team is "not a winner." And in the sense that the Astros were 93-70 instead of 162-0 in 1980 and made baseball's Final Four but not its Final One, the white-haired millionaire from New York was

But wasn't this the Astros' greatest season? Didn't they win their first division title? "That's different. That's not a winner," McMullen said. On a Tuesday afternoon in the security-tight bowels of the Astrodome, reporters trickled in and out one or two at a time for scheduled 15-minute audiences with the man who 24 hours earlier fired — without giving a reason — Tal Smith, president of the Astros and the National League's Executive of the Year. With new Astros' President Al Rosen sitting mutely at the

"I can accept that, that could be an interpretation, yes," McMullen said. "But on the other hand there could be look.
