balls of crumpled metal 30 feet high.

Names of the dead will not be released until next of kin are notified.

The Air Force issued the following statement:

"A U. S. Air Force C-124 Globemaster, returning for a landing, crashed shortly after takeoff from Tachikawa air installation west of Tokyo at 4:34 this afternoon, with approximately 120 passengers and a crew of seven on board.

"The four-engine transport crashed and burned in a clearing near the village of Kodaira, four miles east-northeast of the air installation 2 miles west of Tokyo.

"The Air Force said there was some light rain and fog as the plane left Tachikawa, but the weather was not bad enough to ground aircraft.

"It said there was a ceiling of about 1,000 feet and visibility of about one mile. A spokesman said the safety limits are a 250-foot ceiling and half-mile visibility.

Because of the vast spaces across which winds blow, the Pacific Ocean usually is considered rougher in comparable latitudes than the Atlantic.
