Lake Mary Officials Solicit Offers

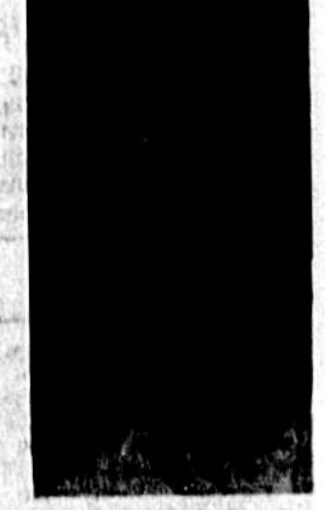
Search Begins For City Hall Complex Site

## Israel: Weisman Visit To Cairo Positive Step

TEL AVIV, Israel (UPI) — Taking issue with gloomy Egyptian reports, Israel's official state television news Defense Minister Bar Weisman's 24-hour Cairo visit may lead to a resumption of high-level but secret peace negotiations.

The report, carried Friday after Weisman's return from Cairo, contrasted with the pessimistic view by Egypt, which said the two sides failed to pry Egyptian President Anwar Sadat from his position.

In other developments Friday, Army Chief of Staff Lt. Gen. Moshikol Gur declared that if Israeli soldiers face charges of looting during the Israeli invasion of south Lebanon.

## Ethiopia Hits Invasion

NAIROBI, Kenya (UPI) — Ethiopia hits it may invade Somalia if Somali guerrillas continue their hit-and-run raids in the Ogaden Desert, which was recaptured by the Ethiopian army after a massive Omani-and Soviet-backed offensive.

The threat, contained in an Ethiopian radio broadcast Friday, came as both sides stepped up a war of words that diplomats feared might lead to renewed fighting in the Horn of Africa.

Fearful that it could be unwittingly drawn into the conflict between the two Marxist neighbors, Kenya has ordered Friday of a squadron of 15 F-4 fighters bought from the United States.

## Probers Hunt 'Weak Link'

ROME (UPI) — Police stepped up their nationwide search today for the kidnappers of former premier Aldo Moro, extending the home-to-home hunt to northern Italy in an effort to turn up "a weak link" leading them to the hideout of the elusive Red Brigades.

The Vatican called for the second time Friday to intervene in an effort to save Moro's life. However, the government's refusal to negotiate with his kidnappers, the elusive, ultraradical Red Brigades.

# Man Hunted In Beating Of Woman

The night abductor of the 26-year-old woman who was beaten and left for dead in a car on Interstate 4 and State Road 60, Altona Springs, last his girlfriend at the gas station early Saturday morning. Then he fled the station's cash register of \$1,200 to \$1,500 and drove the woman to Ocala to be left in the car to die.

Orange County Sheriff's Office and Langford police. Angela Ray, 26, of 401 E. Langford Ave., Altona, was treated and released early Saturday morning with a lacerated left eye, a front tooth knocked out and scratches on the left side of her arm at Florida Hospital North, Altona Springs, hospital.

A police alert to New Smyrna Beach has been issued for the abductor, who lives in the same apartment building on West Bay. He was described by witnesses as 25, with sandy, shoulder-length hair, about 5 feet, 7 inches tall, weighing 160 pounds and wearing blue jeans, a yellow t-shirt and a denim jacket.

The incident came to the attention of police when E. O. Blain, 28, drove his car, in need of repairs, to the 16-hour Tamm station at 2:45 a.m. Saturday. He was at the station, Blain said, and the owner, Bob B. Hedges, was called. Hedges discovered the money missing, according to police.

Miss Ray returned to the apartment building in her car and, 1:30 Saturday morning, police said.

MURDER TRIAL SET Merrill Fleming, 41, of 800 Grandville Drive, Casselberry, will go on trial in Orlando June 12 for first-degree murder Feb. 23, of Christian James Keith Ovin, 24, and attempted first-degree murder of his estranged wife, Arlene Fleming, 28, at Ocala's Orlando center.

# Fired JDC Worker Files State Appeal

Recently dismissed Juvenile Detention Center shift supervisor Virginia Miller has filed for an administrative appeal over her firing.

Miller was fired a week ago Friday when the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services (DRHS) released its probe of an alleged beating of five youths at the center Feb. 28.

Miller also was asked to resign. When she refused, she was given a "letter of dismissal," according to John King, public information officer for DRHS.

"I was fired on Wednesday or Thursday," Miller's attorney James Perry said. He said the letter went to the state personnel director in Tallahassee asking a hearing by the career service commission on the firing. He also has been out for several hours, according to Perry. The two-member Career Service Commission hears all appeals on the firing of state employees, according to King.

"The decision they make is usually considered final and binding for both parties and that's what the state has returned that ruling in district court, but I don't think an employee has."

Perry has left the door open to a court appeal if the state panel's ruling does not favor his client.

"It depends on how the administrative hearing comes out," Perry said of a court appeal. "I'm sure we will be considered."

State officials contacted Miller should have reported the beating immediately after it happened. The beating reportedly occurred near the end of Miss Miller's shift and was not reported until after she had left the facility, according to King.

The child care worker was contacted with the probe, according to his attorney Joseph DeBecker, former Orange County Juvenile Judge.

According to state findings, DRHS officials reported evidence showed the shift crew member and supervisor were in breaking up the situation among the five juveniles.

The youths involved in the beating ranged in age from 14 to 17. They were all arrested at Semoran Boulevard following the day after the beating, according to Perry. The two-member Career Service Commission hears all appeals on the firing of state employees, according to King.

The state attorney's office was called to investigate the incident for possible criminal charges in connection with the beating. However, last week it was announced that no charges would be filed.

# NATION IN BRIEF

## Transit Strike Averted For 3 Million in N.Y.

NEW YORK (UPI) — Mayor Edward Koch early today announced a settlement between the city's transit system and its 33,000 workers, averting a strike that would have paralyzed mass transportation for nearly 3 million riders.

Koch termed the settlement "reasonable." Transit Workers Union President Matthew Guinan called it "a damned good settlement" and predicted it would receive the "overwhelming approval" of the union's rank and file.

## L.A. Ponders Murder Charge

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Police have until Tuesday to decide if they should seek a murder complaint against Peter Mark Jones for one or more of the 13 so-called Hillside Strangler murders — or set him free.

L.A. Dan Cooke, spokesman for the 68-member Hillside Strangler task force, said police would probably go to the district attorney Monday. He said "some material" had been seized as evidence from Jones' apartment and automobile, "but we don't believe it to be significant at this time."

## Ex-Filmmaker Charged

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Former Columbia Pictures President David Begelman, accused of forging a \$10,000 check made out to actor Cliff Robertson, has been charged with forgery and stealing studio funds.

Begelman, who brought such blockbusters to Columbia as "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" and "Shampoo," was ousted from his \$400,000-a-year job Feb. 8 after publicity about the alleged embezzlement startled the motion picture industry. However, he was retained by the studio as an independent producer.

## Drinking Pilots Beware

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Drinking and flying don't mix and the Federal Aviation Administration is being urged to do something about it.

Minimum levels of alcohol consumption should be established so that "flying under the influence" can be defined, the General Accounting Office said Friday.

## Miller Better After Stroke

MIAMI BEACH (UPI) — Arnold Miller, president of the United Mine Workers Union, is improving after suffering a mild stroke Wednesday, but will have to spend the weekend in the Mt. Sinai Hospital intensive care unit.

Cardiologist Dr. Philip Samet said the stroke was caused by a combination of high blood pressure and disease of blood vessels supplying the brain. He said Miller's arm and leg movements were slightly impaired but he remained mentally alert.

## Passman Mum On Bribe

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Former Rep. Otis Passman, D-La., has instructed his lawyers to be tight-lipped about the charges he took bribes from Korean rice agent Tongsun Park to boost rice sales and commodity-purchase aid to Korea.

Passman lay ill in New Orleans, suffering from mental and physical exhaustion, when a grand jury was reporting the agreement and indictment Friday in U.S. Magistrate Jean Dwyer in a District of Columbia courtroom.

# \$28 Million Grant For Sewage Plant

The Iron Bridge sewage treatment plant has moved a step closer to becoming a reality with the federal government awarding Orlando a \$28 million grant for the project.

The plant, which Orlando officials expect will cost about \$80 million, will treat sewage from residential, commercial and industrial Orlando. The plant will treat 24 million gallons of sewage per day.

Official notice of the grant has not been received by Orlando's executive director, Paul Matthews, public works director.

"Congressman (Loy) Fryer's office notified the mayor's office yesterday (Friday) afternoon that the money has been designated for us," said Matthews. "As far as we're concerned, the money is ours. We just haven't received it yet."

Within a couple of weeks, the council is expected to approve issuance of 60 million in bonds to help finance the plant. The bonds are in the process of being drafted, Matthews said.

"Hopefully, we'll be able to cover emergency construction in the next few weeks," Matthews said. "These contracts must be approved by federal officials, so we'll have to wait a few weeks before we can start work on the plant."

"We're in a very good position. We've already had a team of consultants here and they've done a lot of work. We're confident that the project will be completed in 1981."

# Nazi March In Skokie Slowed By Court Ruling

CHICAGO (UPI) — The U.S. Court of Appeals has upheld a lower court order that, in effect, bars members of a militant group from marching through the heavily Jewish northern suburb of Skokie before May.

In its ruling late Friday, a three-judge appeal court panel denied a request by the National Socialist Party of America and its leader, Frank Collins, to vacate a March 17 order by U.S. District Court Judge Bernard Dodge.

The order imposed a 60-day stay on an earlier decision preventing the predominantly Jewish suburb from enacting three ordinances designed to keep the Nazi group from demonstrating there.

The group had expected to march through the suburb on April 28, Adolf Hitler's birthday.

"I concur in permitting to stand the limited stay order pending appeal previously entered by the district court," Appeals Court Judge Irving Harington Wood Jr., said.

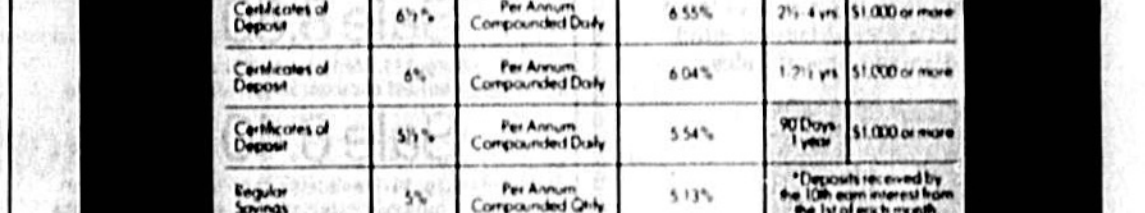
"Otherwise, the controversial proposed demonstration might become an accomplished fact and the matter would likely become moot."

He said he took that position despite his opposition to prior restraints on first amendment rights, but added he did not believe a short delay would inflict any irreparable harm on the Nazi group while the case is under appeal.

Appeals Court Judge Wilbur Paul wrote in a dissenting opinion: "When black people marched in southern states not too many years ago, it was in a hostile environment with the likelihood of violence and, indeed, violence did develop."

"The difference between that situation and the present case is that we place different value judgments."

He said again the stay has been upheld, "everybody concerned in this case should be able to bring this case to a speedy trial on an early date."

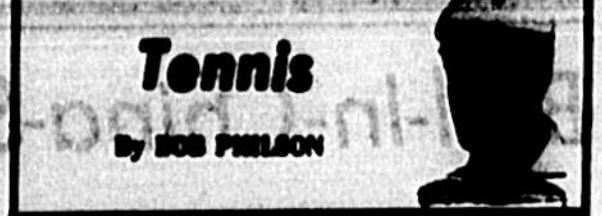

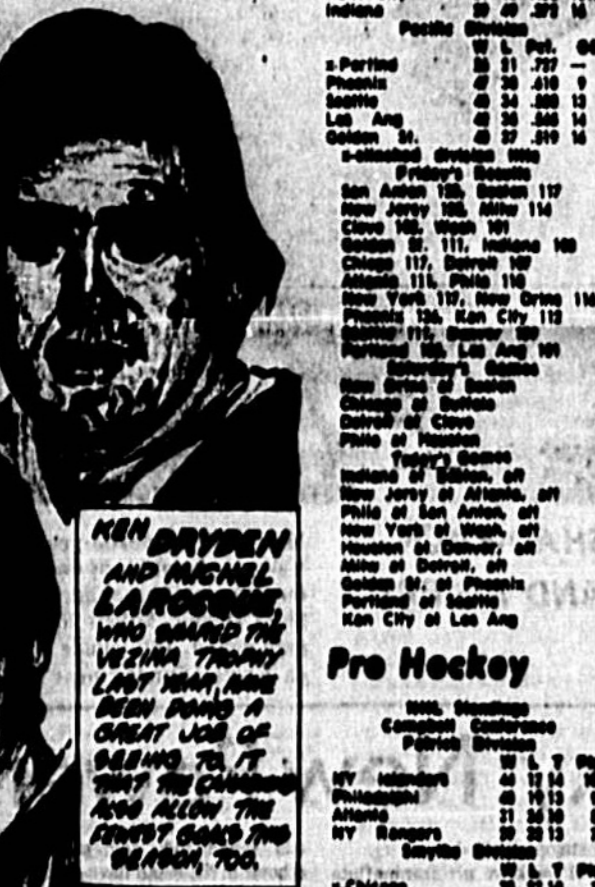

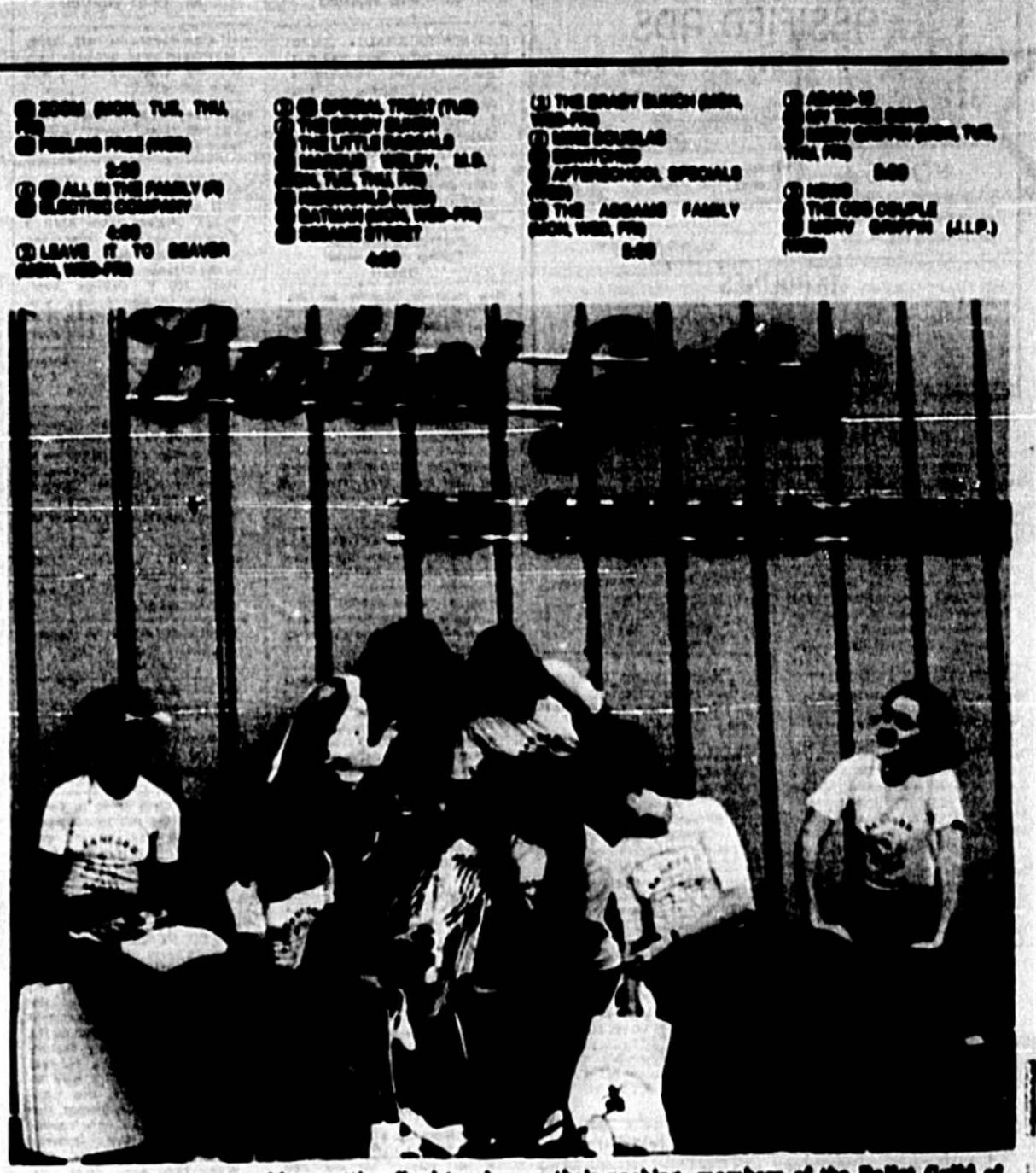

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Inflation, the coal strike and bad weather combined to slash the nation's economic growth for the first three months of 1978 in the no-growth levels of the 1970-77 recession, administration sources report.

The disclosure Friday, three weeks before the Commerce Department is expected to release figures on the nation's Gross National Product, showed recession may be just a real threat to the 1978 economy as inflation — the economic enemy most widely discussed by the administration.

There were indications the administration sought to play down the poor economic news by releasing the information Friday night while President Jimmy Carter was in a beachfront, seven-day trip to Latin America and Africa.

The GNP figure, after stripping away inflation, showed little or no economic growth January through March, far below administration forecasts for increases in the sum of the nation's goods and services.

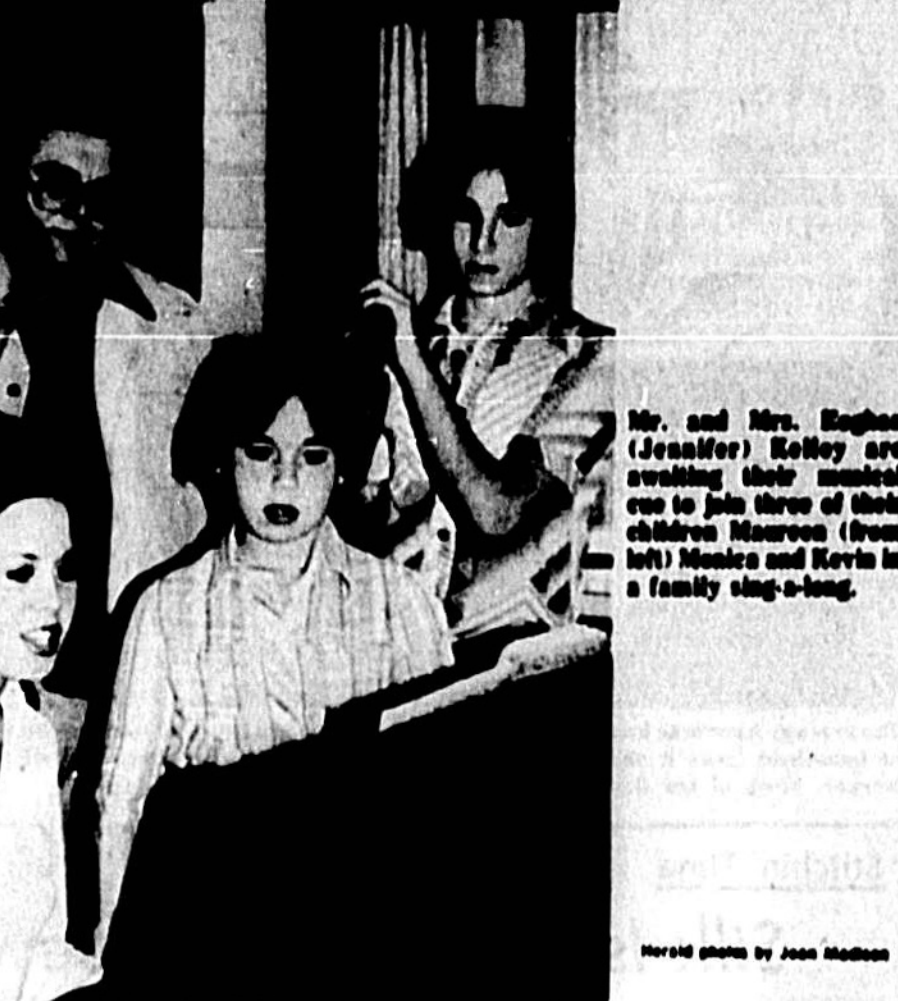

The average American homemaker spends 8.4 hours at household tasks if she is a full-time at-home worker. Much of her day includes: dishwashing, shopping and food preparation . . . and, in some cases, it takes just as much time and energy as it did in grandma's day.

### Mrs. American Homemaker: What Does She Do All Day?

"This is the day we wash the clothes, all on a Monday morning . . ."

It was no simple task. Monday was washday, Tuesday was ironing. Each task took so long, no one ever had to ask what a homemaker did all day, the word.

But what has happened to her day in this age of labor-saving devices? Have frozen foods and the clothes dryer freed her from a more stressful day when they once were? Does she spend her time in leisure—reading, listening to the radio, watching television, or even taking a short nap in the afternoon?

"Recent studies have shown time spent doing housework has actually increased in several areas over the past 20 years," said Margaret Smith, home economist working on the Cornell University time and household production study.

"Today's homemaker seems to have expanded the scope of the job and raised her standards so that even more time is spent on housework. In the early part of the century, there was nothing unusual about wearing a suit or a skirt for several days in a row. Today, it's unthinkable. One wearing the same dress or suit on the same day is considered a disgrace." she said.

One of the most frequently asked questions concerning the homemaker is: "What does she do all day?"

To begin to formulate an answer to this question, a time study was conducted in New York in 1967-68. And, a 20-year comparison survey is being completed in several states this year.

"We have broken down all the household tasks into 10 major categories: food preparation; dishwashing; sleeping; housecleaning; maintenance of home, car, yard and pet; physical care of family; clothing care; construction of household clothing and linens; and management," explained the Smiths.

The most striking feature emerging from this data was the amount of time the homemaker spends doing housework, regardless of whether she is employed, and 8.4 hours in homes with employed wives, the husband's input remains about the same—and the wife's input increases," the home economist explained.

"And the age of these children can also greatly alter the time spent. Almost three additional hours are required to care for a baby instead of a teenager," she said.

If the average working of a full-time homemaker is 8.4 hours, how is it divided? "As my housewife learns, a day is generally 10 minutes here, a half-hour there . . ." Ms. Smith said.

"But the greatest amount of time is devoted to food preparation. This varied from 2.5 hours daily for full-time housewives to 1.5 hours for a non-employed wife inside the home. Those women tend to turn to convenience foods, fast foods and restaurants more frequently," she said.

The only time input which remained constant—whether a woman has two or seven kids, or is a full-time or part-time housewife—is in the sleeping, eating and management field. Approximately one hour is spent in planning and marketing daily—regardless of other factors which underlie the importance of management in the homemaker's life.

Perhaps with an added emphasis on management, the homemaker may eventually spend less time on housework than her grandmother instead of more.

## Pop Warner Rival Football League Formed

A major change in the structure of youth football and basketball programs in Seminole County is anticipated following the granting of a charter for the Seminole Youth Sports Association, a rival league to the Pop Warner League, which last fall under auspices of the Central Florida YMCA, involved 1,200 youngsters in Seminole County.

Don Ruedinger, an Orlando insurance executive who lives in Forest City, recently resigned his position as football director for the YMCA.

Ruedinger is considered a prime candidate to head the new Seminole Youth Sports Association, which plans football and basketball activities as a feeder system to the high school programs.

The new association has a dozen members on its board of directors, and meets Tuesday night to firm up overall plans.

Max Clark, executive director of the YMCA, said this morning the YMCA has no plans of dropping its Pop Warner League program. "We think we have the best program in the U.S.A.," said Clark, "and we are looking forward to bigger and better things next fall. Ruedinger's position will be filled in the near future."

Ken Patrick, a member of the board for the Seminole Youth Sports Association, described the other board members as "people interested in the youth of Seminole County." He noted they were active in some aspect last year with the Pop Warner program. Among them, Bob Timlin, Dave May, Irv Meyers and Gary Snyder are former Pop Warner League board members.

"Simply, we are interested in improving certain aspects of league operations over the way it was last fall," explained Patrick. One of the problems in our

opinion was that too much of the money for overhead was going out of Seminole County."

Another change in format the new association will institute is to eliminate out-of-county travel, those involved said.

The Central Florida YMCA program stretches from St. Cloud to Deland and involves 800 boys in football and 400 girls as cheerleaders, pop squad and team girls.

The YMCA keep centers to ages eight through 14. The new association will concentrate on middle school age youngsters.

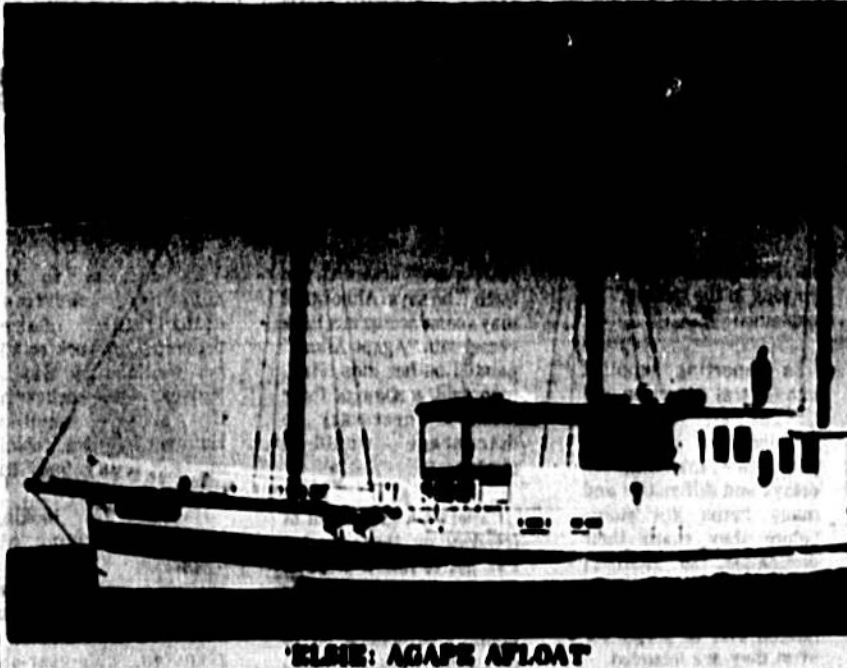

finance his service of delivering books, supplies and medicines to mountain schools and clinics in Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean by buying native crafts and folk art, jewelry, gems, gold and silver to sell in this country on the return trip.

"I try to keep the two parts basically separate; I don't respect those who use religion to further their own end," he explained. "I think I can supply better quality, better-priced goods and sell them for enough money to refuel my ship, pay the crew and enable me to do what I want to help other people."

Saying that "Agape" is the Greek word for a pure unselfish love, Huffman said "I feel a true unselfish love can only be found in the heart of a Christian, but I have found unselfishness throughout in the lives of the people I meet."

"I don't try to do anything to hurt anybody," Huffman said. "But I consider some of the best places to be in are to get the goods into countries where they are needed sometimes receive a few donations that help."

Huffman began planning "Agape Afloat" seven years ago and says he was ready to get it in operation in 1974, but was obstructed by a three-year battle with the U.S. government over his plans.
