Guidelines Handed Down To Curb Spy Agencies

Security Agency will be barred from eavesdropping on conversations to, from or inside the United tates under President Ford's intelligence reorganization, according to administration officials.

The guidelines do not apply to the FBI, which will be governed by a separate set of directives being drawn up by the Justice Department.

The guidelines come after Ford announced at a nationally broadcast news conference Tuesday night his plans to revamp the foreign intelligence organizations. Those plans will enhance the role of new CIA Director

The guidelines would contain a flat prohibition against electronic eavesdropping by the CIA inside the United States, officials said.

Crewmen Abandon Ship

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Crewmen from the 40,000-ton tanker S.S. St. Thomas, who vowed over a month ago to stay aboard until they were paid in full, have left the vessel rather than risk possible removal by immigration

Capt. John Koukis and his 28-man crew had been stranded aboard the rusty-gray ship since Jan. 13, when it was seized by U.S. marshals after the Greek company that owned it defaulted on a bank loan. They began filing down the gangptank late Tuesday on their lawyer's advice, and policemen drove them to a

Reactor Checks Criticized

WASHINGTON (AP) - The federal safety checks on nuclear reaclor controls are less stringent than those governing toasters and hair dryers, according to three engineers who quit their jobs to warn of dangers of

The three, who resigned from middle-level management positions at General Electric's nuclear fivision on Feb. 2 so they could focus attention on nuclear safety defects, warned today that federal reguletions lack any requirement for an independent review of certain nu-

They made their statement in testimony prepared for the Joint Atomic Energy Committee.

Trials Set In Drug Seizure

NEW BERN, N.C. (AP)- Trials have been scheduled or April 12 in U.S. District Court here for a former month's seizure of 22 tons of marijuana.

At arraignment Tuesday before U.S. Magistrate Logan Howell, each man pleaded innocent. All are charged with conspiracy to import marijuana, importing it and possession with intent to distribute marijuana. Maximum penalty for each man is 45 years prison and a \$75,000 fine. Facing trial are former Hallandale, Fla., Mayor John D. Steele and his son John David Steele. George Brent Poppis and Daniel Edward Engle, all of Florida, and six men from the New Bern area.

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (AP)- A Destin, Fla., attorney and two others who represented the plaintiffs in a landmark case challenging conditions in state mental insitutions have been awarded fees totaling more than

The suit resulted in a ruling by U.S. District Court Judge Frank M. Johnson Jr. setting up minimum standards for the treatment of mental patients in state in-Johnson distributed the fees on Tuesday in the wake of a

dismissing the state's appeal of his 1972 order. The principal amount of the attorneys' fees had been on deposit drawing interest during the appeal, and the interest money was also passed on to the attorneys.

Jewel Thief Convicted

HARTFORD (AP) - Anthony W. Cappetta, 53, of Hialeah has been sentenced to two-to-five years in prison for stealing \$10,177 in jewels.

Superior Court Judge Simon S. Cohen noted in his sentencing remarks Tuesday that Cappetta "has been at odds with the legal system for approximately 30 years now." Capetta has a record of convictions in five states dating back to the 1940s.

His latest conviction stems from a June 15 heist from Philip-David Jewelers in West Hartford. Authorities said they recovered a shopping-bag full of jewels from a car Cappetta and John F. "Sonny" Castagna, 34, of Newington were apprehended in after the theft.

WASHINGTON (AF) - A group of generally liberal scholars and politicians today urged mandatory prison sentences for violent offenders and called for an end to the

parole system: The Committee for the Study of Incarceration concluded that a convicted offender should be punished with jail or some lesser penalty primarily "because he deserves it," not because of any hope of rehabilitation. But the panel also recommended that only the most ancious criminale should be jailed longer than five years. The compattee's conclusions from a four-year study were published soday in a book called "Doing Justice."

Mistrial Motion Denied In Lewis Trial

Testimony resumed just before noon today in the firstdegree murder trial of 19-year-old Ronnie James Lewis after Circuit Court Judge Robert B. McGregor denied a defense motion for a mistrial.

Defense attorney Alan Dickey sought the mistrial Tuesday

after the prosecutor, Assistant State Atty. Claude Van Hook, asked arresting officer R.E. Winger of the Seminole Sheriff's Department in front of the 12-member jury if Lewis gave any explanation whatsoever after his arrest "about any shooting." Judge McGregor said the prosecutor's question was "highly improper" and said the court would instruct the jurors to

Lewis was indicted by the Seminole County Grand Jury for first-degree murder in the Dec. 1 pistol slaying of James Lee Williams, 33, of Midway, at the intersection of Midway Avenue

Williams was found dead in his auto and Van Hook indicated in opening statements to the jury that the state will present testimony of an eyewitness to the shooting. Dickey has indicated the defense will claim the shooting

Selection of the jury took most of Tuesday in J McGregor's court.

House Gas Vote Was Shortsighted

The 200 members of the House of Representatives who voted to extend price controls on the biggest natural gas producers theoretically are in a good political position, particularly during an

Presumably they can tell their constituents that they have constrained big and powerful energy interests (read it Goliaths), helped the small producers (Davids), saved homeowners a few dollars a month by keeping gas prices down and fought inflation to boot.

We hope that people of the United States of America won't stand still for that kind of deception. The very best that can be said for the natural gas legislation approved by the House is that it is bad, an abdication of responsibility on the part of

members who voted for it. Distilled to the essence, the purpose of all energy legislation should be to move the United States toward greater independence from foreign

The House-approved measure does not move in this direction for a number of reasons. The first is that it does not encourage conservation of a premium, endangered resource.

When sold in states where it is produced uncontrolled natural gas is snapped up at \$1 to \$2 per natural gas controlled by the federal government cannot begin to meet the demand at 35 cents per

By forcing big producers, who account for 70 per cent of the fuel sold in the United States, to sell for the artifically lowest price, the bill would discourage conservation and continue to encourage less-than-wise uses of this valuable, vanishing

Arguments that exploration will be encouraged by removal of federal price controls on the small producers do not stand up. The days of small operators tapping readily accessible supplies is passing. Most of the promising undeveloped domestic gas fields either are in distant and inaccessible regions or on the continental shelves off our coasts. Both are extremely expensive to explore and develop, probably beyond the credit capabilities of a small producer or even a consortium of small producers. Could a small producer afford to pay even the \$7 billion cost of an Alaskan pipeline, to say nothing of the initial investment needed to put something into that

Another troublesome aspect of the House approach to natural gas prices is that it continues to foster an impression among Americans that there is a cheap way out of our energy problem, and that if we just pass a federal law to retain the status quo today, everything will somehow turn out all right tomorrow. It won't unless we make it turn out by a long range constructive policy. That policy should be to let the free market set the relative costs of fuel so that private industry can gear up to

Good politics is not illusion making, but common sense, such as the Senate displayed when it voted to deregulate all natural gas last year. The interests of America will be served if Senate conferees prevail.

'Honor' Shared

We have no quarrel with Sen. William Proxmire's choice for his "Fleece of the Year" award.

The Wisconsin Democrat, who each month focuses on what he believes to be the most wasteful government program, called the \$66-million jet fleet operated by the Air Force for the convenience of government officials a "private airline for big

Taxpayers, he said, pay more than \$6 million a year to maintain and operate the 23 jets when commercial flights are available to almost every destination. Commercial flights, he added, would not only save the government hundreds of thousands of dollars, but would also help the depressed airline

But Proxmire focused on Cabinet and administration officials in his condemnation of "bigshots who insist on such special treatment."

The senator's congressional colleagues are equally guilty. And they, too, should consider commercial flight schedules and prices — in planning their globe-trotting, giving special attention to coach-section economies

Humidity Important

By JANET TARA

(Second of a Series) Temperature and humidity are probably the two hardest onditions to control in the desert-like atmosphere of the average

While cacti and succulents thrive on these conditions, many ferns, flowering plants and orchids suffer from the low humidity

common to modern housing. Plants kept in offices have a harder battle because of the extremes in temperatures that occur at night and on the weekends when the heat or air conditioning is turned off. Our grandparents grew full, bloom-laden geraniums in their

cool kitchens but in the constant, even heat of today's homes, geraniums suffer and the lower leaves may drop. The easiest, most popular way to raise the humidity in your home is to group plants together on a metal tray filled with pebbles. Keep the water level high enough to cover most of the

pebbles but not high enough to touch the pots. A long spell of wet weather may cut down on a plant's light, but it also temporarily raises the humidity and the plants will look


Frequent misting helps offset dryness for smooth leafed plants, but is not necessary and can be harmful to fuzzy varieties ike gynura aurantiaca (purple velvet plant).

It's best to have one person responsible for the watering of lants. If you have more than one eager gardener in your family, divide the plants equally and make sure each person is responsible for the plants in her or his territory. That goes for regular washing, inspecting for diseases and fertilizing.

If you have a hard time keeping track of which plants need watering once a week, once every other day or once every two weeks, try to group the plants according to pot size and type. To aid your memory, group all plastic potted plants in one area or room; all of the same or similar size, variety and type on one windowsill. Coordinate groups with light requirements.

Big plants pose a more complex watering problem. It's best to have watered enough. Overwatering is very easy with plants in enclosed containers. Try keeping a log book for big plants to help determine when they need watering, but always do the finger test too. Push your finger gently in about one inch to test for dry soil. Then water if necessary






