'Early Out' Kindergarten Money Eliminated

School Board OKs \$75.8 Million Budget

Herald Staff Writer

The \$75.8 million school budget for 1979-80 squeaked past th Seminole County School Board on Monday by a vote of 3 to 2. School board members William Kroll and Roland Williams cast the dissenting votes.

The school budget calls for a reduced tax rate of \$7.07 per \$1,000 assessed valuation, or \$1.28 less than the rate for this fiscal year, which ends Sept. 30. On a home assessed for tax purposes at \$30,000 property taxes under the new rate of \$7.07 per \$1,000 assessed valuation would

total \$212.10 or \$38.40 less than the taxes paid this year at the rate of \$8.35 per \$1,000 assessed valuation. Despite appeals from the audience Monday night, and from taxpayers for the past three weeks, the school board refused to

'War Against Terrorism'

Threatened By Thatcher

SLIGO, Ireland (UPI) — The assassination Monday of the 79-year-old Lord Louis Mountbatten, "Uncle Dickie" to Queen Elizabeth II, drew a threat from British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher "to wage the war against terrorism with relentless determination until it is won." Mountbatten, one of Britain's most distinguished soldier-statesmen; his grandson, Nicholas Brabourne, 15, and a 17-year-old boatman were killed instantly by a bomb blast that tore his yacht apart off the small Atlantic Coast village of Mulleghmore, 12 miles south of the Northern

The IRA said in Belfast it set the 50-pound bomb and detonated it by remote control as Mountbatten, a World War II Allied commander, and members of his family were leaving on a fishing trip near his annual holiday home of 30 years, Cassiebawn Castle. One of those critically injured in the blast, the dowager Lady Brabourne, 84, died in Sligo hospital today, a

IRA Ambushes 2 Patrols

WARRENPOINT, Northern Ireland (UPI) - The outlawed IRA, in its heaviest single blow against the British Army in a decade of strife, ambushed two patrols with land mines and killed 18 soldiers in what was immediately dubbed the "Narrow Water massacre." Monday's incident at the eastern end of the border with the Irish republic raised to 319 the number of British troops killed since they went into the province in force in

Five wounded soldiers were on the critical list and there was an unexplained body on the Irish Republic side of the frontier, 200 yards across a narrow inlet of Warrenpoint Lough, known as Narrow Water, where the ambush took

U.S., China Sign Accords

PEKING (UPI) — Chinese Premier Hua Guofeng today accepted an invitation from President Carter to visit the United States and the two nations signed new agreements on hydroelectric power and cultural exchanges. The official New China news agency said Hua had ac-

epted "with pleasure" the Carter invitation, which was included in a letter handed to the Chinese leader visiting Vice President Walter Mondale. China said Hua would visit the United States at an "appropriate time" and that Carter also was invited to visit China at a "convenient" time. Carter is expected to visit China sometime early next year.

Bomb Blast Injures Four

BRUSSELS, Belgium (UPI) — A powerful bomb ripped through the medieval Grand Place in the historic heart of Brussels today just minutes before a British military band was to give an outdoor concert, police said. Four persons were injured, two seriously, in what police sources said could be another attack on a British target by

The blast shattered windows throughout the historic square and wrecked the outdoor platform on which the visiting British band was to have given a concert.



Salvation Of The Presidency

As the Delta Queen rounded the bend to dock at St. Louis, Jimmy Carter could look back on a rewarding trip through the American heartland. He spent a week doing something at which he excels - talking one-on-one with "ordinary" people, those whose lives are a world away from the political sophisticates, bureaucrats and lobbyists of official Washington.

But this interlude on the river, as refreshing as it may have been, does not solve any of the muchdiscussed problems of Mr. Carter's administration. The salvation of his presidency does not lie in crowds waving from the banks of the Mississippi. but back at the White House.

Mr. Carter's trip down the river proved only that the whistle-stop tour is still alive and well in American politics, and, as always, a media event. However, the old ritual of presenting one-self to the people, in this case as an unpretentious passenger among many on a vacation cruise, replenishes Mr. Carter's political capital where such replenishment is needed the least.

Mr. Carter does not need to remind Americans that he has the common touch. They know that already, perhaps too well. Opinion polls show a sustained respect for his decency, sincerity and humility even as they show an ebbing of confidence in his performance as president.

The words of personal encouragement Mr. Carter heard from Midwesterners are perhaps less important to his future than the words of advice he received recently from his old friend Griffin Bell. Retiring as attorney general, Mr. Bell gently scolded the president for habits that tend to "trivialize" his office. "The American people want the president to act like the president," he said.

Mr. Carter has four months to act like the president before the primaries and conventions of 1980 force him to start acting like a candidate. The best place to act like a president is in the White House, not out among the people, as beckoning as the crowds may be. What Mr. Carter should .. Social Security funds will be sound" for the surrender to the presumptuous airs of an "imperial" presidency, a governing style he rejects. I means simply that he should start using the power

and authority of the Oval Office in the way it is intended to be used. Not all of the examples of his predecessors who understood the uses of presidential power are bad ones. It requires no compromise with moral principle, or with the personal loyalties he feels sodeeply, to take charge of an administration which even leaders of his own party are coming to regard as a sinking ship.

Mr. Carter needs to make sure the left hand knows what the right hand is doing in his administration. He needs to see that our government speaks with a consistent voice. He needs to go beyond railing against "special interests" and should be trying to reconcile their points of view to achieve the compromises which are the stuff of representative government.

From St. Paul to St. Louis people have given the impression that they like Jimmy Carter — they want him to succeed. But can this likable fellow do what has to be done in the White House? Three years ago the verdict of voters was that he could

WASHINGTON (NEA) - Battered by recent staggering Social Security tax increases, the public faces either even steeper withholding rates or benefit cuts in the coming years.

The Clock

The unpleasant choice has developed because national leaders have shielded the full story of Social Security financing. The impact of past decisions is becoming more apparent with the growing number of senior citizens collecting ever higher premiums.

The Congressional Budget Office — Congress's source of economic expertise — predicted recently that by 1964 the government could have trouble paying benefits on time to the elderly. The government, of course, will make sure that all its obligations are paid. It faces several options, including a relatively simple transfer of funds from the disability and hospital insurance programs — the smaller programs operated by the Social Security system — to the old-age

Or Congress could reduce Social Security benefits or supplement Social Security tax The forecast of new problems is disconcerting because Congress in 1977 enacted a huge crease in Social Security taxes — an additional \$227 billion in the next decade. At the time, President Carter said the bill would 'guarantee

County Rejects Hike In \$40 Million Budget

Funds Denied For Human Service Groups

The proposed \$40 million Seminole County budget for 1979-80 Tuesday night survived the first of two scheduled public hearings with only one minor change directed by the county com-

Following two and a half hours of hearings, the commissioners agreed to increase by \$4,000 the amount of general revenue funds allotted to Seminole Community Action. The proposed budget had called for an allotment of \$15,000 to SCA. The increase to \$19,000 means the social service agency will be funded at the same level

"This is a big help, but it is, basically, still a maintenance budget. We are getting the same as we got last year," said Louise Crawford, SCA representative. But while SCA was successful in its appeals, several other

human service agencies were not. Representatives from Community Care for the Elderly Congregate Meals, the Katherine Anderson Comprehensive Work

Information and Referral (I&R) Service each asked for additional funds. All were refused. Patrick Murray, director of the Katherine Anderson Center,

workshop in Seminole County serving adult retarded persons. He said the closest workshop in the area now is in south Orlando, a 60mile round trip from Sanford. "There are 300 adults who need our service. This is one of the few counties in the state without a facility like we are planning."

"It baffles me that our entire grant request was rejected by you," he said. The workshop directors had asked for \$20,000 from the county, but Murray said he would settle for any contribution that could be
