Home Builders Urge Caution On Land Code Herald Staff Writer

The Chairman of the Seminole County ranch of the Home Builders Association of Mid-Florida urged county commissioners Tuesday to take time in dealing with the newly revised and compiled county Land Bevelopment

The code is a compilation of all the rules and regulations relating to land development prepared by county staff. Some revisions of those rules were made by a special Land Use Advisory Committee in March.

The code is scheduled to be adopted in

But in looking over the first draft of the document, the Home Builders Association submitted to the county a list of 42 specific objections or suggestions relating to just the chapter on subdivision

"It would be virtually impossible to engineer a subdivision based on this document," Luddy Goetz, chairman o the Seminole County branch of the Home Builders Association, told comnissioners at a work session.

Militants Relay Warning

As Iran Legislature Opens

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) - Iran's Islamic Parliament convened today with a message from Avatollah Ruhollah Khomeini urging the assembly to fight foreign influences and a warning from militants that lawmakers must furnish an "acceptable reason" if they decide not to try the 53 American hostages. Khomeini has given the Parliament the task of deciding the fate of the captive Americans, who are

spending their 206th day as hostages. After Khomeini's only son, Sayed Ahmad, read his father's message to the Parliament, called the Majlis, its members chanted: "We are your soldiers, Khomeini. We take orders from you, Khomeini." Then the militants who seized the U.S. Embassy Nov. 4 sent a six-point communique to Parliament; according to Tehran radio. The final point was a

"Our great leader, Imam Khomeini, at the beginning of hostage-taking said if the United States will return the former shah and his stolen wealth, the hostages. . will be freed and expelled from Iran. Otherwise, they will be tried and punished and this demand has been repeated and supported by the people all this time.' . The message added, "Any decision other than this has to have an acceptable reason for the people of

S. Korea Rakes Capital

KWANGJU, South Korea (UPI) - Army troops provincial capital of Kwangju to flush out die-hard insurgents who led South Korea's most violent insurrection since the Korean War. But an anti-government torchlight demonstration

flared 40 miles away in Mokpo, with 30,000 people vowing that the government must "pay for the blood in Kwangju."

A total of 186 people were confirmed killed in the nine-day insurrection, including 17 rebels and two soldiers who died when crack army commando troops retook the city in a hinz pre-dawn attack Monday. Reports of total casualties are conflicting but one civic leader estimated the death toll in the uprising at between 400 and 600 and the number of those injured

10 Dead In Lebanon Fights

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) - Fighting today between heavily-armed militant Moslems and leftist militiamen on Beirut's streets left as many as 10 people dead, a Lebanese rightist radio said. Witnesses said the night-long battles, in which heavy machine guns, mortars and rocket propelled grenades

were used, subsided by daybreak. But even after dawn, despite a cease-fire between the warring factions, sniper fire continued in Beirut's southern suburbs and kept residents off the streets,

India To Buy Soviet Arms

NEW DELHI, India (UPI) - India has signed a \$1.6 billion agreement to buy weapons from the Soviet Union in New Delhi's largest arms purchase in history.

Defense Ministry sources said today. The agreement to buy Soviet arms on credit was signed by an Indian delegation led by Defense Minister S. S. Sidhu who concluded a week-long Moscow visit Tuesday, the sources said.

Midway Station Slated LOW COST

Seminole County will build a new \$200,000 fire station on land it agreed Tuesday to lease from the Sanford Airport Authority at \$2,100 per year for the next two years. The lease, approved on a 4 to 1 vote, is subject to renewal every two years. Details concerning the method for computing rent increases have yet to be worked out.

Commission Chairman Bill Kirchhoff objected to the lease, preferring the county purchase land for the fire station, which is intended to serve the Midway area. But Seminole County Public Safety Director Gary Kaiser told the board his staff had looked at five other sites where land was available for purchase, but "prices were not remotely within reason."

In earlier negotiations, the airport authority had asked the county to take on the responsibility of fire protection for the airport, but Kaiser recommended against this, since special equipment and training would make the project too costly for the county.

Senator Gives A Break To 'Common Folk' Speeders

TALLANDESEE, Fla. (UPI) - Sen. David McClair says Florida Highway Patrol troopers ignore the speeding violations of lawmakers and the governor's staff, so common folks deserve a break too.

McClain, R-Tampa, was instrumental Tuesday in amending the so-called speeding surcharge legislation to kick in with an extra \$50 fine at 65 mph rather than a \$25 fine at 55 mph as originally proposed by Gov. Bob "All of us here probably go 65 mph and yet we don't

.Gas-Tax Tactics Ripped

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - An angry Rep. Fred Jones is bracing for a fight with Gov. Bob Graham over state road policy and a proposal to raise the gas tax. Taking the offensive Tuesday, Jones branded as "detestable" the tactics of Graham lobbyists who have been telling lawmakers the governor will veto local road projects unless they accept a penny increase in the eight-cent tax.

Jones, D-Auburndale, and chairman of the House Transportation Committee, has opposed the controversial measure from the beginning despite Graham's repeated assertions it is needed for new road projects and a mass transit program.

"Members have been told their local projects would be done away with." Jones said, taking the House floor on a point of personal privilege. "I find that absolutely detestable. The whole process is one of absolute contempt for the Legislature."

Never one to back down from a fight, Jones threatened to radically alter-state road policy by appropriating money by the project instead of in a lump sum to the Department of Transportation.

Malpractice Bill Passes

Cabinet To Lift Ban

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - Schools districts around the state can breathe easier now that the Cabinet is ready to lift a moratorium on the sale of school construction bonds.

Record high interest rates put a freeze on \$34 million worth of classrooms for which bids had been received and another \$23.3 million ready for bidding when Education Commissioner Ralph Turlington imposed the ban April 14. At the time interest rates for the tax-free bonds were

at a record-high 9.4 percent and would have added immensely to construction costs. Since then the rate has slipped to 7.3 percent. Dr. Gene Chick, associate commissioner of

educational facilities construction, indicated on Tuesday that Turlington and the Cabinet would lift the ban next week. Buh he said it may be August before the bonds go on the market since iffterest rates may drop

Fishermen Plan Protest

KEY WEST, Fla. (UPI) - Commercial fishermen mount a march on the Federal Building in downtown Key West today to press a demand for return of their boats impounded for importing illegal aliens in the Cuban refugee sealift.

The leader of the demonstration is David Trujillo, 27year-old co-owner of a Key West seafood company. He said he expected up to 1,000 fishermen from south Florida, Tampa, Savannah, Ga., the Carolinas and Texas to participate. They were asked to gather at nearby Stock Island and motor to the federal building Despite a warning from Monroe County Sheriff William Freeman that the fishermen's parade permit allows them to march only on the sidewalks, Trujillo declared: "We're going to surround the building and keep it mostly in front until the federal officials come out to meet our demands. "We have one demand: Turn our boats loose," Trujillo said.

Liberty City: A Grim Lesson

For millions of Americans, the televised scenes of the recent rioting in Miami together with the tragic toll of dead and injured can only have evoked painful memories of the fires that seared so many of this country's cities during the 1960s. Now, as then, we are left to ask why it happened. By all accounts, the immediate provocation was

the acquittal of four former Dade County police officers charged with the beating death of an insurance agent apprehended for a traffic violation. The insurance agent was black. The four policemen charged with killing him were white, as were the members of the jury that acquitted them.

But however outrageous these circumstances, and especially the jury's decision, this case alone seems unlikely to have incited the worst rioting in the United States in more than a decade. In fact, the death of the insurance agent and the

acquittal of those charged with his murder were but the latest in a series of incidents perceived in Miami's black community as evidence of a racially motivated double standard of justice and law enforcement.

These corrosive suspicions, and the simmering discontent they bred, were surely compounded by the economic distress of much of Miami's black population. Nearly 40 percent of Dade County's 225,000 black residents have incomes that fall below the poyerty level. Unemployment in the black community there stands at 17 percent, a full 10 percentage points higher than the national unemployment rate. And, unless Miami's black community has somehow escaped a national phenomenon, unemployment among black youths

in Miami probably runs to 40 percent or more. Thus, it is not terribly difficult to understand how some of those living in Miami's Liberty City ghetto could imagine that the statistical gains registered by black Americans in the aggregate since the early 1960s had no relevance for them. It is a lamentable fact of American political life that voter registration among poor blacks is

abysmally low. For whatever complex mix of reasons, all too many ghetto dwellers see no point in the conventional forms of political participation. There can be no doubt, then, that some portion of the motivation for the mayhem in Miami should be attributed to rage on the part of people who saw themselves as dispossessed and,

None of this, of course, can be permitted to integral components of the two nights of rioting in Miami. At least 17 persons are dead and more then 350 injured. The casualties, some shot by snipers and others dragged from their cars and kicked to death, include blacks as well as whites.

Property damage, still being tabulated, will run into the hundreds of millions of dollars. Some of the businesses looted and torched upon will not reopen, and this will mean fewer jobs for black citizens who need them desperately. Nor will the rioting do anything, for the moment at least, to improve race relations in a city, like so many others, where racial harmony is a fragile commodity requiring constant care.

Still, there are constructive lessons that can be learned even before the ashes cool in Liberty City. One is that the quest for maximum economic opportunity for all citizens must be pursued lest we condemn an underclass of poor — not all black by any means — to permanent dependence despair and frustration-spawned violence. And the second is that while this larger challenge is being met, public officials must ensure that law enforcement and administration of justice are color-blind, and that his is so perceived by every





By the time most of us heard it from our mothers or grandmothers, it sounded like sage advice from Ben Franklin, "Worry about the pennies and the dollars will take care of

Many people have already cut their food purchasing as low as it can go. Still it's not enough! What more can be done in staying with lower priced foods, planned menus and concentrated shopping trips?

First, pare down both recipes and the size of servings. Many ground beef and sausage recipes can be managed quite well with about one-fourth pound less of the meal product. Two ounces of protein in the entree is recommended, but many are still serving three to four ounces. Add dairy touches to make foods more nutritious and flavorful to make budgeting more appealing. Stay with seasonal vegetables and fruits to round out the menu.

Another important point to keep in mind is to serve well balanced meals, that is food from the basic four food groups. This creates a feeling of satisfaction all its own.

> MACARONI-CHEESE RING, VEGETABLE SAUCE (6 servings)

Fold into macaroni mixture. Spoon mixture into well buttered 6 1/2-cup ring mold. Place mold in a large roasting pan on oven rack. Fill pan with hot water to 1 inch from top of mold. Bake 45 to 50 minutes or until knife inserted near center comes out clean. Remove mold from pan and let stand 10 minutes before unmolding onto

Meanwhile, for sauce, melt butter in a large skillet with a cover. Cook onion until tender, about 5 minutes. Add zucchini, carrot, peas, celery, green pepper, salt, sugar, besil and garlic powder. Cover and cook 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Blend together water, cornstarch and bouillon; stir into vegetables. Bring to boiling. Add tomatces; cook and stir 3 minutes. Keep warm. To serve, spoon some sauce in center of macaroni ring; pass the remainder.







Meanwhile in small saucepan combine remaining 34 cup sugar water; cook over low heat, stirring constantly until sugar is dissolved. Add orange and lemon slices; boil, uncovered, 20 to 25 minutes until liquid is reduced to 1/2 cup. Remove from heat, discard fruit; stir in liqueur. As soon as cake is removed from oven, puncture cake with fork or food pick. Gradually pour syrup over cake until all syrup is absorbed. Cool completely in pan. Cut in diamond shapes. Yield: About 18 to 24 servings.
