"For which of you, wishing to build a tower, does not sit down first and calculate the outlays that are necessary, whether he has the means to complete it." (Lake 14:28) I was struck by an editorial in The Herald last week which attributed the break-up of many marriages to the immaturity of the parties entering into marriage. I thoroughly agreed with it. Every marriage, however perfect it may seem on the surface, has its problems. Yet the majority of marriages survive; not merely survive but are happy and successful. So it seems obvious that the break-up of a marriage is due not to defects in the institution of marriage or to any insurmountable problems in this particular union but to defects in the parties themselves, to immaturity and lack of understanding on the part of one or both as to the true nature and purpose, the rights and responsibilities of marriage.

The general law of the Catholic Church warns that the pastor "shall not neglect to teach the parties to be married the sanctity of the sacrament of matrimony, the mutual obligations of married people and the duties of parents toward their offspring." Many non-Catholic Churches have similar laws but we are still faced with couples who come in, license in hand, to be married at 24-hour notice. Even if it were possible to do as they wish, such a sudden decision to embark on a lifelong adventure without prior preparation indicates an immaturity and irresponsibility which should cause hesitation. In the Catholic Church along with various other formalities, the engaged couple must first complete a premarriage course on the duties, rights and responsibilities of marriage. In our own parish we are presenting a course for high school seniors and college students on preparation for marriage. We feel they can be helped by a course dealing not only with the moral rights and wrongs of marriage but with ual happy marriage.

for marriage. Their parents did not have to read books or attend such courses, yet did very well in their marriage. Some couples are embarrassed by the idea, others resent the suggestion that they need to prepare for marriage. It is true that marriage has existed for a long time and it may be contended that man's natural instinct is sufficient to guide people in their marriage. Formal training for marriage is a very recent development. Fifty years ago to suggest that a prospective bride or groom read a book about marriage would have been considered indelicate or even improper. People married without any thought of attending courses or reading any book on marriage, other than perhaps a good cook book.

Today we live in age of courses. There are courses for everyone and everything. Skills and trades that formerly were acquired by on the job apprenticeship to a qualified master now are more formally acquired by means of a course and a diploma. If typing, plumbing or automotive repairing require training, do not the more important tasks of establishing a home and raising a family demand even more thorough

Marriage today is more difficult than in times past. Even on the material plane our living standards have risen and so too has their cost in terms of time and training. Today, too, we are a nation of transients. In the past, in-laws and older married couple is often on their own, away from their families, among complete strangers. They are completely dependent on each other, psychologically and socially as well as materially, at a time when they are struggling to adjust to a whole new relationship of marriage. There are often the problems and tensions developed in the normal husband-wife relationship by a wife who continues her job or her career after marriage. Finally marriage in our society is not what it was 30 years ago. Then divorce was unusual; marriages were made to last. Today divorce is common, even socially acceptable.

We cannot adopt a negative attitude, seeing only the problems and pitfalls of marriage, but neither can we bury our heads in the sand. Young people are always certain that these things will not happen in their marriages but they know that they happen to other apparently ideal marriages, that they need to know more about this way of life they are adopting so that their enthusiasm and determination will be guided by sound knowledge. Mountain climbers do not reach the top by pretending they are walking on a level plain but by careful planning of their route and mode of travel. A general course in map reading is not enough, they must study in detail every contour and crevasse. So, too, a parish sermon or a school course on marriage is not sufficient. Many points can be mentioned there only in a general way which need to be discussed in detail with personal questions answered in specific

and concrete terms. There are these many reasons why a thorough preparation for marriage is desirable. 
