





City 'Quitting' **Utility Business**

A resolution which would eliminate an \$8 utility allowance and leave the residents of the Castle Brewer and William Clark housing projects to pay their own electric bills is expected to be approved tonight by the Sanford Housing Authority (SHA).

According to SHA Executive Director Thomas Wilson. the proposed resolution "could cause a problem" because residents of the two projects, in order to receive electrical service, would have to pay a \$20 hook-up fee and pay menthly charges to Florida Power & Light. The controversial issue is on the agenda of SHA's 7:30

p.m. meeting in the conference room at the Redding Gardens housing project on Locust Avenue and 5th Street The SHA has been paying utility costs and the allowance, but now Wilson says that the Authority can no longer afford the costs because of decreased federal

"We're getting out of the utility business," he said "The losses have been too great to absorb." Wilson said the rent on the 211 units in the two complexes will drop by \$8, the utility allowance, but the residents will be subject to any rate hikes by the power

"Whether we like it or not, it's someting that's going to be there," Wilson said. Also, tonight the SHA will vote on resolution for a Housing Assistance Plan for the city of Sanford which will be used in applying for federal funds from the Depart-

ment of Housing and Urban Development. The four-pronged plan, which lists problems with substandard housing in the city will be presented if approved to the City Commission during their Monday meeting for the commission's consideration. Problems listed in the plan reveal that there is an

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Children of parents laid off as a result of the recession may be eligible for free or reduced price school lunches, Education Commissioner Ralph Turlington says.

Youngsters from a family of four with an income of \$5,640 or less may receive free lunches, while children from a family of four with an income of \$7,900 or less are eligible for reduced price lunches, he said in a news

Maximum allowable family income levels vary with the size of the family, he said.

Jail Term Handed Out

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) - A Tampa man convicted of selling obscene materials has been given the maximum sentence of two years in jail and a \$2,000 fine.

Congress and the President are faced with the necessity of compromise or their divergent views on economic and energy policy will lead to a stalemate and test of wills.

As matters now stand, both Mr. Ford and the Democratic leadership in the House and Senate agree that the American people must face some kind of pressure to use less imported oil, but they do not agree on how the pressure should be applied. They both want to rebate some 1974 income taxes to the public, but they disagree on how much should be refunded and how the money should be apportioned among different classes of taxpayers. They both are also looking toward longer-range tax cuts for the sake of stimulating the economy.

It is too early to assess the chances for compromise because the Democrats have yet to line up behind a particular approach to the energy and tax issues. For political reasons if none other, we can be sure that the Democrats will not be satisfied unless they can put their own imprint on any programs that finally emerge.

Who compromises the most is not so important as giving the first priority to resolving disagreements that threaten the most harm if they are not resolved. Clearly, the long-range need is to move ahead with a comprehensive attack on our energy problems, which existed before the current recession began and which will be with us long

The current dialogue between the White House and Capitol Hill suffers from mixing apples with oranges - considering economics and energy as part of a single "package."

The weakness in President Ford's approach is that he has combined his new tariff on imported oil - a sound move toward energy conservation with a tax cut that does nothing toward achieving our energy goals. If we are going to pay more for fuel, what we want to be paying for is some relief from the threat of an energy crisis, not an exercise in tax reform or pump-priming.





PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP) - The commander-inchief of United States forces in the Pacific, Adm. Noel Gaylor, visited Phnom Penh today to review the situation of the besieged Cambodian government and assess American assistance to it. Gaylor was meeting with President Lon Nol and Gen. Sosthene Fernandez, the commander of the Cambodian armed forces. A U.S. official reported that the U.S. government is going to hire one of the American airlines to fly a special 10-day ammunition airlift to Phnom Penh. He said the airlift will cost \$1.2 million.

Park Support Declines

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) - President Chung Hee Park today termed the referendum endorsement of his policies "a valuable decision on the part of the people." But the voting returns showed a drop of more than 20 per cent in public support for Park's authoritarian rule. The pro-Park vote was about 58 per cent of those eligible to vote, but in a 1972 referendum more than 80 per cent of the electorate approved Park's revision of the constitution to increase his powers and prolong his stay in office in-

Iran Switches Currency

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) - Iran has cut its currency loose from the dollar, but Washington officials doubt that the action will mean any change in the price of Iranian oil. The Central Bank of Iran announced Wednesday that the value of Iran's currency, the rial, will now be pegged to the International Monetary Fund's new "paper gold" called the Special Drawing Right, or SDR. The action was interpreted as an indication of growing distrust in the dollar, which has been losing ground recently on foreign money markets.

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) - Seni Pramoj, a leader of the opposition to military dictatorship in Thailand for three decades, was elected prime minister today. Seni, 69, received 133 votes to 52 for Chatichai Choonhavan, a diplomat and former general who was backed by the military. Seni, whose party won 72 of the 269 seats in the lower house, is expected to form a minority coalition gov-


The student's name is visible and a lamp by each slot flickers when he speaks. She can see at all times who is talking. whispering, giggling or just making noises.

The students, answering the ring of their home phone especially provided by the school - are connected at the teacher's console on a conference hookup. As in a regular classroom, they can chat together while waiting for the rest of the class to come in. As the class proceeds, all students hear the teacher's questions.

Stating flatly that "we have a very blighted urban area" in the city of Sanford, the executive director of the Sanford Housing Authority (SHA) has revealed a survey which shows that more than 2 classified substandard or dilapidated.

Substandard housing is classified as buildings which are in need of minor structural repairs, such as a new roof, rebuilt foundation or in need of

The statistics are included in a detailed Housing are Assistance Plan which lists four major problems with the city's low income housing and the SHA's

The plan, which was approved last night by the SHA will be presented to City Commission for consideration as part of the Community Development plan which the city is formulating in order to receive funding from the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The four major problems listed in the plan prepared by Executive Director Thomas Wilson

- Inadequate Housing Supply - Housing Preservation Needed

Inadequate Economic Resources - Lack of Physical Development The survey, conducted by a city survey crew. pointed out that the main concentration of substandard housing existed in the areas of the central city, Georgetown, Goldsboro and northwest of

Sanford Municipal Airport. The survey shows that slightly more than 42 per cent of the total substandard housing of the city is concentrated in the four areas which occupy 10 per cent of the city land area for housing

Expounding on the problems, Wilson said low

income families have no freedom of choice as to the location of their home or their environment "They are restricted to the same areas where the

substandard housing is located," Wilson said.

Wilson also said that "overt discrimination existed with the sale, rental and financing of

"If you want to build out of the problem housing

area, you are going to have trouble getting the financing," he said.

Proposed solutions in the assistance plan include additional housing built with HUD funding, development of a local open housing policy and human rights board to hear grievances and that substandard housing be rehabilitated in order that low income families may purchase the houses

Wilson also mentioned an urban homesteading program in which the city would turn over repossessed housing to low income families for a small price with the requirement that the residents must stay in the location for four years.


