If they are as broke as they say are, it's going to take more work than that to get them out of the red and make that loan any good.

The Tampa Tribune, whose venerable editor, Ed Lambright, is shocked and horrified at the suggestion that the government compel everyone over 60 to retire on a pension. The idea is too preposterous for serious consideration," says the Tribune. The trouble with this country is that too many people would like to retire at about 25 or 30.

Five Grains Of Corn

A Thanksgiving custom occasionally observed is to start the meal with the table bare except for a plate containing five grains of popcorn for each person present. They are doled out and eaten immediately after the blessing is asked. The feast follows. This recalls the five grains of corn to which the Pilgrims are said to have been reduced before their ship of plenty came in. It's a good custom. Americans sit down to turkeys dripping with fat juices, vegetables with butter and cream sauces, white bread and butter, fruit jellies, dessert, coffee with sugar or honey and cream. But all over the world people are still starving. Displaced and wandering, lacking decent shelter, clothing or food, miserable and unhappy people by the thousand roam over Europe and the Far East.

What can be done? For one thing, Americans can make it plain to their Congressmen that there must be no more war. The United Nations must be made as real and effective an instrument for governing itself and its members as the United States with its separate states. Bounties must be bought to help take care of the expense of feeding and clothing people made homeless by the war, and taxes must be paid at a level high enough to keep this nation moving towards solvency and to avoid the pitfalls of inflation.

The hungry everywhere must be fed. That is the first last, greatest necessity. If the United States of America is the mightiest power on earth, it must not act as one who, "clothed in a little brief authority, doth use it like a tyrant", but with the quiet and secure strength, understanding, and gentleness of an Elder Brother in the Brotherhood of Man.

Training For Youth

It is reassuring to learn, from a recent poll, that 70 per cent of American voters are in favor of a one-year peacetime period of military training for all eligible Americans. After the experience of these recent wars, and first-hand observation from many million Americans of what is required for national safety, few are likely to quarrel with the principle involved.

A time may come, as men and women hope and pray, when chastened nations will know war no more, and all can sit in peace, under their own fig and apple trees, but such blessings are still a dream. And it is learned, far better than formerly, that a reasonable term of military service under leaders void of "militarism" can be of much benefit to young men in general.

Indeed, a time may come when, without need of general military defense, similar training may be carried on for the physical and mental benefit of eligible youth rather than for armed defense of their country.

Young America

An interesting sidelight on the housing situation comes from a study of the age of existing residences in 200 American cities. The analysis shows that about 25 per cent are more than 50 years old; 29 per cent have stood from 30 to 50 years; about 23 per cent were built 20 to 30 years ago; and about 23 per cent classified as "modern", are less than 20 years old.

Looked at sectionally the report disclosed that the Californian-southwest area has less than 10 per cent of its houses older than 50 years.

When I wrote last week you remember I was in Bucharest, the capital of Rumania. About 85 per cent of the people of Rumania are farmers—they call them peasants. Rumania and Bulgaria, as you know, are occupied by the Russian Army under the Armistice with Rumania. The British and we, however, have members on the Allied Control Commission but the Chairman is the Commanding Russian General Lt. General Suslov. In addition to talking to the head of each of the 4 main Rumanian political parties I talked to some of the most outstanding Non-Partisan statesmen of Rumania. I was not able to talk to the King, or the Rumanian Government because our Government has not recognized the present Government of Rumania. We take the position that the Government is not in accordance with the agreement at Yalta. On the afternoon of the fifth our representative on the Control Council and I had a long talk with the Commanding Russian General about the whole point of controversy between Russia on one side and Great Britain and the United States on the other, and I hope our discussions did some good in bringing about a closer understanding among our countries. At least our conference ended most pleasantly because we finished our conference ended most pleasantly because when we finished our talk General Suslov had us in for a typical spread, which of course included vodka. I found the Russian General was a good story teller and I contributed a few myself. When I left Bucharest the following morning a Russian Major General with many aides was at the airport to see me and my assistant off. I learned of an incident which greatly contributed to American popularity in Bucharest. A little Rumanian girl, beautiful and talented, was stricken with infantile paralysis and completely paralyzed. ### No Special Plans For Thanksgiving Made In Plymouth

PLYMOUTH, Mass., Nov. 21. (AP)—Thanksgiving means a great deal in Plymouth. That's because it was in Plymouth that the Pilgrim fathers observed the first Thanksgiving. Tradition in the

seacoast town demands a special celebration each November. Before the war, Thanksgiving was the occasion for much pageantry in Plymouth's memorial hall. But this year, no funds were set aside for anything special, because the town fathers hadn't foreseen that this would be a penitence Thanksgiving. Besides, it's no longer possible to bring in the pine trees and forest finery which used to be the scene of the pageantry. State fire laws pre-

vent all that—following the tragedy of Boston's Coconut Grove night club fire in 1942. So this year in the old Pilgrim town, they're going to keep it simple. They're planning turkey dinners—the same as you probably are at your homes. And in some 500 of the homes, there will be a special feeling of Thanksgiving, because men have come home from the wars.

After dinner, a football game will be the big event. At Stevens Field, near the shore, a team from Plymouth meets a team from nearby Stoughton. And every man on both teams is an overseas veteran. Then at 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon, the church bells will call the good people to prayers. In the First Baptist Church on Cole's hill, they will gather together for Thanksgiving services. And at 6:00 in the evening, Plymouth will be the kick-off point for a coast-to-coast broadcast in observance of this penitence Thanksgiving. The Plymouth broadcast will emanate from candle-lit old Harlow house, still standing after nearly 270 years. That is Thanksgiving as it will be observed in the place where Thanksgiving began.

### Early Supply Of New Cars Is Not Likely, Says Editor

DETROIT—When will new cars be available in volume at dealers new that ceiling prices have been released?

Well, that's a question that the automotive industry finds hard to answer. As reported Press A, to- day's Editor David J. Wilkie has just completed an inquiry in an effort to find the answer. Here's what he's turned up:

There is an accumulated demand for upward of 15,000,000 new cars. In the little more than three and one-half months since reconversion started, the auto industry has produced about 45,000 units. They now are finding it going more difficult as the supply of parts and sub-assemblies runs out in many factories.

Of the total available in Detroit, Ford has produced some 16,000 and General Motor's Chevrolet Division about 15,000. Two other G-M Divisions—Oldsmobile and Pontiac—also have achieved fair volume. But the remainder of the industry has not reached anticipated production levels.

Work stoppages in Allied industries have accounted for most of the critical shortage of parts. As a result, the industry now expects it will produce no more than 240,000 units by the end of the year. Production of 500,000 new cars by Dec. 31 had been anticipated originally.

As a result of strike threats hanging over the industry, it appears increasingly uncertain whether Detroit's automobile plants will meet their projected volume of 500,000 cars per month by midsummer.
