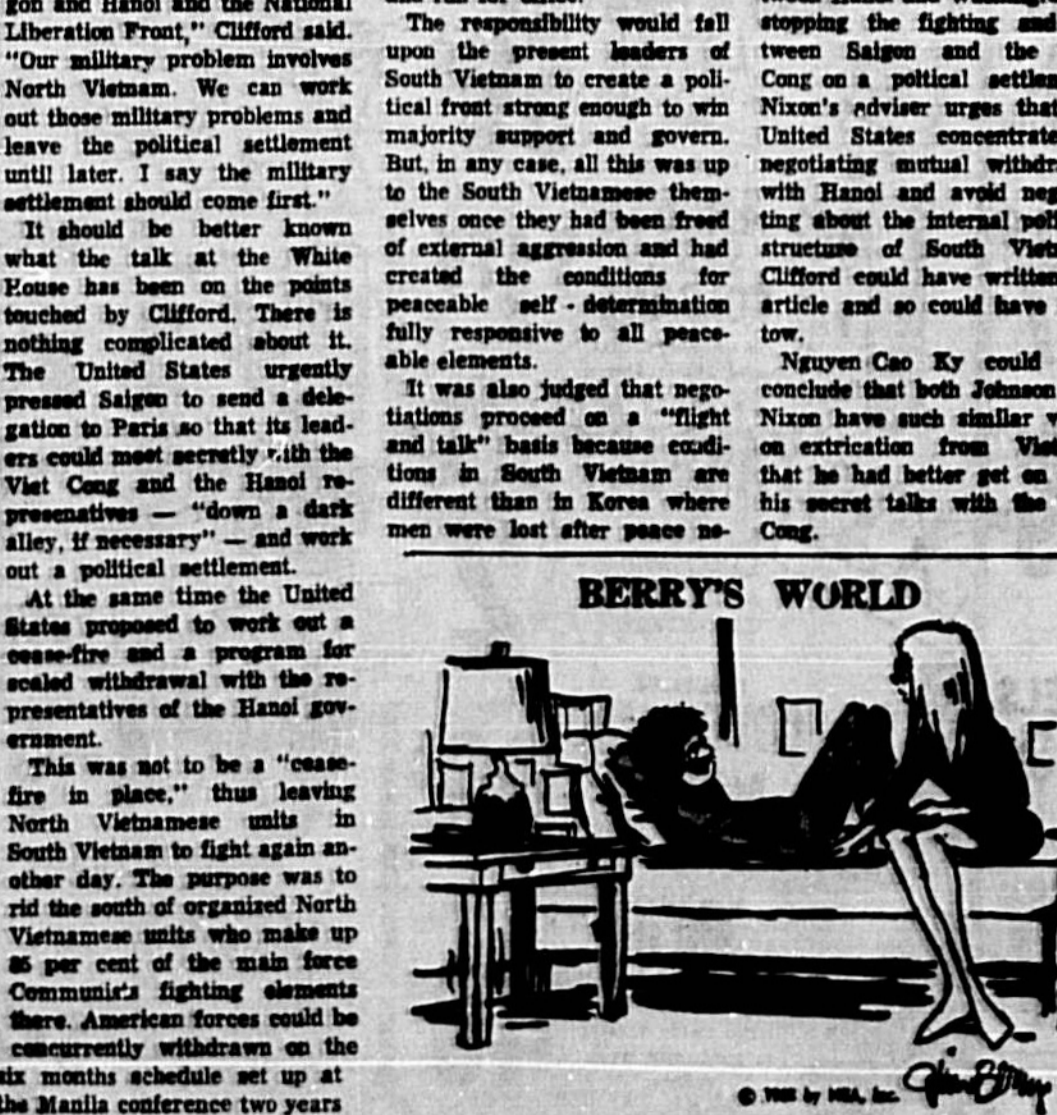

Ocala Mother Waits For PW-Son

OCALA, Fla. (AP)—As negotiations in Vietnam turned their backs on each other in disagreement Wednesday, a widowed mother of 11 talked of renewed faith that her son would be released by the Viet Cong and vowed "He'll have a Christmas even if it's in July."

Military officials in Saigon reported that negotiations between U.S. and Viet Cong officers fell down when the American team balked at a Communist attempt to turn the release of Spots, 41, Mrs. Brigham and two other prisoners into a propaganda display.

WASHINGTON (AP)—In the twilight weeks of the Johnson presidency, Democratic administrators are feeding farewell funds to pet Great Society programs.

The objective, says one departing Democrat, is to create "a legacy of momentum" to propel the programs past possible budget slashes in the early months of Richard M. Nixon's Republican administration.

The latest example came this week and involved one of the Johnson administration's favorite urban programs—Model Cities. Officials disclosed that Seattle, Wash., is receiving a \$11 million bundle of federal grants to move its Model Cities program of the drawing boards and into action.

This was the first time the half-billion-dollar fund for supplemental Model Cities grants had been tapped, but Robert C. Wood, acting secretary of Housing and Urban Development, said "other cities with plans under review can expect a decision shortly."

Before Nixon moves into the White House on Jan. 20, officials said, it's possible that nearly a score of other cities will receive similar grants. These include Atlanta; Baltimore; Boston and Cambridge, Mass.; Charlotte, N.C.; Denver, Colo.; Detroit and Highland Park, Mich.; Huntsville, Ala.; Philadelphia; Portland, Maine; Portland, Ore.; Reading, Pa.; St. Louis,

20 Killed As Airliner Hits Mount

BRADFORD, Pa. (AP)—A young woman coming home to spend the holidays with her parents. A salesman returning from a business trip for a reunion with his children. Two members of a family of four going to meet relatives on the other side of Pennsylvania.

These are some of the 20 people killed when Allegheny Airlines Flight No. 736, struck a mountain on Christmas Eve. Twenty-seven others were injured.

Christine Farlow, 20, an only child, left her parents' house in Copeland, Pa., nearly a year ago to take an office job with Allegheny Airlines in Detroit, Mich. She was coming home for Christmas. Mr. and Mrs. Howard Farlow were waiting for her at the Harrisburg airport.

She never met them. Christine was killed when the twin-engine propeller crashed while approaching Bradford Regional Airport, a stop away from an icy marsh midway up the mountain and overturned.

Volunteers in ambulances, trucks, jeeps and snowmobiles rushed to the downed craft. One of the survivors, Ron Van Pelt, 26, of Camp Hill, Pa., started a bonfire to keep himself and the others warm in the 10 degree temperature and its light helped the rescuers.

Waiting in Camp Hill, Pa., for Joseph King, was his wife and four of his five children. The fifth, 17-year-old Christine King, was riding in the plane with him.

The three older King children, a relative said, arrived earlier from Michigan and Detroit for a Christmas gathering.

King, a 52-year-old sales manager for a carpet company, was killed in the crash. His daughter was injured and taken to Bradford Hospital.

Lewis C. Angel Jr., 44, and his son, Lewis C. Angel III, 21, were in the same room Wednesday at Bradford Hospital. The bodies of Angel's wife and daughter were resting in the same funeral home 30 miles away in Kane, Pa.

An investigating team of 35 men started its probe of the crash of the Convair 440. The flight originated in Detroit and was scheduled to end in Washington.

"At this point in the investigation, all we're doing is collecting facts," said Russell J. Abbott, air safety director for the National Transportation Safety Board.

The lucky 27 who survived the crash have started checking out of hospitals.

"This was the biggest Christmas present I ever had," said Terrie Gray, 26, ignoring her frostbitten feet, cut legs and badly bruised forehead. "I'm alive."

Arabs Fire Israeli Jetliner; Passenger Killed

ATHENS (AP) — Two Arab guerrillas fired a rocket-propelled missile at an Israeli jetliner today, killing one passenger and wounding another.

The attack was the first such incident in the history of the airline industry, and it was the only one of its kind to result in a fatality.

The Israeli jetliner, an El Al Boeing 747, was flying from Tel Aviv to Rome when it was struck by the missile. The plane was flying at an altitude of 35,000 feet when the missile hit the fuselage.

Offensive Operations Resume After Holiday

SAIGON (AP) — Resuming offensive operations after a 24-hour Christmas cease-fire, U.S. forces caught more than 20 enemy troops on the move north of Saigon and killed at least 13 with bombs, rockets and artillery, the U.S. Command reported.

The enemy soldiers were spotted in two groups Wednesday night and this morning by scouts from the U.S. 1st Air Cavalry Division leaping from helicopters near the jungled borders of Cambodia.

U.S. planes and artillery went into action in an area 15 miles northwest of Saigon and only two miles from the Cambodian frontier. In addition to the 13 men killed, "numerous second ary explosions were observed," a U.S. command said, indicating direct hits on ammunition stores.

You'll Love Egg Nog Dessert

By GENE BROWNSTONE
 Assorted From Food Shop
 We think you'll love this part-
 icular egg nog dessert. Why? First
 and foremost, it has delightful
 flavor and texture.
 Second, it can be prepared a
 day ahead of a party and al-
 lows you to enjoy it in the refrig-
 erator.

Then the preparation is simple.
 You soften the gelatin and dis-
 solve it over low heat. The rest
 of the action is in beating the
 cream, egg yolks and egg
 whites and in combining all the
 ingredients. That's all there is
 to it. But one tip: assemble the
 ingredients and make this Egg
 Nog Snow without interruption.
 This way the refrigerated beat-
 en cream and the beaten egg
 yolk mixture will have to
 "wait" only the shortest possi-
 ble time.

The egg nog used in this re-
 cipe is the pre-mixed kind that
 can be stored on a shelf until
 the bottle is opened; then it
 must be refrigerated. The egg
 is made with a mixture of spirit-
 um, brandy and blended whis-
 key—and it's a spirited brew.
EGG NOG SNOW
 1/2 cup cold water
 1 envelope unflavored gelatin
 1 container (8 ounces) heavy
 cream
 2 large eggs
 1/4 teaspoon vanilla
 1/4 cup 30-proof egg nog (from
 a 4 1/2 quart bottle)

Into a small saucepan pour
 the water; sprinkle gelatin over
 it and get ready to soften.
 In a small bowl, whip cream
 until stiff; refrigerate.
 Separate eggs, putting yolks
 in a medium mixing bowl and
 whites in a small mixing bowl.
 Without washing beater, beat
 yolks slightly; add sugar and
 beat until thick and lemon col-
 or; add vanilla.
 Add egg nog to softened gela-
 tin; over very low heat stir until
 gelatin dissolves and mixture is
 completely smooth—this will
 take only a few minutes. Grad-
 ually stir into beaten yolks to
 blend.
 With clean beater, beat egg
 whites until stiff; add to yolk
 mixture and fold in. You may
 do this folding at lowest speed
 of electric mixer or with a rub-
 ber spatula. If using spatula,
 use beater very gently at end
 of folding to smooth out remaining
 small bits of white. Add
 whipped cream; using spatula,
 fold in.

Turn into sherbet or parfait
 glasses, or into a 1 1/2- to 2-quart
 glass bowl. Chill until set—
 about two hours; or cover bowl
 with transparent plastic wrap
 and store overnight. If you like,
 garnish with whipped cream
 and candied cherries. Makes 8
 to 10 servings.
