

WASHINGTON (AP) - Reports of record oil company profits have prompted an outpouring of bills aimed at rolling back the price of domestic crude oil and taking away some of the oil industry's tax breaks.

Meanwhile, energy chief William E. Simon returns to Capitol Hill today for a third straight day. Simon is scheduled to testify before Sen. Henry M. Jackson's investigations subcommittee, which has been probing the extent of the energy crisis. He spent the past two days testifying before a

Senate Finance subcommittee considering establishment of an Jackson, D-Wash., predicted Thursday that the Senate next week would pass the emergency energy bill authorizing President Nixon to order gasoline rationing.

Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield, D-Mont., filed a cloture petition Thursday aimed at thwarting the threat of a filibuster. Republicans and oilstate senators object to a provision in the bill that would put a lid on excess profits earned by the oil ndustry as result of fuel shortages. A vote on the debate-ending etition is scheduled for Monday.

The bill's controversial excess profits provision would auhorize the President to set prices on petroleum products that would prevent windfall profits by the oil companies. Three of the nation's largest oil companies reported on Thursday large profit increases in 1973.

Mobil Oil Co., the nation's second largest oil company, reported a 47 per cent profit increase in 1973 compared to 1972, while Texaco, the industry's third largest, announced a 45 per cent gain, and Shell, seventh in size, said its profits were up by 28 per



A Small Part Of Story Is Known

WASHINGTON - In late 1970, President Nixon attempted to open some choice federal beachfront property next to his San Clemente estate to residential development The timing suggests he may have sought to reward his millionaire benefactor, Robert Abplanalp, for picking up the heavy end of his San Clemente mortgage.

A small part of the story is known. The rest has been locked in the files of the White House and the General Services Administration.

In 1969, Abplanalp loaned the President \$450,000 to make the down-payment on the San Clemente place. The following year, Abplanalp granted him another \$175,000 loan to make the first mortgage payment. Nixon put up only \$42,054 of his

COULDN'T MEET PAYMENTS

Even on his \$200,000 presidential salary, he couldn't keep up the steep mortgage payments and reduce the \$625,000 debt. So Abplanalp obligingly cancelled the whole debt, and assumed most of the mortgage. In return, the President deeded over to him the bulk of the San Clemente estate.

The aerosol-valve millionaire, in other words, put up 15 times more money for the President's Pacific paradise than did the President himself. Yet Nixon got rid of his total debt to Abolanalo and still wound up with the heart of the estate. The President also continued to occupy the entire estate, including Abplanalp's portion, without paying a penny rent.

Our investigation indicates that the millionaire's munificence may have been motivated by something more tanglible than pure friendship. For at the precise time the President was negotiating to unload most of his San Clemente acreage upon Abplanalp, he also directed the government to declare certain parts of the adjacent marine base at Camp Pendleton surplus.

More significantly, the President's people sought to sell the choicest parcel, including the excellent surfing beach known as the "Trestles," for residential development. This particular tract happens to tie up against the SanClemente property which Abplanalp bought from Nixon, separated only by a small Coast Guard intrustion.

With the aerosol king's inside connections, he would have been in excellent position to pick up this valuable beachfront. But no matter who got it, the residential development would have enhanced the value of Abplanalp's adjoing acreage. As it happened, Congress prohibited the sale of Camp Pendleton land. But by this time, the President had already

### BOUGHT BEBE OUT

The negotiations with Abplanalp began in mid-September 1970, according to the White House's own account of the transaction. The President's other millionaire benefactor, Bebe Rebozo, was also involved in the deal at first. But Abplanalp later bought out Rebozo's interest.

Suppressed documents in our possession show that on Sept. 14, 1970, at the same time the President was maneuvering to get out from under his huge San Clemente debt, John Ehrilichman sent a memo to the Federal Property Review Board. This was set up by the President in carly 1970 and was dominated by his most trusted aides, including "While at San Clemente," Ehrlichman wrote his fellow

board members, "the President was again made aware of the desirability of moving Camp Pendleton from govern-mental ownership into the hands of local government and the Under Ehrilichman's spur, the bureaucrats moved

swiftly. Two government appraisers toured the Marine base during the first week in October 1970.

### DIDN'T MENTION NIXON

On Oct. 23, they filed a 28-page report. Despite a careful description of the history and economics of the region, not a single word was mentioned about Camp Pendleton's important nextdoor neighbor, Richard Nixon.

Nonetheless, the survey team recommended against building a proposed mobile home park on a section of the base near the Nixon property. "Such a development on what is a prime portion of the parcel," objected the survey team, "could have a . . . detrimental effect on the adjoining residential area of San Clemente."

Instead, the survey team recommended that the most desireable 3,400 acres, including the beachfront next to the presidential estate, "should be sold for residential development. The 3,400 acres is valued at approximately \$5

# POLLY'S POINTERS

Polly's Problem: DEAR POLLY - My built-in range has push buttons on the front so our 13-month-old son is frequently turning on a burner even though I try to watch him every moment. It is impractical to keep him out of the room since we have a kitchen-den combination. He moves or climbs over chairs or any other barriers I put in his way. Slapping his hands does not keep him from going back later. I know he will eventually outgrew this but I hope some other mothers will give me some ideas as to how they keep their children away from such burners. He certainly needs to be better protected now. - MRS.

DEAR POLLY - My Pet Peeve is with store managers who do not realize how difficult it is for housewives who live 10 or 15 miles away from the store to reach home without warm dairy products, melted ice cream, etc. I do wish these items were at least placed on the last aisle of the grocery instead of the first. - JUDY M.

DEAR POLLY - Bonnie could try soaking her pink stained white nylon sweater in a solution of dish-washer detergent and warm water. Dissolve the detergent in hot water and then add to the warm water. This should be done in a non-aluminum pan. The amount of detergent depends on the hardness or softness of the water. Repeat with more detergent each time until stains are gone. Soak at least one hour. Different stains take different lengths of time. I find this is also good for making yellowed white nylon slips and uniforms really white again. - BARBARA.

DEAR GIRLS - Colors that nylon picks up from other garments are very difficult (almost impossible) to remove. Go into such a project knowing there may be no improvement and the garment already lost. I tried the dishwasher detergent on nylon underwear and it could "take it" but a nylon sweater, particularly one that

is loosely woven and may not have too much body, may be another story. Often we misjudge synthetics and think they are one thing and they are another so the reaction could be completely different. I always feel if something is a loss anyway I am willing to make a try and take the consequences. Color remover, made by dve companies, will remove color from nylon but color that has bled from something else may be another matter. - POLLY.





# Krogh Keeps Break-In Blame From Nixon

WASHINGTON (AP) - Egil Krogh Jr. says he received no orders from President Nixon to send burglars into the office of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist and that he has no information that could implicate the President

But Krogh, sentenced Thursday to six months in prison for his role in the break-in, skirted the question of where the orders originated because the matter will come before the courts

"I would simply say that I considered that a break-in was within the authority of the unit and that I did not act to foreclose one from occurring despite the opportunity to do so."

Asked if he had information that would implicate John D. Ehrlichman, his former boss and one-time top aide to Nixon - Krogh replied: "I

Ehrlichman had given the unit - known as the plumbers — authority to engage in covert activity to obtain information on Ellsberg, then Pentagon papers.

conspiring to violate the rights of Dr. Lewis

"I have just listened to a tape of that meeting and Dr. Ellsberg's name did not appear to be

mentioned," Krogh said. "It must be that those instructions were relayed to me by Mr. Ehrlichman. In any event, I received no specific instruction or authority whatsoever regarding the break-in from the President, directly or indirectly.

### Impeach History Studied

WASHINGTON (AP) - House impeachment investigators are turning to history books for clues to what the Founding Fathers intended when they wrote impeachment into the Constitution. John W. Doar, special counsel to the Judiciary Committee, said the key question to be answered is what constitutes "high crimes and misdemeanors," which the Constitution says are impeachable offenses.

### Educators Hail School Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) - Education associations and the chairman and ranking minority member of the House Education and Labor Committee have hailed President Nixon's proposal to inform school districts a year in advance how much federal aid they will get. Other aspects of the President's special education message to Congress came in for criticism, however, including an assertion by the National Education Association that the aid was insufficient.

General Motors has announced another round of major production cutbacks. GM said Thursday the reductions will idle 75,-000 assemblers in 14 plants and an indefinite number of GM component parts workers between now and April 1. A total of 221,000 GM workers have been laid off since layoffs started in December. GM's sales figures for the first 20 days of this year show 128,896 units sold, compared with sales of 226,032 units during the same period in 1973.







cluding some letters, and draw on paper what they saw. Although several key problems remain unsolved, researchers estimate that an artificial eye - a tiny television camera in the eye socket connected to electrodes permanently implanted through the back of the skull - may eventually be built for \$5,000 apiece, plus \$2,000 for surgery and related expenses. "Much work remains to be done before artificial vision equipment can truly benefit even a single patient, let alone be
