THE WORLD TODAY

Some time ago this column pointed out that the Communists appear to be shifting the weight of their offensive for world revolution to southeast Asia

Since then conditions in the Orient have worsened until the Western Democracies are much concerned. Apart from other considerations, this vast area—including Burma, Malaya, Indonesia and Indo-China—is rich in rice, oil, tin, rubber, sugar and other necessities of both peace and war

The democracies need some of these supplies for military security. Moreover the rehabilitation of both the Orient and Europe call for all these products available, and of course untold millions of folk in the Far East are dependent on them, especially the rice which is their "staff of life"

So this international Red offensive is calculated not only to weaken the democracies of military supplies, but to block rehabilitation

This situation has impelled British Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin to call for a resolution in Parliament that the Communists should be expelled from the Far East

Former Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden supported this grim thesis. He pointed to Communist uprising in Malaya and Burma as evidence of a serious loss of the Bolshevik "drive for power" in southeast Asia

Simultaneously the U.S. State Department sharply counter-attacked in a statement against the Bolshevik "drive for power" in southeast Asia

At the same time Dutch Foreign Minister Dirk Udo Stikker visited Washington in the hope that America would take a stand against the spread of Communism in the Far East

The Communists have seized Madelon, in the central part of the island of Java. This is the third largest city of the Republic

Work also comes from an informed source in Jogjakarta, capital of the Indonesian Republic, that a document found in Communist party files discloses that a Communist coup was to be staged in Java after a rebellion was under way in Malaya

The whole Far East is throbbing with the Bolshevik threat

Naval Base

NEW YORK, Sept. 21 (AP)—The New York Times says the joint chiefs of staff have set up a tentative schedule of armed services requirements for a possible "mobilization day"

In a dispatch from Washington by Charles Hurd, the Times said today that the tentative schedule was delivered to the Munitions board of the national military establishment

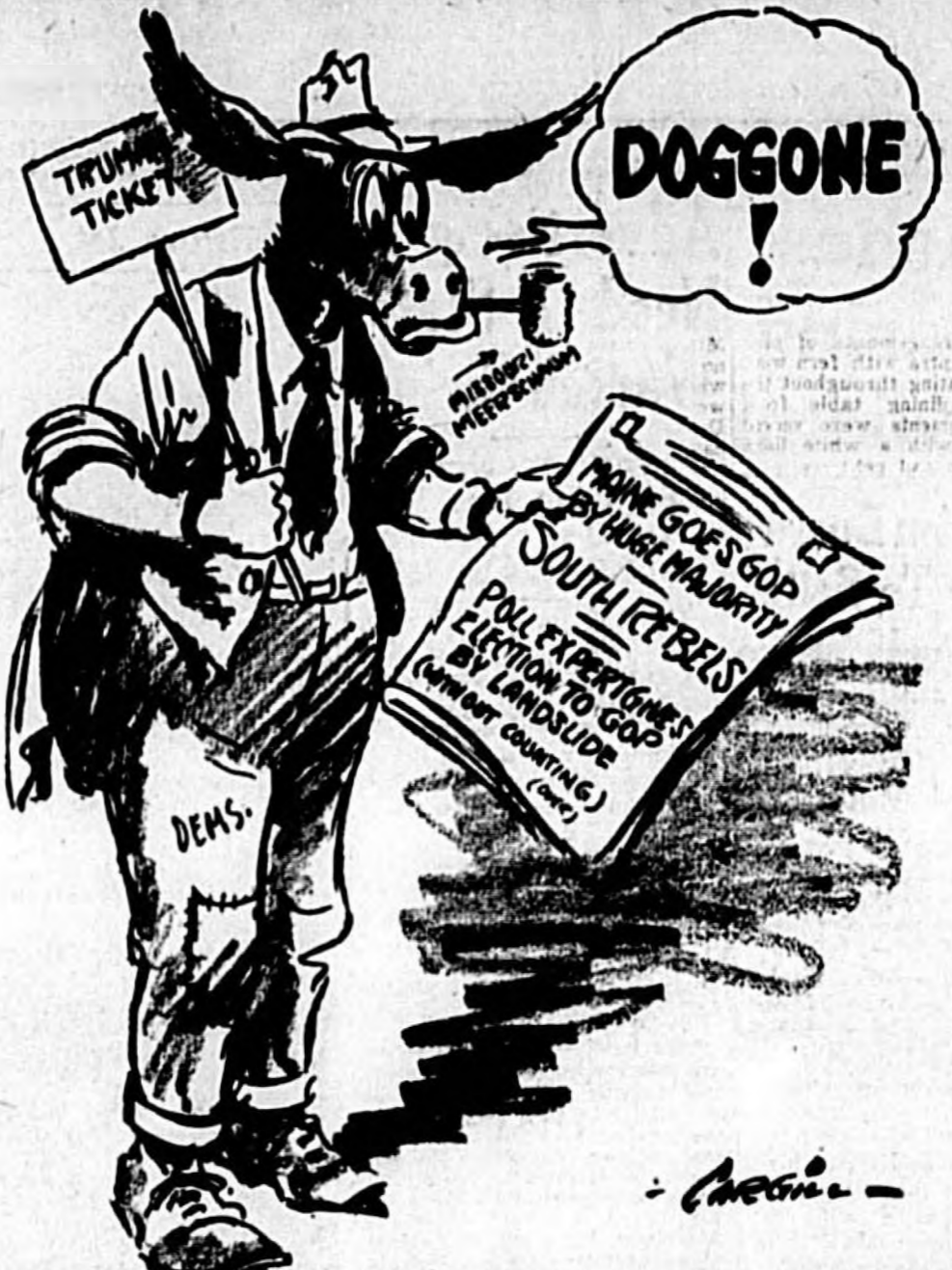
The munitions board now is in a position to construct a firm plan for the industrial mobilization necessary for conducting modern war, the Times said

It reported the following: The Munitions Board has made considerable progress in its planning and substantial gains in stockpiling materials

About \$700,000,000 worth of critical materials has been stockpiled against potential military

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# Gators Turn Full Attention To Rebel's Offense

## Sutton And Dempsey Make Challenging Bids For Starting Tackle Assignments

GAINESVILLE, Sept. 21.—Six days from their opener Saturday night, Florida's Gators have turned full attention to anticipating just what Mississippi Rebels might have in their bag of gridiron tricks.

On the sidelines and thus somewhat doubtful as week-end maneuver ways looks Bob Gruetzmacher, Charlie Huntington and Eldridge Beach and end Vic Vaccaro. Halfback Hal Griffin was in uniform but still not completely recovered from a bothersome leg. The injuries of Gruetzmacher and Vic Vaccaro appeared most serious.

Punting workouts for Billy Barker, Alex Gardiner, Fred Montedecora and John Cox also gave safety men Hal Griffin, Loren Brumby, Jim Yancy and Rocky Peek a chance to work in the runback category.

The linemen spent two periods learning completely their defensive assignments before Coach Wolf brought the entire squad together for a thorough overhauling of defensive tactics to be employed against the mysterious Mississippi T, being used this year for the first time.

Lettermen Cliff Sutton and Frank Dempsey, tackles, moved still closer to the front in their bids for starting assignments against the Rebels and non-letterman guard Anton Brown began to look like a good bet as running mate for Captain Fletcher Groves.

The final practice period found one team testing its defensive knowledge while another ran offensive signals against a freshman dummy defense. Then the two teams switched over just before heading for the showers.

"We are far from ready to meet the Gainesville Purple Hurricanes on Friday night." Those were the words of Coach Carl Kettles as he sent his Seminole High School Celery Fed eleven through another another heavy drill yesterday afternoon.

Passing was the order of the day as Ed Brooklyn, Charles Anderson and Don Deal filled the air with spirals, but Kettles again brought out the crying towel. "We certainly could use a couple of good pass catching aids to assist the good passing we are getting," he declared.

The Sanford mentor moved Jim Greer, recent transfer student from Orlando High School, to the end post for yesterday's practice drill.

After a routine signal drill, Coach Kettles and Assistant Coach Otis Mooney sent the youths to the playing field for a lengthy scrimmage session.

Assistant Coach Fred Ganas made an appearance at the field yesterday afternoon, but was on the "watching" end of the practice. "I feel pretty good, but I am weak," Ganas declared.

Kettles declared that he has not decided on his traveling squad for the Gainesville trip. "I don't guess I will fully decide until after the practice session Wednesday afternoon. I am going to give each one of the fellows an opportunity to show what he can do. I am going to take only 20 men, and I want them to be the best of the squad," he said.

The squad will be made up of four ends, three tackles, four guards, two centers and seven backs.

A lengthy session of field goal kicking was held yesterday afternoon. Richard Bass kicked several through the uprights at the 30 yard line and then dropped back to the 35 to send several more through the bars. Don Deal was holding the ball for the kicks.

Charles Anderson continued to spark the offensive power of the Celery Fed Machine. "I think he will make a pretty good back before the year is over," Kettles declared.

## Ted Williams Is Continuing Pace In AL Bat Parade

## Stan Musial Seen As Sure Bet To Win National Title

CHICAGO, Sept. 21. (AP)—Boston's Ted Williams leaped 21 points ahead of Cleveland's Lou Bruders last week virtually to win his second consecutive American League batting title and his fourth in his last five playing seasons.

Williams slammed 34 hits in 25 tries to boost his mark by eight points to 376. The Tribe's player-manager, meanwhile skidded seven points to 355.

Williams would have to hit a prolonged slump while Bruders would have to strike it hot for the batting race before the season ends Oct. 31.

He captured the hit title in 1941 and 1942 before spending three years in military service. Washington's Mickey Vernon won the crown in 1945.

A week ago Williams led Bruders by the narrow margin of 238 to 362.

Other leaders through last Sunday's game were Cleveland's Dale Mitchell with 334; Banner McCoy, Philadelphia, 329; Al Zarilla, St. Louis, 325; Bob Dillinger, St. Louis, and Luke Appling, Chicago, with 321 apiece; Full Gooden, Boston, 314; Walt Evers, Detroit, 312; and Hank Najzick, Philadelphia, 311.

Joe DiMaggio of New York continued in runs-batted-in with a bag of 145 after collecting nine. He also was tops in homer production with 33 after adding three for the week.

Stan Musial, slugging ball hawk of St. Louis Cardinals, is virtually assured of winning the National League batting crown for the third time in his career.

Musial, including games of Sunday, was punishing opposition pitching at a .375 rate. Only a terrific slump would deprive the fence-busting Cardinal of the crown.

No one is within shouting distance of the Carl mauler, Richie Ashburn, rookie outfielder of Philadelphia who is out for the best of the year with a hand injury. Sports the annual best mark in the league.

Another recruit, Alvin Dark of the Boston Braves, is third, 48 points back of Musial with a .327 average. Tommy Holmes of Boston and handy Andy Falck of Chicago are tied for fourth place at .325.

Steve Slaughter of the Red Birds and Jeff Heath of the peanut ball Braves are deadlocked for sixth place with .323 averages. Dale Walker of Pittsburgh is eighth with .309 and Jackie Robinson of Brooklyn and Ed Walburn of Chicago are tied for ninth at .304.

The Washington Redskins led the National Football League in scoring in 1940—the year they lost to the Chicago Bears in the playoff game, 73-0.
