Writing scores show progress

SANFORD — Seminole County Public Schools remained tied with Brevard County for the top middle and high school rankings in FCAT writing as the state began to release 2005 results April 27.

As of Tuesday, only writing scores had been released and Superintendent Bill Vogel did not know when the rest would be published. Still he said he was happy about the writing results since the district emphasized that subject this

past year. "We were pleased with the writing scores," Vogel said Monday. "I have to commend the teachers and students for their hard work."

At the elementary level, Seminole schools ranked second behind Brevard County. The rankings are from combined average scores for writing, which is graded on a scale with 6.0 being the

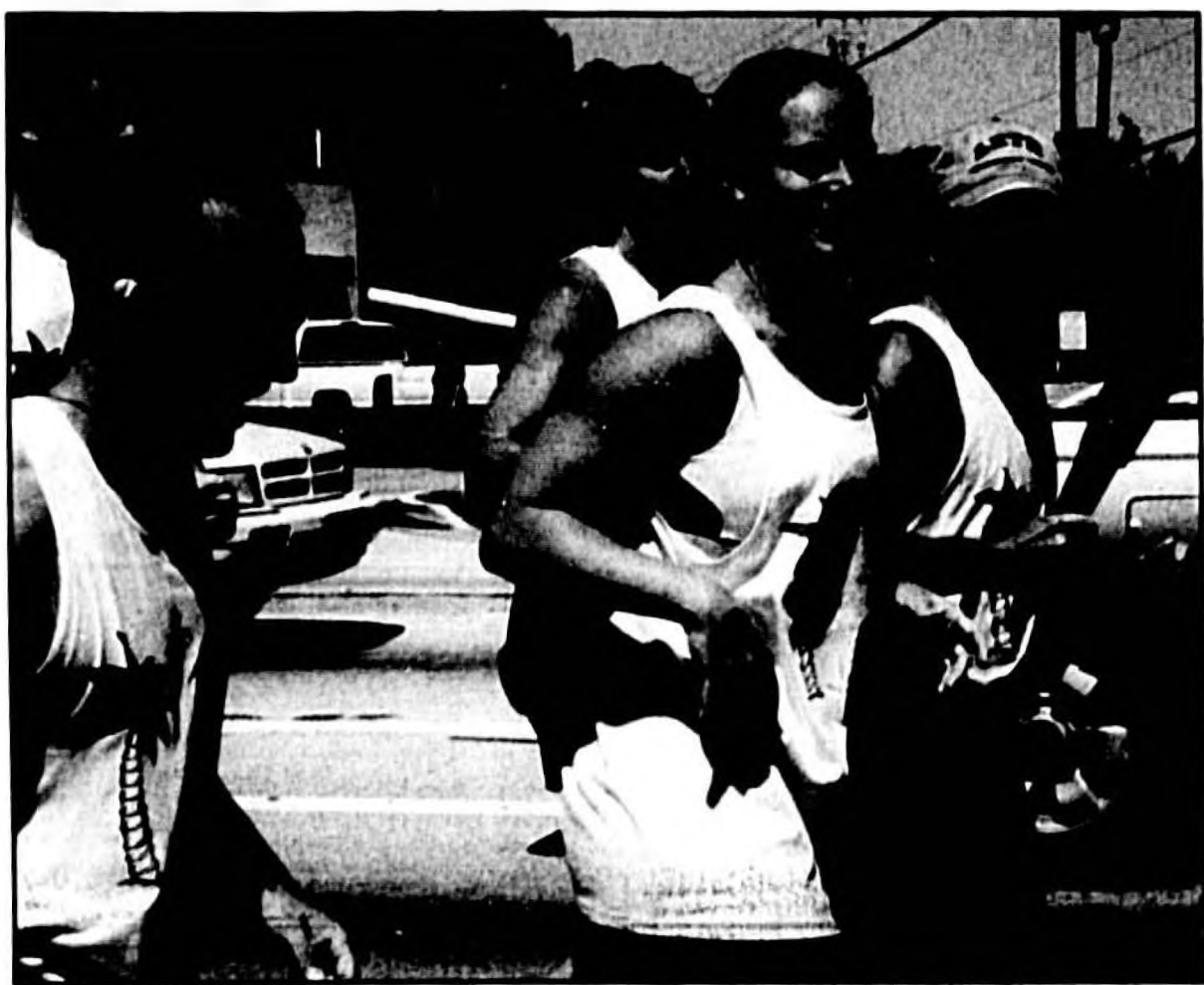
highest score and 1.0 the lowest. The combined scores come from the two types of writing grades on the FCAT. All levels have an expository assignment where students have to explain something. For example, fourth-graders had to choose an activity they enjoy and explain why they enjoy it. Eighth-graders explained a time of year they like and 10th-graders wrote about a

personal quality they think is important. The second part for fourth-graders is to write a narrative. This year they had wrote a story about a teacher surprising a class.

Eighth- and 10th-graders write a persuasive piece for the second half. Eighth-graders were asked to persuade a newspaper editor whether teens waste too much time watching TV. Tenth-graders had to persuade the school board whether students should have a study hall.

Police carry special flame

SANFORD — Law enforcement officers from four Seminole County agencies carried the torch April 25 in the 2005 Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run.

A total of 23 runners jogged the 14-mile stretch from Maitland Boulevard and 17-92 to the Sanford Civic Center on Seminole Boulevard.

The torch run is similar to the Olympics torch run. The Florida Special Olympics Summer Games, an event for handicapped athletes, took place April 29 and 30 in Tampa.

The Law Enforcement Torch Run began in 1981 with Wichita City Police Chief Richard LaMunyon to help raise money for the Kansas Special Olympics. It has grown into a national event with each state organizing a run to support their Special Olympics so athletes can qualify for the national event.

Seminole County has participated since 1989, according to Deputy Jarritt Negri of the Seminole County Sheriff's Department, who helped organize the local leg. Negri said this year's participants of 23 runners is the largest for Seminole County, which had only three runners last year.

Young people lose a friend in Coach Franklin

Cornelius B. "Coach" Franklin, 77, a winner, educator, community servant, friend to youth and mankind, departed this life April 26, 2005, at Orlando Regional South Seminole Hospital.

Cornelius, Coach as he was affectionately called by the thousands of students, family and friends whose lives he touched, was born July 31, 1927 in DeLand to the late Mr. and Mrs. Benjamine and Martha Franklin.

After graduating from Volusia County School he attended and graduated from Bethune Cookman College in 1949 and earned a Masters Degree from Stetson University and Rollins College. Franklin began his teaching career at his alma mater, Euclid High School. Education of children was his top priority. He accepted the position as a Health and

Warrant waiting for Kansas man

SANFORD — If and when a former Seminole County resident bonds out of a Kansas jail, he will be served a warrant for his arrest here on charges of capital sexual battery of a child under 12 among others, according to the Seminole County Sheriff's Office.

In a Tuesday news release, Sheriff's officials said Circuit Judge Kenneth Lester signed the arrest warrant for a Jerry A. Horn, 66.

Horn is in a Johnson County, Kansas, jail under \$300,000 bond on charges from a case in Lenexa, Kan. There is no bond on the Seminole County charges.

Investigator trains Olympic hopefuls

SANFORD — When he's not solving crimes for the Sanford Police Department, Daniel Camargo coaches young people with Olympic weightlifting dreams.

Working through the Altamonte Springs Recreational Department, Camargo trains high school women and others in the sport he loves and which almost sent him to the Olympics himself.

An injury cut his dream short, but Camargo puts as much into coaching as he has into the sport since beginning when he was just 11 years old at Greenwood Lakes Middle School in Lake Mary.

Lake Brantley High School

freshman Meredith Hamill is one of Camargo's most promising athletes.

At 14, she is young, but has the skills to defeat other women four or five years her senior. Meredith is the youngest member of the U.S. Junior Team.

Recently Camargo accompanied her and his local team to Minneapolis, where both Meredith and Kathleen McConnell, a senior at Lake Brantley, earned national championships.

"Meredith is lifting weights that 18 and 19 year olds are doing," Camargo said during an interview at the Sanford police station.

SANFORD — A new twist to an old tradition will light up the Helen Stairs Theatre in Sanford on Saturday, May 7.

Dancers from numerous dance companies and schools will come together to perform in the revised Central Florida Dance Festival.

In the past, the festival honoring Edith and Bill Royal was held at the Disney Amphitheatre at Eola Park in Orlando. These annual performances were hosted by Beatrix Aldana, who passed away in November 2003. Aldana retired from the Orlando City Ballet in August 2003 after 40 years as a dancer, teacher, choreographer, and artistic director.

This new Central Florida Dance Festival will honor both the Royals and Aldana. Two performances at the Helen Stairs Theatre will be presented. The matinee will be at 2 p.m. and an evening show will be held at 7:30 p.m.

Each show will feature different styles of dance, providing audiences with a wide variety of pieces. More than 20 area companies and dance groups will be presenting dancers in the festival.

In addition to the dancers, a display highlighting the history of dance in Central Florida will be presented.

"The historic Helen Stairs Theatre will provide a lovely venue for all the artistic samples of ballet, tap, modern and musical theatre. Many talented choreographers will be represented in each of this year's two festival presentations," a press release said.

The Ballet Guild of Sanford-Seminole and S.O.D.A. Pops will perform at both shows.

Tickets are \$10 and they are available by calling the box office at 407.321.8111, or tickets can be purchased at the door before the 2 p.m. or 7:30 p.m. performances. Proceeds from ticket sales will go toward advancing a scholarship fund in Aladana's name dedicated to helping deserving young artists in the Central Florida area.

"Celebrate dance and dancers, bring the family and enjoy this Mother's Day weekend tribute. The variety and excitement of a live performance will certainly provide an entertaining theatrical experience for all," the release said.

For 2005, the combined mean scores for grade four is 3.7, just a tenth lower than Brevard County, but two tenths higher than 2004 scores.

Among large school districts, county schools finished tied for fourth place at the fourth-grade level, third at the eighth-grade level and first for grade 10.

The district has contended with parents about rezoning

students. Parents from Sebal Point have sued the district mainly because they want their children to remain at Lake Brantley High School instead of Lyman.

The mean combined writing scores for Lake Brantley sophomores is 4.1, up a tenth of a point from 2004.

The state Department of Education figures also show that 95 percent of 10th-graders earned a 3.0 or higher on the FCAT writing exam, while at Lyman only 83 percent scored that well.

Seminole High School received the lowest grade in

the county last year at 2004. It received a D grade from the state. Writing scores for this year, however, indicate improvement.

The mean combined writing score for Seminole High School increased a tenth of a point to 3.8. The school also increased the number of students scoring at least 3.0 on the writing test to 91 percent.

According to the Department of Education, students who score 3 and above on FCAT writing have scored at or above a "minimally acceptable level."

Ninety percent of fourth-graders and 93 percent of eighth-graders scored 3.0 or better in 2005.

Sheriff's Office spokesman Steve Olson said.

In Seminole County, Horn faces capital sexual battery charges on a child as well as lewd and lascivious battery of a child under 12.

In early April, Lenexa police informed the Seminole County Sheriff's Office of Horn's arrest. Olson said information about a local tie to Central Florida was learned during their investigation about the Kansas case against

him. Following the initial arrest, Olson said, a 17-year-old boy, who once lived in Seminole County, alleged that he had also been molested by Horn.

Horn lived near the boy's family when they lived in Seminole County. Horn followed the family to Kansas when the boy's family moved there in 2000.

"An interview in Kansas of that child revealed accusations of molestation over

a number of years with over 100 incidents of abuse that had occurred in Seminole County," a news release said.

The Crimes against Children Unit is still seeking information whether other local children were victimized by Horn.

So far, no additional victims have come forward, Olson said.

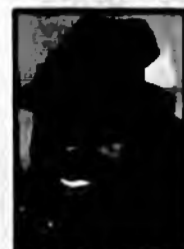

State lays out case for widening 46

MIDWAY - In 25 years, nearly 30,000 vehicles a day will travel the stretch of east State Road 46 between Mellonville Avenue and S.R. 415, according to Florida Department of Transportation projections. That's not far from the 20,853 cars, trucks and cycles that currently swift along the two-lane roadway.

To accommodate growth and avoid traffic congestion, the state wants to four lane that stretch of roadway.

State transportation officials and consultants presented their preliminary findings and offered a possible timetable to about 50 people during a recent public hearing at Midway Elementary School.

Bill Walsh, DOT project manager, said the meeting is the first of several hearings to inform residents of the various stages of the project. If the widening project is approved, a design process will begin, followed by right-of-way acquisitions, and then construction. If all the stages go as planned, construction would begin in five to seven years, Walsh said.

"If we don't do any improvements, it will be hard to get along on State Road 46," Walsh said.

He assured the residents of the historic village of Midway that no property on the north side of S.R. 46 would be acquired for right-of-way purposes. Property on the south side, majority owned by the Orlando-Sanford International Airport, will be purchased for the widening. Only a small strip of land between Beardall Avenue and S.R. 415 would be used for right-of-way, he said.

"We're not hardly going to touch anything at all on the north side of the roadway," Walsh said.

He said the state plans to move a ditch on the south side of S.R. 415 further south on airport property and use the old ditch area for the widening. Included in the project will be an 8x10 sidewalk on the north side, and a 4-foot bicycle lane "for experienced bicyclists," which Seminole County has requested, he said.

Walsh said the department is aware of the historical and archeological significance of Midway and is sensitive to environment issues, such as an eagle's nest near State Road 415. Storm water runoff will be retained in a borrow pit between Mellonville Avenue and Brissan Avenue to the west and S.R. 415 and the new Lake Mary Boulevard extension to the east.

The next stage in the study process is a community meeting in October or November, followed by another public hearing in January 2006.

"The final decision should be made about this time next year on the study," Walsh said. Afterward, funding will be sought for right-of-way acquisitions, and roadway design and construction.

Use your refund wisely

So your 1040 is filed and you are now anxiously waiting for your refund. What do you plan on doing with it? Go on that long-awaited cruise, get a new set of golf clubs or buy that wide-screen TV you've had your eye on? There are so many ways you could spend your refund, but there may be better alternatives to consider.

According to the Internal Revenue Service, over 75 percent of American taxpayers received a federal tax refund, with the average around \$2,000. It's what you do with your refund now that may create a better financial future for you and your family later on.

Instead of spending your refund this year, consider funding an Individual Retirement Arrangement (IRA), setting up a college savings fund for a child, or paying down credit card debt. These options will help to improve your financial situation.

First on your list of priorities should be paying down any high-interest credit card debts you have incurred. By paying only the minimum each month, you may be paying just the interest (or less) on the debt and little or nothing towards the principal. Paying down the debt can free up additional money for other important financial needs.

If debt is not a problem, your tax refund could provide you an excellent opportunity to fund an existing IRA or establish a new one. For the 2004 tax year, you can contribute up to \$3,000 to an IRA. If you are 50 years or older by December 31, 2004, you can add an additional \$500 to the account. Making a tax-deductible contribution to a Traditional IRA is an option if you are not participating in an employer-sponsored retirement plan or, if you are participating, your Adjusted Gross Income falls within eligibility guidelines.

A Roth IRA may be a more appropriate choice, depending on your eligibility. Contributions to a Roth IRA are not

tax deductible. However, qualified distributions are received free from federal income tax.

Your refund could also be used to fund a Coverdell Education Savings Account (ESA) or 529 Plan for your child. Contributions are not deductible, but withdrawals to pay qualified educational expenses are free from federal income tax.

One thing to remember after you've decided the fate of this year's refund: the check you received is not a windfall but the return of an interest-free loan you provided the government.

Regardless of the pleasure you may get from receiving a large check each tax year, adjusting the amount withheld by Uncle Sam to reduce the amount of future refunds may be an appropriate course. You may not get a refund in April, but you may have more to each paycheck to contribute to a Coverdell ESA, 529 plan, IRA or to pay down debt throughout the year.

Take some time to consider your options before making the down payment on that cabin cruiser. The earlier you start saving for your future, the more you may have during your retirement.

pounds, but she lifted 175 pounds to win her national championship. Weighing 138 pounds, Meredith can lift more than 210 pounds. She is one of just seven young women headed to the World Championships in Busan, South Korea, in late May.

"Our family owes so much to Danny Camargo," said Mary Hamill, mother of Meredith. Mary Hamill is a former news anchor for a local Orlando channel.

Mary Hamill said all of her children are into weightlifting. Their relationship with Camargo began with her son, James, who went a national championship in 2002.

Sitting in the audience watching was Meredith, then just 11 years old. She saw the excitement and heard the cheers and said, "Mom, I want to do this."

Hamill admits she worried whether the sport might stunt her daughter's growth, but she talked with an Olympic coach who suggested having Meredith train with Camargo.

"She said there is no way it would stunt Meredith's growth," Hamill said. "[Meredith] started the very next week."

Even though wrestling is an individual sport, Hamill said Camargo really builds a team spirit among the competitors.

"He's a fabulous coach," she said. "They have really built a team identity. They encourage each other. I think that's why his program has been so successful."

Camargo said the group he brought to Minneapolis from Altamonte Springs included seven girls, three boys, three assistant coaches and two sets of parents.

The competition at the 2005 National Junior

Championships is for 18 to 20 year olds, but younger athletes can compete if they qualify. This is how Meredith made the competition that she dominated.

Camargo was selected himself to train full-time for the 1996 games in Atlanta. He left Lake Mary High School and moved to Colorado to train at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs.

One year before the 1996 games, he was ranked high enough to make the team. Eight months out, however, he sustained a lower back injury.

He worked his way back and trained for the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. The injury popped up again in 1998, however, and the dream, for himself, ended.

The experience prepared him for the coaching he does today.

He started coaching seriously in 2001 and in just four years is sending his first athlete to the World Championships.

Meredith, Camargo said, tells her coach that she wants to go further than him. That's just fine with Camargo.

"The injury makes me a better coach," he said. "The fear of having an injured athlete keeps me from pushing them too far at too young an age."

Parents sometimes want their children to lift higher weights, but Camargo knows the limits.

"We push when we need to and back off when we need to," he said. "It's not about the win, it's about the athletes."

Hamill said Camargo is totally committed to the young athletes.

"Some coaches talk about their glory days, but that's not

him," Hamill said of Camargo. After competitions, he will make the athletes take some time off for their bodies to adjust from the adrenaline and stress.

"He has created a great atmosphere," she said. "The kids totally trust and believe in him. I've never seen Danny do anything other than praise."

If someone fails to make a lift, he'll always tell them that they will do it next time.

"I've seen coaches blow up at kids," Hamill said, "and he'll never do that in a million years."

Camargo won't be able to go to Korea because of the expense, but in the future he may qualify to go as a coach to such events.

He said he is blessed with a schedule and supervisors who understand the rigors of training. The athletes work out every day during the week, he said, but he also has three assistant coaches who take over for him.

Solving crimes, he jokes, keeps the flexibility possible at work. He will not leave his position as an investigator. He said there is no full-time work as a coach.

Meredith and Kathleen both have hopes of the Olympics. The next Olympics will be held in Beijing, China, in 2008. Meredith is young enough to try for the 2012 Games as well. The site has not been chosen for those Olympics, but New York City is in the running.

If they make it, both athletes owe it to Camargo, Mary Hamill said.

"They're such good friends," she said of her daughter and Kathleen. "They help each other and watch each other's techniques."

Camargo explained that Olympic weightlifting is not just lifting as much weight as possible. Athletes are judged on their technique as well.

"Kat is better because of Meredith and Meredith is better because of Kat," Hamill said. "Both are better because of Danny."

Trinity Prep boys 10th in Class 1A State Track

Small local group headed to Class 4A State Meet

It did not turn out to be a great weekend for local track teams as no one won an individual state title and no team finished better than seventh in state and regional meets.

The Trinity Prep boys, led by runner-up individual finishes by John Roberts in the 800-Meter Run and Steve Curley in the 3,200-Meter Run, finished 10th in the FHSAA Class 1A State Championship at the Coral Springs High School Track Friday.

Crooms Academy made a good showing, tying for 16th place, with Larry Cherry finishing third in the 400-Meter Dash.

As she was at district and regions, eighth-grader Amanda Powell was the star for the Trinity Prep girls' squad, which finished 11th.

Powell's best finish was a fifth in the 200-Meter Dash, but she was also a member of the 4 x 100-Meter Relay Team along with Casey Hurst, Isi Irumundom and Emily Decicio that finished second. Powell also finished eighth in the Long Jump and ninth in the 100-Meter Dash.

The locals' showing was anything but spectacular in the Class 4A-Region 1 Championships on the Bob Mosher Track at Showalter Field in Winter Park last Thursday as only three individuals won events and the Seminole High boys were the best overall, finishing a distant seventh.

Fighting Seminole standout senior Stevie Warren won the Triple Jump and also qualified for state in the 200-Meter Dash (fourth place) and as a member of the 4 x 100-Meter Relay Team, along with Travis Knight, Freddie Howard and Cavese Richardson, that finished second.

Lyman, which finished ninth, will send two individuals to state, both in the Pole Vault, where Greyhound junior's Daniel Hamilton and Christopher Bridgeman finished first and second, respectively.

No other local boy earned a trip to the state meet.

The 4A girls will have a little more representation with 14 individuals or relay teams qualify-

ing, but even that was probably way down from what was expected.

The biggest upset came in the 1,600-Meter Run where Oviedo All-American Jennifer Barringer came in second, the first time she has lost to a Floridian in two years.

Barringer did come back to win the 3,200-Meter Run by over nearly 40 seconds over Lake Brantley's Amanda Hintze, but the loss in the mile ended her hopes of trying to win the 'triple', 800, 1,600 and 3,200, at state.

The Lions, who led all local teams with a ninth place team finish, will also be sending senior Brittny McDermott to state after she finished fourth in the Pole Vault.

Hintze, a junior, led the Patriots to a tie for 10th with Lyman as she also qualified in the 1,600-Meter with a third place finish and as a member of the second place 4 x 400-Meter Relay team along with her sophomore sister Whitney Hintze, and freshmen Darcie Stahler and Azura Robillard.

The Greyhounds will be sending junior Nefe Bennfield in two events, the Shot Put and Discus, in which she placed fourth and senior Quawanda Grubba, who was fourth in the 300-Meter Hurdles.

Lake Mary finished 15th, but will have only one state representative in senior Sherena Hollis, who was third in the Shot Put.

Seminole was 18th and will send senior Evelyn Moore (fourth in the 800-Meter Run) and the third place 4 x 400-Meter Relay Team (senior Faith Hampton, junior Brittny Martin, sophomore Michelle Parodi and junior Leah Fitten) to state.

Also earning a trip to state was Winter Springs junior Yvonne George, who led the Bears to 19th Place with fourth-place finishes in both the Long Jump and Triple Jump.

Also making the 4A State Meet will be DeLand's Willie Calloway, the son of the former Lake Mary boys track coach of the same name, in the 800-Meters.

The FHSAA Class 4A State Track and Field Championships will be held this Saturday at Coral Springs High School.

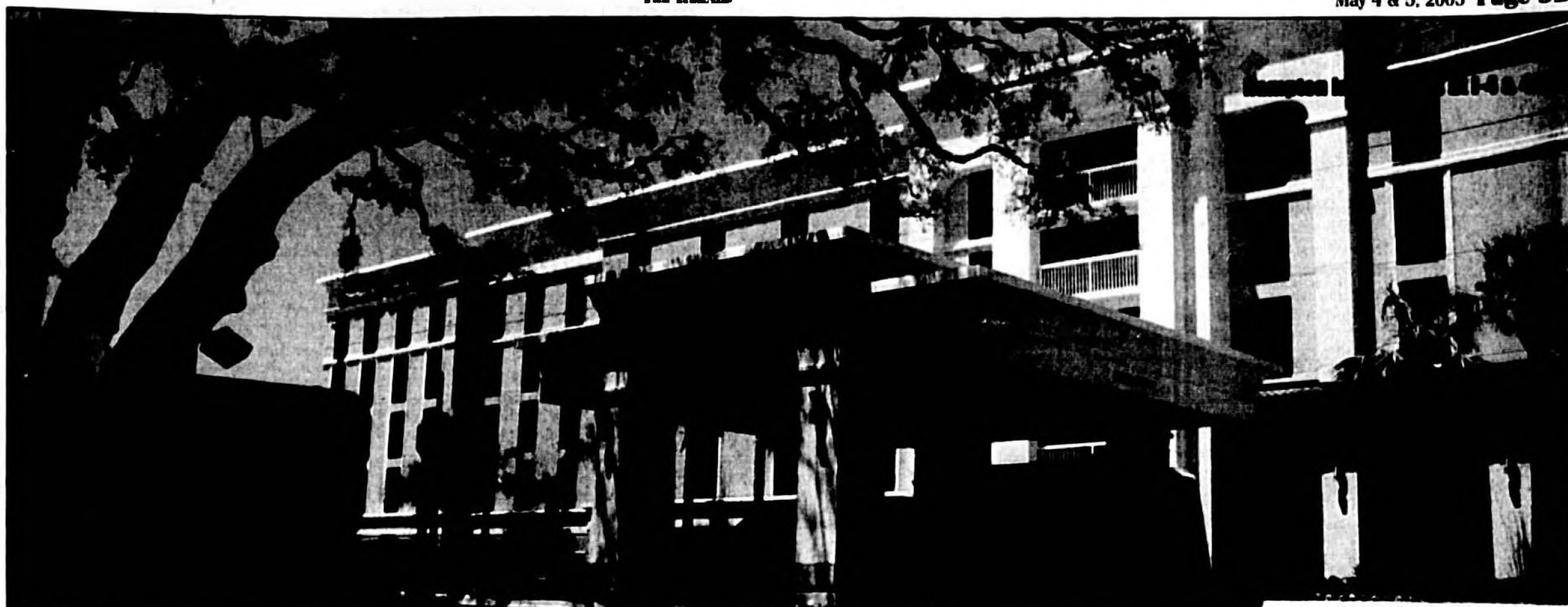


