

Slowing economy puts strain on funds

Sanford finance director says employees must 'Run it like you own it'

SANFORD — Despite strong gains in ad valorem revenue, the city is facing tough financial times and possible budget shortfalls.

Finance Director Kevin Smith presented city commissioners with a budget overview — three months ahead of schedule — and warned that the city faces a potential \$800,000 shortfall based on current spending levels.

"I feel confident we will find efficiencies throughout the city to balance the budget," Smith said. "However, I wanted to let the

commissioners and department directors know that the revenue growth we have seen in the last four or five years is just not there, I didn't want to wait until July before we started talking about this."

Revenues from ad valorem taxes, which are generated from property values, have increased about \$2.5 million in five years. Smith expects those revenues grow at that rate for some time as real estate appreciates and more property is developed.

Meanwhile, the city's other revenues sources remain flat or have declined because of a slow economy. Those sources include:

- **Half-cent sales tax:** "That's revenue that is directly affected by the economy. The worse the economy, the less people spend and the less sales tax we collect," Smith said.

- **Income off of interest:** As the economy declines, so do rates on interest bearing accounts. "In the past we generated about \$800,000 in interest," Smith said. "Now

we're getting \$300,000."

- **Building permits:** During the last five years, apartment construction has ballooned revenue generated through permits. City commissioners put a moratorium on new apartment construction and agreed to extend it another three months.

"Whatever your opinion on apartments, you have to realize that those permits were adding more revenue that was getting appropriated," Smith said.

- **Franchise fees from Florida Power & Light:** "FP&L has had two rate cuts, which is good for everyone, but it does mean less

Zoo unveils expansion plans for Commission

SANFORD — Joe Montisano, executive director of the Central Florida Zoo in Lake Monroe, discussed the zoo's \$11 million expansion project during Tuesday's Seminole County Board of County Commission meeting.

According to Montisano, Phase 1A of the renovation project will launch this summer and include the Wayne Denach Discovery Center, a 200-seat auditorium for educational presentations.

The renovation will also include several classroom-style areas, a zoo lab, courtyard and lobby.

With pre-construction work complete, the zoo staff will soon begin accepting contract bids. Construction is expected to last 12 to 18 months.

"We're very excited about the project," said Montisano. "But, we're not sure how construction will affect gate attendance. That will be the challenge for the zoo."

According to Montisano, yearly zoo attendance is upward of 250,000 guests, plus an additional 50,000 students who participate in educational programs.

"We are a unique alternative to the big attractions," he explained to Commission. "It's a lot more than bringing people into the gate. It's about touching those people lives."

The zoo is currently working at capacity during its educational programs, which continues to be the zoo's main focus. Recently, staff has been forced to turn people away due to space restrictions.

"This renovation will give us the opportunity to triple capacity," he said.

Supporters of the project include Wayne M. Denach Charitable Trust, Seminole County government, Seminole County Public Schools, Darden Restaurants Foundation, city of Sanford, Inez and Bob Parsell, Orange County government, and several others.

Fundraisers were also held to raise money.

"The zoo is a regional asset," said Commission Chairman Daryl G. McLain. "It's great to see other counties, such as Orange County, getting involved."

Commissioner Dick Van Der

Mid Florida Wrestling plans Friday benefit show for The Place of Comfort

SANFORD — There's going to be some body slamming and choke holding in downtown Friday, and it's all in the name of charity.

Mid Florida Wrestling (MFW) competitors, including Nightstalker, LoneWolf and Jumpin' Jack Flash are coming to town for a benefit show supporting "The Place of Comfort," a local organization that helps families with children who have terminal illnesses.

Eight matches are planned at the Sanford Civic Center, including the main event, which will feature former WWF wrestler Barry Horowitz vs. Mace.

"We love helping kids," said MFW Commissioner Ann Bass. "We've been working with Place of Comfort for awhile, and it's good to know there's a group like them out there. That's why we want to help."

After expenses, all proceeds from the event will go to the local organization. According to Bass, all of the wrestlers are volunteer-

ing their time and energy for the show in order to raise as much money as possible for the group.

Bass said it's appropriate to host the benefit in Sanford since her group considers the city home. MFW was created by "Outlaw Tom Bass," and the first match was held here on Dec. 7, 2001.

"Sanford is definitely our hometown," Bass said. "We are all hometown people, and we have a great group of wrestlers."

Doors open Friday at 7 p.m., with the first bell ringing at 8 p.m. The opening match pits LoneWolf

against Jumpin' Jack Flash. Other matches include two singles matches, hardcore title, triple threat, six-man tag, the semi-main match and the main event. Wrestlers slated to compete include El Macho, Deathrow Jethrow, Nightstalker, Phil Crude, CPL. Wright, Ant-Mime, El Corupto, The Breakers, Bill & Wikid, J.J. Vegas, Rocker Levi Mullins, and Thump Dupree.

One name missing from Friday's roster is local favorite Mad Dog, a.k.a. Sgt. Mike Taylor. Although he isn't scheduled to

compete in any of the matches, he may make an appearance at the show.

"Mad Dog isn't wrestling, but you never know what might happen," Bass said. "We love surprising people, so people shouldn't rule anything out."

Tickets for the benefit show are \$8 for adults and \$4 for children ages 6 to 12.

Children under six are admitted free.

Should we, or shouldn't we, say something to our children?

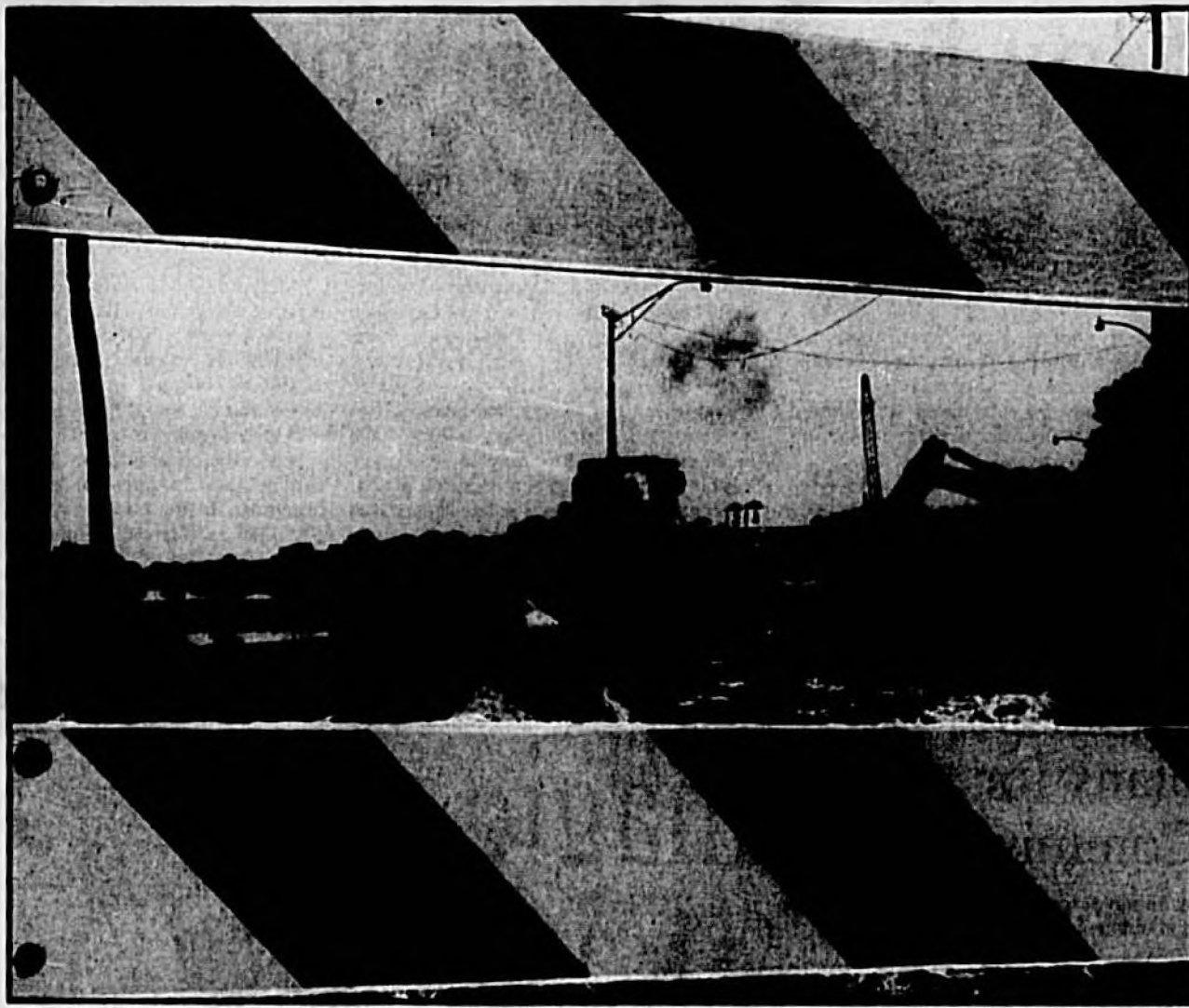
ADAM AND EVE IN THE GARDEN STATE

Survivors include two daughters, Maxine Power of Marietta, Ga., and Marilyn Joiner of Orlando; four grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.

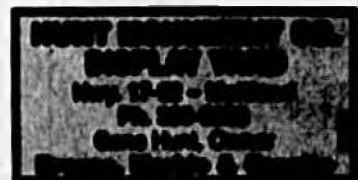

revenue to the city," Smith said. A flat or slightly declining growth rate in any one of these revenue sources does not have a substantial effect on the city's \$30 million budget. "It's when you have all of these revenues remain stagnant that it begins to add up," Smith said. In addition, Smith said, the city has to "get a handle on spend-

ing." The city has spent about \$1 million in impact fees for capital projects, and last year alone spent \$1 million in reserves. "At some point in time — which is now — those impact fees are going to run out," Smith said. "They're meant to be spent on capital projects, but the money eventually runs out." That's not to say Sanford will

cease investing in capital projects. "We've got money to continue our current capital programs," said Mayor Brady Lessard. "Multi-year projects like sidewalk improvements and the Riverwalk are funded and will be completed." "However, the city's got to get its house in order before it goes on any more capital shopping spree," Lessard added.

Personnel costs, which have grown at a 7 percent annual rate for the last five years are another concern. Part of that increase is attributed to annual pay raises, but employee health insurance, 100 percent of which the city pays, and new positions add substantial increases to personnel expenditures. "We have to find ways to contain our costs, particularly on

insurance," Smith said. "The city has had substantial increases in health coverage and we may be forced at asking employees to pay part of that cost." "We also need to evaluate new positions. We've added 50 positions in the last few years. I'm not saying that's a good or bad thing. That's not my call. What I am saying is that new positions cost money and we have to plan to

pay for them." Smith said he is confident city residents will not face a decrease in services or an increase in taxes. Nor does he anticipate any layoffs within the city. "That's always the challenge: to do more with less," Smith said. "I think there are plenty of opportunities to do that within the city. We've just got to start running it like we own it."

- Approved 3-2 to move forward with an option agreement to acquire 2.9 acres within Spring Hammock Preserve owned by Oakwood Inc. An additional donation of 1.8 acres will be given for a conservation easement. After 10 years the 1.8 acres will become county con-

trolled. Staff will continue research and approach Commission at a later date for a final decision.

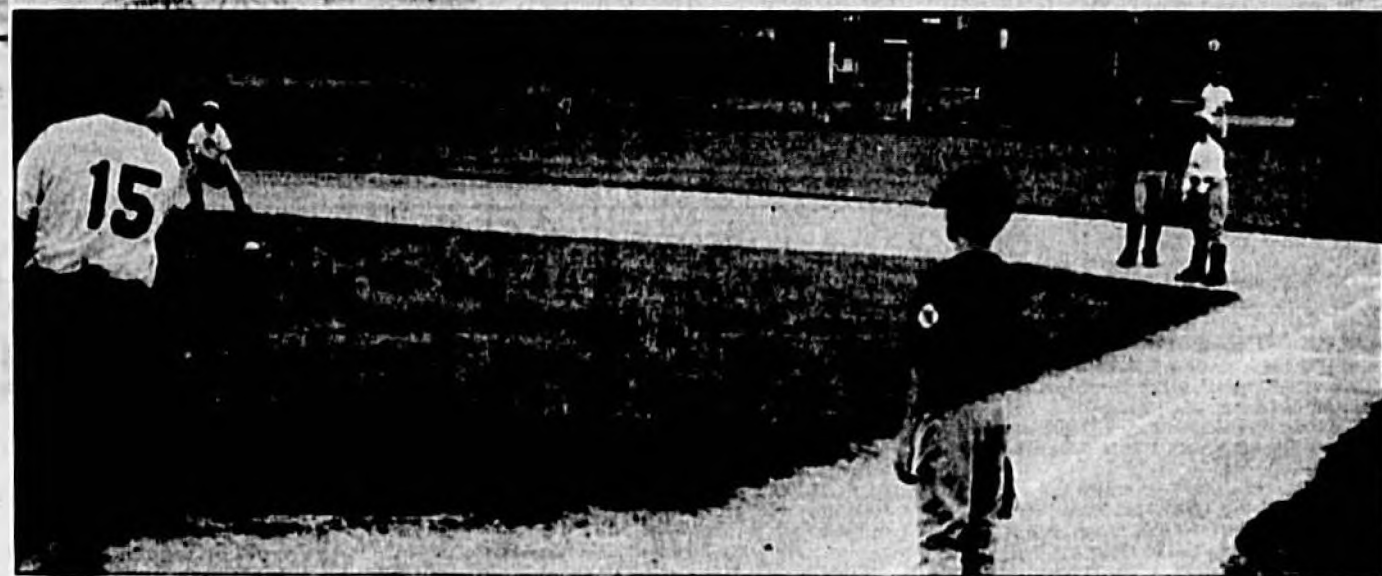

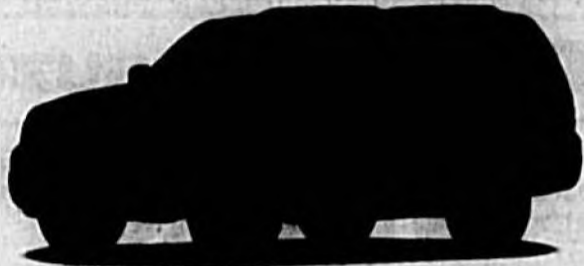
