This will not be a case of leaving our party; rather our party, as we inherited it from our fathers, and as we still would like to have it, has left us.

Fourth Round Wage Boost Already Speculated Upon

Eberstadt, Gotham Banker, May Become Defense Head Special to Central Press

W/ASIIINGTON-Aircady there is speculation about the fourth round of postwar wage increases, although many unions still have not completed their 1946 third-round negotiations.

The telephone unions, for example, are just launching an all-out fight for the third-round pattern of about 12% cents an hour established in other major industries. However, there is talk of another boost next spring and the

unions may demand about the same increase received this year. Some statisticians calculate that the cost of

living will have gone up a little over nine points in the period from April, 1948, to next Jan 1. Using the General Motors formula -a one-cent hourly wage boost for every increase of 1.14 points in the cost of living that would mean a fourth-round pay boost of about eight cents. Add to this the three cents an hour contained in the GM formula as an "Improvement factor," and the total comes to about 11 cents an hour. Unions may ask double that in fourth round

negotiations but settle for half.





Rural Common Sense By SPUD JOHNSON

GROWERS SHOULD TALK
MORE ABOUT VERSATILE
CITRUS THEY PRODUCE

Perhaps Florida citrus growers on't talk about their fruit enough. In a very interesting talk at the recent Florida Citrus Institute, Citriculturist Fred Lawrence of the Extension Service gave the growers some food for thought along that line. The story of maximum possible utilization of citrus fruit trumps that of the packing house pig and certainly equals that of the say or "wonder" bean, as it has been called.

Mr. Lawrence's remarks revealed Florida citrus as a "wonder" fruit insofar as total possible utilization is concerned, and it certainly would be fine if demand for all the products made from citrus were strong enough to make their production profitable to growers and proces-

If served fresh, the peel and rag of citrus usually are wasted, but full processing of the fruit, the Extension worker pointed out, is a different story.

From the peel comes marmalade.

candied peel for fruit cakes, feed for cattle, and vitamin P to reduce blood pressure.

And everyone is familiar with canned citrus sections fruit salad. Also from the "inside" of citrus comes whole juice, single strength juice, frozen and powdered concentrate, wine, and a distilled oil used in perfume and somp.

The pulp remaining after the whole juice has been extracted is good cattle feed. Fully processed, however, it yields such things as methane gas useful for fuel, citrle acid, vitamin C, cold press oil for flavoring, turpeneless oil, which sells for \$50 or more a pound and alcohol, yeast, and pectin, press cake for feed or dry pulp for feed sea, or for production of vitamin P and pectin, and naringin for flavoring marmalade or for medicine.






