

Mrs. King, 69, was shot to death Sunday in the simple red brick church near downtown Atlanta while she sat at the organ and the choir sang "The Lord's Prayer." A church deacon also was killed and a church member wounded when a young black man opened fire with two

Funeral services for Mrs. King were set for Wednesday Marcus Wayne Chenault, 23, of Dayton, Ohio, was bound over to a grand jury Monday on two counts of murder and one of aggravated assault.

Jaworski: Jury Named Nixon

WASHINGTON (AP) - Special Watergate prosecutor Leon Jaworski has denied it was his idea for the Watergate grand jury to name President Nixon as an unindicted co-conspirator. "The grand jury ... and not merely the prosecutor made this important determination in the first instance," Jaworski told the Supreme Court. Jaworksi and White House attorney James D. St. Clair filed final briefs with the court in preparation for arguments next Monday on the President's resistance to a lower court subpoena for potential Watergate coverup

Bill To Aid Youths

WASHINGTON (AP) - The House has passed and sent to the Senate a bill authorizing \$480 million to deal with problems of juvenile delinquency and runaway youths. The four-year measure, approved Monday on a 329-20 vote, would establish a juvenile delinquency prevention agency in the Department of Health, Education and

The House defeated 210-144 an attempt by Rep. Albert H. Quie, R-Minn., to shift jurisdiction over the new agency to the Justice Department's Law Enforcement Assistance

In a report backing the legislation, the House Education and Labor Committee said that previously only about \$10 million in HEW funds had been allocated to the handling

of youth crime, although almost half of all serious crime

in the United States is committed by juveniles.

Hughes Loses Suit

LOS ANGELES (AP) - The former head of Howard Hughes' Nevada operations has won his \$17.3 million defamation suit against the billionaire recluse. How much money Robert A. Maheu gets will be decided at a later phase of the trial.

A six-member U.S. District Court jury made the ruling Monday after a four-month trial and four days of deliberations. The same four women and two men will set the damages in the second phase of the case, set to begin Oct. The suit was filed 18 months ago after Maheu said he

was defamed by Hughes-or a voice purporting to be Hughes-during a telephonic news conference. The voice said Maheu was "a no-good, dishonest sonof-a-bitch and he stole me blind." Hughes attorneys contended that Maheu, a former FBI

agent fired by Hughes in 1970, actually stole more than \$1 million from Hughes by misappropriating funds placed at

Hunt Sought CIA Agents

WASHINGTON (AP) - In a three-month period immediately before the Watergate breakin, E. Howard Hunt Jr. asked his former CIA bosses to direct him to retired agents skilled in lock-picking and burglary, a report to the Senate Watergate committee said today.

The CIA official who provided the information retired one day after the arrests of the Watergate burglars, the

Prepared at the direction of committee Vice Chairman Howard H. Baker Jr., R-Tenn., the long-awaited report said the new information contradicts public testimony by senior CIA officials that Hunt had no contact with the agency after Aug. 21, 1971. That was the date on which the agency says it refused Hunt any further assistance for his undercover assignments for the White House.

The Baker report raises-but does not confirm-several new suspicions that the CIA may have known in advance of both the June 17, 1972, Watergate break-in and the Sept. 2, 1971, burglary of the offices of Dr. Lewis Fielding, a Los Angeles psychistrist treating Pentagon Papers figure

Dog Lovers Prevail

EDGEWOOD ARSENAL, Md. (AP) - The procurement of beagle puppies for use in chemical warfare experiments has been suspended pending intensive review by the Defense Department, according to

The Army said it has suspended procurement of 450

beagle puppies on which bids were to have opened Friday. The announcement follows congressional and public criticism for the use of beagles in military testing programs. The Army has denied it planned to test poison gas on the dogs, however, saying they were to be used in efforts to develop a vaccine against chemical agents such as tear gas and other riot controls.

The statement said tests are continuing with the small number remaining from the 400 puppies purchased last

Haitian Refugees

MIAMI (AP) - About 100 Haitian refugees recently released from jail have been offered a home at a Catholic seminary by the Catholic Archbishop of the Archdiocese

"We will give them a decent place to sleep and decent food" at the St. John Vianney Seminary in suburban Miami, Archbishop Coleman Carroll said Monday night. The refugees had been jailed after entering the U.S. sporadically over the past few months. They were released from jail on \$10,000 total bond last month pending a decision by immigration authorities over whether they can remain in the country.

The bond was raised by South Florida religious leaders, who support the Haitians' claim that they left their native land to escape political persecution. Some authorities have said that they suspected the refugees came to the U.S. for economic reasons.

Telephone Strike

FORT MYERS, Fla. (AP) - Standing water from heavy rains has caused 1,700 more telephones to go out of order near here, and a six-day strike by telephone workers left most of them unrepaired.

The total number of customers reported without telephone service in Southwest Florida increased to 2,750 Monday, most of them in Lee County, said a spokesman for the United Telephone Co.

Makeshift crews of company management personnel worked frantically to keep ahead of the breakdowns, utility officials said. Meanwhile, federal mediators called a meeting in Fort Myers on Wednesday between utility officials and striking

Local 199 of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. The strike began last Thursday when nearly 1,500 repairmen walked off the job in a contract dispute that came during a week-long rainstorm.

Health Facilities

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - By Jan. 1, state health officials must begin making a survey of the medical

condition of all Florida school children. The bill requiring the survey was signed into law Monday by Gov. Reubin Askew. The measure's purpose is to find where problems are and to encourage parents to take their youngsters to health facilities.

The bill sets aside \$1.6 million to begin the work. The total cost - state and county - is expected to be \$4.2 million between now and next July 1 and increase each fiscal year until it reaches \$15.7 million in 1977-78. Askew also signed bills which:

-Require establishment of "911" as the emergency number statewide for calling police, firemen and ambulances. -Require all homes built in Florida after Oct. 1 to have

plumbing that will accommodate solar water heaters. -Establishes a nine-member board to supervise vocational, technical, trade and business schools providing high school training. It would be similar to the Board of Independent Colleges and Universities. -Require a residency program to train family physi-

Environmental Centers

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - State environmental agency chiefs have agreed to start four regional permit centers so they can stop "permitting people to death," Natural Resources Director Harmon Shields says. Shields said he would ask the Cabinet in two weeks for guidance on whether to proceed with the plan to let people get ecology-related permits all in one place. The centers would be set up in Panama City, St. Petersburg, Miami and Orlando, he said.
