Marshall Is Grounded By Bad Weather

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—(AP)—The big ceremony in the White House this morning when General George C. Marshall was to have been sworn in as Secretary of State was postponed today when bad weather forced the grounding of his plane in Chicago.

Marshall will take the oath of office at the White House tomorrow. The exact hour will depend upon the time of his arrival in the Capital.

The army plane in which General Marshall was flying to Washington from the West Coast was compelled to halt in Chicago because of bad weather. Conditions at the Washington airport were so bad that the Army Transport Command signaled Marshall's pilot to stand put in Chicago. ATC headquarters said it was a possible chance of the general completing the trip by air today.

The general and his wife have gone to a hotel in Chicago, and Marshall said he probably will continue his trip to Washington by train later today.

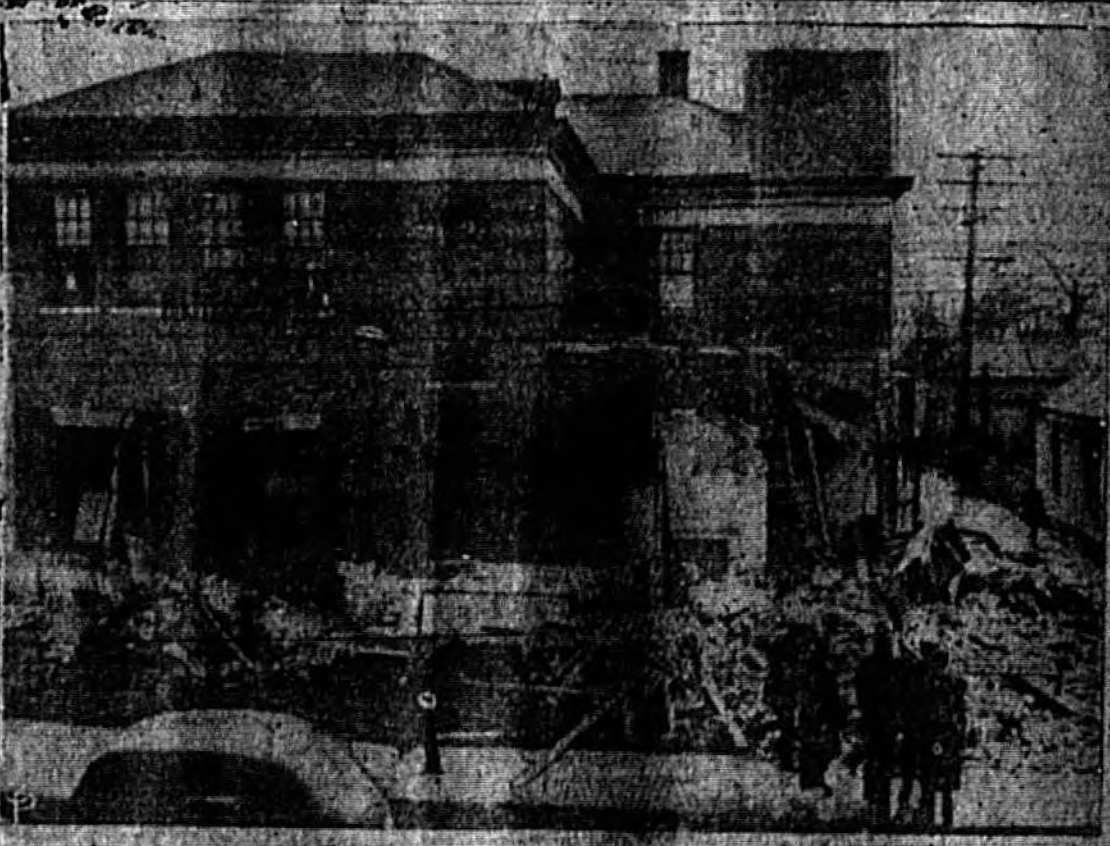

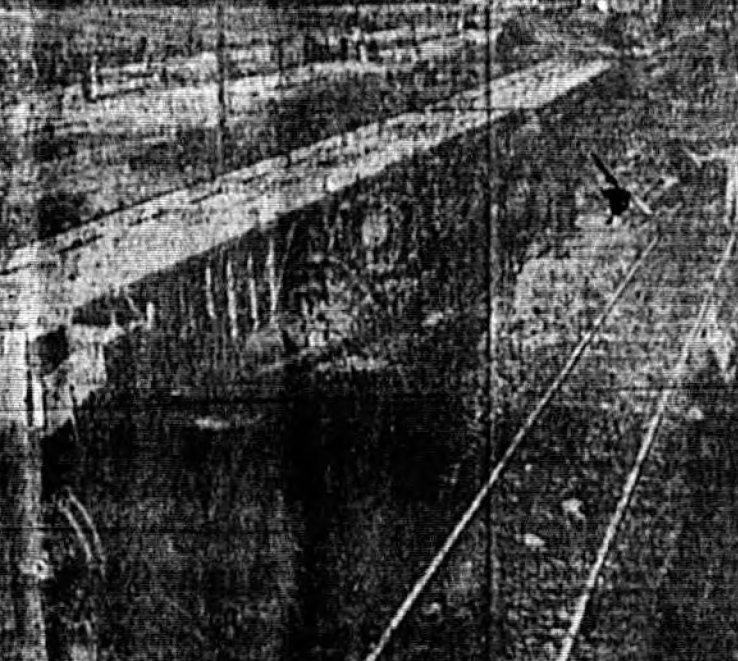
