Roasts, Steaks Popular Buys

The following guide to the nation's food shopping buys for the week ahead was prepared by the U. S. Department of Agriculture and Interior for United Press International. Eggs are the eighth product to be marketed under the seal so far. The others are oranges, lemons, grapefruit, watermelons, cucumbers, new potatoes and sweet corn. Week-end shoppers will generally find abundant supplies of seasonal fruits and vegetables with plentiful quantities of poultry and selected meats at their food shopping centers. Roasts and steaks should be popular choices this weekend. Broiler-fryers and turkeys continue to be plentiful and reasonably priced in the meat-poultry section. In the vegetable area, harvest give abundant quantities of green beans, cabbage, carrots, celery, corn, cucumbers, and eggplant. Onions, potatoes, squash, sweet potatoes and tomatoes continue to be in top supply. Increased volume in bananas, cantaloupe, grapes and nectarines will be reflected in better prices for consumers. Lemons, peaches, plums, and watermelons are in good supply. Nationally, fish sticks and portions, canned tuna, and chum salmon are good shopping buys.

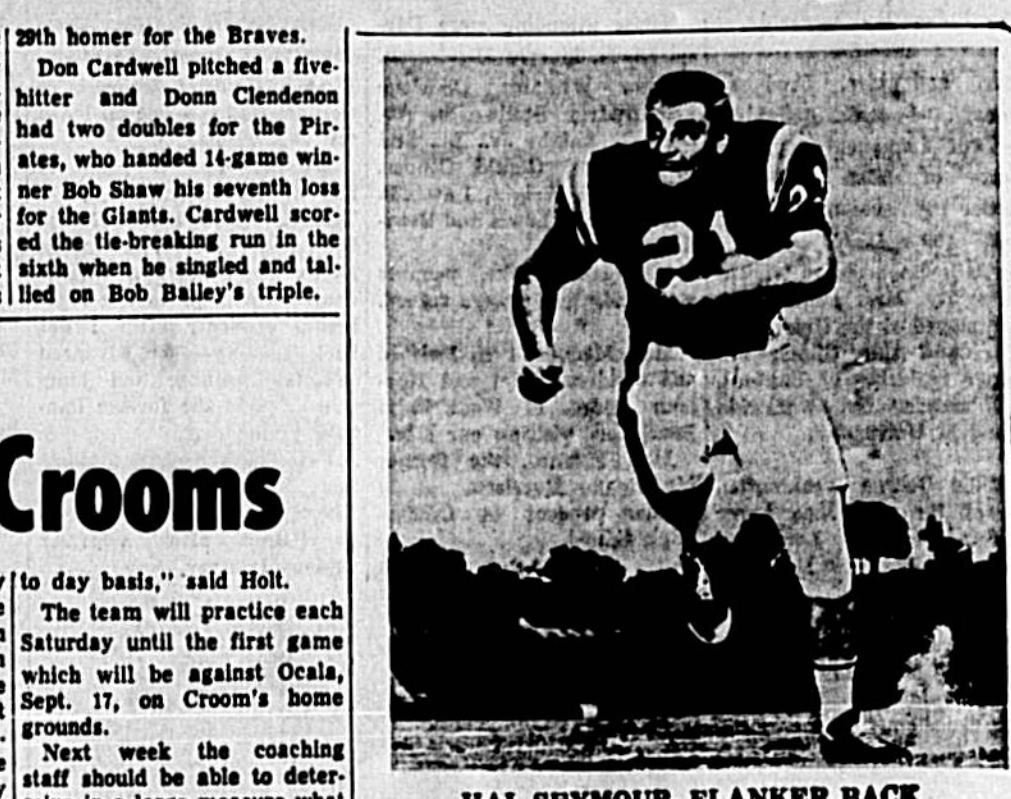

'Head Start' Aid Scheduled For Year-Long Basis

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Project Head Start is going on a year-round basis.

Launched this summer as a nationwide experiment in preparing deprived youngsters for the awesome adventure of going to school, Head Start has captured the public's imagination as no other aspect of the war on poverty.

The Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO) originally planned to enroll only 100,000 children in Head Start centers this summer. But the response from communities across the nation was so enthusiastic that OEO ended up financing 200,000 centers with an enrollment of 600,000.

Plans for putting Head Start centers on a year-round basis will be announced soon by President Johnson. Pending his official announcement, community officials already have been advised by OEO that they should continue a continuing flow of federal funds.

Federal support for pre-school centers is available both under the anti-poverty program and through other projects, are provided in the recently enacted Medicare Social Security law.

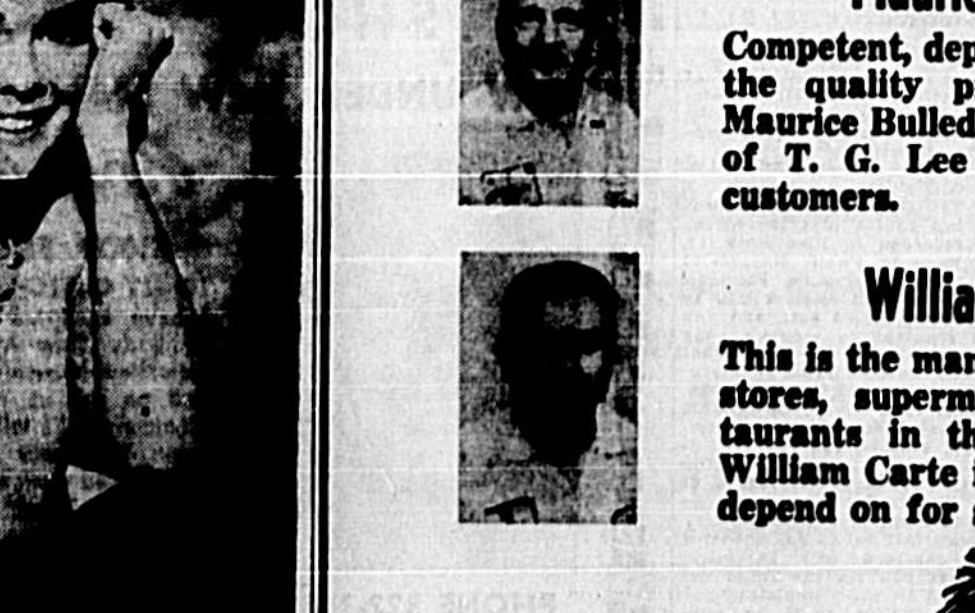

Health Vital To School Child

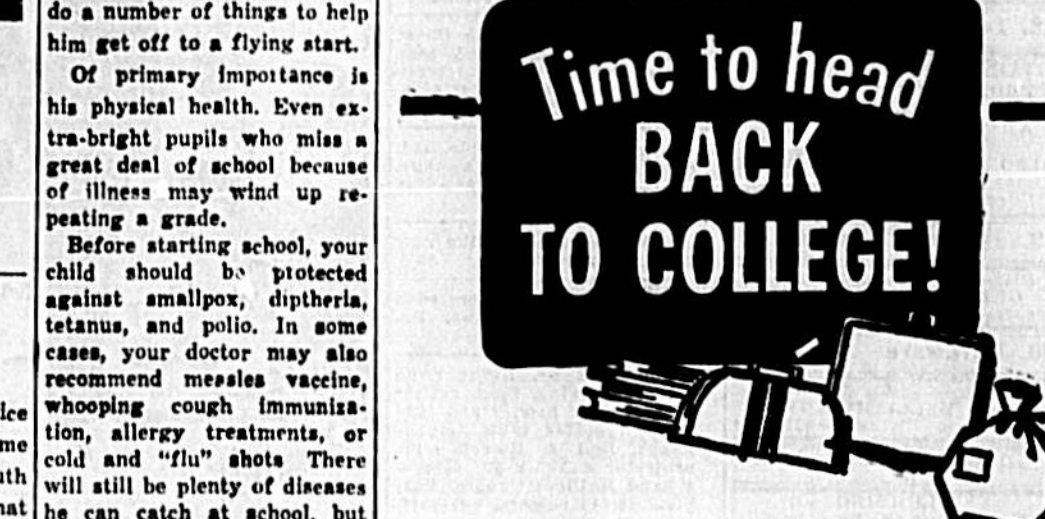
In the "dog days" of August, school seems a bit remote and unreal. Yet within weeks millions of youngsters will be back at their desks and studies. Many will enter school for the first time, happy and excited at being kindergarten or first graders, but worried, too, about what lies ahead.

As a parent, you can't make the adjustment to school FOR your child. You can, however, do a number of things to help him get off to a flying start.

Of primary importance is his physical health. Even extra-bright pupils who miss a great deal of school because of illness may wind up repeating a grade and missing out on the social and emotional benefits of school the next day.

Special consideration should be given to the child who has a chronic health problem. I know of one case where a mother failed to report her son's extreme sensitivity to bee stings. He was stung on the playground and nearly lost his life before medical attention was procured.

Teach your child good health habits, such as washing his hands before eating and after using the toilet, bathing frequently, using a handkerchief properly, and getting at least 10 hours of sleep. Regarding the latter, children who stay up until all hours seldom learn much at school the next day.

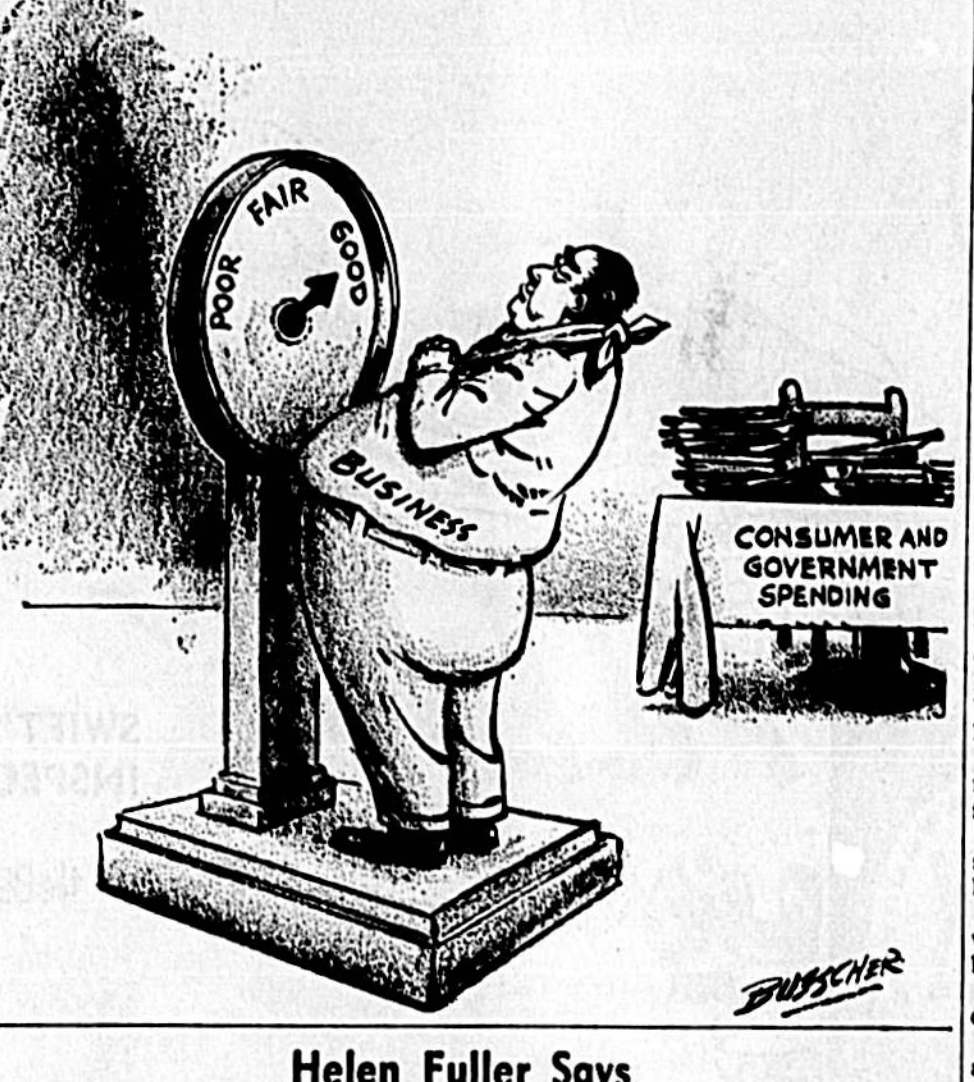
