GOP May Convene In Miami

Because Of Hotel Dispute WASHINGTON (AP) - Kansas City could lose this year's Republican convention, possibly to Miami Beach, in a dispute over hotel space, party leaders say.

Local officials claim they may fall as much as 10 per cent short of providing the Republicans the 16,000 rooms promised for the August event. GOP officials say if they can't have all the rooms pledged they are prepared to move their convention to

Drought Plagues Kansas

WICHITA, Kan. (AP) - Wheat farmers in the Great, Plains have begun plowing under part of their droughtshriveled 1976 crop in a desperate effort to head off severe wind erosion that could affect millions of acres. High winds this week in western Kansas and the Oklahoma and Texas panhandles kicked up dust storms reminiscent of Dust Bowl days.



Social Security System Falters

President Ford's proposal to increase the Social Security tax to 12.3 per cent - an increase of three-tenths of one per cent for both employes and employers — is one way to drive the wolf away from the door of this endangered pension program. It is not the only way, however, and there are alternate proposals being discussed in Congress which would raise as much money or more to relieve the impending crisis.

The trouble is these alternate funding schemes would destroy what remains of the original concept of Social Security. The time is rapidly approaching when Congress must decide whether Social Security is worth saving as a form of retirement insurance or whether it should be allowed to degenerate further into a thinly-disguised welfare

If Congress wants to reject the President's plan, and leave the tax rate at the present 11.7 per cent, it has two choices. It could increase sharply the maximum earnings on which the tax is imposed, or it could plan to stave off deficits with money from general tax revenue. Both of these alternatives would leave only the wispiest connection between what most workers would put into the Social Security system and what they could expect to receive in benefits upon retirement.

It is the penchant of previous Congresses to broaden Social Security coverage and sweeten its benefits that has made the program an actuarial disaster area. No amount of tinkering with the way the program is funded is going to save it unless there is a major overhaul in the way benefits are

Economists and actuaries who have studied the program are coming up with various approaches to reform, but most of them agree that Congress made a fundamental mistake in laying down the present formula for computing benefits, which ties them to increases both in average wage levels and the cost of living. In recent years this has caused benefits to rise faster than the inflation rate.

Fundamental reform of Social Security will be no easy task, both because of the complexities o such a program and because of the political sensitivity of lowering the expectations of those relying on it for all or most of their retirement income. By the same token, to treat the problem only by raising payroll taxes - or shifting support to the general fund - invites a rebellion among young and middleaged workers who resent the rising burden it places on their earnings.

As it is, the one out of five Americans who earn more than \$14,100 a year will see their Social Security tax rise by \$70 this year even without new action by Congress. The maximum earnings taxable at the present rate rises this year to \$25,300 and is scheduled to go to \$16,500 next January, raising the tax bite by another \$70 to \$965 - with a corresponding increase in the employer share. With the system not able to stay solvent even at that rate of support, something's got to give.

Examples Of Waste

Two years ago responsibility for programs to aid the elderly, blind and disabled was transferred from the states to the federal government to be operated as a single program called Supplemental Security Income, under the wing of the Social Security system. Now, a status report shows that one out of 10 recipients in early 1975 were being over-paid, and one out of 15 were not eligible for the benefits. The loss: \$547 million, which the government doubts it can recover.

Meanwhile, the Agriculture Department is trying to run down \$6.7 million which cannot be accounted for in another welfare operation administered from Washington, the Food

Guatemaian Officials Turn To Problems Of Rebuilding

GUATEMALA CITY, Guatemala (AP) — One week after Guatemala's devastating earthquake, officials are turning to such longer-range problems as the wheat harvest, reconstruction of shattered villages and towns, and clearance of the highway from Guatemala City to the

There has been no increase for more than 24 hours in the official toll of 17,032 dead, almost 55,000 injured and more than a sixth of the country's 6 million people homeless. Emergency foreign aid is pouring in, no serious outbreaks of disease have been reported and business activity is resuming in Guatemala City.

The corn harvest was over before the quake, but workers are needed to get the wheat crop in during the next two weeks. The nation's bread basket, between Chilmaltenango and Lago de los Cisnes (Swan Lake) was hit hard, and many farm workers were killed or injured Many of the survivors are busy rebuilding their adobe

Officials said priority must also be given to rebuilding the small towns in which damage was heaviest. Many are just piles of rubble. Guatemala is an agricultural country, and the rural towns are regional centers of commerce and

Leftist Angolans Seize Ports By The Associated Press

The Soviet-backed MPLA faction in Angola has announced the capture of the two ports at the Atlantic end of the railroad across the central part of the country, and British correspondents report the MPLA and Cuban forces are moving toward confrontation with the South

Jane Bergerol of the London Financial Times reported from Luanda, the Angolan capital, that the MPLA (Popular Movement) announced its unopposed occupation Tuesday of Benguela, the coastal terminus of the Benguela Railroad, and Lobito, the country's chief port 20 miles to the north.

"The rout of the pro-Western UNITA (National Union) n southern Angola now is virtually complete.... A direct confrontation with the South African army now seems imminent," Nicholas Ashford of the Times of London reported from Johannesburg.

Even before the suit was filed, some judges in different parts of the country distributed a "my dear editor" letter along with the petition and a separate statement. The letter said "we have been unfairly singled out and discriminated against."

The suit asks that the government reimburse the judges for a 34.5 per cent decrease in the value of their pay dollar in the period from March 15, 1969, to Oct. 1, 1975. During that period, federal district judges earned \$40,000 a year and appeals court judges \$42,500.

They claim that inflation reduced their spending power to about \$26,200 a year for district judges and \$27,800 for the ap-

"Unlike most citizens of the United States who are gainfully employed, including most federal employes, federal judges received no increase in salary to adjust for this decrease," the petition says.

Plaintiffs are 38 district judges and six from appeals courts. Eleven are chief judges Lambros of Cleveland, said judges could be out working as


