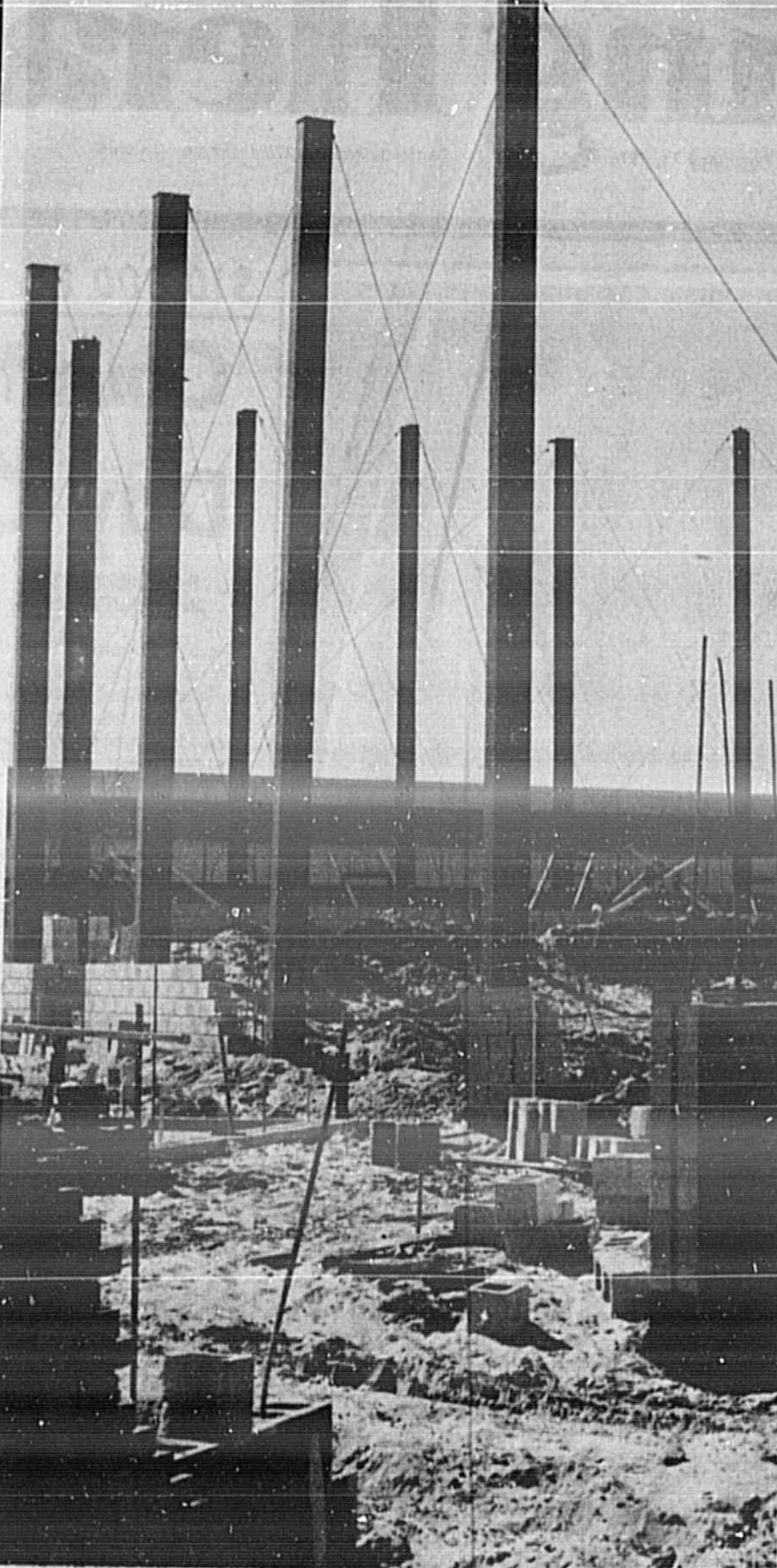

Hamburger Goes From Harbor To Back Yard Grill

Sailors from Hamburg, Germany, docking in New York City in days gone by are said to have patronized the eating stands along the wharf. They

insisted that their beef be chopped and placed between buns so they could easily carry it aboard their ships in bags. From New York, the custom spread westward and today has become a standard at the backyard barbecue. More hamburger is consumed in America

than any other type of meat. We all have our favorite ways of preparing hamburger, some from our immigrant forefathers, others that we have created ourselves.

New hamburger recipes are always welcome. Try cutting an

eggplant in two lengthwise; scoop out the inside leaving 1/4 inch all around the shell. Chop the scooped-out eggplant and cook in 1/2 cup butter until clear. Add 1/2 cup chopped onion and one minced garlic clove. Cool and add 1 1/2 cups fine bread crumbs, 1/4 lb. hamburger, and

one egg, slightly beaten. Heap the eggplant shells with the mixture, sprinkle with bread crumbs, and top with butter. Bake at 325 degrees until meat mixture is done. Serve with tomato sauce mixed with horseradish. Serves 4.

For a different kind of soup

you might like to try this recipe.

MEATBALL SOUP
Mix one lb. hamburger, one slightly beaten egg and one teaspoon salt and form into small balls. Place the following ingredients in a large kettle and bring to a boil.

1 cup diced carrots
2 cups diced potatoes
2 cans (2 cups tomatoes)
1 cup chopped onion
1 cup water
1 cup chopped lettuce
leaves
1 cup chopped green pepper

1 minced garlic clove
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
Simmer for about 30 minutes, then drop meat balls into soup. Cover and simmer for 20 minutes more. Top with chopped parsley and serve in bowls. Serves 4.

1 cup softened butter
1 cup sugar
1 egg yolk
1 tablespoon grated semi-sweet chocolate
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
2 tablespoons Cheri-Suisse
2 1/2 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
maraschino cherries

Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy, beat in next 4 ingredients, then add next 3 ingredients and mix until dough holds together. Cover and refrigerate a few hours. Roll out dough very thin and cut with small cookie cutter. Place cookies on ungreased cookie sheet. Decorate with maraschino cherry and bake 10 minutes at 350 degrees. Makes about 8 dozen.

SUGAR COOKIE HEARTS (About 6 Dozen)
1 cup (two sticks) butter, softened
1 1/2 cups sugar
2 eggs
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla
1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
1 cup sour cream

Cream butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs and vanilla. Add sifted dry ingredients alternately with sour cream, mixing well after each addition. Wrap in waxed paper and chill until firm enough to roll. Roll on lightly floured surface to about 1/8-inch thickness; cut with floured cookie cutters. Place on ungreased baking sheets. Sprinkle with plain or colored sugar. Bake in pre-heated 375-degree oven for 8 to 10 minutes or until cookies are lightly browned. Place on wire rack to cool.

CHOCOLATE RIPPLE CAKE (12 to 18 Servings)
1 cup (two sticks) butter, softened
2 cups sugar
3 eggs
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla
2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 cup milk
1/2 cup chocolate flavored syrup
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
Confectioners' sugar

Cream butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add vanilla. Sift dry ingredients together; add to creamed mixture alternately with milk, beating until smooth after each addition. Pour two-thirds of the batter into a greased and floured 10-inch tube pan. Combine chocolate syrup and soda; lightly blend with remaining batter. Pour over batter in pan; do not mix. Bake in preheated 350-degree oven for 45 minutes. Place a piece of aluminum foil over top of pan; continue baking 25 minutes longer or until done. Cool completely before removing from pan. Sift confectioners' sugar over top and sides of cake.

DDC Takes Steps Toward Special Taxing District

The Downtown Development Corporation of Sanford, Inc. (DDC) today signed its charter which provides for a 15 to 18-member board charged with rejuvenating downtown Sanford.

Atty. Douglas Stenstrom explained that the Improvement Authority Act would provide for the setting up of a taxing district which would have to depend upon the unreliable income of an annual fund raising drive.

The City Commission would also be the vehicle for levying taxation within the designated taxing district, with a taxing limit of three mills.

The Improvement Authority Act would not become law, he added, until a referendum was called and a majority voted in it. No time limit has been set for a referendum.

Airport Jail Rejected; Options Presented

There will be no jail at the Sanford Airport. Instead, according to County Commissioner Sidney Vihlen, voters may be asked to approve a \$2.5 million bond referendum in September for a new jail.

Robert M. Rosemond indicated to Vihlen, who arrived just as the meeting ended at 9:36, that the county's proposal to lease the airport building probably would have been defeated even if Vihlen had made it to the meeting on time.
