

Oysters are relatively lowfat, low-cholesterol foods based which replace older values that isted them as high-fat, highcholesterol foods. A three and a half ounce serving of raw oysters contain from 37 to 58 milligrams of cholesterol; a similar amount of shrimp is 150 milligrams; lobster, 200; and crab 52 to 98. You can eat shrimp in

moderation, restrict your lobster intake a little more and need not be concerned about crab any more than you would any similar amount of meat. If you limit your cholesterol intake to 300 milligrams, a day, you can't cat much shrimp and obster and still eat other choiesterol containing foods you need for a balanced diet.

Orr Welcomes SEEDCO Probe

#### Herald Staff Writer

Horace Orr, president of Sanford's Seminole Employment Economic Development Corporation (SEEDCO), said this morning he called last week for a

federal investigation of his organization "to clear the air of vicious charges" made against both SEEDCO and Orr Sen. Lawton Chiles (D-Lakeland) today responded to Orr's request, by calling for an audit of SEEDCO records

by the federal government's watchdog agency - the General Accounting Office (GAO). Rep. Richard Kelly (R-Holiday), who has indicated that he might call for a Federal Grand Jury to hear the allegations against SEEDCO management, has not yet

decided on a course of action. His office reported today that preliminary staff work is now being done on the SEEDCO question to determine the most desirable course. Kelly himself made a factfinding trip to Central Florida over the weekend.

Speaking at the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce Personality Breakfast this morning Orr said Sen. Chiles had been "bombarded" with letters and telephone calls deprecating SEEDCO and its president. He said the "vicious allegations and innuendoes" were also being directed to the office of U.S. Sen. Richard Stone (D-

"I could talk until I'm chartreus in the face, and some people wouldn't believe me," said Orr. "But maybe they'll believe the government.'

Orr added that for the past five years, SEEDCO has been audited annually by independent chartered public accountants, and has been either audited, or had in-

dependent audits reviewed by the federal government. "We have made our audits public," said Orr. "The public does have a right to know and we have tried to be as

"Cur records are public information," he continued, "but I believe they should be seen by people who understand what they see." The issue centers on Orr's alleged refusal to open

SEEDCO books to the public. Actually, Orr was asked to show payout vouchers covering the past five years. He refused to show the vouchers to an Orlando newspaper. Orr said he had not been treated "fair" in press reports concerning the poverty-fighting agency. However, all along, Orr has offered to open his office

He today extended this same invitation to everyone present at the Chamber meeting. In Orr's request to Sen. Chiles, he said "SEEDCO came under attack" from the Orlando newspaper and a columnist for the Seminole edition.

Orr said items were chosen at random and criticized without giving his staff a chance to explain what canceled checks and other items meant. Orr said newspaper reports have destroyed SEED-

CO's credibility in the business community. He hopes the GAO audit will restore some of that confidence in the agency which has brought more than \$4 million in federal grants to this area since its establishment in 1970.

#### Warren Learned Of Plots, **Ex-Security Chief Says**

WASHINGTON (AP) - A former head of the Secre Service confirms that the late Chief Justice Earl Warren once told him he learned of U.S. plots to kill Cuba's Fide Cantro, but not until three years after the Warren Com mission had concluded its investigation into assassination of John F. Kennedy.

In an interview Monday night, James J. Rowley, who retired in 1973 as director of the Secret Service, also confirmed that he had passed the information on to the FBI in a memo to then-FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover. Earlier Monday, well-informed sources reported that the Senate intelligence committee has obtained a copy of

Rowley To The Marie and the information had been provided to Warren by an unidentified source at a meeting arranged by the late columnist Drew Pearson.

#### French Dodge Taxes

PARIS (AP) - Despite the toughest crackdown ever France's annual income tax filing deadline passed at midnight, with the nation cheating the government out of about \$11 billion - more money, by official estimate, than it actually pays in taxes.

On a national scale, it meant that the usual tissue of lies, averaged out to saving each of the country's 50 million equivalent of the Internal Revenue Service.







### Social Security Rules Are Unfair

voluntary? About 90 per cent of American workers now have no choice. The law demands that they and their employers contribute.

Making Social Security voluntary might be more appealing to many Americans today than it was when Sen. Barry Goldwater came up with the idea in his 1964 presidential campaign. The most it cost a worker in 1964 was \$245. Today the top and doubts are being expressed about the ability of the system to keep its promises in the future.

The trouble is, going voluntary could deliver the coup de grace to an "insurance" system that is already giving actuaries nightmares because of the amount of money going out is overtaking the

ever, is whether the scarch for ways to refer provisions which exclude most government employes or give them the option of taking part. All government employes — federal, state and

local - were excluded originally from Social Security on the theory they were covered already by adequate retirement programs. In the 1950s Congress opened the way for state and local employes to join on a voluntary basis. Many did, seeing Social Security as a bargain for supplementing their other retirement benefits. Now, the high cost of participating, and the realization that Social Security may not be such a bargain after all, is causing some groups to consider with-

Civilian federal employes make up the largest category of workers excluded from Social Security. Members of the armed services are required to contribute. So are most self-employed professionals and farmers, regardless of what other provisions they make for retirement. The fact that government workers are covered by separate retirement plans is not unique. So are many other Americans who also pay, with some reluctance, into Social Security.

In an era when government salaries generally stood lower than those paid for comparable work in private employment, there may have been a justification for placing them in a special category in terms of fringe benefits. Today, government jobs often are among the best-paying in a community.

Whether the future financial soundness of Social Security would be helped or hindered by bringing all government employes into the system is a question for actuaries to consider. From the standpoint of fairness in the here and now, however, their exclusion or granting them to option to bow out seems hard to justify.







At Tuesday night's meeting the commission decision was based on a report from Roger Neiswender, the director of county development Neiswender said yearly operating costs would have totaled \$135,000, plus the initial cost of purchasing new buses was \$370,000, with the county's

share coming to \$37,000. The federal government would have paid 90 per

Two buses were slated for the Sanford area, a third for the Altamonte Mall, and a fourth bus would have been held as a spare.

officials will be allowed the option of providing funds to purchase the buses.

The key to the purchase, Neiswender explained is the fact that the county would be required to finance yearly operating costs if buses were bought. He also explained that mass transit contains

"Ridership is low," Neiswender said. He pointed out that if mass transit is to survive "government must put people in buses."

That would require a cutback in road construction and a halt in construction of parking lots. He said government — cities plus the county would be required to "move people out of buses," Commissioner John Kimbrough said.
