Pastor's Corner

Money And Your Church

Presbyterian Church of the Covenant
Lev. 27:30 "The title is the Lord's..."
"The church is always asking for money. The only people who have not heard this complaint must live in Outer Mongolia. Those concerned with the stewardship program of the church must be prepared to answer this charge when they are asked for commitments. Louis Casseels says that his answer, and he is a layman, is, "Yes, the church does have its hand out all the time. It is kept in this beggarly posture by the stinginess of its members." The person being contacted will bristle at this word "stinginess." If there is any truth that has no place in the self-image of the average American, it is meanness about money. We have heard so many times that Americans are a very generous people. It seems almost contradictory to question it. Many people are kindly minded of the needs of others, and liberal in their giving, but it cannot be proved that the average liberal is generous to church and charity.

Last year American Protestants gave about \$2 billion to their churches. That's an all-time record, and it sounds like a lot of money—until you begin to compare it to incomes of our people. Then you discover that only about one per cent of the personal incomes of Americans is contributed to the support of all religious causes. Protestant giving in 1966 averaged out to \$710 per church member. That is, if a week. The per capita figure is, of course, misleading. Hidden within the overall average are wide differences in giving habits. Casseels suggests that if we sort out church members according to their giving habits, we find that they fall into three broad categories.

First, there are the tip-payers. They refuse to sign pledge cards. "We do not want to be tied down by the promise to give the church a specific sum each week. We'll give what we can as we can." They say this in a kind of "poor-man's" way intended to impress the visitor that they are in dire want. What they mean is that when they do come to church they drop a single in the plate. These are called "tip-payers" because this dollar bill (the amount this type gives has not changed through two decades of inflation) is obviously meant to be a sort of gratuity to the preacher for whatever spiritual stimulation they may have received at the worship service.

Then there are the dues-payers. They sign pledge cards, because they recognize an obligation to help pay the costs of maintaining an institution in which they have membership, and from whose services they benefit. But the amount they pledge bears no real relationship to their incomes. If any calculation is done and many automatically pledge the same as last year without considering a raise in salary they may have had, it is apt to be directed at ascertaining their "fair share" of the budget.

Finally, there are the titheers. As here used this term includes all who follow the biblical principle of giving in proportion to income. For those people who carry this principle into the financial support and usually prayer support, also giving it first of all an act of gratitude and worship. It is an acknowledgment that we do not own anything absolutely and of our own right, but that everything we have is available to use. There are more titheers in our churches today than you would think. A surprisingly large number faithfully observe the ancient biblical yardstick of giving a tenth of their total income to church and charity. They find it financially helpful because "God's tenth" comes off the top; it is the first claim on their resources, the overriding priority in their budget. They are generally characteristic of titheers that they do not give quickly. You would never guess the identity of some of the titheers in your own congregation. Casseels suggests that the church's secret cache. Even with their always support, the church is always riding on the ragged edge of insolvency, needing many more dollars to carry on even a minimal Christian mission to a lost and groping world. Without this third group, the titheers, the program could not go forward at all.

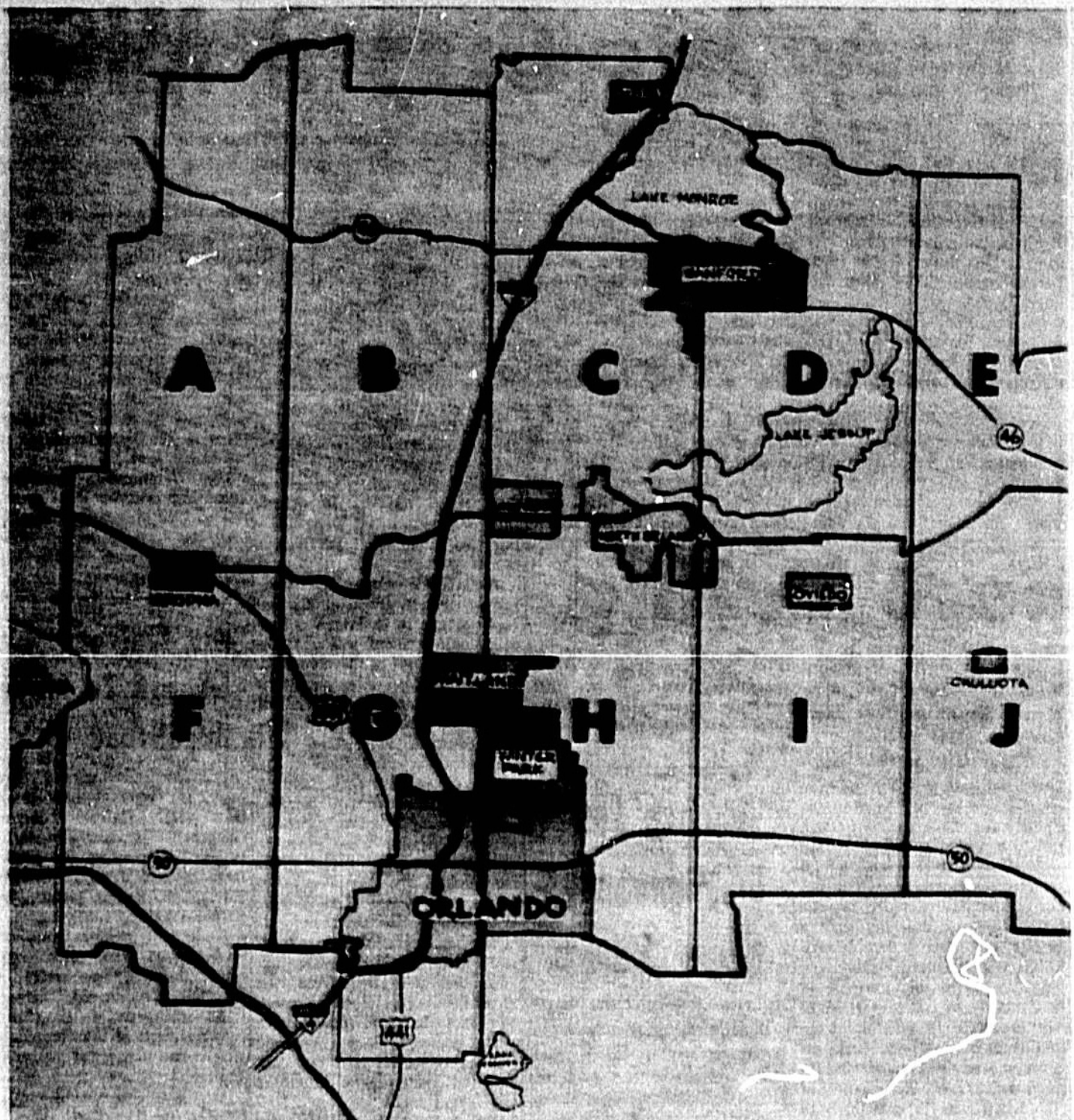

If you consider yourself a "pro" at growing roses then you know black spot and powdery mildew are major headaches here in Florida and can only be controlled by proper spraying methods.

Since black spot can only be prevented, not cured, you should get a spraying rig — such as a trouble-shooter or tank sprayer — and spray on a REGULAR basis.

The materials you use for controlling insects and mites can be added to your spray materials for black spot as a problem is mainly one of prompt recognition of pests and addition of the right insecticide to the spray solution.

The spray application for insect control should be repeated after seven to 10 days, in order to kill the new hatch from eggs unhatched from previous spraying. One hundred and sixty Florida Homemakers and Home Economics Agents had the high honor of having a "most gracious and vivacious first lady," Mrs. Arati Dutt of India, with them at their 42nd annual meeting of the Florida Extension Homemakers Council in Gainesville.

Mrs. Dutt is the first non-Caucasian world president of Associated Country Women of the World.

Grown in a 65-year long tradition, the 42nd annual meeting of the Florida Extension Homemakers Council was held at the University of Florida in Gainesville, Florida, from July 17-21, 1967.

Mrs. Dutt is a highly educated social worker. Her mother-in-law started the first women's organization in India.

U. S. Presents Expo Building To Montreal

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States will give the City of Montreal the 20-story-high, modern building housing the American exhibit at Canada's Expo 67, the U.S. Information Agency said today.

USA's new Lemare H. Marks presented the big, futuristic building to Montreal's Mayor Jean Drapeau as "a symbol of the warm friendship between Canada and the United States."

A USA spokesman estimated the cost of the 280-foot-high dome—the tallest building at the site of the Canadian exposition—was about \$2.6 million. He said the exhibit's most notable feature would be removed when Expo 67 closes in late October.

The dome has a spherical diameter of 236 feet, encloses a volume of 6.7 million cubic feet and is relatively light weight because of its frame of piping covered by translucent plastic panels.

USA said the Canadian have not decided how they might use the dome pavilion. It noted the Canadian government is considering turning the entire Expo 67 site into an international center.

show hard finish just as do other self-polishing waxes, but do you feel like throwing up your hands in despair when your self-polishing waxes are not what you need? This type of liquid wax is especially good if you have a large expanse of wood flooring in the den? Then perhaps this summary of the different types of wax available will help.

There are two basic types of wax compounds — the solvent-base waxes and the water-base waxes, each of which has a definite purpose.

Most solvent-base waxes are of the polishing type; that is, they must be buffed to a shine. They are available in either paste or liquid form and are primarily intended for wood and cork floors.

They are also recommended for sealed concrete floors; and some manufacturers recommend them for other floor coverings, as well. To be on the safe side, never use a solvent-base wax on a light-colored vinyl or linoleum flooring since it does tend to have a yellowing effect. Solvent-base waxes are harmful to some resilient floors and may even melt asphalt or rubber tiles.

Liquid solvent-base waxes are easier to apply than are the paste waxes, and also have more cleaning action. Don't expect the shine to last as long, however.

There are also a few self-polishing solvent-base waxes on the market. This type dries to a

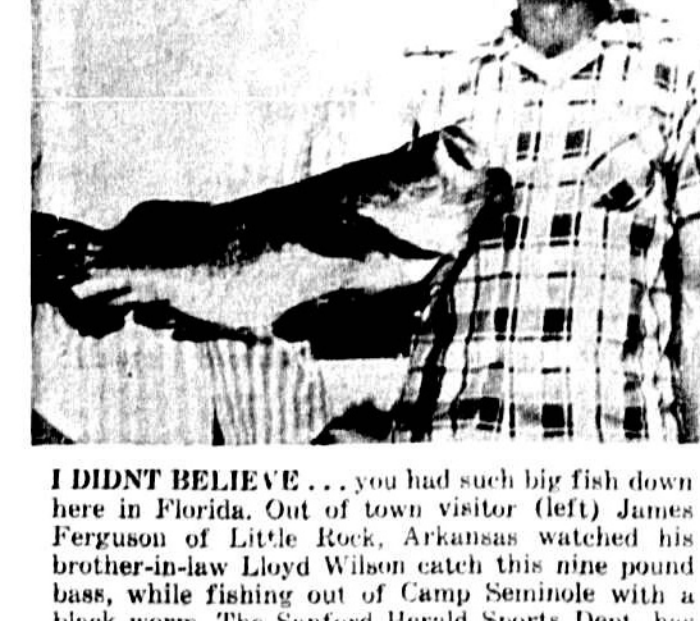
