





take on gargantuan odds in defense of their nest-ask me how I know. Whew! These birds appetites can be satiated with 700 pounds of seeds and feeds each six weeks. To add interest to the vast collection of birds which the Mennigs possess is an assortment of unique pets. For example, "Cassius," the basilisk lizard, who earns his keep by ridding the aviary of insect


The menu featured charcoal broiled steak, corn on the cob, French bread, tossed salad, and watermelon.

## Crop Rotation

Men have been cultivating the good ing seed potatoes to interrupt the nor-arth for at least 10,000 years, yet mal 60 to 90-day rest period before earth for at least 10,000 years, yet we continue to learn new things about this most fundamental and necessary

Back in 1957, Urban Pittman, a Canadian agricultural researcher in Alber-ta, noticed something peculiar about wheat. Crops planted in rows running north and south always matured up to a week earlier than wheat planted in east-west rows. Examining the roots of a test row, he found them aligned in a generally north-south formation.

After ruling out every other possible cause, he realized that the plants must be responding to an outside force, which could only be the earth's mag-

Later, he discovered he could speed up germination by exposing wheat seeds to an ordinary magnet. Corn and beans responded much the same way. Alberta farmers are now applying some of this new knowledge, planting winter wheat by the "compass crop" principle. Some of them claim it yields a four to seven-bushel increase in dry
