



Farmers' Markets Say 1948 Plantings Are Ahead Of '47

JACKSONVILLE Aug. 23 (Special)-"Reports from three of the vegetable markets which handled record-breaking quantities of produce the past two seasons show plantings are underway in excess of even last year's records," said William L. Wilson, Director of State Farmers' Markets in his weekly markets report today.

Frank E. Coner, Manager of the Wauchula State Farmers' Market advises, "The outlook for a jarge fall crop in this section is very Considerable pepper and eggplant have been set out already and much land is ready for the planting of cucumbers. At least one grower in this section has some very early cucumbers which are within two weeks of picking. Another has produced cucumbers of the Puerto Rican variety during the summer months. Some damping off of peoper plants has been reported but on the whole conditions are very fav-

C. S. Phillips, Manager of the Florida City State Farmers' Mar-ket reports, "We have approximately 50 acres of pepper already planted in our section. Some is already coming up. I believe there will be about 50 acres more planted. The acreage will run about half Florida Giants peppers and half California Wonders."

"I crawled under a British sector fence to take pictures of the British signs designating their sector. I walked midway into the street. In my mind, I am not sure whether I crossed the dividing line. "I was careful to remain within

the white line which marks the British sector. From there I took some pictures and I may have stepped back a foot or two into the Soviet sector. (Military police said the distance did not involve more than five feet at the most.)

"I snapped a couple of pictures and then, as I looked over my shoulder, I saw a jeep with three Soviet soldiers. One soldier jumped out and cut off my escape to the British sector. Another seized my camera. Two then grabbed me by the arms, put me into a jeep and took me to a nearby Soviet police station.

"Before you could say Winston Churchill, I had it. "At the station, I was interro

gated. I was told it was forbidden o take pictures of the Potsdamer Platz, which the Russians said was the Soviet sector.

"They accused me of taking pic-tures of Soviet soldiers.' I denied
