pain and distress," the motion stated, "and was threatening to take his own life."  
Herring said Clicquennoi bought the guns "for protection" and may have left the sawed-off antique shotgun cocked two nights before the infant's death after investigating a noise in the yard.

In his second statement to investigators about the shooting, Clicquennoi said he'd finished eating his hotdog and knocked the 16-gauge shotgun over. He said he didn't pick it up and didn't realize the infant had entered the room. Clicquennoi said he reached back then to get the 1875 model sawed-off shotgun to clean rust from the barrels and swung it up over his shoulder and it discharged when he started to lay it in front of him on his leg. He said he doesn't remember cocking the weapon but "may have as it slipped in my hand." —BOB LLOYD

# At Port Saxon Oil Plans Offices

A new 2,000-square-foot office building for Saxon Oil Co. will be built at the Seminole County Port in about four months, according to port officials.

The Seminole County Port Authority (SCOPA) board of Directors Monday night approved financing arrangements for the new office building, which will cost about \$30,000.

Standard Systems Inc., a port tenant that manufactures modular concrete structures, is now able to utilize its production line and seek new contracts, Port Administrator Jim Ryan told the port's board of directors.

Ryan said the concrete units had been removed from the production line by agreement with Sun Bank.

The port is now negotiating to lease warehouse space to three small prospective tenants: a trucking firm branch office, a silk screen producer and a cemetery vault manufacturer.

PESCO, a structural steel manufacturer with headquarters in Fort Lauderdale, is planning to add a 35,000-square-foot warehouse to the 50,500-square-foot warehouse and office the company now leases at the port, Ryan said.

The port's legal dispute with Lake Moore Utility owner J. W. Hickman will go to court Nov. 14, the port administrator said.

TAMPA (AP) — The leader of Florida's Ku Klux Klan claims that the battle isn't over yet against court-ordered busing in Polk County schools despite a federal order denying court action.

U.S. Magistrate Paul Game denied a hearing Wednesday to a group of parents protesting forced busing to desegregate elementary schools in that central Florida county.

Game based his ruling on a legal technicality. His law clerk said the 37 writs of habeas corpus failed to list a proper respondent.

Game recommended to the three federal judges handling the cases that the parents must "name the person allegedly having custody." And he cited 12 federal cases to back his point.

The pleas were addressed to the U.S. District Court, Middle District of Florida. The cases will not be closed until the judges file appropriate orders.

The parents, backed by the Klan, sought to raise the questions of whether children were under federal custody while on the bus. A federal judge earlier had ordered busing to achieve racial balance in the schools.

"As long as the parents want to fight this thing, then I'm willing to stand with them and help get a document that the courts can't throw out," said John Paul Rogers, grand dragon of Florida's KKK.

ARCADIA (AP) — Two armed convicted robbers remained at large today after four other inmates who escaped with them from the DeSoto Correctional Institution were captured, authorities said.

Police were looking for William G. Brooker, 35, and his brother, Robert M. Brooker, 31, who were last seen by deputies in the Sweetwater area. The Brooker brothers were serving sentences for robbery.

Prison officials refused comment on how the six escaped from the facility Tuesday night.

One of the escapes was recaptured in DeSoto County by a state trooper. The escapee was identified by police as Ronnie Peoples, 18.

Authorities said Alvin Humphries, 16, William Stewart, 20, and Ricky Feal, 18, were apprehended by deputies Wednesday in Hardee County.

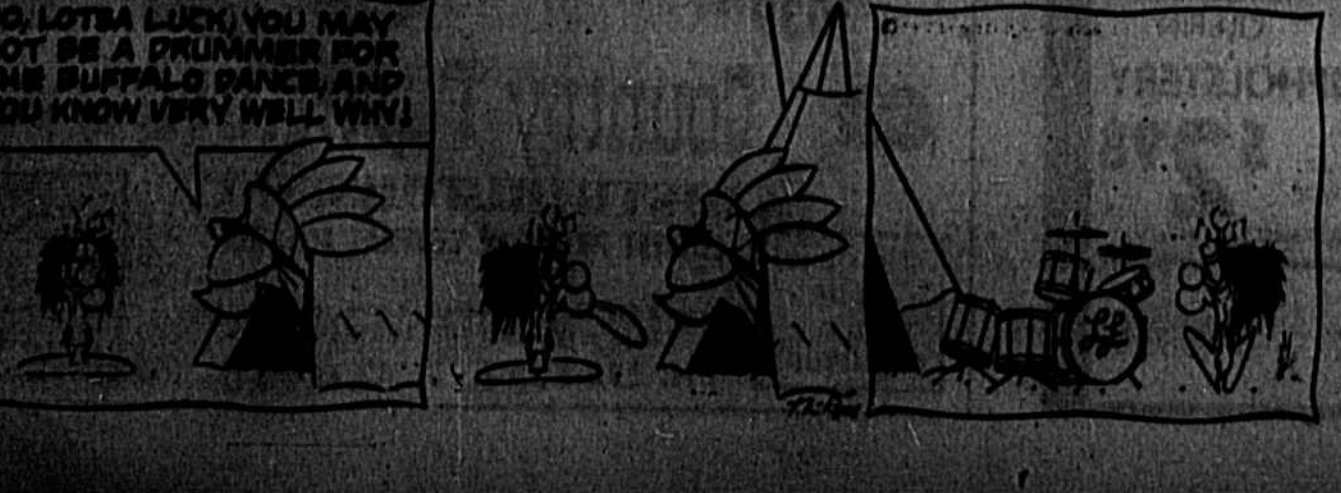
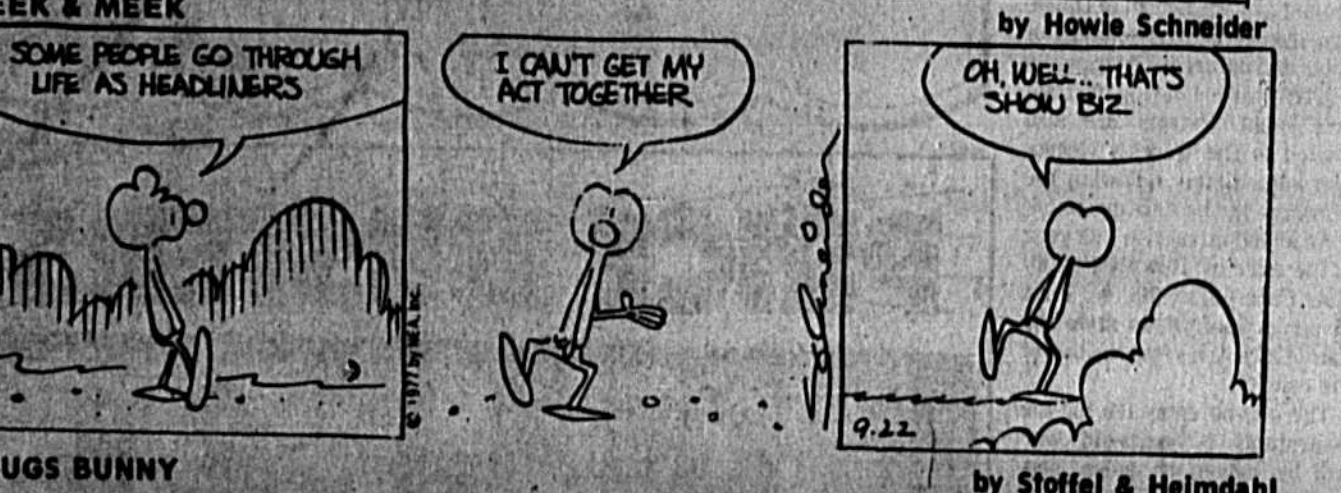

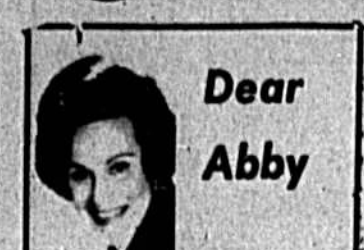

## From Medicine To Music

By MARY CAMPBELL, AP Newsfeatures Writer, NEW YORK — Thea Musgrave's father, back home in Scotland, didn't think that becoming a composer of classical music was a canny move, so he didn't encourage her. Still, he figured, if a man became a classical composer, married and had six children, eight people would starve. If a

woman married and had six kids, the husband would have to support her. So he didn't discourage her, either. With that, Thea Musgrave, at Edinburgh University, turned from medicine to music because "an overwhelming passion" overcame the earlier choice made on the cooler reasoning that doctors make a good living. "I never felt unwanted," Miss Musgrave says. "It's difficult and involving enough to master your profession and be good at it. If you had to fight a battle at the same time that women should be allowed... I never felt I had to do that." After abandoning medicine, Miss Musgrave first studied piano, then composition under Nadia Boulanger in Paris. She won the Lilli Boulanger prize for composition there, a prize in honor of Miss Boulanger's sister, also a composer. "It's vital for a young composer to get a chance to hear her work played," says Miss Musgrave. She had better luck than most: The British Broadcasting Corporation's classical orchestra in Scotland, which liked to play music by Scottish composers, performed many of her early works. Miss Musgrave wrote her first opera, in one act, while still a student in 1965. Her second opera, "The Decision," in three acts, was written in 1964-65. "It's about a Scottish mining disaster," Miss Musgrave says. "I was asked to do music for a TV play about this story. I was driving home from the final run-through, and it came in one of those flashes — This is what I want to do."

Miss Musgrave, brisk, cheerful, and slender, came to Santa Barbara Calif., to teach for three months. She met teacher-violinist-conductor Peter Mark there. They married and she stayed.
