Herring said Clicquennoi bought the guns "for protection" and may have left the sawed-off antique shotgun cocked two nights before the infant's death after investigating a noise in the yard. In his second statement to investigators about the shooting, Clicquennoi said he'd finished eating his hotdog and knocked the 16-gauge shotgun over. He said he didn't pick it up and didn't realize the infant had entered the room. Clicquennoi said he reached back then to get the 1875 model sawed-off shotgun to clean rust from the barrels and swung it up over his shoulder and it discharged when he started to lay it in front of him on his leg. He said he doesn't remember cocking the weapon but "may have as it slipped in my hand." ----- BOB LLOYD

A new 2,000-square-foot office building for Saxon Oil Co. will be built at the Seminole County Port in about four months, according to port officials.

The Seminole County Port Authority (SCOPA) board of Directors Monday night approved financing arrangements for the new office building will cost about \$36,000. Detailed engineering specifications for the building will be completed in about two weeks, according to Dennis Dolgner, assistant port administrator. When the specifications are completed, construction bids will be solicited.

The oil company headquartered in Ft. Lauderdale, now leases oil storage tanks from the port. The new building will be built by the port and leased to Saxon.

Standard Systems Inc., a port tenant that manufactures modular concrete structures, is now able to utilize its production line and seek new contracts, Port Administrator Jim Ryan told the port's board of directors.

The production line had been tied up in a legal dispute involving Sun Bank of Orlando, which had obtained a court order prohibiting Standard from removing several modular units for Seminole County's planned jail addition. The units were built by Concrete Concepts, a previous port tenant, which the port evicted in June for non-payment of rent.

Ryan said the concrete units had been removed from the production line by agreement with Sun Bank. The port is now negotiating to lease warehouse space to three

small prospective tenants: a trucking firm branch office, a silk screen producer and a cemetery vault manufacturer. The port now has eight tenants on its 120-acre facility on Lake Monroe. The port also is negotiating with two "larger" tenants, ac-cording to Dolgner: a food processing plant and a fertilizer and feed mill operations.

Fort Lauderdale, is planning to add a 35,000-square-foot warehouse to the 50,500-square-foot warehouse and office the company now leases at the port, Ryan said. The port's legal dispute with Lake Monroe Utility owner J. W.

Hickman will go to court Nov. 14, the port administrator said. Hickman claims the port owes him \$2,400 in connection fees for water and sewer lines to the port built by the utility.



#### South Africa And The Bomb A tremor ran through the world when the Soviet

Union, and later France, announced that South

Africa was planning to test an atomic bomb. The scenarios that could follow that possibility would do credit to Dr. Strangelove. South Africa becomes isolated from the Western world and is surrounded by hostile Marxist states. Facing hopeless odds, it develops tactical nuclear weapons and becomes desperate enough to destroy itself as well as its enemies.

The tremor subsided when South Africa assured the United States that it has no intention of developing nuclear weapons. Undoubtedly, that's true, fo

tedly, that's true, for political if not for other reasons. If South Africa detonated an atomic bomb, it would be further ostracized from the world. There would be no immediate benefit to Pretoria from possession of atomic weapons. And the frontline African states would undoubtedly take atomic intimidation as a direct challenge.

Still, not to be ignored is the report that South Africa constructed an atomic decoy in its Kalahari

Desert to rattle super power cages. Yet, the nagging thought persists that South Africa could "go nuclear" within a year if it wanted to. According to the authoritative Institute for Strategic Studies of London, 15 other nations could join the nuclear club within a decade, inling such beleaguered countries as Israel. Taiwan and Pakistan.

Some of the 15 nations are members of Western military alliances or under the nuclear protection of the Soviet Union. Unfortunately that is not true of some nations that might consider themselves in

increasingly desperate circumstances because of changes in world power selationships. The Carter administration is working with other suppliers of atomic technology and fuel to agree on guidelines that will prevent nuclear threshold nations from taking that big step.

The Carter program merits the support of the five existing nuclear powers, and particularly France—which has been nothing less than pious about the South African episode.

France now is calling for international disamament programs and discussions to promote nuclear restraint. But France is among the world's ne world s largest arms suppliers. And France is supplying South Africa and other nuclear threshold nations with atomic technology. It is not a party to nuclear ban treaties.

If the Carter administration can stay France's hand and make it practice what it preaches, the Great South Africa Bomb Scare will have served a purpose after all.

If a census could be taken right now, the pertinent question about Mr. Lehman's bill should be. Does Mr. Lehman bave something up his sleeve? There is only one right answer to this question: Mr. Lehman does indeed have something up his sleeve — a ploy to ensure that more Americans can get their hands into the congressional pork barrel. For not only is Congress to limit the congressional pork barrel. The division would pass directly to Congress any challenges to the bureau's population estimates from local and state governments, whose hand-outs from Washington very often depend on such data as the bureau


Beckwith said Wednesday afternoon that he attended a meeting of the Florida Supreme Court's Traffic Court Review Committee. of which he is a member, and learned from Justice James Adkins Jr. that the supreme court does not plan to address itself to the matter of the refunds, "only to the constitutionality of the law." "Frankly so far as I am concerned we are not going to order and direct the refund," Beckwith said the Justice told him.

The supreme court ruled on Sept. 7 that the surcharge, which went into effect July 1 as part of a controversial insurance law, was unconstitutional, but reserved judgment on the rest of the law. However, the court is yet to issue a written opinion and has not said if the ruling was retroactive.

Meanwhile, local courts continued to collect the \$30 surcharge for moving violations and \$250 surcharge for drunken driving. The law required the surcharges to be put into a Good Driver Incentive Fund to be paid out later as a reward to ticketless drivers. get it back." 

court rolling voided the incentive fund and the traffic fines - for still-unexplained reasons. And de la Parte argues that lawmakers wouldn't have made the ability policies optional without the incentive fund to reimburse

icketless drivers who kept their liability policies. "Any other result," the clubs argue, "would have eliminated empulsory liability insurance without an incentive provision to get drivers to voluntarily retain this coverage."

Attorney General Robert Shevin, who also was asked to file briefs on whether or not the Sept. 7 decision obligates the court to void the entire law, was joined by 12 prominent legislators in urging the high court to limit its order to the controversial fines and incentive fund. They contend that the legislature intended those items to be only a part of a broad revision package.

"The Good Driver Incentive Fund was a stone in the bridge-

work on the road to reform," the legislators said in their brief b Tallahassee lawyer D. Stephen Kahn. "However, it was not the keystone without which the insurance and tort system would have crumbled and tumbled into the chasm of disarray." They and Shevin note that legislators attached the standard severability clause to the bill, which was approved in the waning


hours of this year's regular legislative session. The provision, which de la Parte says is a "mere formality," asks the court to preserve sections of the bill that aren't struck down. By striking down the entire statute, the court could order all

Florida drivers again to carry liability coverage amounting to \$10,000 per person and \$20,000 per accident. That requirement was removed by the new law, which retained \$5,000 personal injury protection as the only mandatory auto insurance coverage 'in Florida.
