# County Accused Of Plotting Consolidation

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS- Councilman Dan Dorfman, Tuesday night accused the county commission of moving toward consolidation of county and city government in Seminole County via the Seminole Expressway Authority legislation. At the city council meeting, Dorfman also panned the local legislative delegation, State Sen. Lori Wilson in particular, charging local citizens were deliberately misinformed on the content of the proposed law before it was passed by the

He added that copies of the legislation had not been made available to city officials, who learned of its content only through an Evening Herald story published last week. The law creates a seven member expressway authority to

control construction of Seminole's portion of the planned tricounty beltline. The high-speed limited access highway is expected to cut through Casselberry or Winter Springs and Lake Mary or Sanford.

Dorfman said city officials throughout Seminole had been

spokesman said last week it is doubtful the CALNO Council has authority to take official action binding on individual cities. Officials of two of Seminole's seven cities agreed with the

Sanford city commission earlier this week voted to ratify in advance the CALNO choices to be selected in December. Altamonte Springs council Tuesday night left the option to Mayor Norman Floyd to select this city's choices. County commissioners were not available for comment today. Meyer Paving and Construction Co., \$134,550.20, and Central Florida Underground Inc. at \$134,889. Engineer's estimate for the project was \$180,000. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and consulting engineers are reviewing bids opened Tuesday on the project. The engineers will make recommendations to the FAA and FAA approval of contracts is expected on the project next week, he said. our application early in order to get our fair share of funds. since only 20 per cent of HUD funds go to non-urban areas.' Wilson, who coordinates both had already asked for, and received, a resolution supporting the application from the Sanford City Council on Nov. 18. But since both the county and city are fed by the same regional funds, the application will be delayed until a HUD regional representative can meet with the commission after the first of the year to offer

Not surprisingly, the near-unanimous conclusion of the 130 participating nations coincided with that of one representative of the U.S. Department of Agriculture: "The hope of the world

At issue, however, is whether the American people must also shoulder the burden of the inevitable sacrifices and pay the staggering bill linked to the battle against starvation.

And it seems unlikely that even the compassion DON OAKLEY of the American public can surmount the agony of its own domestic cirses to subsidize an international welfare agency without more assurances of world cooperation than currently are

## Neanderthal Man Finally Off Scene

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - As the old order changeth again in this fickle city, a fair man would have to say some of the 100- odd departing members of Congress are going to be missed. On the other hand some of them are just going to be going. Included in this latter lot, in fact leading it, is the Hon. John R. Rarick of Louisiana; not a tear save his own will be shed over the fellow's

During eight years in the House of Representatives, the Hon. John has accumulated few friends. Even those who agree with his positions and philosophies shy away from the identification for fear of guilt by association. It's not just that the Hon. John is according to the Almanac of American Politics "the most rabid right winger" in Washington, nor is his place as a political leper entirely the result of his racism and anti-semitism; fair numbers of his fellows share these traits — but none so glories in their public expression or so openly abuses public sen-

Two years ago, as example, during hearings concerning the District of Columbia, the Hon. John stunned the proceedings by calling predominantly black Washington a "rat infested," stinkhole," and suggesting that many of the Negro residents should be relocated in some sparsely populated Western state. Such was the esulting outrage that even a fellow Louisiana Democrat, Pat Caffery, felt it necessary to censure the remarks on the floor of the House.

Usually, however, no one bothers to censure the Hon. John. As one Southerner points out, "You only argue with a guy if you' think he's redeemable." Few think the Hon. John is. Few care. He came to Washington with the reputation of having ties with the Ku Klux Klan and he announced on arriving that his main task would be the preservation of the white culture. "A lot of us thought he'd change," says a black Congressman, "but we were wrong. He's still the most open racist I know. He called Martin Luther King a friend of Communists and Bayard Rustin a sexual pervert. Personally, I don't other." 



### Selassie Facing Execution

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Deposed Ethiopian Emperor Haile Selassie may be executed in the next two days, the French-language Beirut newspaper L'Orient-Le

The newspaper, quoting Western diplomatic sources, said the 82-year-old Selassie had been moved from detention in Addis Ababa to a town 30 miles away to prepare for the execution.

Selassie was deposed and placed under arrest last September. The government was taken over by a provisional military council which last weekend executed 60 aristo-

crats and former Ethiopian officials. L'Orient-Le Jour said several Western nations are urging African countries to intercede with the Ethopian junta to save Selassie's life.

### U. S. Seeks Funds Release

PEKING (AP) - U.S. and Chinese officals have begun negotiations on around \$200 million in American assets frozen after the 1949 Communist revolution. Terms of a settlement may be reached by the time Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger ends his visit Friday. Agreement would mark a further thaw in U.S.-

The assets represent confiscated property of Americans living in China in the early 1950s.

U.S. claims boards certified in hearings during the 1960s about \$200 million in claims. Offset against this would be about \$80 million worth of Chinese bank assets frozen in the United States during the Korean Conflict.

### Cambodia Faces UN Expulsion

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) - The vote could come late today on the cliffhanger of the General Assembly's current session - the Chinese-African bid to oust Cambodian President Lon Nol's pro-American government from the United Nations and seat Peking-based Norodom Sihanouk's exile regime. The United States and its supporters favor an alternate measure asking both sides in the Cambodian conflict to hold peace talks with the assistance of U.N. Secretary-General Kurt Waldheim.

### Mexico Breaks With Chile

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Mexico has broken diplomatic relations with Chile, culminating a period of hostility that began with the violent overthrow of the leftist Allende government more than a year ago. The government announced the break Tuesday night in a brief statement that said the Mexican charge d'affaires had been recalled. Mexico and Chile have had no ambassadors in each other's capital since the September 1973 overthrow of President Salvador Allende.

### **Burial Money Sought**

CAPE TOWN, South Africa (AP) - The father of 10-yearold Jennifer Schrikker, whose heart was used in an historic transplant operation, said today he is trying to raise about \$150 to bury his daughter. Frederick Arthur Schrikker, 38, said he is seeking the financial aid of heart specialist Dr. Christiaan Barnard. Barnard implanted Jennifer's heart in a 58-year-old man, making him the first man ever to have two hearts.

## **Prince Denounces Executions**

LONDON (AP) - The crown prince of Ethiopia, once designated as the African country's next king, says last weekend's execution of 60 Ethiopian officials was a mockery of justice. "This is an affront to all Ethiopians, young and old, who are struggling to create a just system in our country," said Asfa Wossen, 58-year-old son of deposed Emperor Haile Selassie.



That dismissal came on the grounds that the panel's special prosecutor, State Atty. T. Edward Austin of Jacksonville, improperly used his assistants in the grand jury room.

### Dickinson's Resignation Asked

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Gov. Reubin Askew has called for the resignation of indicted Comptroller Fred O. "Bud" Dickinson, but Dickinson says he intends to serve out his term and expects to be acquitted.

"While Bud Dickinson must be presumed innocent until proven otherwise, it seems clear that the wisest course of action that he can choose is to resign as comptroller," Askew said Tuesday in a statement issued by his office. Dickinson was charged Tuesday by a federal grand jury in Tampa with conspiracy to commit extortion and accepting a loan or gratuity from an official of a bank he

### Coastal Setback Lines Delayed

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - The Cabinet has rejected Agriculture Commissioner Doyle Conner's motion that it refuse to set new coastal setback lines until the legislature agrees to compensate property owners.

In a testy squabble with other Cabinet members Tuesday, Conner was defeated 4-3 as the board deferred until its Dec. 17 meeting a decision on establishing a Gulf Setback lines have been mandated by the legislature as

a means of controlling beachfront construction that could cause erosion or be destroyed in storms.

### Law Ruled Unconstitutional

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) - A creditor must notify a debtor before garnishing his wages, a federal judge says. U.S. District Judge Charles R. Scott ruled Tuesday that a section of a Florida law permitting garnishment without notification or a hearing is unconstitutional.

"The risk of loss of employment because of the issuance of a writ of garnishment is not illusory," said Scott. "The administrative burden upon the employer caused by the imposition of writs of garnishment for wages of his employes can be onerous."

### Miami Jeweler Robbed

MIAMI (AP) - Three masked men robbed a Miami jeweler of \$75,000 in gold and jewelry today after they kid-naped the man's wife and son and threatened to kill them if the man didn't cooperate, authorities said. The wife and 16-year-old son, who were handcuffed, gagged and locked in car trunk for three hours, managed to free themselves and alert police, and no one was hurt,

DEAR POLLY - I am answering Mrs.W.L.H. about the odor in her cast iron skillets. Tell her to put water in a large pot with a generous amount of baking soda. Immerse skillet in solution, boil 30-45 minutes. Rinse skillet and dry. Place dried skillet on the stove over flame, let it get almost red hot and turn flame off. Leave on stove until cool. Grease inside and put away. Wipe out excess if you wish. No rust. Before using skillet wash in sudsy water and vigorously scour inside with fine steel wool or a soap pad to prevent food sticking. After several oil and steel wool treatments skillet will be useful without it. After washing my skillet I always place it on a low flame so it dries thoroughly before being put away. 
