War's Effect On Business

We are afraid there are some people in this country who are rather hoping that a war will break out in Europe for the thoroughly selfish and somewhat erroneous belief that war somehow or other promotes better business conditions. In fact we have heard people say, "I hope there is a war. We certainly won't go mixed up in it this time, and besides, it would help business."

Undoubtedly, their conviction that a war in Europe would stimulate business in this country is based on the fact that that is exactly what happened in 1914-18. Business had not been so good in this country for some time prior to the last war, but almost immediately with its outbreak, things began to pick up, and within a year or two there was a great boom. There was an actual shortage of labor, wages were high and profits immense.

But whether or not the same thing would happen again depends of course upon whether or not this country adopts the same or similar economic and financial policies with regard to European countries at war. Twenty years ago, the great underlying policy of this country was, as everyone will recall, neutrality, peace at any price. But at the same time, we weren't above making an "honest dollar" if we could by selling guns and ammunition to France and England, and to Germany, when her U-boats could get through.

Not only did we sell Europe great quantities of arms and ammunition, but we also sold those countries, particularly the Allies, whole shiploads of cotton, steel, iron, coal, oil, and countless other ingredients of the materials of war. We also sold them wheat, beef, pork, to feed their soldiers, and shoes and textiles with which to clothe them. Because some ten million young men were engaged over there in fighting each other, here was suddenly created in those countries an extraordinary big demand for the things which this country produced.

So the people of the United States went to work making things for Europe. It was because we were producing such large quantities of the necessities of life for Europeans, which they ordinarily supplied for themselves, that business picked up in this country. Business here would again be affected by a war in Europe only in so far as we decided to do as we did before, make and sell things to the warring nations.

If an embargo were declared on all commodities going to any country at war, then plainly the business of the munition factories would be curtailed to that extent, and the men who would be given jobs making these munitions, would remain out of work. An embargo would also mean that we should place an embargo on our own producers and steel, out of which commodities made by the producers of these raw materials would also be adversely affected.

In short, a war in Europe would not stimulate our business. It would curtail our normal foreign trade and would curtail the extensive tax which we collect from the sale of millions of productive young Europeans, going on their normal occupations and consuming our goods. Our munition factories, for instance, which employ about 10 per cent of our total population, and produce a market for them.
