Possibility of Extra Session Is Forcing Negotiations To Dissolve Deadlock

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—(AP)—Delicate compromise maneuvers were moving forward on Capitol Hill Wednesday night seeking to dissolve the deadlock on relief legislation.

The possibility of an extra session of the new Congress in the Spring, which both Republican and Democratic leaders profess to desire to avoid, is forcing the negotiations.

President Hoover and the responsible leaders of all factions on either side of the Capitol spent the day discussing ways and means of meeting the problem.

FRESH TREMORS CRUMPLE WALLS OF RUINED CITY

Relief Workers Held At Bay As Another Shock Hits Napier

NAPIER, New Zealand, Feb. 5.—(AP)—While Red Cross officials tonight counted the dead in Tuesday's earthquakes at considerably more than 1000, new shocks were felt in this region and heightened the alarm of those who survived the earlier quakes.

The fresh tremors crumpled many buildings which had been weakened by the first shocks and increased the likelihood of fresh fires joining those now raging in the streets of this once-beautiful seaport.

Officials feared the number of dead would go above even the latest estimated, for tons of debris have not yet been explored and (Continued on Page Four)

The place of the meeting has not been announced, but it will begin at 8:00 o'clock.

Mr. Sala, as a member of the Florida delegation to the National Democratic Convention in Houston, received much publicity in this state as the standard bearer who sat on the floor of the hall with the Florida banner, rather than enter it in the parade of state delegations which had swung to Alfred E. Smith.

He brings to Sanford a message which according to the Rev. F. M. Marler, chairman of the committee on arrangements, is filled with up-to-the-minute facts and figures on communism. He has spent many months in foreign countries studying the effects and growth of communism, and a month's return to America, to begin a lecture tour, he maintains constant contact with agencies in those countries which furnish him with the latest developments. CURE FOR BANK ILLS REVEALED BY OWEN YOUNG

Federal Supervision Under Reserve System Urged For All Banks Of Country

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—(AP)—Nationalization of all banks of deposit under supervision of the Federal Reserve system was proposed Wednesday by Owen D. Young, New York financier, as a major step toward development of a "sound" banking policy to prevent recurring economic disasters.

"Then, for the first time," he said, "we shall be able to fix responsibility somewhere for a sound banking system."

This was included among a series of proposals and suggestions presented by the author of the Young plan for German reparations payments to the Senate banking investigating committee.

Los Angeles Heads For Panama To Aid In War Maneuvers

LAKEHURST, N. J., Feb. 5.—(AP)—Just as the sun was setting the Navy dirigible Los Angeles, with 48 men aboard, took off late Wednesday from Roosevelt Field to join the United States fleet in war maneuvers off Panama.

The flight had been postponed two days because of poor weather and the takeoff was delayed until late Wednesday to assure almost perfect flying conditions.

The ship, which left, had authority to fly over the Bahamas, Cuba, Costa Rica and Nicaragua before reaching its destination, but Commander Vincent R. Clark stated he was not sure all would be included.

Speaking into a microphone just before the takeoff, Clark said the Los Angeles would stop in Cuba to test out a new motor mast at Guantanamo Bay and would then proceed to Panama. On the return trip tests of measuring accuracy of the compass will be made.

The Los Angeles is expected to be back March 2.

With Citrus Exchange In Control Of Crop, Growers Are Urged Not To Sell

TAMPA, Feb. 5.—(Special). A material improvement in orange market which should mean hundreds of thousands of dollars extra to Florida and its citrus industry was predicted today by C. C. Conner, general manager of the Florida Citrus Exchange.

According to Mr. Conner, the Exchange has virtual control of the midseason crop of oranges left in the state and will utilize its position to bring a material improvement in the market.

"Our consumers have been rushing their orders to market and the market of the past few days indicates that they are practically cleaned out of midseason fruit," stated Mr. Conner. The Exchange will hold back awaiting either a market or a price which would avoid the market.

MAXON ON STAND IN OWN DEFENSE DENIES KILLING

Claims He Was Struck Over Head, Stunned In Terrific Fight

NEW YORK, Feb. 5.—(AP)—James Matthew Maxon, Jr., who wanted to be a reporter, as his father, now bishop of Tennessee, had been in his youth, yesterday played a part in one of those incidents of a newspaperman's work which doubtless had appealed to his boyish imagination.

Instead of sitting at a long table taking notes, however, young Maxon was the story itself, for he sat in the witness chair in general sessions court and told of a rooming house brawl killing that may send him to prison for life.

He described a terrific fight in the kitchen of a west side rooming house; said he was finally hit on the head and knocked out; declared he never consciously struck David Paynter, shabby old fellow lodger, for whose death he now is on trial.

Maxon said he had not known Paynter was even in the room until later, when a policeman's flashlight, playing around over a scene of wild disorder, revealed the old man's body.

9 British Fliers Die As Seaplane Dives Into Bay Of Batten

PLYMOUTH, England, Feb. 5.—(AP)—A giant seaplane of the Royal Air Force carrying 12 men on firing practice plunged into the waters of Batten Bay Wednesday with a loss of nine lives and injuries to two. One man escaped unhurt.

The surface of the smooth bay, bright as a mirror, apparently caused the pilot to misjudge his distance above the water in landing. The craft dived full tilt into the water, turned over and only the port wings were visible.

A loud explosion was heard as the plane crashed. It brought nearby water craft to the rescue. All except four in the plane were trapped in the submerged body. Divers were sent down in an effort to recover the bodies of the missing, among whom was Wing Commander C. G. Tucker, who had a splendid war record.

Flying Officer F. K. Wood was rescued alive but he died shortly afterward of his injuries. Lieut. M. H. Ely was rescued seriously injured and Flying Officer C. Ryley was picked up only slightly hurt.

Of the eight enlisted men in the crash all but one are missing. Corporal W. M. Barry received no injuries.

The big plane had a wing spread of 97 feet and was 67 feet long.

British Ace Does 528 Miles An Hour Average For Speed Man At Daytona Beach

DAYTONA BEACH, Feb. 5.—(Special)—Two hundred and forty and a fraction miles per hour, or slightly more than four miles per minute, official time, was the remarkable record hung up here this afternoon by Captain Malcolm Campbell, of the British speedway lists as he drove his giant eight-hull Bluebird II over sands before an audience who jammed every possible point vantage.

Rolling his machine on the beach shortly after 2:00 o'clock, Captain Campbell spent but a short time in tuning it for the terrific ordeal which ended in complete triumph. The new record exceeds by 14.77 miles that set for Sengrave, British speed set in March 1929.

On his first run along the mile course, Captain Campbell registered a recorded speed of 528 miles per hour, going around the course from the north. Moments later, he sped along at the rate of 245.727 miles per hour or an average of slightly more than 245 miles an hour.

DRUG SUSPECT IS SEIZED IN ACT OF GETTING SUPPLY

Man Arrested Here Is Thought Member Of Huge Narcotic Ring

A slip in otherwise well-timed plans, and prompt action on the part of Sheriff J. F. McClelland and his deputies, resulted in the arrest this morning at about 10:00 o'clock in the Post Office building of a man who is believed to be one of the important cogs in an narcotic smuggling machine which has been operating in Florida for some time.

The man, who gave his name as W. V. Doudy, of Savannah, Ga., was nabbed a few moments after he had been handed by a postal clerk a package which contained morphine valued at about \$125. He is now in the county jail awaiting the arrival of Federal Narcotic Bureau agents who enroute to Sanford from both Jacksonville and Tampa.

Only a matter of a few moments separated Doudy from freedom, for Sheriff McClelland had hardly had time to confer with Postmaster J. P. Hall, to lay plans for his arrest, when he was notified that the suspect was in the postoffice. Had the Sheriff been delayed five minutes or more, the man might have made his escape, although postal authorities here were on the look-out for him.

The details surrounding the entire affair, pieced together after the arrest, cover a period of several days. Poorly executed final details were clearly evident in that the sender of the package did not apparently know that the Forrest Lake Hotel was closed, or that a person named H. M. Watson resided in Sanford.

Senator Caraway Gets Cramton Talk In Telephone

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—(AP)—A dispute between a Senator and two Representatives Wednesday spilled over the barriers of Congressional rules and resulted in the stage of a one-sided duel by telephone and the issuance of public challenge.

Representative Cramton, Mich., hung up the receiver of Senator Caraway, (D. Ark.), after the latter called him by telephone to invite him to repeat false charges which he had made against Caraway in a "plain unadulterated" way which was made on the House floor Tuesday.

Caraway called back two times and got the same response. He said, however, he told the Michigan member what he thought of him before the receiver was hung up. Cramton's comment about the telephone exchange was a surprise and a statement that Caraway had called him several times that when he "shot him, or heard something that sounded 'ferry causing words'."

Later, Caraway on the floor issued a standing order to Cramton and to Representative Treadway, (R. Mass.), to face him to face what they had Tuesday in the House in response to Caraway's attack upon for their opposition to the \$20,000,000 Red Cross relief bill.
