### Iraq Claims Capture

### Of Key Iranian Port

BAGHDAD, Iraq (UPI) - Iraqi said its forces virtually captured the key Iranian port of Khurramshahr today in a major victory of the 15-day-old Persian Gulf war. Iran insisted its forces were holding out. Baghdad radio broadcast a claim of the city's capture, saying, "The heroes of the battle are loftily standing in al-Muhammarah and its port." Al-Muhammarah is the Arabic name for Khurramshahr Iraqi commandos and armored troops completed the capture of Khurramshahr's port area along the Shattal-Arab waterway Sunday. They had the city center surrounded and seemed content to starve out the few Iranian defenders left.

### Oil Facilities Crippled

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) — Oil industry reports say Iran and Iraq have suffered billions of dollars in damage to their oil facilities, but Saudi Arabia's willingness to pump more crude oil will make up enough of the lost production to avert substantial oil shortages or price hikes in the West.

"Damage to oil installations and equipment, as well. as weaponry, will undoubtedly exceed \$20 billion," the authoritative economic weekly An-Nahar Arab Report "Iraq might be able to draw on its financial reserves

to rebuild its military machine, its refineries and

petrochemical complexes, but Iran, with its meager

holdings, will find this difficult without increasing The report said the war should provide a financial windfall for Western manufacturers: "The industrial countries, including the U.S.S.R., will receive orders for arms and petroleum and petrochemical facilities running as high as \$25 billion."

### Terrorist Groups Linked?

PARIS (UPI) - French police drew links today. between French Neo-Nazis who bombed a Paris synagogue and ultrarightists who detonated explosives The Friday synagogue bombing claimed a fourth life

Sunday and a woman tourist, with no Jewish ties, was maimed in a fresh bombing.

France's Justice Minister Alain Peyefitte said the timing of the Friday night synagogue bombing was a "troubling coincidence," coming exactly a week after a blast set off by suspected neo-Nazis left 13 dead at the

A 25-year-old Portugese man died in a hospital Sunday, becoming the fourth victim of the bombing at a Paris synagogue. Thousands of Jews took to the streets to denounce the government for inaction and the police for possible involvement with ultra-right

### Portuguese Democrats Win

LISBON, Portugal (UPI) - Portuguese voters handed the ruling Democratic Alliance a decisive victory in parliamentary elections and dealt the country's once-powerful left its worst worst defeat since democracy was restored by the 1974 revolution. With only a handful of precincts still uncounted today, Prime Minister Francisco Sa Caneiro's conservative three party coalition culled 47.3 percent of Sunday's poll and captured an expected six-seat majority in parliament, seaving the dividend left in

Fireworks exploded as the sun came up today and jubilant supporters of the Democratic Alliance AD careened through the streets in honking automobile caravans, in an ironic turnabout from the festive celebrations hailing the 1974 leftist-led "revolution of the flowers" that ended half a century of dictatorship. The leaders of the chief opposition parties on the left, former prime minister Mario Soares' Socialist Front and the communist-led United Peoples' Alliance, expressed concern that the shift to the right could signal a return to authoritarian rule.







The list of endangered industries in America is lengthy and growing all the time. It appears that powerful elements in the federal government regard many industries as expendable.

Dennis J. Carney, chairman of the Wheeling-Pittsburgh Steel Corp., made this specific charge in a recent speech. Citing lower employment in his company and industry, Mr. Carney said: "It appears that some unofficial policy in Washington has written off large portions of the steel and auto

industries in particular, as expendable."

Mr. Carney charged that foreign countries are dumping their steel and unemployment in this country. He said that the Secretary of Commerce and the U.S. Trade Representative view the dumping of steel products as helpful to foreign

"This is like arguing that being burgled is good for us," he said, "if the burglars return a little of

The steel industry isn't the only basic industry that is in trouble and that needs attention. The textile industry, which employs almost one million Americans, is another industry that is suffering from short-sighted government policies.

U.S. president drawn an undercurrent of guffaws from the press by giving a straight answer to a straight question. But such was the case when Jimmy Carter characterized his re-election effort as "very moderate in tone" when questioned on campaign tactics at his latest press conference.

In response to another question, the president elaborated: "I try to discuss the issues and I do not indulge in attacking personally the integrity of my opponents and I hope that I never shall." In addition, Carter denied that he becomes "mean spirited" on the stump or that he ever called Ronald Reagan a racist or believed him to be one.
