Stepfather Pleads Innocent in Murder

An effort is being made by Charlene Bennett Powers to have Ronald F. Powers, her husband and accused slayer of her 2 1/2-year-old daughter, released on bond from Seminole County where he has been confined since being arrested on Feb. 26 by county detectives.

The Herald has learned that Mrs. Powers tend to obtain title to his car and while at the jail indicated she planned to have raised sufficient money to fund the \$10,000 bond set by Judge Volle Williams a week ago.

Powers and his wife have been charged in the beheading of Lana Bennett, youngest of four children born to Charlene and George Bennett. The three remaining Bennett children were taken from their mother after Powers' arrest and placed in receiving homes by a court order.

The woman divorced Bennett, an Air Force enlistee, and married Powers, an auto mechanic.

Mrs. Powers was arrested after a Seminole County grand jury probe that resulted in second degree murder indictments being returned for the man and his wife.

Powers pleaded innocent at a Circuit Court arraignment Thursday and was returned to jail in lieu of \$10,000 bond.

His wife was released from jail four days previous after her employer, Clark Jennings, Winter Park atorney, posted her \$10,000 bond with a cashier's check for the full amount.

Powers was arrested after his step-daughter died in Orange Memorial Hospital of a ruptured spleen and stomach injuries, according to Dr. Thomas Hegert, Orange County medical examiner, who performed an autopsy.

The child had been hospitalized before other injuries including a broken arm and a broken leg.

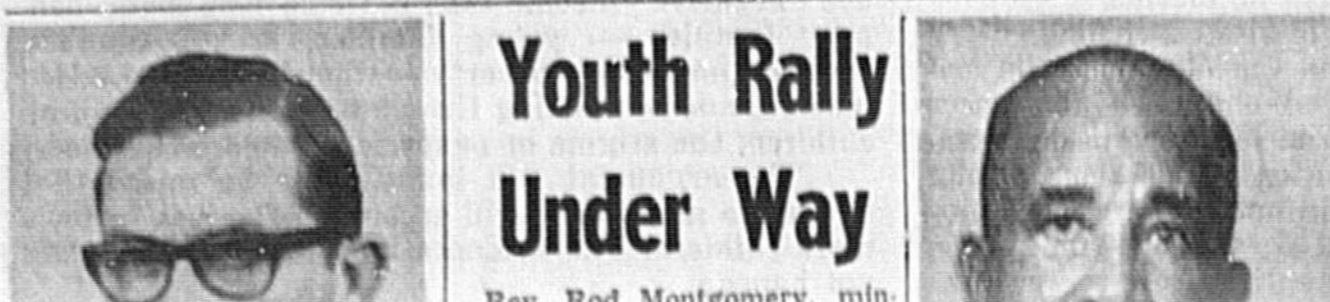

## 22 Americans Die In Heavy Fighting

SAIGON (UPI)—U.S. military spokesmen said 22 Americans were killed and 37 wounded in stepped-up fighting and helicopter crashes Thursday and early today—the heaviest losses in any 24-hour period yet this year.

The costliest incident was the crash Thursday of an Army UH1 helicopter that killed 10 Americans. The cause of the crash near Ba Hia, 45 miles southeast of Saigon, was not known.

Two other helicopters were shot down by guerrilla ground fire, killing one American and injuring three others.

Communications reported American forces lost 11 killed and 32 wounded in ground fighting that raged from the edge of the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) to provinces adjoining Cambodia near Saigon.

North Vietnamese and Viet Cong units launched attacks against four positions defended by American troops and shelled 17 Allied targets during the night.

## Junior High Football Will Be Passe In Fall

With the 1970-71 school term implementation of the middle school there will be no more junior high schools for 6-8 grade county youngsters.

This was approved yesterday by Seminole County District School Board in an afternoon meeting that saw the policy change taken after a recommendation from the administration.

The school board discussed, but not passed for present, was a proposal that no middle school shall participate in athletic contests outside the county.

Board declined to act on this recommendation for time being preferring to wait for a more detailed explanation of what type athletic program is being planned for middle schools next year.

With the start of the Modified Operational Plan (MOP) next term all elementary schools will operate with kindergarten through fifth grades; middle schools take the sixth grade from the elementary schools and move the sixth grade from present junior high facilities into the high schools.

In the two ten-period day schools, board approved allowing the division of pupils by zones.

The principal and appropriate members of the District Staff will zone the area served to create a numerically balanced schedule with approximately one-half of the pupils attending morning classes and one half attending afternoon sessions.

The principal shall have the authority and responsibility for making individual assignments.

# Cambodia Serves An Ultimatum

PHNOM PENH (UPI)—The Cambodian government closed today it had sent letters to Hanoi and the Viet Cong leaders demanding they withdraw their forces from this country by dawn on Sunday.

The demand came in a letter dated March 12 and addressed to the North Vietnamese and Viet Cong governments.

The government notes that right-wing elements might seize power in Cambodia.

The ultimatum was made public today by Premier Lon Nol who is in charge of the Phnom Penh government.

The ultimatum stated: "I demand that the Viet Cong and Communist forces stop supporting the Cambodian prime minister."

At the same time, the Cambodian prime minister demanded an increase of 10,000 men for his 30,000-man army to combat subversive elements along the border, the official news agency reported.

It said reports Cambodia wanted a 60,000 man increase were in error.

The government notes that the Viet Cong forces are in Cambodia's trade agreements with the Viet Cong.

Earlier today government officials running the country in Phnom Penh suspended Cambodia's trade agreements with the Viet Cong effective as of today. And the premier also asked Sihanouk to increase the size of the country's army.

But the notes said the ultimatum "to oblige even our friends to be correct with us and keep their promises."

# Bombing Scare Disrupts Schools

A wave of bomb scares has disrupted private and public facilities in several cities following the bombing of corporation offices in three New York skyscrapers.

New York police said they received 205 bomb threats Thursday after the explosions. An estimated 15,000 persons were affected by evacuations of at least 15 buildings during bomb scares.

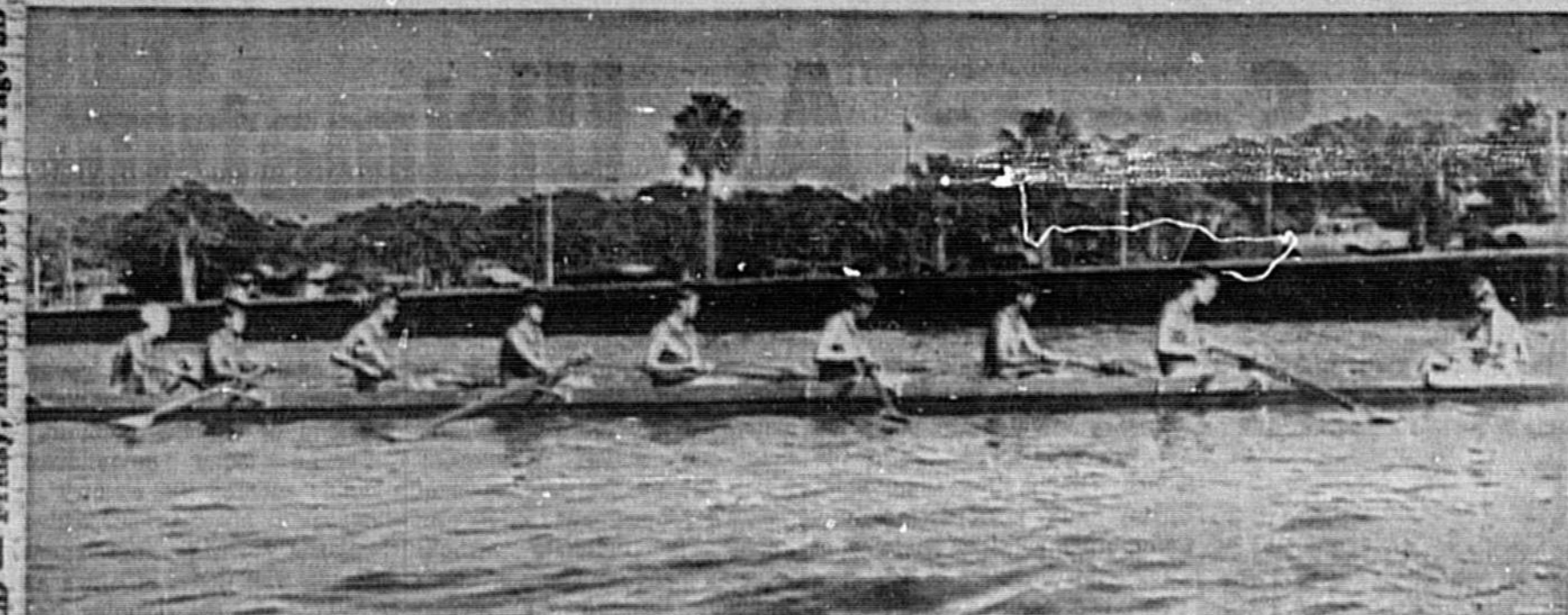

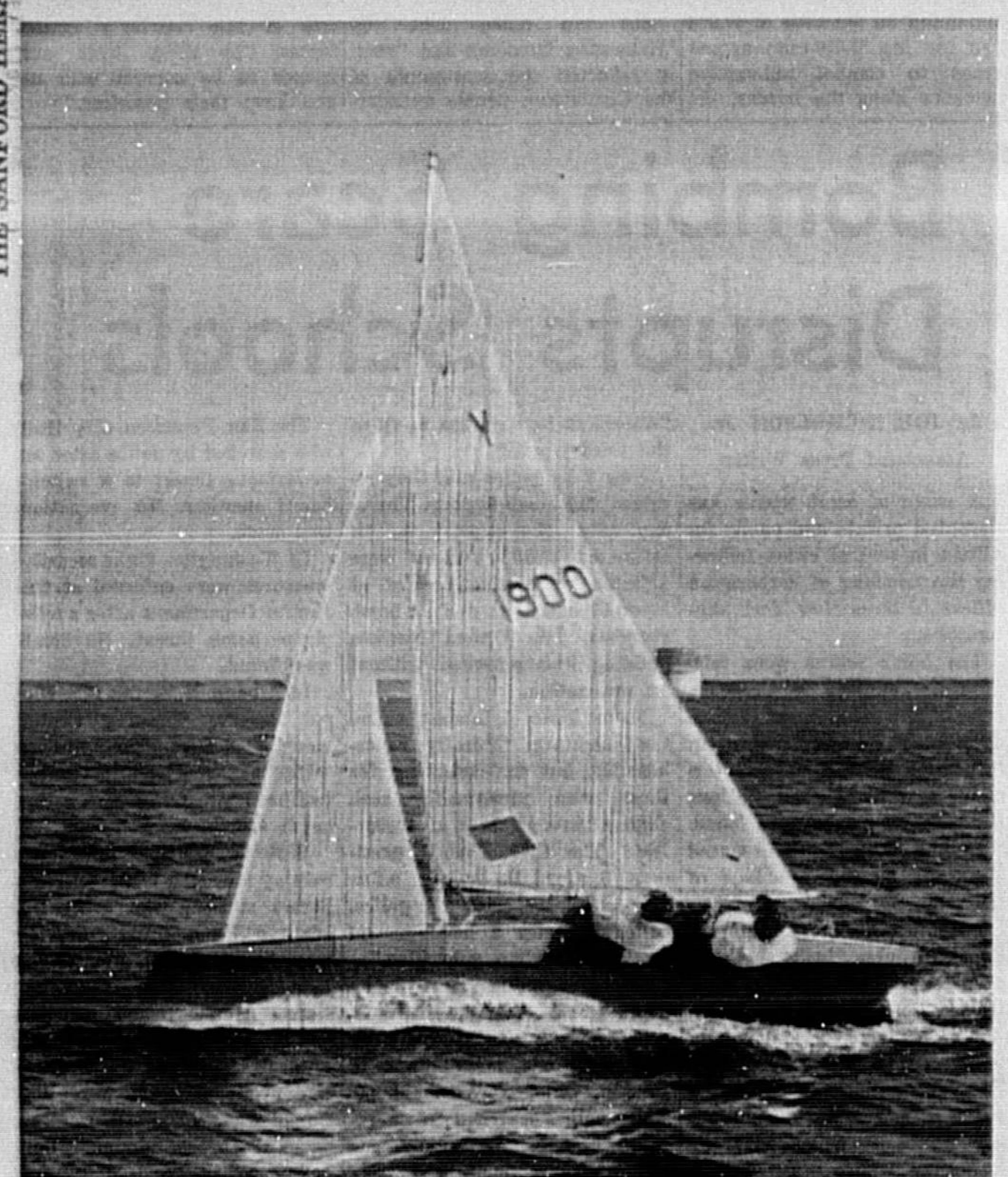

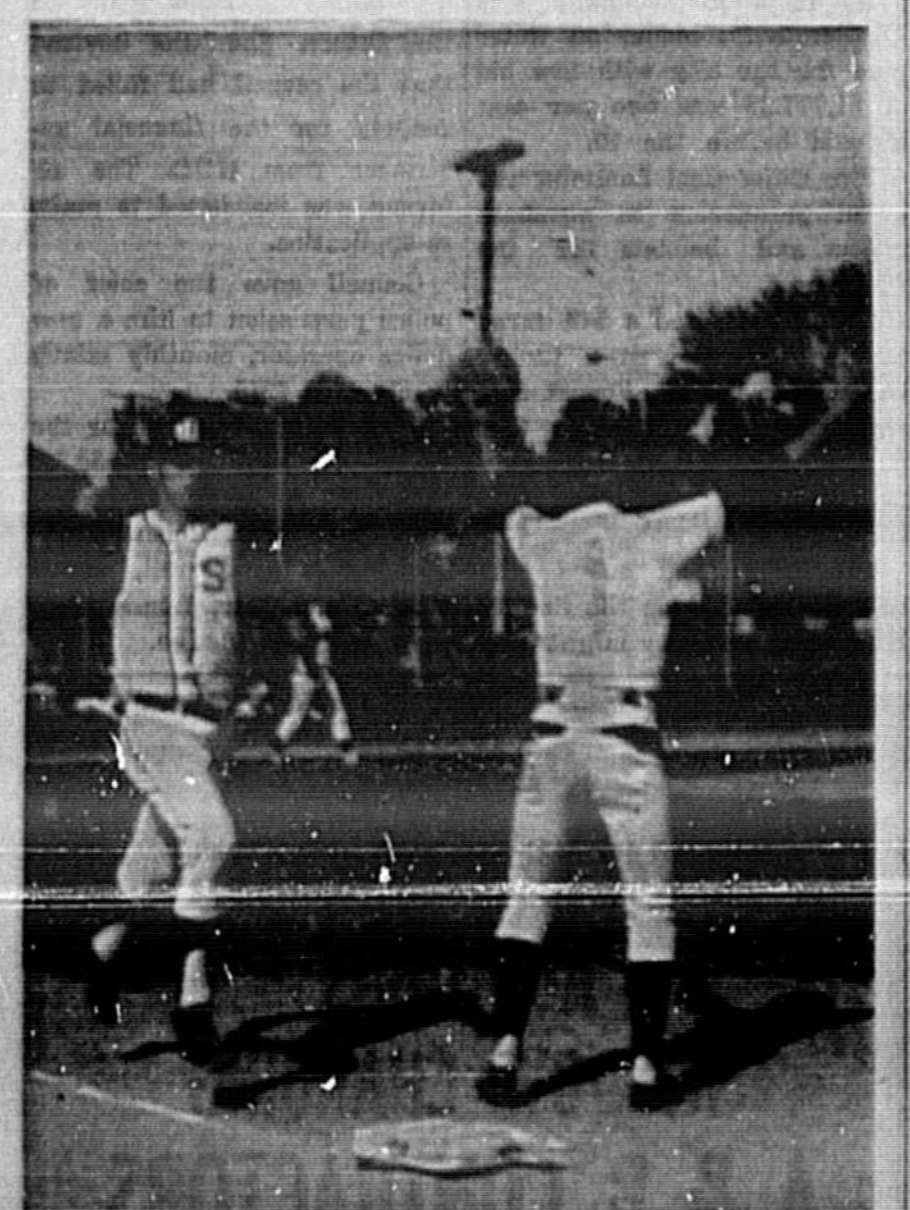
Raiders Edge Tough JU, 5-4

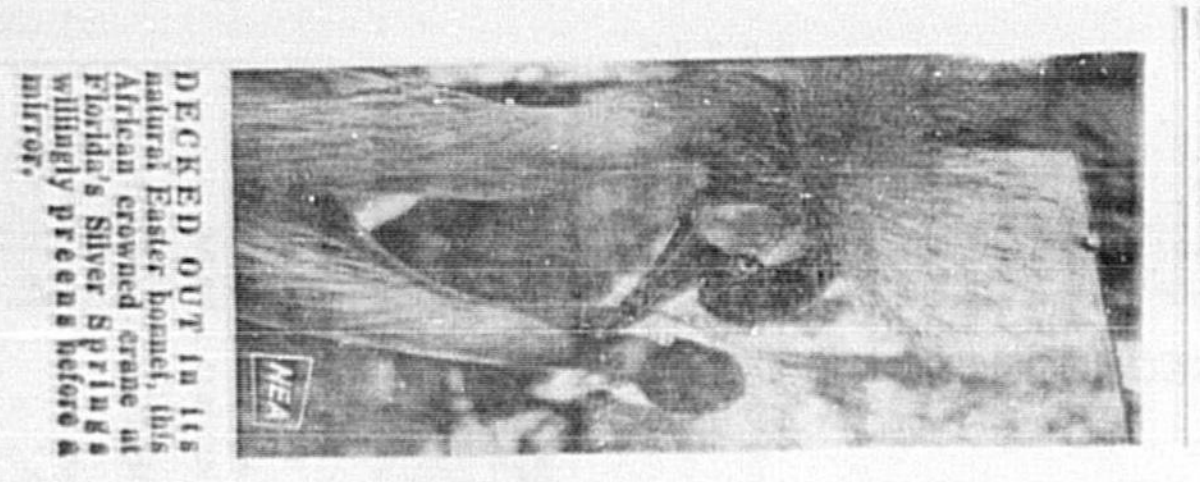

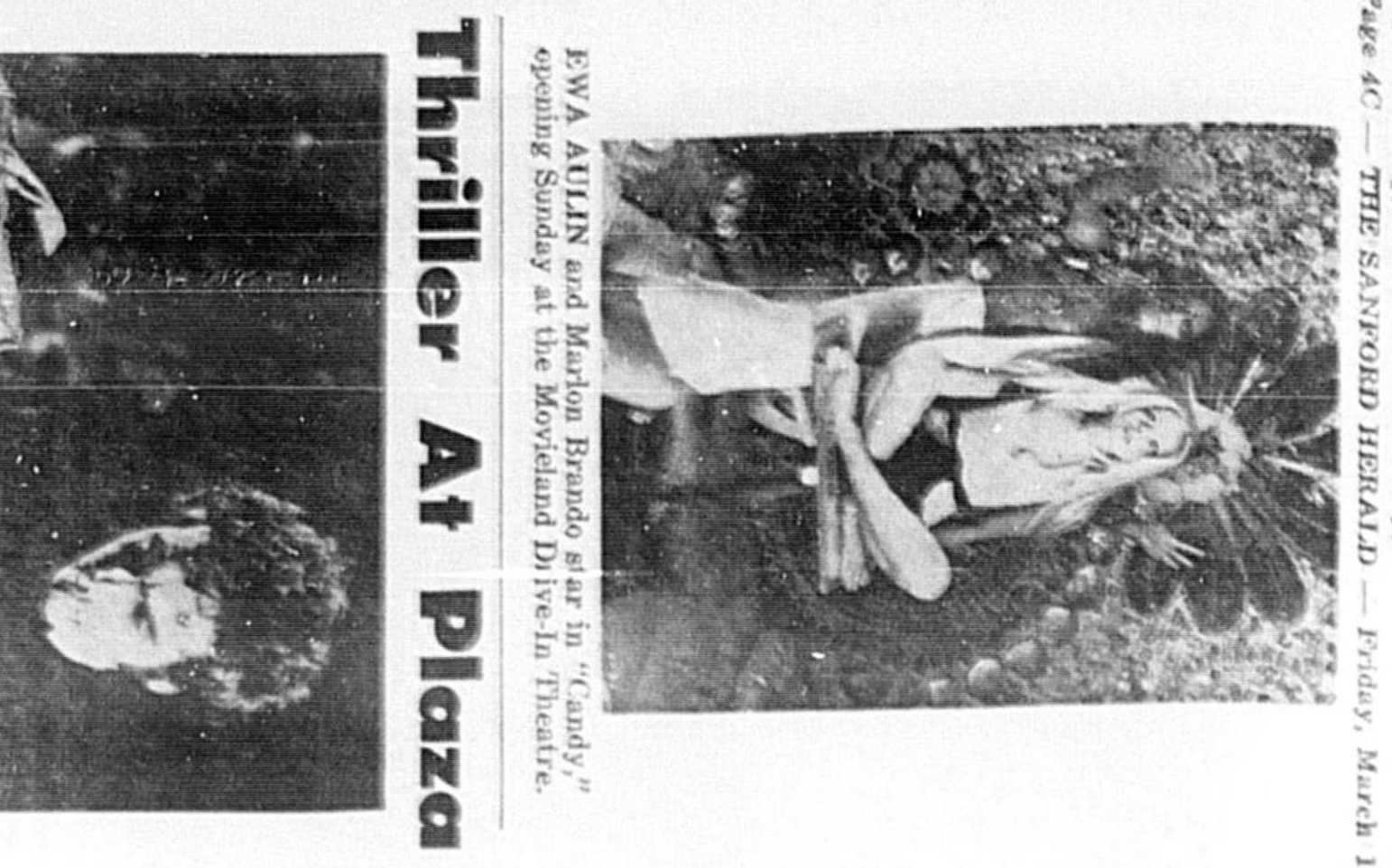

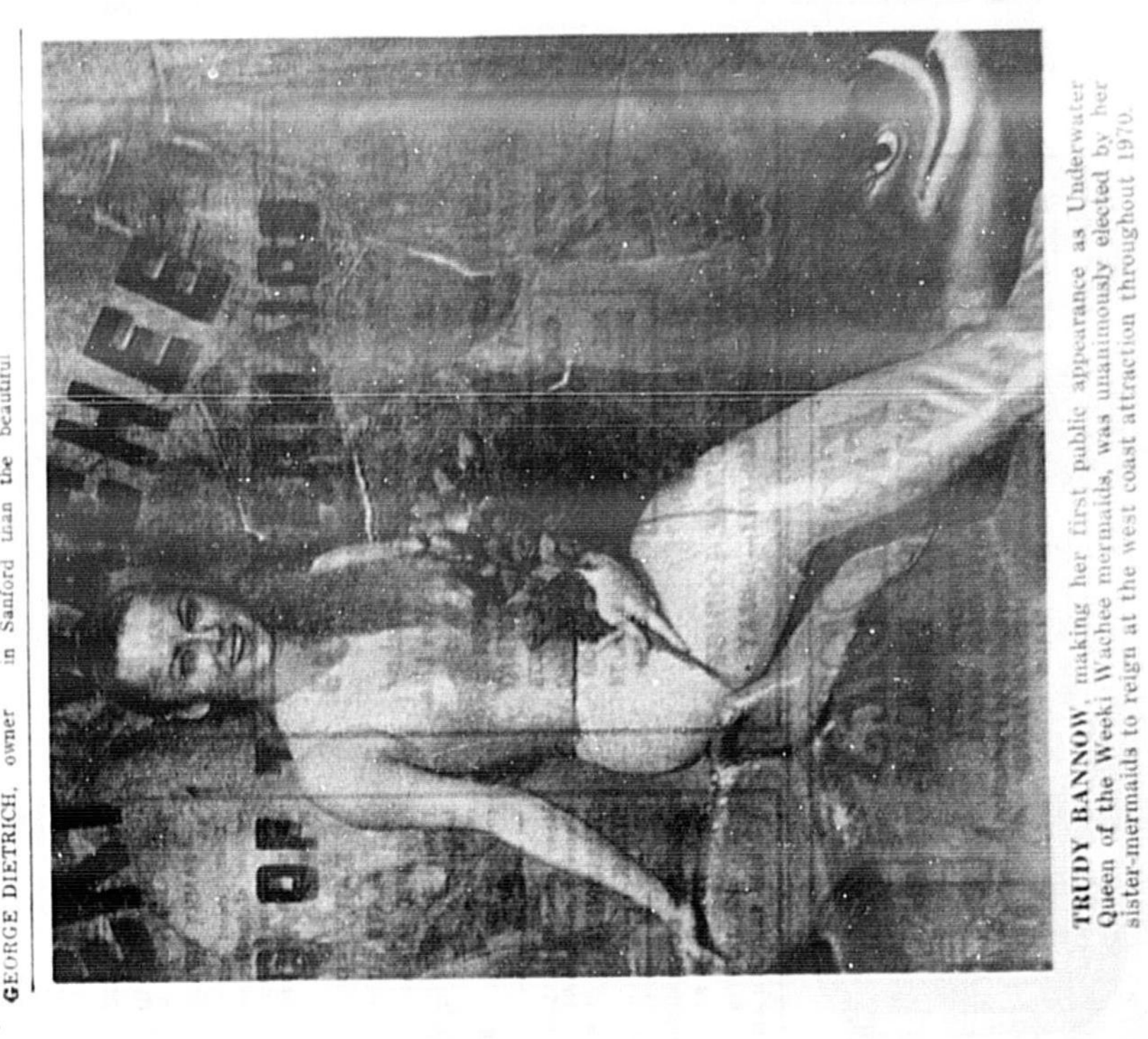
