# **KELLYS** GIVEN LIFE ENDING

#### Jury Deliberated One Hour Before Turning In Verdict Of Guilt Against Pair

OKLAHOMA CITY, Oct. 12. - (A.P.) - George "Machine Gun" Kelly and his wife Kathryn were sentenced to life imprisonment today a few minutes after a federal jury convicted them under the "Lindbergh Law" of the FOR ORGANIZING kidnaping of Charles Urschell, off millionaire.

The maximum sentences were pressured by Judge Edgar Vaught 16 days after the capture of the Kellys at Memphis, and mly three days after they went trial. Thus six of the nine percas convicted for the \$200,006 kideaping conspiracy have been erdered to prison for the rest of their lives.

## An Aspect Of The Naval Race

The new credit corporation Not in the spirit of jingoism but more as a matter of the purpose of making loans on information we move to comment on statistics comparing the purpose of making loans on the security of commodities has the naval strength of Japan and the United States. We suppose that a majority of Americans believe that their Navy is second in strength among the navies of the world. This is theoretically true but actually we are out-ranked by the seas forces not only of Great Britain but also of the Mikado.

A writer recently has pointed out that Japan's navy is incredibly stronger than ours, that it has used up every ton

A writer recently has pointed out that Japan's navy is incredibly stronger than ours, that it has used up every ton granted it by treaty, three years in advance of the limiting December date, that it has only 55,000 tons less of fighting ships than we have, and that out of its total of 220 ships it has only 56 which are out of date while the United States, out of a total of 372 ships, has 288 which are showing their age.

In other words Japan almost equals our navy in actual tonnage, but further, the tonnage which it has is almost all of modern construction, whereas much or ours is ovill like.

of modern construction, whereas much or ours is over age.
To correct this unfavorable picture the United States has begun a rush of shipbuilding which will bring the American

begun a rush of shipbuilding which will bring the American Navy up to full treaty strength. With the completion of contemplated naval expansion our sea forces will be more nearly on a per with Japan, if not exceeding her.

All of this means little or nothing so far as the safety of our shores is concerned. If we desired to dominate the high seas, than the possession of a much larger navy would be desirable and necessary, but if our policy is to be one of isolation then the Navy which we have is adequate enough for our own defense. However, in view of the troubled state of world conditions and the manifest determination of other countries to build up their sea strength, it is not unwise for the limited States to keep up with the leaders, just to have a wide margin of safety.

Any alarm which Americans might have over the insections of their naval forces should be quieted somewhat by travelations by Admiral Sims made at a hearing shortly after the World War. 


