



Jomo Kenyatta, Founder Of Kenya, Dies At 85

NAIROBI, Kenya (UPI) — Jomo Kenyatta, the last of Africa's original nationalist leaders and the father of this thriving East African nation since it gained indpedence from Britain in 1963, died peacefully in his sleep today, the government announced.

He was about 85 years old though his exact birthdate was never established. Kenyatta died at Statehouse in the Indian Ocean port of Mombasa at 3:30 a.m. today (8:30 p.m. Monday EDT), an official

statement said. The government ordered all flags in this moderate East African nation to be flown at half mast and urged the country's 16 million people to remain calm.

13 Quizzed In Iran Arson

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) - Thirteen suspects faced interrogation today on their alleged involvement in the weekend moviehouse fire that killed more than 400 in the Persian Gulf oil town of Abadan. Government officials have blamed the incident on Moslem fundamentalists opposed to reforms advocated by the shah.

450 Tons Of Oil Spilled

SAN JUAN Puerto Rico (UPI) - More than 450 tons of oil in a slick 12 miles long and 300 yards spread across the Caribbean today, the result of a collision between a Brazilian freighter and a Greek tanker about 180 miles southwest of Puerto Rico.

Soviet Scientists: Save Seals

MOSCOW (UPI) - Soviet scientists warn that ringed and Baltic seals are almost extinct, the Tass news agency reported. The scientists, calling for killing restrictions, said inventories on the Gulf of Riga, Gulf of Finland and Lake Ladoga showed there are fewer than 200 seals per breeding spot in contrast to 1,000 seals 15 years ago.

SYDNEY, Australia (UPI) — More than 150 prison inmates broke into a clinic today, stoked up on a variety of drugs then went on a burning rampage at a penal institution near Australia's largest city.

Viets Tell Of Cambodia Fights

HANOI, Vietnam (UPI) — Chinese troops and heavy artillery are fighting with Cam-bodian forces in the border war against Vietnam, Hanoi officials said today. The Vietnamese leaders made the charge in

private talks with an American congressional delegation and then repeated the allegation to U.S. reporters traveling with the mission.

Israel: Anti-Terror Action

TEL AVIV, Israel (UPI) - Israeli Authorities announced a large-scale antiterrorist exercise in major population centers today as part of precautions to ward off a new guerrilla attack before the Camp David summit. Police dismantled a bomb in Jerusa-

The small explosive device was found in the renovated Jewish quarter of the walled Old City, a predominantly Arab section resettled after the 1967 war when it was annexed by

Police took the device away and exploded it harmlessly in a nearby field. It was the 12th bomb found in 10 days.

Organizers of a committee to help prevent bomb attacks said they will pay a \$550 reward Wednesday to a man who found an explosive charge and alerted police.

On the other hand, it has been the official position of the United States, ever since the 1967 war, that Israel will eventually have to relinquish control over the Arab lands occupied in that war. That is the position of the United Nations and it is

the position of the U.S. government. At stake are the territories of Gaza and the West Bank of the Jordan River - lands apportioned to the Arabs in the 1948 partition of Palestine. The lands question lies at the center of the

We hope that with President Carter sitting at the negotiating table, some compromise can be worked

out between the Arabs and the Israelis. Both sides must be flexible. The compromise must protect the security of Israel's borders. But it cannot deprive the Arabs of the prospect of eventually regaining sovereignty over their lands.
